## Editorial

# Argument Leads To Deadly Fight

BASSETERRE, St.Kitts (Thursday 4th June 2020)-A man in his 20s has been killed in the aftermath of a recent fight in the Old Road Community.

Dead is 26-year-old Donte Samuel of Old Road who was fatally stabbed on Tuesday 2nd June 2020.

Police say investigations so far have revealed that close to 4 PM that day an altercation

between several persons occurred in Old Road.


During the incident, Samuel was stabbed in the chest and 31-year-old Quezney Watson, also of Old Road, received a wound to his left eye.

They were both transported to the Joseph N France General Hospital in private vehicles.

According to police Samuel succumbed to his injuries and was pronounced dead upon arrival at the Hospital. Watson underwent surgery and is currently warded in a stable condition.

# Police Looking For Who Killed 'Honey Man'

BASSETERRE, St.Kitts (Thursday 4th June 2020)- Police on St.Kitts are investigating the death of a Saddlers Village farmer-popularly known as 'Kwondo' and 'Honey Man'- found dead in a mountain area of that community with wounds about his body.

Police on St.Kitts are investigating the death of 55-

year-old Stenneth Harvey of Saddlers Village.

Reportedly, police responded to a report of a murder at Saddlers Mountain on Friday 29th May 2020 May 29, sometime after 5 PM. Upon arrival, they found Harvey's motionless body lying on a dirt track with several lacerations.

The District Medical Officer pronounced him dead and members of the Forensic Unit

processed the scene.

Up to press time, there was no information provided from an autopsy report as to the exact cause of death.

The Police are making an appeal to anyone who might have any information in relation to this incident to call the Violent Crimes Unit (VCU) at 467-1887, 662-3468 or their nearest Police Station. Investigations into the matter are ongoing.

# Fulbright scholar warns grave danger if PM Harris returns to power in 2020; will make St. Kitts-Nevis pariah state in the West

Nashville, Tennessee, USA , May 30, 2020 - A retired Professor of International Relations and Security Studies and Fulbright Scholar said the pre-election events unfolding in St Kitts and Nevis have astounding, and far-reaching consequences that have the potential to make the twin-island Federation the new pariah of the western hemisphere.

Dr Daniel K Gibran in a feature article published worldwide is of the view that St Kitts and Nevis' Prime Minister Dr Timothy Harris' use of the State of Emergency and Covid-19 has become an excuse for taking the short step from authoritarianism to dictatorship.

The Fulbright scholar wrote that Kittitians and Nevisians woke-up Friday morning to the unmistakable noise of a rumbling.

But it wasn't an earthquake. It was a noise that is about to shake the very foundation of its democracy. That violent noise was coming from Timothy Harris, a leader who has become desperate in his election bid to the point that he has turned his back on regional diplomatic convention, and bluntly denied entry to an Organization of American States (OAS) election

observer team for the June 5 General Election.

What is telling is that the Harris government was in discussion with the OAS Secretary General 11 days before (May 19), with no indication that it (the Harris administration) would deny their request. However, a communication from the OAS dated May 28 made it clear that the Harris administration has pulled the COVID-19 card, and curtailed off the Federation from impartial and objective eyes.

According to the OAS release, OAS Secretary-General (SG) Luis Almagro had already identified the personnel to

carry out their mission, finalized the team's itinerary, and secured funding for the activity. The OAS SG also advised that its personnel had been repeatedly tested for coronavirus and that they consistently tested negative. However, the release revealed that on May 27, the Harris administration canceled the observer mission, saying that the personnel would have to undergo a mandatory 14-day quarantine (despite being tested negative), which would surpass the time until polling day. The OAS SG indicated his regret that "a practical solution was not put in place like it was the case in Suriname" to allow its observers, and further stating that the process will be monitored from afar.

Dr Gibran noted the immediate joint response to the OAS letter by the President of the St Kitts and Nevis Chamber of Commerce, Chair of the Christian Council and President of the Evangelical Association expressing their concerns with the modus operandi of the Harris government.

The NGO Coalition notes clearly that it was obvious that the polls would be conducted during the pandemic lockdown, and that government should have made the necessary arrangement for observers, using the recent Suriname election as a template.

The civic leaders stated: "We note that one of the five resolutions in the preamble to the 1983 Constitution Order establishing the Sovereign State of St. Christopher and Nevis specifically states that the people of St. Christopher and Nevis "believe in the concept of true democracy with free and fair elections." Throughout our history of universal adult suffrage and for every general election in a post-independent St. Kitts and Nevis we have always adhered to the regionally and internationally accepted benchmarks of undertaking our electoral process, especially polling day activities, under the scrutiny of regional, hemispheric and international observers."

Dr Gibran stated the events unfolding before our eyes today have astounding, and far-reaching consequences that have the potential to make the Federation the new pariah of the hemisphere, and take the society 50 years back, eschewing the development and progress of the nation. Harris is clearly discarding the struggle, sacrifice, and suffering of pioneers such as Robert Bradshaw and Paul Southwell; and is even turning the faces of his own party's influencers, in Kennedy Simmonds and Simeon Daniel.

He wrote that Dr Harris' declaration of a State of Emergency for a public health issue and his denial to domestic and international observer groups to authenticate a fair and free election shows how unfazed he has become. Seizing upon the State of Emergency and Covid-19 has become an excuse for taking the short step from authoritarianism to dictatorship.

In doing so, Harris has taken a page out of Hungary's strongman, Victor Orbán, playbook. After he was elected to the office of president the first time in 2009 Orbán said: "We have only to win once, and then properly." Harris won once, and then properly, in 2015.

But wait there is more. After winning his second term in 2013, Orbán said: "You don't need governance by institutions." During his second and third terms, Orbán took direct control of the Courts and extended his rule by fiat to almost every facet of Hungarian society. And in the wake of Covid-19, he is governing by decree. Harris is doing the same things as he marched hand-in-hand with Victor Orbán, and there is grave danger ahead for democracy and the rule of law in St. Kitts and Nevis if he is returned to power in 2020.

Harris' march to governance by fiat and the complete evisceration of the rule of law is unrelenting as his thunderous outburst to his supporters a few days when he said repeatedly: "Borders closed." A clear signal that his decision is the law. And while he may not be infected with the coronavirus, he shows every sign that he has been infested by the virus of election rigging.

It is impossible to think that the other leaders in this knocked-together coalition of political expediency are actively supporting this open dissent by their leader, Timothy Harris, which will only increase the anger and frustration of the people.

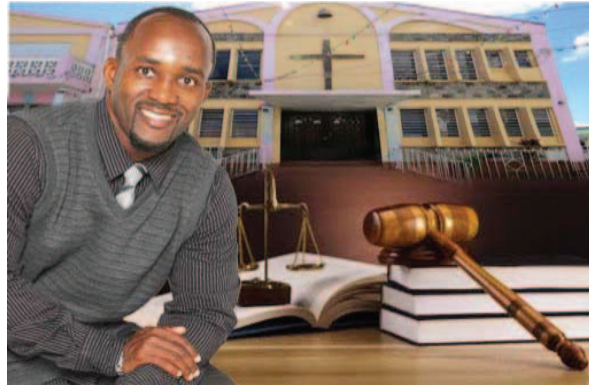
# Pastor Lincoln Connor says not enough was done to ensure overseas observers monitor June 5, 2020 elections

Basseterre, St Kitts, June 2, 2020 - Pastor of the Antioch Baptist Church Rev Lincoln Connor has expressed his disappointment that the June 5, 2020 general elections will not be monitored by overseas observers.

“Our country is looking for people with integrity who they can trust and I really believe that this election cycle, all of us should go out and vote. I must say that I am very disappointed

that we are not having overseas observers. I think it is absolutely necessary for the process and the civil society have indicated that we do not have the manpower. That is the reality and it concerns me greatly as a minister of the gospel,” said Connor.

“Most pastors you ask, they telling you they do no want to be in nothing. They do not want to mixed up with something over their name,” said Connor, who added the pastors do not want to have problems in the governance issues going forward.

“It is going to affect all of us. I think it is a poor decision and I think could have been done to ensure that we have international observers on the ground. I really believe that should have happened,” he said.

# Former PAM chairman says Denzil Douglas’ land for debt swap “It was a stoke of genius. That is what reduced the debt to GDP”

Basseterre, St. Kitts, June 2, 2020 - Former prime minister Dr Denzil Douglas’ land for debt swap has been described as a “brilliant idea and a stroke of genius.”

That is the view of former chairman of the People’s Action Movement (PAM), attorney Chesley Hamilton said over the weekend.

Hamilton told a talk show host that the Team Unity Government in opposition prior to the February 15, 2015 general election, framed the land for debt swap as “the most stupid idea that any politician can come up with.”

“Denzil Douglas came up with the land for debt swap. Team Unity labelled it as ‘a stupid and dumb idea’ and accused him of going to give away our patrimony. The land for debt swap was (really) taking your land and giving it to your bank (National Bank) and so you lost nothing. It was a stoke of genius. That is what reduced the debt to GDP,” said Hamilton.

“Why you think Team Unity cannot reverse the land to debt swap (as they promised). They cannot reverse it because that is what has the debt ratio below 60 percent,” said Hamilton.

Hamilton said: “the land for debt swap is one of the most brilliant ideas that came up in St Kitts politics.”

The Washington-based International Monetary Fund (IMF) Country Report on St Kitts and Nevis (No 15/248) dated September 2015 stated that stronger growth in 2013 and 2014 and sizable advance repayments have improved the debt outlook of the twin-island Federation.

The IMF stated that St Kitts and Nevis’ debt-to-GDP ratio declined to 79 percent of GDP at end-2014.

Despite making promises to repeal the law, Prime Minister Dr Timothy Harris has sold nearly 1,000 acres of land to foreigners at La Valle in Sandy Point and at Brighton Estate, opposite the Windsor University School of Medicine to foreigners.

FORM No. 9.

DIRECTIONS FOR THE GUIDANCE OF VOTERS.

1. Each voter may vote only at one polling station and for only one candidate.
2. Before delivering a ballot paper to a voter who has one or both hands the presiding officer will in the presence of the poll clerk and of the agents of the candidates inspect the hands of the voter so as to satisfy himself or herself that there does not appear upon the appropriate digit or other digit of his or her hands any mark of electoral ink, and if there is any such mark he or she will not deliver a ballot paper to the voter.

[Inserted by Act 11/1971]

3. The voter will go into one of the compartments and, with the pencil provided in the compartment, place a cross on the right hand side, opposite the name of the candidate for whom he or she votes, thus X.

For example:— Supposing John Jones and George Smith are the candidates for election and the voter wishes to vote for Jones, he or she must place a cross opposite Jones’ name as follows:

4. (1) The voter shall then fold the ballot paper so that the initials of the presiding officer and the numbers on the counterfoil can be seen and the counterfoil detached without opening the ballot paper; he or she shall then return the ballot paper so folded to the presiding officer.
  - (2) The presiding officer will satisfy himself or herself that there does not appear upon the appropriate or other digit of the hands of the voter any substance which in his or her opinion is likely to prevent the adhesion of electoral ink.
  - (3) If the voter fails or refuses to immerse the said digit in electoral ink the presiding officer will destroy the ballot paper.
  - (4) If the voter immerses the said digit in electoral ink the presiding officer will then in full view of those present, including the voter, remove the counterfoil and place the ballot paper in the ballot box.
  - (5) The voter shall then forthwith quit the polling station.

[Amended by Act 11/1971]

5. If the voter inadvertently spoils a ballot paper, he or she can return it to the presiding officer, who will, if satisfied of such inadvertence, give him or her another paper.
6. If the voter votes for more than one candidate or places any mark on the paper by which he or she may be afterwards identified, his or her ballot paper will be void and will not be counted.
7. If the voter takes a ballot paper out of the polling station or deposits in the ballot box any other paper than the one given him or her by the presiding officer, he or she shall be liable, on summary conviction, to imprisonment for three months or to a fine of two hundred and forty dollars.

**PART VI – ELECTION OFFENCES**

**101. Intoxicating liquor not to be sold or given on polling day.**

(1) No intoxicating liquor shall be sold, offered for sale, or given away at any premises situate in any constituency in which an election is being held to which a licence issued under the Liquor Licence Act, Cap. 18.21 applies, at any time between the opening and closing of the poll on polling day.

(2) Any person who contravenes the provisions of this section shall be liable, on summary conviction, to a fine of one thousand dollars or to imprisonment for six months.

*[Previously section 88. Amended by Act 7/1976]*

**102. Employers to allow employees time.**

(1) Every employer shall, on polling day, allow to every voter in his or her employ a reasonable period for voting, and no employer shall make any deduction from the pay or other remuneration of any such voter or impose upon or exact from him or her any penalty by reason of his or her absence during such period.

(2) Any employer who, directly or indirectly, refuses, or by intimidation, undue influence, or in any other way, interferes with the granting to any voter in his or her employ of such period for voting, as in this section provided, shall, on summary conviction, be liable to a fine of five thousand dollars or to imprisonment for six months.

**103. Offences by election officers.**

Every election officer who

- (a) makes, in any record, return or other document which he or she is required to keep or make under this Act, any entry which he or she knows or has reasonable cause to believe to be false, or does not believe to be true;
- (b) permits any person whom he or she knows or has reasonable cause to believe not to be a blind person, an illiterate person or an incapacitated person to vote in the manner provided for blind persons, illiterate persons or incapacitated persons, as the case may be;
- (c) refuses to permit any person whom he or she knows or has reasonable cause to believe to be a blind person, an illiterate person or an incapacitated person to vote in the manner provided for blind persons, illiterate persons or incapacitated persons, as the case may be;
- (d) wilfully prevents any person from voting at the polling station at which he or she knows or has reasonable cause to believe such person is entitled to vote;
- (e) wilfully rejects or refuses to count any ballot paper which he or she knows or has reasonable cause to believe is validly cast for any candidate in accordance with the provisions of this Act; or
- (f) wilfully counts any ballot paper as being cast for any candidate, which he or she knows or has reasonable cause to believe was not validly cast for such candidate;

commits an offence against this section and, on conviction on indictment, shall be liable to be imprisoned for a term not exceeding two years.

**104. Loudspeakers, ensigns, banners, etc., prohibited on polling day.**

(1) No person shall furnish or supply any loud speaker, bunting, ensign, banner, standard or set of colours, or any other flag, to any person with intent that it shall be carried, worn or used on motor cars, trucks or other vehicles, as political propaganda, on polling day, and no person shall, with any such intent, carry, wear or use, on motor cars, trucks or other vehicles, any such loud speaker, bunting, ensign, banner, standard or set of colours, or any other flag, on polling day.

(2) No person shall furnish or supply any flag, ribbon, label or like favour to or for any person with intent that it be worn or used by any person within any constituency on polling day as a party badge to distinguish the wearer as the supporter of any candidate, or of the political or other opinions entertained or supposed to be entertained by such candidate, and no person shall use or wear any flag, ribbon, label or other favour, as such badge, within any constituency on polling day.

(3) Nothing contained in either subsection (1) or subsection (2) shall be deemed to extend to the furnishing or supplying of any banner bearing only the name of any candidate or only such name preceded by the words "Vote for" or of any rosette or to the use of any such banner on any vehicle or of any such rosette.

(4) Any person who contravenes any of the provisions of this section shall be liable, on summary conviction, to a fine of ten thousand dollars or to imprisonment for six months.

**105. Definition of bribery.**

(1) The following persons shall be deemed guilty of bribery within the meaning of this Act:

- (a) every person who, directly or indirectly, by himself or herself or by any other person on his or her behalf, gives, lends, or agrees to give or lend, or offers, promises, or promises to procure or to endeavour to procure any money or valuable consideration to or for any voter, or to or for any person on behalf of any voter, or to or for any other person in order to induce any voter to vote or refrain from voting, or corruptly does any such act as aforesaid on account of any voter having voted or refrained from voting at any election;
- (b) every person who directly or indirectly, by himself or herself or by any other person on his or her behalf, gives or procures; or agrees to give or to procure, or offers, promises, or promises to procure or to endeavour to procure, any office, place or employment to or for any voter, or to or for any person on behalf of any voter, or to or for any other person in order to induce such voter to vote or refrain from voting, or corruptly does any such act as aforesaid on account of any voter having voted or refrained from voting at any election;
- (c) every person who, directly or indirectly, by himself or herself or by any other person on his or her behalf, makes any such gift, loan, offer, promise, procurement or agreement as aforesaid to or for any person, in order to induce such person to procure, or endeavour to procure, the return of any person as an elected member of the National Assembly, or the vote of any voter at any election;
- (d) every person who, upon or in consequence of any such gift, loan, offer, promise, procurement or agreement, procures or engages, promises or endeavours to procure the return of any person as an elected member of the National Assembly or the vote of any voter at any election;
- (e) every person who advances or pays or causes to be paid, any money to or to the use of any other person with the intent that such money, or any part thereof, shall be expended in bribery at any election, or who knowingly pays or causes to be paid any money to any person in discharge or repayment of any money wholly or in part expended in bribery at any such election;
- (f) every voter who, before or during any election, directly or indirectly, by himself or herself or by any other person on his or her behalf, receives, agrees, or contracts for any money, gift, loan or valuable consideration, office, place, or employment for himself or herself or for any other person, for voting or agreeing to vote, or for refraining or agreeing to refrain from voting at any election;
- (g) every person who, after any election, directly or indirectly, by himself or herself or by any other person on his or her behalf, receives any money or valuable consideration on account of any person having voted or refrained from voting, or having induced any other person to vote or refrain from voting at any such election.

(2) The foregoing provisions of this section shall not extend or be construed to extend to any money paid or agreed to be paid for or on account of any legal expenses incurred in good faith at or concerning an election.

(3) For the purpose of this section, "legal expenses" includes

- (a) the payment of the agents, clerks, canvassers and messengers of candidates;
- (b) payments made for the purpose of hiring vehicles for the conveyance of voters to or from a polling station;
- (c) payments made for the use of any premises for a public meeting in furtherance of the candidature of any person or for the use of any committee room or office for the purpose of promoting or procuring the election of a candidate;
- (d) payments made in respect of postage, stationery, printing, advertising, the distribution of advertising material and the use of any public address system.

**106. Definition of treating.**

The following persons shall be deemed guilty of treating within the meaning of this Act:

- (a) every person who corruptly, by himself or herself or by any other person, either before, during or after an election, directly or indirectly, gives, or provides or pays, wholly or in part, the expenses of giving or providing any food, drink, entertainment or provision to or for any person for the purpose of corruptly influencing that person, or any other person, to vote or to refrain from voting at such election, or on account of such person or any other person having voted or refrained from voting at such election;

- (b) every voter who corruptly accepts or takes any such food, drink, entertainment or provision.

#### 107. Definition of undue influence.

Every person who, directly or indirectly, by himself or herself or by any other person on his or her behalf, makes use of or threatens to make use of any force, violence, or restraint, or inflicts or threatens to inflict, by himself or herself or by any other person, any temporal or spiritual injury, damage, harm, or loss upon or against any person, in order to induce or compel such person to vote or refrain from voting or on account of such person having voted or refrained from voting at any election, or who by abduction, duress or any fraudulent contrivance, impedes or prevents the free exercise of the franchise of any voter, or thereby compels, induces or prevails upon any voter either to give or refrain from giving his or her vote at any election, commits the offence of undue influence within the meaning of this Act.

#### 108. Definition of personation.

Every person who at an election applies for a ballot paper in the name of another person, whether that name be the name of a person living or dead, or of a fictitious person, or who applies for a ballot paper at a time when there is upon any of his or her digits any mark of electoral ink, or who, having voted once at any election, applies at the same election for a ballot paper in his or her own name, shall be guilty of personation within the meaning of this Act.

#### 109. Penalty for bribery, treating or undue influence.

Every person who is found guilty of bribery, treating or undue influence, under the provisions of this Act shall, on summary conviction thereof, be liable to imprisonment for twelve months or a fine of one thousand dollars.

#### 110. Penalty for personation.

Every person who is found guilty of personation, or of aiding, abetting, counselling or procuring the commission of the offence of personation, shall be liable,

- (a) on summary conviction, to a fine not exceeding thirty thousand dollars or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding five years;
- (b) on conviction on indictment, to a fine not exceeding fifty thousand dollars or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding five years or both.

#### 111. Disqualification for bribery, etc.

Every person who is convicted of bribery, treating, undue influence, or personation, or of aiding, counselling or procuring the commission of the offence of personation shall (in addition to any other punishment) be incapable during a period of seven years from the date of conviction

- (a) of being registered as a voter, or of voting at any election;
- (b) of being elected a member of the National Assembly or, if elected before his or her conviction, of retaining his or her seat as such member.

#### 112. Penalty for certain illegal practices at elections etc.

- (1) Every person who
  - (a) votes, or induces or procures any person to vote, at any election, knowing that he or she or such other person is prohibited by this Act, or by any law in force in the State, from voting at such election;
  - (b) before or during an election knowingly publishes a false statement of the withdrawal of a candidate at such election for the purpose of promoting or procuring the election of another candidate;
  - (c) between the date of the publication in the *Gazette* by the returning officer of a notice in accordance with the provisions of subsection (1) of section 59 and the day after polling at the election, whether in a general election or in a by-election, acts in a disorderly manner, with intent to prevent the transaction of the business of a public meeting called for the purpose of promoting the election of a candidate as a member to serve in the National Assembly;

commits the offence of an illegal practice, and shall, on summary conviction, be liable to a fine of four hundred and eighty dollars and be incapable, during a period of five years from the date of conviction, of being registered as a voter or of voting at any election.

(2) Every person who, between the date of the publication in the *Gazette* by the returning officer of a notice in accordance with the provisions of subsection (1) of section 59, and the day after polling at the election, whether in a general election or in a by-election, incites, combines or conspires with others to act in a disorderly manner with

intent to prevent the transaction of the business of a public meeting called for the purpose of promoting the election of a candidate as a member to serve in the National Assembly, commits the offence of an illegal practice and shall, on conviction on indictment, be liable to imprisonment for two years, and be incapable, during a period of five years from the date of conviction, of being registered as a voter or of voting at any election.

#### 113. Offences in respect of ballot papers.

- (1) Every person who
  - (a) forges or counterfeits, or fraudulently defaces or destroys, any ballot paper;
  - (b) without due authority supplies a ballot paper to any person;
  - (c) fraudulently puts into any ballot box any paper other than the ballot paper which he or she is authorised by law to put in;
  - (d) fraudulently takes out of the polling station any ballot paper;
  - (e) without due authority destroys, takes, opens, or otherwise interferes with any ballot box or packet of ballot papers then in use for the purposes of any election; or
  - (f) not being duly registered as a voter, votes at an election;

shall be liable, on summary conviction, if he or she is an election officer, to imprisonment for twelve months or to a fine of one thousand five hundred dollars, and, if he or she is any other person, to imprisonment for three months or to a fine of five hundred dollars.

(2) In any information or prosecution for an offence in relation to the ballot boxes, ballot papers, and other things in use at an election, the property in such ballot boxes, ballot papers, or things may be stated to be in the returning officer at such election.

#### 114. Offences of election perjury.

- (1) A candidate for nomination who gives false information relating to his or her citizenship contrary to the provisions of section 59.(6) commits an offence.
- (2) A voter who nominates a candidate for election and gives false information relating to the citizenship of that candidate commits an offence.
- (3) A candidate who commits an offence under this section
  - (a) shall be liable, on summary conviction, to a fine not exceeding thirty thousand dollars or to a term of imprisonment not exceeding five years or to both such fine and imprisonment; and
  - (b) shall not be qualified for a period not exceeding five years following his or her conviction or, as the case may be, following a report of the court hearing an election petition as may be so prescribed, to be elected or appointed as a member of Parliament.
- (4) A person who nominates a candidate for election who commits an offence under this section shall be liable, on summary conviction, to a fine not exceeding twenty thousand dollars or to a term of imprisonment not exceeding five years or to both such fine and imprisonment.

#### 115. Infringement of secrecy.

(1) Every election officer and every agent appointed under the provisions of section 69 in attendance at a polling station shall maintain and aid in maintaining the secrecy of the voting in such station, and shall not communicate except for some purpose authorised by law, before the poll is closed, to any person any information as to the name or number on the list of voters of any voter who has or has not applied for a ballot paper or voted at that polling station, and no person shall interfere with or attempt to interfere with a voter when marking his or her vote or otherwise attempt to obtain in the polling station any information as to the candidate for whom any voter in such station is about to vote or has voted.

(2) Every election officer and every such agent in attendance at the counting of the votes shall maintain and aid in maintaining the secrecy of the voting and shall not attempt to communicate any information obtained at such counting as to the candidate for whom any vote is given in any particular ballot paper.

(3) No person shall, directly or indirectly, induce any voter to display his or her ballot paper after he or she has marked it so as to make known to any person the name of the candidate for whom or against whose name he or she has so marked his or her vote.

(4) Every person who acts in contravention of any of the provisions of this section shall be liable, on summary conviction, to imprisonment for six months or to a fine of seven hundred and fifty dollars.

## STATEMENT FROM COMMISSIONER OF POLICE HILROY BRANDY REGARDING SAFETY AND SECURITY ON ELECTION DAY 2020

The role of The Royal St. Christopher and Nevis Police Force during any general election is very critical. We are charged with maintaining law and order throughout the entire process, and are committed to ensuring voters can exercise their franchise in an environment free of violence and intimidation, among other things.

The general public is, hereby, assured that on Election Day on Friday, June 05, 2020, members of the Federation's Police Force and the St. Kitts and Nevis Defence Force will be out in their numbers around the country, particularly in the area of polling stations, to ensure the security of the people and that orderly voting is maintained. I urge the public to cooperate with the police and other members of the security forces in a determined effort to avoid any mishaps and/or breaches of the peace. Let us work together to ensure the security of all citizens and property.

Additionally, the general public is, hereby, reminded to obey all the COVID-19 health protocols that have already been established in the Emergency Powers (COVID-19) Regulations, in particular social distancing and the wearing of face masks. Any breaches of any section of the Regulations in this regard is likely to result in the appropriate police action being taken which includes making an arrest and prosecution.

Opposition representative of the Electoral Commission Jason Hamilton, a former attorney general, spoke with WINNFM on Wednesday 3rd June 2020 on such topic hours before the official polling station details were issued citing interference from higher authority.

“This is Wednesday and there has not been a list produced yet that indicates where the polling stations for this elections will be held and that is because there has been some level of interference by the executive halting the Supervisor of Elections in preparations of the necessary work to facilitate an election when he would have started that process as early as about January of 2020.”

When questioned about it, he had this to say: “On the report of the Supervisor [Elvin

Bailey], it was felt that any kind of preparatory work would give the impression that an election was imminent. That is his report to the commission which he is supposed to do but certainly the bigger picture on that the constitution specifically states the only authority that can direct the Supervisor of Elections is the Commission.”

Hamilton added: “However, we have a situation where for example where the Supervisor of Elections would have prepared a list of persons to be returning officers. He would have vetted the persons, he would have interviewed the persons, he would have had training sessions with the persons. That list disappeared in the sense that none of the persons who were selected-and that list was voted on by the Commission- and then a new list is presented with returning officers none of whom were selected by the Supervisor. The national Assembly Elections Act specifically says the Governor General appoints on advice of the Supervisor of Elections so unless the Supervisor is going to say that he recommended a set of persons he's never spoken with, never interviewed in the process then it means some other level or arm or administrative body is directing the supervisor of elections on what to do.”

Opposition Leader of the St.Kitts-Nevis Labour Party Dr. Denzil Douglas, in speaking at a live press conference that same day addressed the “undermining of the free and fair conduct of the elections here in St.Kitts and Nevis pertaining to the upcoming general elections on Friday...”

owned and was driven by Mark Archibald of Lodge Village and ATV P3431 which was driven by Javid Browne of Newtown while Raheem Patrick of Shadwell was the pillion (passenger) rider on the ATV.

Police further inform that the circumstances are that Archibald was traveling eastward along Wellington Road when Browne came out of the stop at Branch Street and both vehicles collided.

Browne and Patrick were taken to the Joseph N. France General Hospital via ambulance. Patrick sustained several injuries and is warded in a critical condition, while Browne suffered a broken leg.

Videos at the scene of the accident have circulated social media-particularly Facebook and Whatsapp- showing the hurt ATV occupants with the driver in one spot while the passenger close to the bus.

In one of the videos, a female could be seen and heard asking

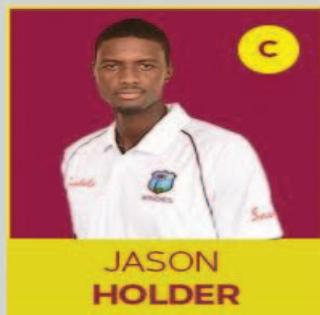
It was also outlined that the team was expected to be screened immediately upon arrival and also undergo a molecular (RT-PCR) test while being housed in a Government facility.

charters on June 8.

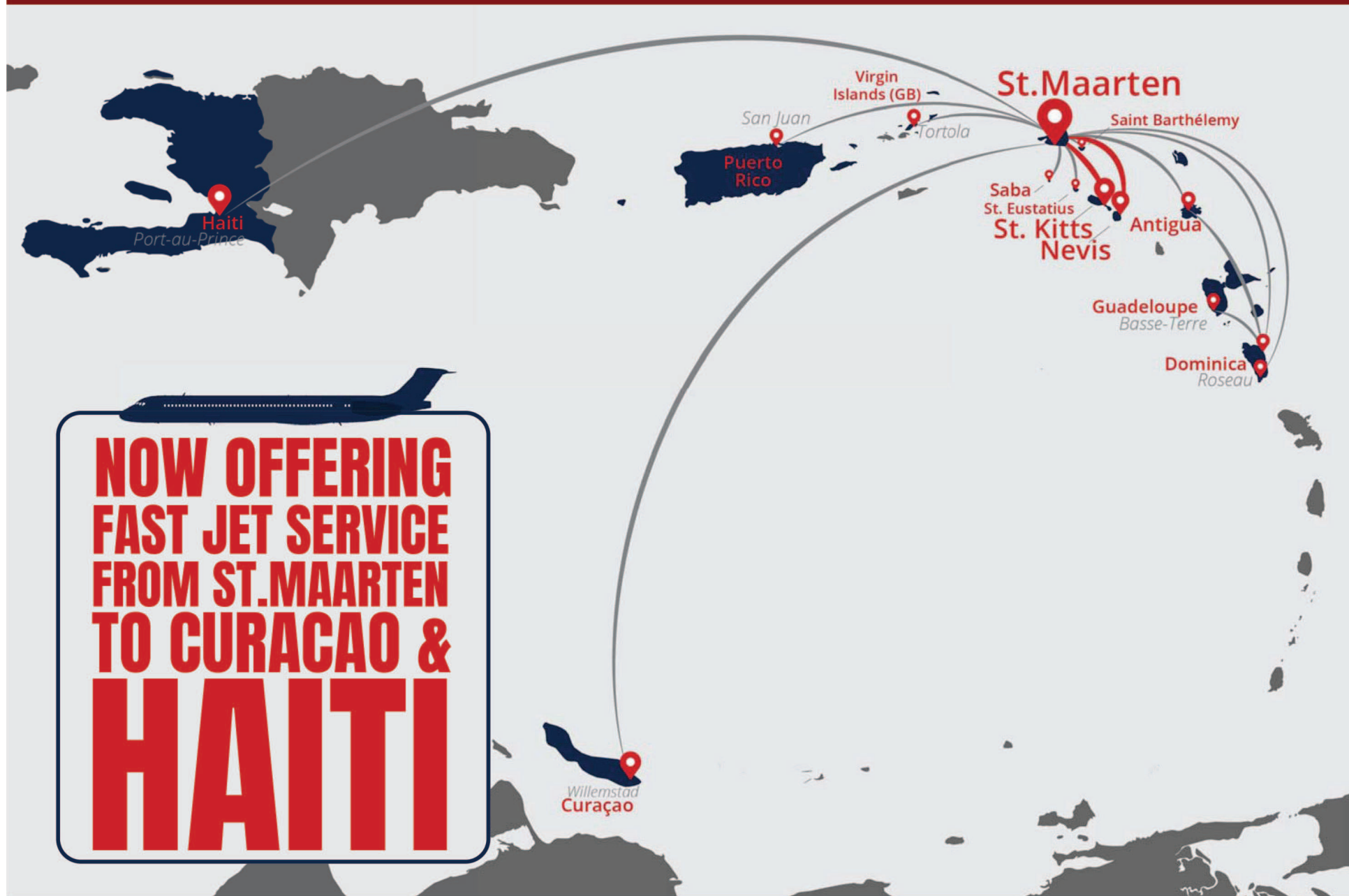

## Pope Says World Cannot Turn A Blind Eye To Racism

VATICAN CITY - Pope Francis says he has "witnessed with great concern the disturbing social unrest" in the United States in reaction to the killing of George Floyd, and called for national reconciliation.

"My friends, we cannot tolerate or turn a blind eye to racism and exclusion in any form and yet claim to defend the sacredness of every human life," the pope said during his weekly Wednesday audience, held in the presence of bishops due to coronavirus restrictions on gatherings.

At the same time, the pontiff warned "nothing is gained by violence and so much is lost."

Francis said he was praying "for the repose of George Floyd and all those who have lost their lives as a result of the sin of racism" and issued his condolences for all those who grieve their loss.

He called for national reconciliation and peace.



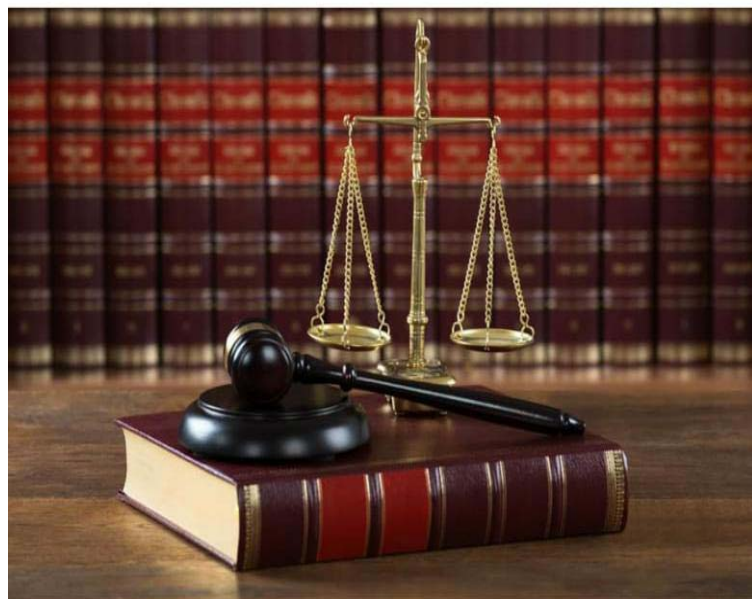

## Social Status Helped And Hindered By The Same Behaviors And Traits Worldwide



Beyond fame and fortune, certain traits and behaviors may have pervasive influence in climbing the social ladder, according to a study by evolutionary psychologists at The University of Texas at Austin.

The study of 2,751 individuals in 14 nations identified universally valued qualities, such as intelligence and honesty, that can heighten a person's social status. It also identified universal double-standards that socially reward men for certain sexual behaviors but punish women.

The findings were published in the *Journal of Personality and Social Psychology* and fill an important gap in understanding the psychology behind who rises and falls within human societies.

"Humans live in a social world in which relative rank matters for nearly everything - your access to resources, your ability to attract mates, and even how long you live," said UT Austin evolutionary psychologist David Buss, one of the study's lead authors. "From an evolutionary perspective, reproductively relevant resources flow to those high in status and trickle slowly, if at all, to those lower on the social totem pole."

The researchers compared people's impressions of 240 factors - including acts, characteristics and events - to determine what increased and impaired a person's esteem in the eyes of others. They found that certain qualities such as being honest, hard-working, kind, intelligent, having a wide range of knowledge, making sacrifices for others, and having a good sense of humor increased a person's social value.

"From the Gypsies in Romania to the native islanders of Guam, people displaying intelligence, bravery and leadership rise in rank in the eyes of their peers," said UT Austin psychology graduate student Patrick Durkee, who led the study with Buss. "But possessing qualities that inflict costs on others will cause your status to plummet, whether you live in Russia or Eritrea."

Being known as a thief, as dirty or unclean, as mean or nasty, acquiring a sexually transmitted disease, and bringing shame on one's family, decreased a person's social status or value.

These status-harming actions can also lead to a person being ostracized from the group - "an action that would have meant near-certain death in ancestral environments," the researchers said.

"Although this study was conducted prior to the current pandemic, it's interesting that being a disease vector is universally detrimental to a person's status," Buss said. "Socially transmitted diseases are evolutionarily ancient challenges to human survival, so humans have psychological adaptations to avoid them."

Lowering a person's social status is an evolutionarily ancient method of social distancing from disease vectors."

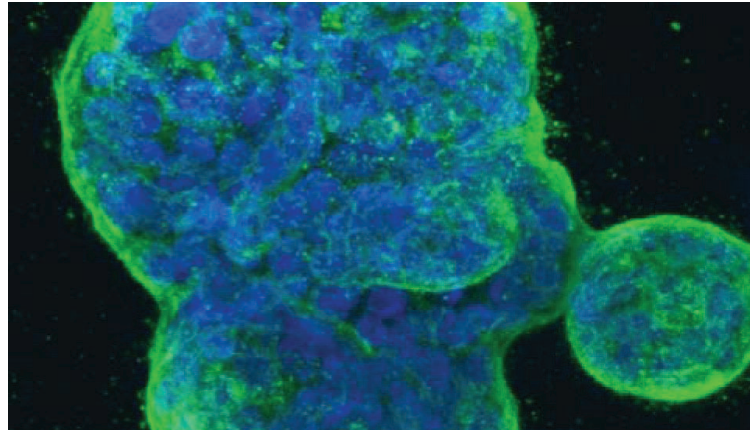
In considering universal gender differences in status criteria, the study supported that the ability and willingness to protect others - demonstrating bravery and physical formidability, and taking risks to protect allies - was more status-enhancing for men than women. On the other hand, women were more valued socially for qualities relating to domestic skills and attractiveness.

Sexual strategies and mating practices also influenced status

## Scientists Find A Switch To Flip And Turn Off Breast Cancer Growth And Metastasis

Researchers at Tulane University School of Medicine identified a gene that causes an aggressive form of breast cancer to rapidly grow. More importantly, they have also discovered a way to "turn it off" and inhibit cancer from occurring.

The animal study results have been so compelling that the team is now working on FDA approval to begin clinical trials and has published details in the journal *Scientific Reports*.

The team, led by Dr Reza Izadpanah, examined the role two genes, including one whose involvement in cancer was discovered by Tulane researchers, play in causing triple negative breast cancer (TNBC). TNBC is considered to be the most aggressive of breast cancers, with a much poorer prognosis for treatment and survival. Izadpanah's team specifically identified an inhibitor of the TRAF3IP2 gene, which was proven to suppress the growth and spread (metastasis) of TNBC in mouse models that closely resemble humans.

In parallel studies looking at a duo of genes - TRAF3IP2 and Rab27a, which play roles in the secretion of substances that can cause tumor formation - the research teams studied what happens when they were stopped from functioning.

Suppressing the expression of either gene led to a decline in both tumor growth and the spread of cancer to other organs. Izadpanah says that when Rab27a was silenced, the tumor did not grow but was still spreading a small number of cancer cells to other parts of the body. However, when the TRAF3IP2 gene

and showed strong gender differences.

Being sexually promiscuous decreased the status of both genders, but hurt women's status considerably more even in the most sexually egalitarian cultures in the study, the researchers said. Conversely, attaining a committed long-term mate increased the status of both genders, but somewhat more so for women. And fidelity increased the status of both women and men substantially and equally.

The study also identified cultural differences in qualities influencing social status.

For example, practicing witchcraft damaged a person's status in Zimbabwe and Eritrea, but has virtually no impact on status in Estonia, Russia or the United States. And although valued universally, a good sense of humor contributes to a large boost in status in Poland; a moderate boost in China, South Korea and Japan; but only a slight boost in Eritrea.

was turned off, they found no spread (known as "metastasis" or "micrometastasis") of the original tumor cells for a full year following the treatment. Even more beneficial, inhibiting the TRAF3IP2 gene not only stopped future tumor growth but caused existing tumors to shrink to undetectable levels.

"Our findings show that both genes play a role in breast cancer growth and metastasis," says Izadpanah. "While targeting Rab27a delays progression of tumor growth, it fails to affect the spread of tiny amounts of cancer cells, or micrometastasis. On the contrary, targeting TRAF3IP2 suppresses tumor growth and spread, and interfering with it both shrinks pre-formed tumors and prevents additional spread. This exciting discovery has revealed that TRAF3IP2 can play a role as a novel therapeutic target in breast cancer treatment."

"It is important to note that this discovery is the result of a truly collaborative effort between basic science researchers and clinicians." Izadpanah continued. Members of the team included Eckhard Alt, David Jansen, Abigail Chaffin, Stephen Braun, Aaron Dumont, Ricardo Mostany and Matthew Burow of Tulane University.

Dr Bysani Chandrasekar of the University of Missouri has joined in the Tulane research efforts and found that targeting TRAF3IP2 can stop the spread of glioblastoma, a deadly brain cancer with limited treatment options.

The team is now working on getting FDA approval and hopes to begin clinical trials soon.

# Electoral commission confirms government tampering with preparations for June 5, 2020 general elections

A member of the three-man St Kitts and Nevis Electoral Commission has confirmed that the List of Returning Officers prepared by the Supervisor of Elections Elvin Bailey was thrown into the proverbial waste paper basket by the government of prime minister Dr Timothy Harris.

When the new list was made public among the new names were Prime Minister Dr Timothy Harris' brother in law, Jermaine Sacy Lake, St Christopher 1; Dr Harris' former campaign manager, Dr Patrick Welcome, in St Christopher 7, where the incumbent is Dr Harris himself and Dr Vincent Hodge, Permanent Secretary to Deputy Prime Minister Shawn Richards, the incumbent candidate for St Christopher 5.

Commission member, attorney Jason Hamilton, who represents the opposition, told WINN news that activities in preparation for the 2020 poll were interfered by the government and erodes the work if the constitutional body.

He identified the selection of the Returning Officers, late publication of the Election Day Voters List, late publication of the polling stations and earlier activities in preparation for the June 5 poll.

"As of today, Wednesday 3 June, the Voters' List has not been produced yet that

indicates where polling stations for this election will be held and that is because there has been some level of interference by the Government halting the supervisor of elections in the preparation of the necessary work to facilitate an election when he would have started that process as early as January of 2020," Hamilton told WINNFM.

The former attorney general pointed out the St Kitts and Nevis constitution states that the only authority that can direct the supervisor of elections is the commission.

"However we have a situation where the supervisor of elections prepared a list of persons to be returning officers. He would have vetted the persons, interviewed the persons and have training sessions with the persons. That list disappeared, disappeared in the sense that none of the persons selected from the list that was voted on and approved by the commission and a new list is presented with returning

officers none of whom were selected by the supervisor," said Hamilton who pointed out that the National Assembly Elections Act says the Governor General appoints on the advice of the supervisor of elections.

Commission chairman lawyer Nassibou Butler initially said he did not know about the first list of returning officers, but later conceded that there had been a commission vote on the matter but he was outnumbered.

Hamilton gave another example where the Commission was informed by Supervisor of Elections that the Electoral Office was going to operate on reduced hours leading up to the elections because there is some preparatory work needed to be done by the staff.

"A sign is posted on the door of the office indicating that the office will be closed from Tuesday of this week to Thursday of this week giving only Friday (June 5th Election Day) to be opened. If the list was published last week, a person would only know last week if his or her name is not on the list. If the office is closed this week where does the person go to complain," said Hamilton.

"According to the Supervisor, he never gave that directive for the office to be closed and the commission never gave that instruction. The question is who gave that directive?," said Hamilton.

# CARICOM confirms presence of Observer Team in St Kitts and Nevis

Basseterre, St Kitts, June 4, 2020 - The Guyana-based C A R I C O M Secretariat has confirmed it has sent an Observer Mission to monitor the June 5 general election in St Kitts.

It is the first official announcement that a CARICOM Observer Team is in the Federation.

"We are waiting the arrival tonight of the RSS plane - that is the Regional Security plane and that plane will be bringing to us the observers for the general elections. The observers for the elections will be arriving on the RSS plane," said Abdias Samuel, Chairman of the National COVID-19 Task Force at Wednesday's briefing.

The CARICOM statement confirming the presence of the CARICOM Mission stated that at the invitation of the Government of the Federation of St. Kitts and Nevis, the Caribbean Community (CARICOM) has fielded a CARICOM Election Observation Mission to monitor the General Elections which will be held in that country on Friday, 5 June 2020.

The three-member Mission will be headed by Mr. Gaspar Jean Baptiste, Chief Elections Officer of Saint Lucia, who has served as a member of CARICOM Election Observation Missions to other CARICOM Member States. The other members of the Mission are:

- H.E. Mr. Arley Gill (National of Grenada); and
- Mr. Chester Arlington Humphrey (National of Grenada).

The CARICOM Election Observation Mission proposes to meet with the electoral officials, leaders of political parties and other stakeholders of the Federation of St. Kitts and Nevis, and will monitor the voting process including the opening of the poll, the casting of votes, the closing of the poll and the counting of the ballots.

The members of the Observation Mission arrived in St. Kitts and Nevis on Wednesday, 3 June 2020 and will depart on Sunday, 7 June 2020.

The Election Observation Mission will issue a Preliminary Statement based on its observations and findings. A Report on the General Elections will be subsequently prepared and submitted to the Secretary-General of the Caribbean Community.

For CARICOM, election observation serves as a platform to support existing democratic traditions within the Caribbean Community as part of its wider policy of supporting democracy and good governance. In this regard, at the request of the Government of the Federation of St. Kitts and Nevis, the CARICOM Secretariat conducted virtual training in election observation for a group of local election observers.
