Passengers Attempting To Fake Process Negative COVID-19 Tests Frowned Upon

BASSETTERRE, St.Kitts (Friday 27th November 2020)-Travellers attempting to use inaccurate test details to board flights to St.Kitts-Nevis, when they are expected to have a negative test result, are being frowned upon and asked to do it the right way.

Chairman of the COVID-19 National Task Force Abdias Samuel, speaking at the National Emergency Operations Center (NEOC) COVID-19 Daily Briefing on Tuesday 24th November 2020, informed that there are passengers trying to bypass the approval process by uploading wrong information and other things.

“You are jeopardizing the travellers who are travelling with you, you are jeopardizing the country at large and everybody else that you come into contact with. We are appealing to everyone who wants to travel to St.Kitts to do so and do so the right way,” he commented.

Samuel emphasized that “the reverse transcription polymerase chain reaction (rRT -PCR) test is what will be accepted and not no rapid test or any other type of test; please ensure. There are persons who are doing home kit testing and uploading these home kits testing. Those will not be accepted.”

“We are seeing a number of irregularities as it regards to the approval process where persons are attempting to circumvent the system with uploading wrong tests, wrong information and doing other things in order for them to travel,” he said.

He continued: “Persons are uploading receipts, persons are actually uploading things that cannot be verified. That will not be accepted, and let me repeat such uploads will not be accepted. Please ensure that when you upload your test, it verifies everything, the lab, the location of the lab, the information and all the regular information required; it’s very important that you do so. If you don’t do so and there’s no mean of verifying the test, your application will not be processed.

Samuel thanked the team that is doing the vetting process noting that the workers go as far as calling and emailing individuals to ensure that they understand what is required.

“Again, there is no need to panic...the corridor of containment is going well from the arrival process at the international airport, our ports of entry to the processing by border agencies in immigration, customs and also our port health officers and the transportation,” he said further.

Samuel underscored the appeal by the Chief Medical Officer to those working in the transportation industry namely taxi operators and water taxi operators.

“Please be mindful of how you manage. We have been doing well with the corridor of containment in terms of detecting, identifying and ensuring that there is isolation and containment and management of individuals who may be positive or may become positive,” he advised.

Additionally, in addressing the business community, he told that the Compliance Task Force will be out in numbers doing its job and asked for cooperation.

We have done enough in terms of educating you, in terms of doing everything to prepare you for this moment. From now on we are going to be applying the law to its full extent to ensure we have compliance from the business places.

Such areas include appropriate distance markings inside and outside buildings as well as sanitisation processes.

“There is no need for us to begin to panic to think that the country is going into a shut down. What is being required of you is to be more alert; to be more vigilant. That is what is required of all of us,” the COVID-19 National Task Force official encouraged.

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Updated Autopsy Report Involving Newton Woman Pending

BASSETERRE, St.Kitts (Friday 27th November 2020)- Members of the media are expecting a follow-up report concerning a young woman, 32-year-old Rochelle Bennett alias ‘Boom Boom’ of George Street, Newtown who was recently found unconscious with wounds about her body on a sidewalk in her community.

Details of an autopsy report from a police press release, issued on Thursday 26th November 2020, continues to be debated by members of the public but that report is currently on hold as the police public relations department has asked media workers to hold off on publishing or sharing the story relating to the autopsy until further update on the matter.

Police say some time after 4 p.m. on Sunday 22nd November, Beat and Patrol reported to the Criminal Investigation Department that a woman was found unconscious on the sidewalk along the Newtown Bay Road in the vicinity of the T-junction at the end of Sandown Road.

Bennett had a number of wounds about her body. She was transported to the JNF General Hospital via the Emergency Medical Service ambulance where she died late that night.

Personnel from the Forensic Department visited and processed the scene in Newtown.

The Police are making an appeal to anyone with information regarding this incident to contact the Violent Crimes Unit by dialing 467-1887, 467-1888, 662-3468, their nearest Police Station or the crime hotline at 707 where information can be given anonymously.

Credible information reaching this media house indicates that the deceased originally hailed from Jamaica.

Up to press time on Thursday 26th November no further update was given.

Little Girl Recovering After Traffic Accident

BASSETERRE, St.Kitts (Friday 27th November 2020)- A six-year-old girl of the Dieppe Bay community who was recently hit by a motor van is said to be recovering well, according to credible information reaching this media house from a friend of a family member.

Police are currently investigating that traffic accident that occurred four (4)days ago in Dieppe Bay at about 3:30 p.m. on Tuesday 24th November, 2020.

It involved motor van TA 192 which is owned by James Gardiner of Parson’s Village, but was being driven by Keanu Gardiner also of Parson’s Village and the six-year-old pedestrian.

Police say circumstances are that Gardiner was traveling along the Island Main Road in Dieppe Bay heading to St. Paul’s. When he got in the vicinity of the Dieppe Bay Lawn, he collided with the pedestrian.

Reportedly, she was, at the time, crossing the street in front of a stationary omnibus from the mountain side to the seaside of the road.

As a result, she sustained bruises and swelling to her face and legs and was transported to the JNF General Hospital by the Emergency Medical Service via ambulance.

She is currently warded in a stable condition at the hospital.

Contacts Of Latest COVID-19 Positive Patients In Quarantine Too

BASSETERRE, St.Kitts (Friday 27th November 2020) - Contacts of the two travellers tested positive for the novel coronavirus (COVID-19) have been placed in quarantine while it has been indicated that the other passengers who took the same flight as them are too.

Chief Medical Officer Dr. Hazel Laws disclosed such information when she spoke at the National Emergency Operations Center (NEOC) COVID-19 Daily Briefing on Tuesday 24th November 2020.

“The protocols we have established have been adhered to and these protocols would have been followed along the corridor of containment between their arrival into the country at RLB International Airport and the hotel where they are staying. Contacts meaning the significant contacts of these two cases are presently being interviewed. The significant contacts are placed in quarantine. They are being tested and they will be monitored,” she commented.

According to her: “Our contact tracing system is quite robust here in the Federation.”

“All passengers who would have arrived in the Federation on this same flight last Saturday afternoon, they are in quarantine and they are confined to their rooms,” she added.

In touching on what happens in travelling, the CMO outlined the events surrounding passenger interaction.

“Let’s say you’re booked on a flight to the Federation via American Airlines or any other carrier. You would go to the international airport, you would be waiting in the departure lounge and so you would interact inevitably with passengers who are going on the same carrier and then once you are onboard, you would be sharing the same air space with the passengers on board. That three hour flight between Miami and St.Kitts-Nevis.”

you were to say use the restroom, other passengers onboard also utilize the rest room and then once you would have landed here in St. Kitts and Nevis, there is interaction between passengers when they are disembarking and when they are making their way through RLB International Airport through the health screening unit through immigrations and customs and then as they exit the airport and so as a result of this inevitable interaction all passengers who were onboard at this conveyance, they have been asked to remain in quarantine confined to their rooms while here or within the first 14 days of their vacation in the Federation."

Meanwhile, Chief of Staff at the Joseph N. France General Hospital and member of the COVID-19 national Task Force Dr. Cameron Wilkinson is calling on members of the public to be vigilant of the pandemic.

"If we let our vigilance wear thin, we can expect to see a spike in positivity rate and an overwhelming of our healthcare system as we would be unable to capture and contain these cases leading to viral spread in our communities."

"We need not only to focus on the increased case numbers but the containment measures as well. We have reached thus far in this fight as a nation through our collaborative efforts with the all of society approach and should not let complacency set in and erode the gains we have made in containing this virus," he said.

Dr. Wilkinson said a progressive cutting of corners in this fight will not bring back tourism and a thriving hotel industry nor return us to the norms we were accustomed to pre-COVID-19 in a hurry.

"We first have to get through this wave with everyone alive and well with hope of building a brighter tomorrow when we have conquered the virus with an effective vaccine," he expressed.

He also stated that he understands the frustration when people say they want to get back to the old norms saying: "I, too, want to get back there, every single member of the task force wants to get back there but it does not mean we should ignore the risks posed by COVID-19 and abandon the fight. With the virus back in the Federation, our precautionary vigilance must be greater now."

He then urged: "We must do all we can to prevent the spread of this virus and prevent it from getting a safe haven in our homes, churches, schools and workplaces leading to community spread."

Following the reopening of borders on Saturday 31st October, the Federation has recorded three (3) present active cases with one on Saturday 21st November and two more on Tuesday 24th November; all of whom are visitors.

Overall, there is a count of 22 cases having been recorded with 16 on St. Kitts and 6 Nevis.

BASSETERRE, St.Kitts (Friday 20th November 2020) - A female who failed to follow restrictions having visited a high risk traveller in quarantine has found herself in quarantine too.

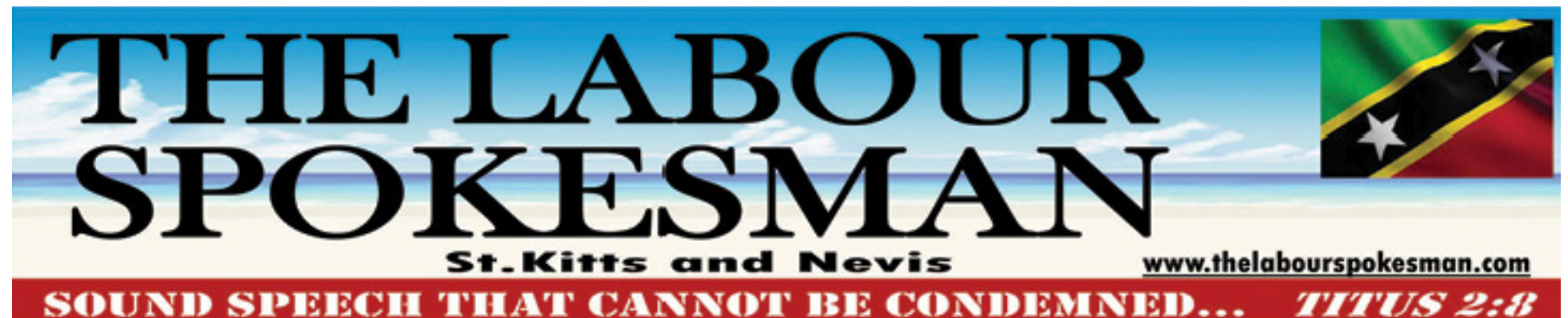
Such information was disclosed by Superintendent Cromwell Henry, in a presentation at the National Emergency Operations Center (NEOC) COVID-19 Daily Briefing on Wednesday 11th November 2020.

"Speaking of being conscious of your health, over the last weekend, a resident visited a high risk traveller who is quarantined at one of our designated quarantine sites and despite being warned by the security personnel on duty, the young lady came in close contact with the person who is in quarantine," he told.

Superintendent Henry said: "Out of an abundance of caution, the CMO [Chief Medical Officer Dr. Hazel Laws] who is the quarantine authority directed that the young lady be quarantined in the interest of public health. She is now at another designated quarantine site for 14 days at her own expense.

According to him: "Regulation 14 of the Emergency Powers Regulation provides 'No person shall visit or be permitted to visit any place of quarantine or isolation station, properties where persons are in quarantine or vacationing in place have separate areas demarcated for such persons. All other unauthorized persons are prohibited from accessing these areas.'

"Hotel security and compliance and quarantine officers are on duty at these locations to enforce the restrictions. We ask for the full cooperation of the public when using these facilities. Remember, the restrictions are in place to protect you and so we ask that you protect yourself by not violating the restrictions and comply with whatever directions the quarantine officers or compliance officers may give you," Superintendent Henry added. He also made a further call to follow protocols.

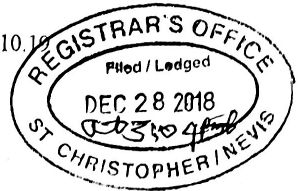

Former Education Minister In Antigua Arrested And Charged

ST JOHN'S, Antigua, CMC (Thursday | November 26, 2020)

Information Minister Melford Nicholson on Thursday announced that Michael Browne, 44, who resigned as Education Minister on Wednesday, has been arrested and charged. Nicholson did not state the nature of the charge.

Following the news of Browne's arrest, Prime Minister Gaston Browne asked the Governor General to rescind the appointment of the former education minister from the Cabinet.

According to the Prime Minister, the Education Ministry has been given to Sports and Festivals Minister, Daryl Matthew, who has already been sworn in.

On Thursday, he was arrested and charged and granted bail in the sum of EC\$15,000 when he appeared in court.

Browne's attorney, Gail Pedro, told the court that her client has no previous arrest and will not be interfering with the victim or witnesses.

The presiding magistrate Ngaio Emanuel-Edward granted the former minister bail, ordered him to surrender his travel documents, and report to the police three times per week.

Kaieteur News – The Good Intent community was thrown into a state of shock yesterday as news spread that a drug addict brutally murdered his mother and left his five-year-old niece battling for her life in the West Demerara Regional Hospital.

Allegedly beaten and stabbed to death by her own son is Jenifer Anderson, 62, popularly as 'Aunty Judith' of Good Intent, West Bank Demerara (WBD).Police, however, believe that more than one persons participated in the heinous crime.

Between her bed and wardrobe.

Prior to the discovery, her severely injured grand-daughter only five, turned up close to 08:00hrs at the home of a relative, heavily traumatized. One of her uncles told Kaieteur News that she was brought to his home by the individual in a bloody state.

He recalled asking her what happened and her response was “Uncle Devon choke meh” and “he choke Granny and beat she up and took her to hospital.”

The uncle rushed out with the little girl and took her to the hospital where he inquired about his mother.

The staffers there told him, he recounted, that she was not a patient there. The man claimed that he left his niece there and went back to her two-storey house. He began searching for his mother but couldn't find her anywhere.

His attention was then grabbed by a pile of clothes, he said, stuffed between her bed and the wardrobe. He remembered removing all the clothes only to find his mother lying in a pool of blood with lacerations to her face.

The police were alerted immediately and arrived at the scene shortly after. News of the gruesome discovery spread through the community and many turned up at her house.

Persons living close by did not recall hearing any screams or noises coming from her house.

In a video seen by this publication her children **(cont'd on page 16)**

and other close relatives broke down in tears as the undertakers removed her body from the house.

According to family members, doctors who examined her body said that she was stabbed with a sharp object at least 72 times.

Doctors also told them that her granddaughter also received several stabs to her abdomen. “It’s a miracle that she survived,” said one of the relatives who spoke with Kaieteur News.

Last evening whilst cleaning up Anderson’s room, family members found a bloodied screw driver on her bed believed to be the murder weapon.

Kaieteur News learnt that the son, Devon Anderson, 31, was captured by police late last evening.

Sources close to the investigation said that it appears that the son did not act alone.

Family members revealed that he was into drugs and would constantly steal from his mother and abuse her.

“He does not live with her, but would still go to her home and cause trouble. He was arrested and locked-up multiple times,” said one relative.

In fact, he had only recently come out of jail- two months ago.

As her friends and family attempt to come to grips with the brutal murder, they recalled an ‘Auntie Judith’ who was kind, friendly and charming.

One of her sons, Mark Anderson, recalls her selling in a stall at the Stabroek Market, just to raise her children as a single parent.

Even now, he said, she sells her “one one” drinks at her house to maintain herself.

“She also has two buses which are down. It was only on Wednesday we spoke. She told me that she wants a mechanic to repair the buses. I didn’t know it was the last conversation with my mother,” said Mark.

During her final days Jenifer Anderson lived alone with her granddaughter. She was described as a doting grandmother.

Amazon to give \$500 million in holiday bonuses to front-line U.S. workers

(Reuters) - Amazon.com Inc said on Thursday it would spend more than \$500 million on one-time bonuses for its front-line employees in the United States who are working the holiday season amid the COVID-19 pandemic.

Full-time operations staff in the United States who are employed by Amazon from Dec. 1 to Dec. 31 will receive a bonus of \$300, while those in part-time roles will get \$150, the online retailer said here in a blog post.

Several retailers, including Walmart Inc and Home Depot Inc, have spent millions in bonuses to compensate staff for catering to a surge in online shopping during the pandemic.

In an earlier round of one-time bonuses in June, Amazon spent \$500 million in one-time payments to front-line employees and partners.

The world’s largest online retailer has been facing intense scrutiny from U.S. lawmakers and unions over whether it is doing enough to protect staff from the coronavirus.

Twitter plans to relaunch verification program next year

(Reuters) - Twitter Inc on Tuesday released plans for its new policy on how people are “verified” on the site, an area the company has long promised to revamp to address confusion and criticisms over the blue check-mark badges it uses to authenticate the identity of prominent accounts.

The social media company said in a blog post here that it plans to relaunch its verification program, including a new public application process, in early 2021. It said a public feedback period for the new policy would open on Tuesday and run until Dec. 8.

Twitter said it paused public submissions for verification in 2017 after hearing feedback that the program “felt arbitrary and confusing to many people.” It said at the time the check mark was being confused with “an endorsement or an indicator of importance.”

A year later, Twitter said it was putting fixes to the verification program on the back burner to focus on issues like election integrity, though it has continued to verify some accounts, such as medical experts tweeting about COVID-19 this year.

“Since then, we haven’t been clear about who can become verified and when, why an account might be unverified, or what it means to be verified,” Twitter said in the Tuesday blog post.

The company laid out more detailed criteria here for the “core types” of notable, active accounts it will verify, such as government officials, companies, nonprofits, news organizations, entertainers, sports teams, athletes and activists.

Twitter said it also may verify accounts that meet other standards such as being one of the top-followed accounts in the user’s country and having “off-Twitter notability,” which could be assessed through Google search trends, Wikipedia references or coverage in news outlets.

The company said it may cut the blue badge from accounts that severely or repeatedly violate rules, such as its policies on hateful conduct, civic integrity or glorification of violence. But it said these removals would not be automatic and would be assessed case by case.

Twitter also released proposed grounds for denying verification, for example, accounts that have been locked out for violating rules in the last six months or accounts of individuals associated with hateful content or who have been found to have committed “gross human rights violations.”

Twitter aims to introduce the final policy on Dec. 17. It also indicated plans for more ways for users to identify themselves with new account types and labels.
