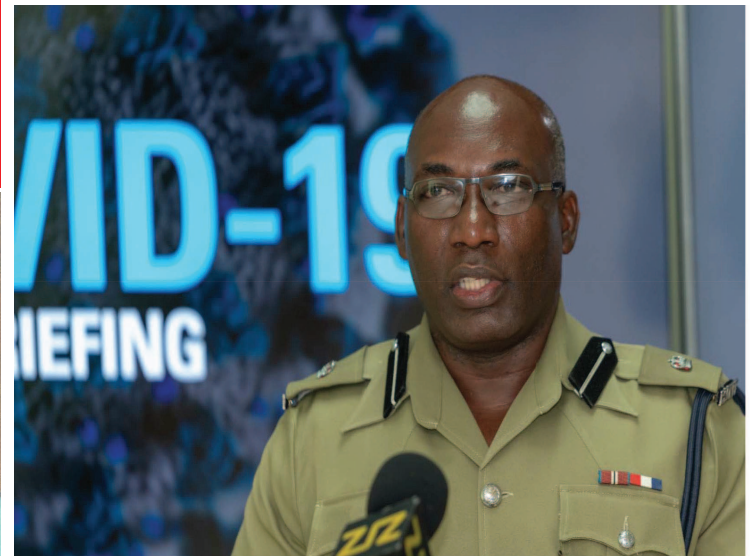

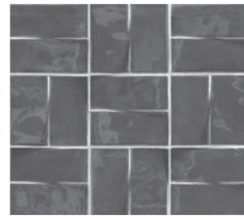

Dr. Terrance Drew Starts CARE Foundation

BASSETERRE, St.Kitts (Tuesday 20th April 2021)-Well-Known community activist and medical practitioner specialized in Internal Medicine Dr. Terrance Drew has officially launched a non-profit charitable organization called the CARE Foundation (Compassionate Action to Reach and Empower) of which he is the founder.

Held under the theme ‘**We are Stronger When We CARE**’, a ceremony was held on Saturday 17th April 2020, at Carambola Beach Club located at the South East Peninsula.

Dr. Drew shared an experience which helped to inspire his commitment to serve having seen an elderly woman trapped in her house near a running ghaut in his childhood community of Upper Monkey Hill, St. Peter’s.

“All of us have stories that we will never ever forget. I can never ever forget that 80-year- old in a little wooden house screaming for help and the ambulance could not pass because the ghaut was running and the bridge was damaged and then some men rushed to the house... getting over the ghaut into that house to get her to the hospital. I thought then that she deserved better and that she deserved. That to a great extent inspired in me my commitment to serve the best I can and to ask others to give of themselves and the best of themselves so that as a community, as a country and as humanity in general that together we can overcome the difficulties that we face and so that story is etched in my soul and you have your own stories that are etched in your souls but I think there’s a common humanity or common stream of stories that connect us all and those stories really pull at us to say always seek to give and to give the best that you can,” he highlighted.

The five (5) main pillars of the organization are: Poverty Alleviation, Disaster Response, Health, Wellness and Nutrition Empowerment & Education and Community Enhancement.

Dr. Drew said when he first conceptualized the establishment of the CARE Foundation, never would he have “imagined or anticipated how quickly and strongly so many of you and what a diverse group of you would have immediately connected and aligned with the vision and expressed your support financially and materially to our cause.”

“This has been a very humbling experience and an incredibly affirming one as well,” he added.

According to Dr. Drew, the launch of the CARE Foundation will mark a defining moment in our national story.

“It will mark the day when a movement spread kindness, love and light throughout our Federation. It will mark the day, when the people of St. Kitts and Nevis, as sampled here in this audience and those watching online, decided that they will not be defeated by all the national challenges but they will be inspired and empowered.”

The other members on the Board of Councilors of the CARE Foundation are Ms. Nerys Dockery (President) Anthony Johnson (Secretary), Mr. Jonathan Bass, Dr. Christine Walwyn, Mr. Dominic Stephens, Ms. Lauretta Evelyn, Ms. Lanein Blanchette, Ms. Mary Clarke and Ms. Kelvina Salters.

The C.A.R.E. Foundation is fully described to be a non-sectarian, non-profit charitable organization that was established on February 22, 2021.

Furthermore, it is said to be a humanitarian organization focused on community outreach across St. Kitts and Nevis to do good and to serve wherever there is a need.

Police Concern Over Normal Partying During COVID-19

BASSETERRE, St. Kitts (Friday 23rd April 2021)-“We continue to see complacency setting in, and persons getting a false sense of health security. We see this happening very frequently at parties, bars and other similar social activities.”

Such was reported by member of the COVID-19 National Task Force Superintendent Cromwell Henry when he spoke at the National Emergency Operations Centre (NEOC) COVID-19 Briefing held on Wednesday 21st April 2021.

He reminded members of the public that COVID-19 “remains a health threat to the Federation.”

In addressing concern over the nature of interactions at social events, he went on to say: “These types of events and their very nature facilitate very easy spread of the virus should someone who is infected be present. Persons in these environments do not wear masks, they do not observe physical distancing, they do not practice good hand hygiene. Instead, they interact dangerously close with other persons who are not from their circle.

“Somehow persons are of the notion that everyone who enters the country are in quarantine so it is ok to socialize

and ignore the protocols. While we do our best to ensure that persons who should be in quarantine are in fact in quarantine, we’ve had instances in the past and some of these instances were well publicized where persons whom we considered high risk found themselves socializing at crowded events,” Cromwell added.

Furthermore, he called on all individuals to do their part in helping to keep the country safe.

“We continue our best to keep the country safe. However, we need you to be responsible by doing your part to help us keep us all safe. All that we are asking is that you follow the basic protocols that are prescribed in the COVID-19 regulations and they have kept us safe thus far. We have asked when in public avoid crowds and crowded events, practice good hand hygiene and maintain physical distance of six feet from others persons.”

Cromwell, encouraged individuals to take the COVID-19 vaccine.

“We are now in the vaccination phase of our journey to full opening or near normalcy. We encourage all to take advantage of this opportunity to be vaccinated and do your part to ensure that we have a safe and prosperous country.”

As of Wednesday 21st April, there were 44 recovered COVID-19 patients and zero in isolation along with 13,526 persons tested for the virus, 7869 released from quarantine, 229 released from quarantine and 3 in pre approved quarantine at home.

CMO: Shelf Life Of Vaccine Is Short

BASSETERRE, St. Kitts (Friday 23rd April 2021)-Chief Medical Officer Dr. Hazel Laws says the current supply of the Oxford/AstraZeneca COVID-19 vaccine available in St.Kitts-Nevis has to be used by June 2021.

She made the disclosure while speaking at the National Emergency Operations Centre (NEOC) COVID-19 Briefing held on Wednesday 21st April 2021.

Dr. Laws informed that to date, the Federation would have received a total of 41,600 doses which is being offered to adults age 18 and over.

“So initially, we received 20,000 and then on April 7th we received an additional 21, 600 doses. Now ladies and gentlemen, the shelf life for these vaccines is quite short and so we have to utilize, we have to use up all these vaccines by the end of June this year. So persons saying ‘ I’m gonna waitâ€™...please note that the shelf life of the vaccines is quite short and they must be utilized before on or before the end of June this year.”

She reminded that St.Kitts-Nevis’ aim is to attain the herd immunity threshold.

“Now the science tells us that this is anywhere between 70 to 90% of our population but in our situation, based on our last census, the adults in St.Kitts comprise of about a little over 70% of our population and so our aim is to vaccinate 70% of our population, the adults in our population and based on the rate at which we are vaccinating, we hope to achieve this goal by about September of this year, and so we are hoping that most of the adults would come onboard in terms of accepting this vaccine.”

According to her, as of that afternoon after the health centres were closed, some 11,848 doses were administered since the vaccine rollout awareness campaign began on Monday 22nd February 2021.

“In other words, we would have covered 35.86 % of the target population with at least the first dose of this vaccine.”

The breakdown, she reported, was 8,935 in St.Kitts and 2,913 doses in Nevis.

The CMO urged individuals to get vaccinated.

“Protect yourself against COVID-19, choose to vaccinate because in so doing you will be protecting yourself as I said before, once you are fully vaccinated you would have an 83% risk reduction in picking up the virus; very, very small risk. So in other words, let’s put it in ordinary terms, if perchance we have clusters



cases of COVID-19 if we go into community transmission and the virus is spreading, once you are fully vaccinated the risk of your contracting disease is very slim and perchance you do, it prevents you from becoming very ill (and) it prevents death.”

“Once you are fully vaccinated, and full vaccination means you would have received the two doses of this vaccine and we are administering the doses 10 weeks apart,” she told.

As understood, this particular vaccine (Oxford/AstraZeneca) is stored in fridge 2C to 8C unto six months

Dr. Laws explained that the World Health Organization (WHO) “advises us that if you administer these two doses, 8 to 12 weeks apart, the individual who is fully vaccinated can enjoy an 83% risk reduction in contracting COVID-19.”

“And please note that this vaccine provides good protection against the SARS COVID 2 variant identified in the United Kingdom and also based on the latest science coming out, this vaccine also provides some protection against the SARS 2 COVID variant identified in South Africa and Brazil,â€™she pointed out.

PM Harris Responds To 43-Page Document About Stopping Vaccination Programme In SKN

BASSETERRE, St. Kitts (Friday 23rd April 2021)- St.Kitts and Nevis' Prime Minister Dr. Timothy Harris has labelled "fake news" a 43-page document circulating via social media addressed to him from the International Tribunal related to an order to "cease and desist" COVID vaccinations, dated 18th March 2021.

A statement published by the government's media outlet SKNIS (St.Kitts Information Services) on Wednesday 21st April 2021 highlighted his response on this matter which the document claimed was an emergency injunction."

Part of the document read: "Pursuant to the Tribunal's final Order of November 29, 2020 and its Universal Jurisdiction under Natural and Common Law, under articles 6 and 7 of the International Criminal Court Statute banning Genocide and Crimes Against Humanity, and under 18 USC 1091."

According to PM Harris: "We have no matter before the ICC neither are we a party to any matter therefore no judgment nor order can be given with regard to St.Kitts-Nevis. The Benavides of the purported ICC document currently in circulation on social media has yet to be confirmed. The office of the Prime Minister is not in receipt of or has officially been made aware of any document related to this matter. Further, the World Health Organisation, the relevant international body which oversees all health-related matters in the UN has approved the use and administering of the AstraZeneca vaccine since April 2021."

He continued: "It must be highlighted that the document in circulation speaks to a judgment or order in November 2020 at a time when no country in the hemisphere was engaged in any COVID-19 vaccination programme. This significantly diminishes the credibility of the purported document. I would encourage all to check and verify before accepting as

facts, these types of information being peddled in this era of fake news."



Dear Sirs,

Re: Challengers Sports and Social Centre

Warmest Federal Greetings to you.

We are Challengers. That is who we are.

In this indomitable spirit we enthusiastically embrace our Government's vision to deepen, widen and strengthen our Domestic and Diaspora Tourism ecosystem.

Concordantly, we cordially invite you to kindly consider cartwheeling our ardent embrace into a graceful dance of mutual delight at the captioned venue.

In this direction our first coordinated steps are:

1). To request that you kindly assist James Buchanan and Associates in drawing an updated cadastral map of Challengers/Stone Fort showing land ownership and use. This map is a priority requirement for expediting our plans to dovetail Government's Rails to Trails Project. That project proposes to re-open trails to our numerous historic, iconic features. This fits our objective to regularise land ownership in Challengers Village proper. And thereby facilitate reopening the paths and alleyways to the numerous overgrown land lots and dilapidated buildings. We endeavour to respond adequately to many owners of these properties who reside in diaspora and desire to invest in the restoration of their properties. There are profound reasons underlying their desire to maintain and strengthen bonds with their roots. Some want to utilize their properties as affordable retirement homes; some, for winter, convalescence, and vacation retreats for their families and friends. And some want simply to peacefully and quietly indulge nostalgic sentiments incidental to seniors and people who are freed from bondage and oppression. Whatever the motivation, we intend to assist our fellow Challengers enjoy their Property and Democratic rights.

It is widely known that Challengers village is iconic due to being the first location on St. Kitts where ex-slaves, emancipated in 1835 were allowed, in 1848, the privilege to own the land that they lived on. This distinction of itself is a powerful tourist attraction. Our goal is to make the village fit for habitation and for Kin and folk tourism.

Another good example of our joint objectives is to reopen the trail to Marcus of the Woods refuge. Marcus of the Woods is the most prominent slave escapee on St. Kitts. His refuge is located in the forested Stone Fort Mountains. Challenger, Mr. Emile Davis has conceptualised and is masterfully fabricating an attractive, inspirational monument to the Caribs, Marcus and all other Resisters of genocide, colonialization, slavery, and every kind of cruelty be it indenture, human trafficking, pauperization, mass incarceration, desecration of family, religion, sacred tradition, rituals and sacraments, mind and body. Mr. Davis anticipates your kind, indispensable cooperation in placing and mounting the monument.

2). Our second priority request to the Federal Government is to assist the employment of a capable,

reputable Challenger to fill the role of Caretaker/Manager of the captioned facility. Her or His main responsibility is the day to day upkeep of the buildings and grounds and to coordinate neighbouring properties and businesses in a symbiotic working relationship that will redound to the best collective interests of all stakeholders.

Also, the Manager will be responsible for coordinating visits to/and events at the Challengers Sports and Social Centre.

3). Our third perhaps most pressing point of our embrace is to persuade the Government to assist resident business Doyling Back-hoe and Trucking in ongoing coastal and river bank revetment; and, excavation of the Net ball/Lawn Tennis court.

The main objectives of these conservation and development earth- works are:

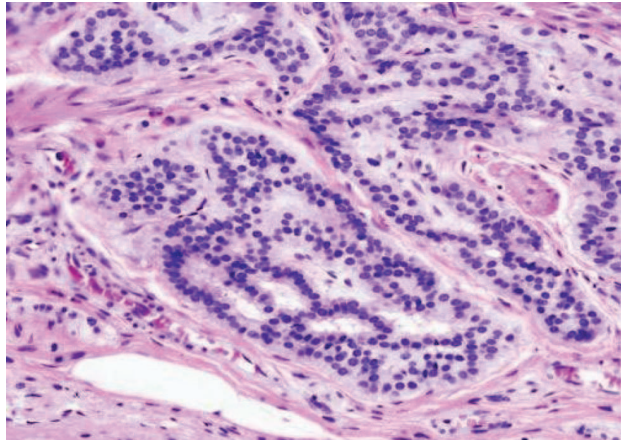

Average-Risk Individuals May Prefer Stool-Based Test Over Colonoscopy For Cancer Screening

When given a choice, most individuals with an average risk of colorectal cancer said they would prefer a stool-based screening test for colorectal cancer over colonoscopy, the method most often recommended by health care providers, according to results published in *Cancer Prevention Research*, a journal of the American Association for Cancer Research.

Although colorectal cancer is the second most frequent cause of cancer-related death in the United States, about one-third of eligible American adults have never completed a colorectal cancer screening test, explained lead author Xuan Zhu, PhD, senior health services analyst at the Mayo Clinic Robert D and Patricia E Kern Center for the Science of Health Care Delivery.

Zhu added that colorectal cancer screening is particularly underutilized by individuals experiencing socioeconomic disadvantages, racial and ethnic minorities, and certain age groups.

The US Preventive Services Task Force (USPSTF) recommends several colorectal cancer screening methods for adults ages 50 to 75 with an average risk for this disease, and the USPSTF draft guideline update released in October 2020 recommends lowering the age of screening initiation to 45.

The three most common tests are:

1. an annual fecal immunochemical test or fecal occult blood test (FIT/-FOBT) that detects blood in the stool;

2. the multitarget stool DNA (mt-sDNA) test (Cologuard), completed every three years, which detects altered DNA from cancer cells, precancerous polyps, or blood in the stool; and

3. a colonoscopy every 10 years, which involves a gastroenterologist examining the colon with a camera and removing any precancerous polyps while a patient is under sedation.

“Previous research has shown that fewer patients complete colorectal cancer screening when only colonoscopy is recommended compared to when stool-based options are also recommended,” said Zhu.

In this study, Zhu and colleagues evaluated patient preferences for colorectal cancer screening through a survey conducted in collaboration with the National Opinion Research Center (NORC) at The University of Chicago.

The survey included short descriptions of FIT/FOBT, mt-sDNA, and colonoscopy, and asked a

nationally representative sample of adults ages 40 to 75 to choose between two options presented at a time. A total of 1,595 respondents completed the survey.

The researchers focused their analysis on a subgroup of 1,062 respondents aged 45 to 75 with an average risk of colorectal cancer.

When presented with a choice, 66 percent of respondents said they preferred mt-sDNA over colonoscopy, and 61 percent said they preferred FIT/FOBT over colonoscopy. When asked to choose between the two stool-based options, 67 percent indicated a preference for mt-sDNA over FIT/FOBT.

The investigators also examined differences in patient preferences across sociodemographic characteristics, access to health care, awareness of colorectal cancer screening, and prior experience completing a test.

While mt-sDNA was preferred over colonoscopy for all age groups examined, a larger proportion of older adults (ages 65 to 75 years) said they preferred colonoscopy compared to those in younger age groups (ages 45 to 54 years).

Similarly, the preference for mt-sDNA over colonoscopy was higher among non-Hispanic white individuals compared with non-Hispanic Black and Hispanic individuals. Half of Hispanic and non-Hispanic Black respondents preferred stool-based tests over colonoscopy, with a preference for mt-sDNA over FIT/FOBT.

Zhu said the observed differences among age and racial/ethnic groups

might have reflected variations in preferences or disparities in access to information about newer testing methods. Respondents without insurance were 2.5 times more likely to prefer less expensive stool-based tests over colonoscopy.

The overall awareness of stool-based tests was about 60 percent, compared to 90 percent for colonoscopy, indicating that there is an opportunity to improve patient education about stool-based options, Zhu

noted.

Study participants who were aware of stool-based tests were two times more likely to prefer mt-sDNA over FIT/FOBT, and those who had previously had a stool-based test were 2.8 times more likely to choose FIT/FOBT over colonoscopy.

By contrast, those who had previously had a colonoscopy were less than half as likely to prefer a stool-based test over colonoscopy and those who had a provider recommend colonoscopy in the past 12 months were 40 percent less likely to prefer mt-sDNA over colonoscopy.

“The best colorectal cancer screening test is the one that patients are most likely to complete,” Zhu said.

The findings highlight the importance of patient education about available screening options and taking

Reigning Mrs World Resigns Weeks After Pageant Controversy

COLOMBO (Reuters) - The reigning Mrs World, Caroline Jurie, has resigned her title, the organisation running the pageant said late on Tuesday, weeks after she was involved in a controversy at the Mrs Sri Lanka event.

Mrs World is a beauty pageant for married women.

Jurie was arrested and released on bail this month after a fracas at the Mrs Sri Lanka pageant in Colombo, where Jurie forcibly removed the winner's crown, claiming the other woman was a divorcee and not qualified to win the title.

"Her voluntary resignation decision was made solely by Caroline herself," Mrs World Inc said late on Tuesday, in a news release on social media.

Jurie was not immediately reachable for comment.

Kate Schneider of Ireland, the runner-up in the 2020 contest which Jurie won, will be the new Mrs World 2020, the organisation said.

The organisation had said that it was a local matter for the country's pageant organisers to review, and that it would have no bearing on the Mrs World 2021 contest that Sri Lanka will host later this year.

Jurie's decision to remove the crown from the the winning Mrs Sri Lanka contestant on stage moments after the winner was announced, because of claims she was a divorcee, drew widespread social media condemnation.

Mrs Sri Lanka, Pushpika De Silva, filed a complaint against Jurie. She complained to police that her head was wounded when the clips of her crown were removed by Jurie. Mrs de Silva was later crowned again.

Jurie was arrested when she visited a police station to record her statement. She later made an appearance before a magistrate and was released on personal bail.

The winner of the Mrs Sri Lanka contest will compete in the Mrs World contest. Jurie won the Mrs Sri Lanka crown in 2019, and went on to win the Mrs World crown in 2020 in Las Vegas.

patients' needs, preferences, and values into account in shared decision-making discussions to increase colorectal cancer screening rates, Zhu added.

"Providing patients with as-needed navigation support, from initiation of screening to completion of a colonoscopy after stool-based tests show abnormal results may increase screening completion and adherence."

Limitations of this study include the observational design, meaning that causal relationships cannot be inferred, the reliance on self-reported data rather than objective measures, and limiting the scope of the study to the three colorectal cancer screening tests most commonly recommended by health care providers.

What's Next For Cuba And The United States After Raul Castro's Retirement

Cuba's Castro dynasty has officially ended.

On 16 April 2021 Raul Castro - younger brother of longtime Cuban leader Fidel Castro - relinquished his position as first secretary of the Communist Party of Cuba, the most powerful position in Cuba.

Castro, 89, became Cuba's president in 2008, after his brother's incapacitation, and took over the first secretary role from Fidel in 2011. Fidel Castro died in 2016.

Just as Fidel's death did not suddenly transform antagonistic US-Cuban ties, neither does Raul Castro's departure.

Cuban President Miguel DÃ-az Canel, who took office in 2018 after Raul Castro stepped down as president, has resisted calls for democratic reforms and has pressing economic issues to manage, as well as a pandemic.

So does his American counterpart, President Joe Biden. The White House recently said Cuba policy is "not a top priority."

Neither leader is likely to risk his political future with bold diplomacy. But younger Cubans continue to separate themselves from the policies and priorities of their government, creating a basis for a different relationship with The US.

No longer a threat

Raul Castro's retirement coincided with the 60th anniversary of Cuba's military triumph over The US at the Bay of Pigs.

On 17 April 1961 Cuban nationals, aided by The CIA, began an invasion designed to overthrow Fidel Castro. The Cuban army quickly defeated them, humiliating the Kennedy administration.

Cuba soon allied itself with the Soviet Union, then America's greatest enemy. The U.S. responded with a rigorous trade embargo.

In the six decades since, US-Cuban relations have alternated between hostile and icy, with a brief thaw under President Barack Obama.

Fidel Castro's Cuba supported leftist insurgencies and Soviet allies across Latin America and the world, from Nicaragua to Angola. In 1962 Castro permitted Soviet missiles to be set up in Cuba and aimed at The US, about 100 miles away, leading The US and The Soviet Union to the brink of nuclear war.

Today Cuba is still communist and it remains on the State Department's list of countries that support terrorism, alongside Iran and North Korea. But, bereft of patrons like the Soviets, it presents no danger to the US mainland or its allies.

Cuba can do little more than irritate US presidents by supporting Latin American leaders who resist American power, like Venezuela's Nicolas Maduro and Bolivia's ousted former leader Evo Morales.

Entrepreneurship, Cuban-style

The Cuban people have changed just as much, according to my two decades of research on and travel to the island.

Unlike their parents and grandparents, Cubans in their 20s, 30s and 40s never enjoyed a sustained, functional contract with the regime: We provide you a living, and in exchange you give us support, or at least acquiescence.

Cubans who came of age during or after the so-called "Special Period" of the 1990s - when Cuba faced economic collapse - rely on the government to deliver certain services, primarily health care and education. But they know it cannot feed, clothe and house its people in any but the most basic way.

Young Cubans have to hustle to survive - or "resolver," a Spanish verb that means "to resolve" but which in Cuba refers to providing for one's family.

And the Cuban hustle has a capitalist bent.

In 2008 Raul Castro's government cut public payrolls and allowed Cubans to earn private incomes, hoping Cubans would earn more money and generate more tax revenue. Previously, all jobs in Cuba were government jobs, whether you were a grocer or an architect, with government-regulated salaries.

Today, official statistics say about a third of Cubans are privately employed. But the real proportion is almost surely higher. Almost all the adult Cubans I know have their own business - whether cutting hair or renting their home as a bed and breakfast - along with a traditional government-regulated job.

Cuban resolve

Meanwhile, the government has begun to eliminate

the subsidies that long defined Cuban life. Ration books for staple foods are disappearing and, with them, subsidized prices.

Food and clothing costs have doubled or tripled in Cuba in the past year. Utility prices have increased by factors of four or five.

Cuban state salaries have risen since economic liberalization, but not that much.

Consequently, many Cubans operate outside of the law, trading in everything from clothing to scrap metal or gasoline stolen from the state. Cubans call people with illegal businesses "bisneros."

Whether legal restaurateur or black-market bisnero, Cubans operate businesses not to become rich but to "resolver." They hope to improve their lots modestly, allowing their families to eat a wider range of fresher foods, or to save for a child's birthday party.

Cuba "forces us to be criminals just to make a living," said 26-year-old Carlo Rodriguez, a server at a Havana restaurant.

Generational divide

Older Cubans remain faithful to the Castros' vision of Cuba as an anti-imperialist, anti-American outpost. But revolutionary slogans like "socialismo o muerte" - "socialism or death" - do not resonate with young Cubans.

Young Cubans also want more free speech. While Cubans can and do complain privately, the Cuban government has long restricted civil liberties. Journalism is mostly state sponsored, and the country's few independent newspapers run into trouble when stories criticize the regime.

Social media only recently became legal and relatively widespread in Cuba.

Last year a dissident artists movement organized via WhatsApp and gained enough popular support to force the government into unprecedented negotiations about expanding freedom of expression in Cuba. A crackdown followed, with some dissidents jailed. But calls for free expression persist among younger Cubans.

Most Cubans also want closer ties to The US, according to a 2015 poll. Since the adoption last year of a single currency pegged to the US dollar, American money is "like gold" on the island, my friend Tony, a shopkeeper, told me.

It is the US embargo and former president Donald Trump's tightened restrictions on travel to the island - not the Cuban government - that prevent Americans from spending their dollars on the island.

Cubans know this, and they resent the embargo for making their lives miserable. But younger Cubans recognize Cuba's ailing centrally planned economy as a problem, too.

Cuban Americans, on the other hand, largely supported Trump. Recent polling showed about 45% support keeping the embargo, up 10 points from two

Biden OKs More Foreign Seasonal Workers As Economy Improves - By Ben Fox

WASHINGTON (AP) - President Joe Biden's administration announced an increase Tuesday in the number of temporary seasonal workers who will be allowed to work in The US this year, as the US economy recovers from the pandemic.

The Department of Homeland Security said The US would approve an additional 22,000 H2-B seasonal, non-agricultural worker visas on top of the annual limit of 66,000 set by Congress. It cited increased demand from employers, with the number of

people seeking jobless benefits at the lowest point since the outbreak of COVID-19.

The H2-B program has bipartisan support in Congress and with businesses across the nation, though immigration opponents portray it as taking jobs from Americans. The visas are used to fill jobs in landscaping, construction, hotels and restaurants, as well as in seafood and meat processing plants and amusement parks.

Employers must show they tried to recruit US workers and then certify that they will suffer "irreparable harm" without a foreign, seasonal worker in order to qualify for the program, DHS said in a statement announcing the supplemental increase.

President Donald Trump last year authorized an additional 35,000 H-2B visas above the annual cap. But then three months later he halted foreign worker programs to preserve US jobs during the pandemic under an executive order. Biden let that order expire.

The US will set aside 6,000 visas for people from the Northern Triangle countries of Central America, where long-standing economic and social problems deteriorated further because of the pandemic and two hurricanes that struck the region.

People from the Northern Triangle countries of Honduras, El Salvador and Guatemala made up nearly half of the migrants apprehended at the US southwest border last month, part of an increase that has turned into an early test for Biden.

DHS Secretary Alejandro Mayorkas said that setting aside visas for Central Americans reflects the administration's goal of "expanding lawful pathways for opportunity in the United States" for people from the Northern Triangle countries.

At The UN on Tuesday, US Ambassador Linda Thomas-Greenfield outlined plans to provide additional humanitarian aid to the region and to work with other nations and the private sector to help modernize the countries. She noted that at least 5 million people in Central America don't have enough food.

"They need security, economic opportunity and access to food to feed their families," Thomas-Greenfield said. "That's what's driving them from their homes. So ultimately, that's what we need to address."

years ago.

Such sentiments make it more difficult for Biden to initiate his own Obama-style "thaw." But they cannot stop the changes at work in Cuban society.

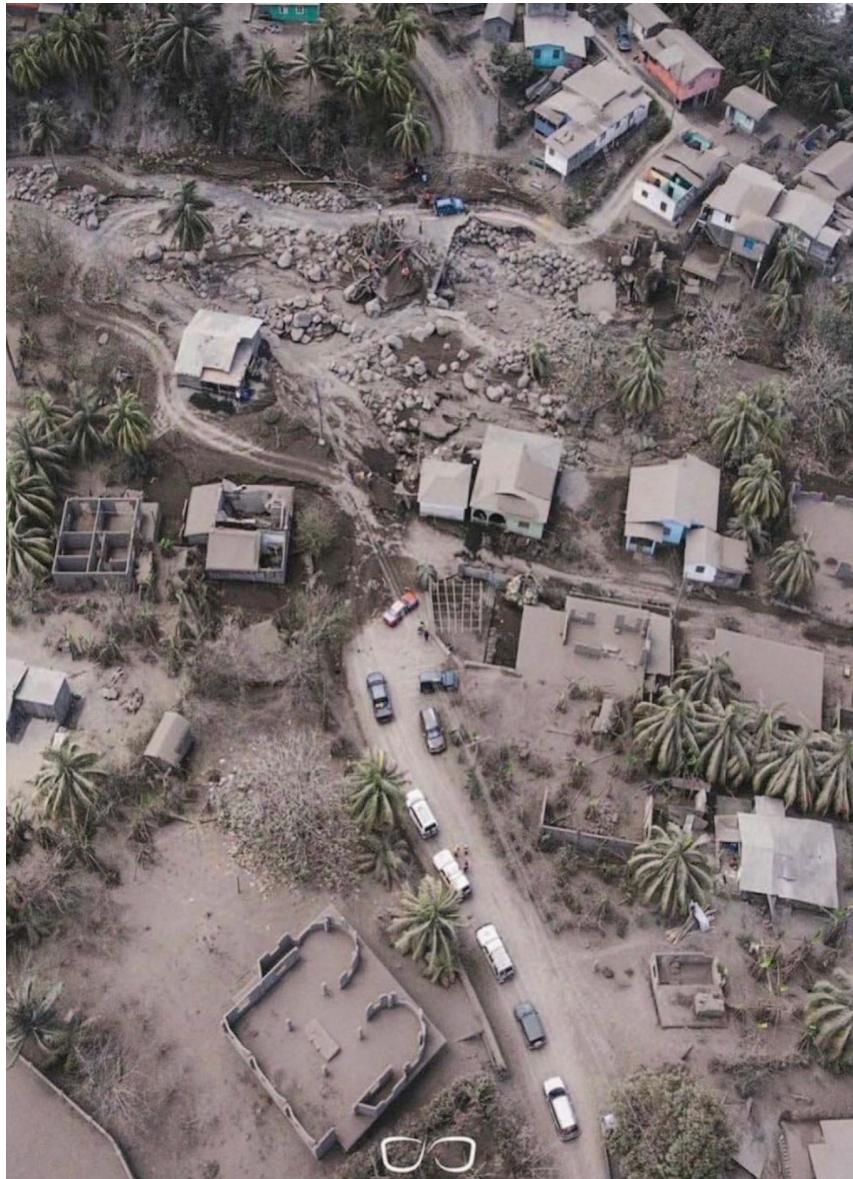

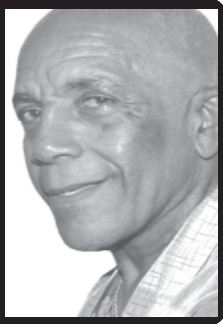

It MUST NEVER be forgotten, over looked, taken lightly or for granted, that, were it not for the kind hearted generosity of Dr. Denzil Llewellyn Douglas, the Leader of the St. Kitts-Nevis Labour Party, who defied the vigorous objections of his Cabinet Colleagues and allowed him as a Government Minister, to continue his studies with FULL Ministerial Pay, and while abroad, pledged to be the care-taker representative of his #7 Constituency, Dr. Timothy Harris would never have realized that Degree. Some times in life, when we try to be the GOOD SAMARITAN to others, we are unaware that we are creating a whip to cut our own backsides and this was exactly the case.

On Dr. Harris’ return to the Federation, he started referring to Dr. Douglas as being too old to Lead the Party, and began

pressuring him as to when he is going to turn over the Leadership to him, a feat which Dr. Douglas could not perform as it is the people’s choice and decision at the Party’s Annual Conference held in May. Despite all the shenanigans taking place, whenever Dr. Douglas and his Deputy Hon. Dr. Douglas observed the Leadership qualities in him and was training him, but Dr. Harris had different motives. He was biting the hand that was feeding him. How ungrateful eh?

PAM saw the AGREEMENT of rescuing it out of the political wilderness where it was withering for nigh 20 years because of its disloyalty to the country and its people.

From its inception (beginning) in 1965, PAM has divided the Working- Class. It has driven many Investors out of the country such as the First Fort Thomas Hotel to be constructed in 1966 by PRINAIR A Puerto Rican Airline which plied between St. Kitts and Puerto Rico. It vehemently and bitterly opposed the introduction of Social Security of 1978, which provided the Working man and woman with sick Payment, Maternity Leave with Pay, Invalidity Payments and a Lifelong Pension after contributing 500 contributions or payments. PAM encouraged Taxi Drivers to BAD TALK the country to visitors and saluted them when they ran any intended investor out of the country. PAM came onstream after the Electricity Generating Plant was moved from Mid Central Street and Lower Prickley Pear Alley to Needsmust Estate where it expanded and offered Electricity to the ordinary man and woman in the country.

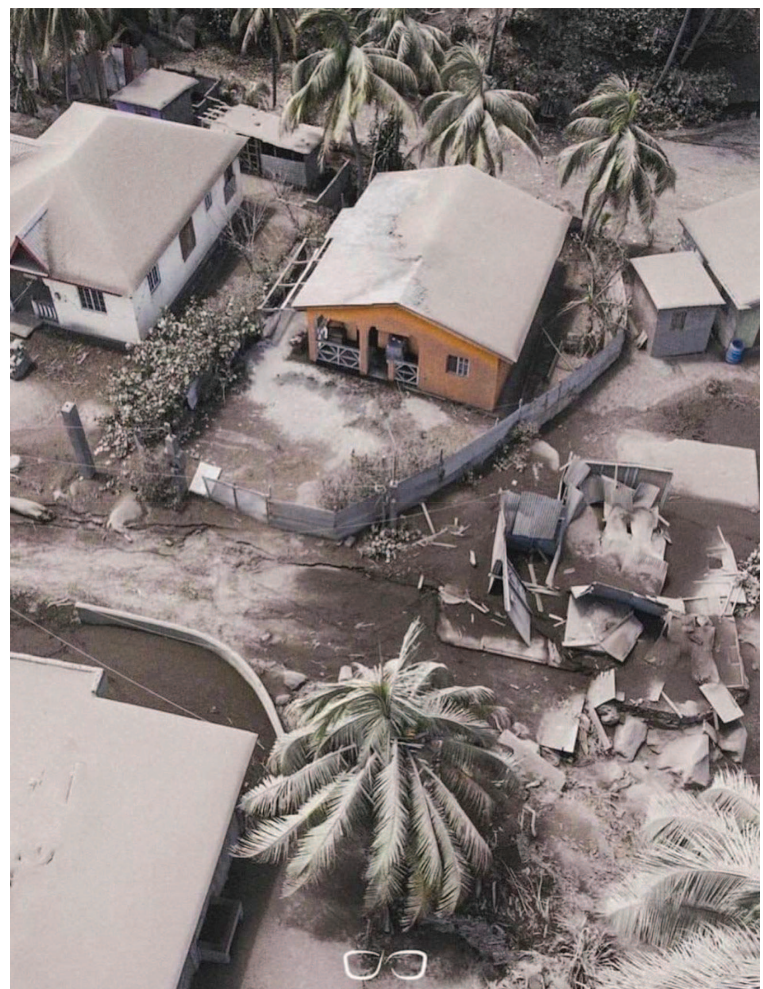
