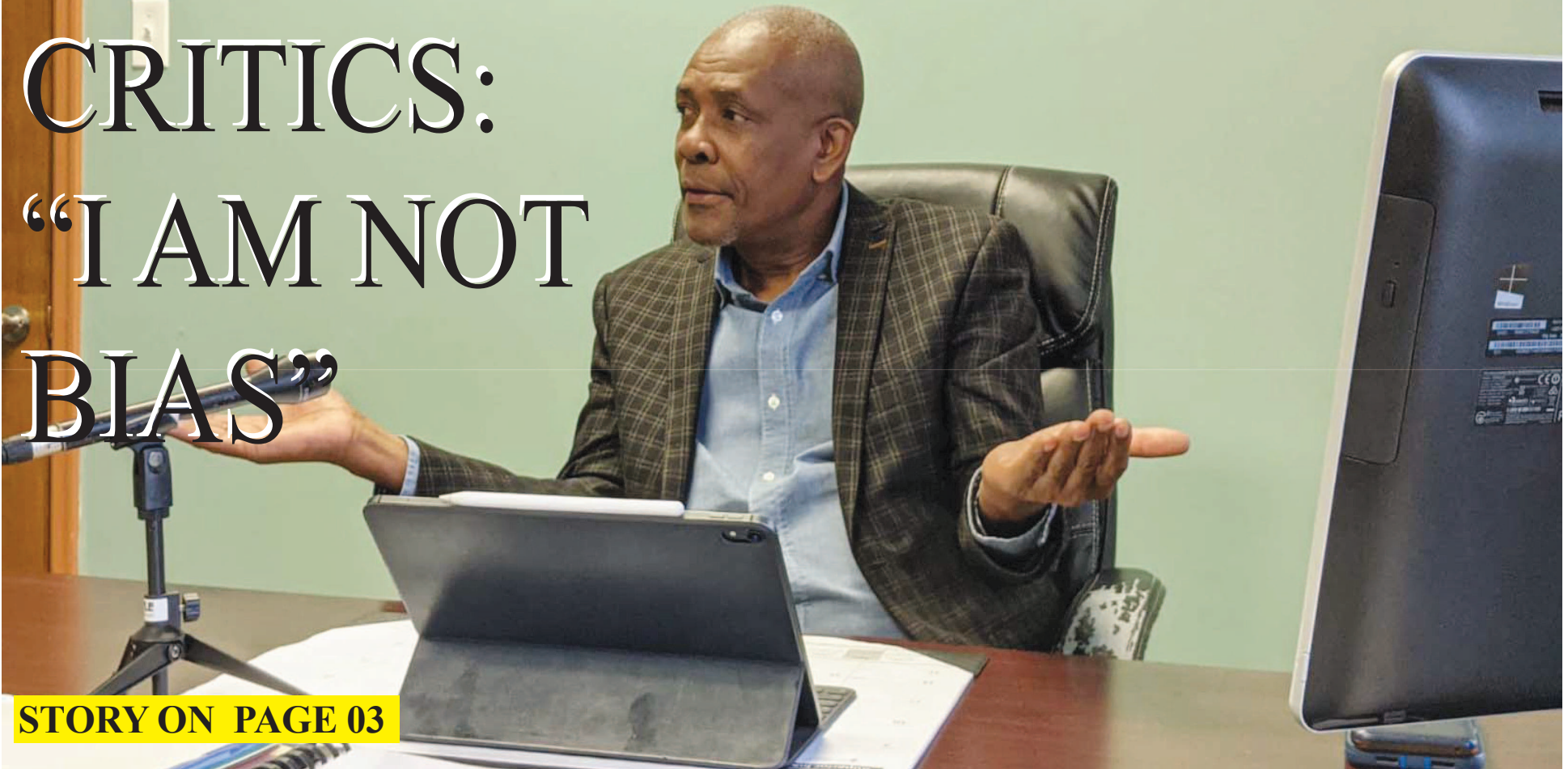

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## Editorial

# Playing Politics With Our People's Health

On Monday of this week, 22 February, our beloved Comrade Leader, Dr The Right Honourable Denzil Douglas, issued an open letter to the public in connection with government's announced start of a COVID-19 vaccination programme for the people of St Kitts and Nevis.

Dr Douglas did so primarily in his capacity as leader of the parliamentary opposition, but also as medical doctor, as a former prime minister, and as someone who has held the CARICOM health portfolio, in which capacity he also performed with great distinction.

Above all else he wrote that letter out of his great love and compassion for people, and, in particular, for the people of St Kitts and Nevis.

He also felt it was important to obtain from the government absolute clarity on a number of issues pertaining to the vaccination programme, especially as he regularly interacts with hundreds of persons who are both fearful and anxious about the safety of vaccination.

With the benefit of his many years of experience, in both the medical and political fields, Dr Douglas is also keenly aware of the critical importance of proper public health education and awareness initiatives that promote understanding and transparency.

He also has considerable experience, as well as a personal passion, for working with persons from all walks of life and just about every sector of our nation.

Thus it was that he attempted to encourage feedback as a major part of his efforts to secure our people's support and acceptance of the government's programme.

As any seasoned and well-intentioned politician or ordinary citizen will tell you, in order to achieve the goal of excellence in prevention, testing, teaching, tracking and a clear rollout vaccination plan, such enlightenment and inclusion is needed to encourage full and willing participation, and that is indispensable for the achievement of wellness, boosting immunity, and to promote prevention as well as reducing the spread of diseases.

In those regards Dr Douglas demanded urgent but reliable answers from the administration, and he did so again and again.

Such information and cooperation was not forthcoming.

Indeed, in his letter Dr Douglas pointed out it has been sometime since last year that efforts have been made to encourage the administration to collaborate with the opposition in the fight against the pandemic. As he pointed out, Prime Minister Harris has flatly refused, when several doctors and he (Dr Douglas) 'shared practical advice on how to use the Public Health Act, instead of a State of Emergency, to balance democratic rights and public health protocols for positive results'.

Parliament met on Thursday of last week, 18 February. The Leader of The Opposition sought to call on the government to



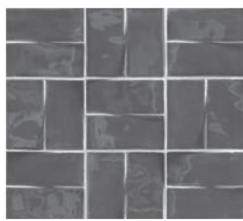
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provide a clear Vaccination Rollout Plan to be shared with our citizens. As is customary with the incumbent regime, Dr Douglas was interrupted and prevented from doing so.

Time and again we of this newspaper have pointed out that the administration uses parliament as if it is merely a rubber stamp for the wishes of the executive. That is not what parliament is about, and the sooner our people take stock of this matter and begin to put some heat on the government, the better it will be for all of us.

Our Comrade Leader has also raised a number of questions concerning other aspects of this matter: were certain other health professionals in the exercise (medical association, nurses, front-line workers, etc) informed and included; about the original source of the vaccines; about supporting scientific data (bearing in mind the many associated risks and adverse reactions related to age and pre-existing medical conditions); and clarification on the storage of the vaccines while the storage facilities were being prepared; among many others.

He also raised a number of questions related to the finances attendant upon the acquisition of the vaccine.

Again, answers to those questions were not forthcoming.

As Dr Douglas has pointed out, he requested that kind of information on behalf of thousands of residents and citizens.

The government was clearly failing to inform the public of its plans, assuming they had anything worthy of such a definition in the first place.

That is a very serious matter, for, in circumstances such as those prevailing, people need to be fully informed as they have to devise all kinds of innovative ways to preserving lives and livelihoods.

The Prime Minister seems to have a heightened preference for operating in secret. As Dr Douglas has pointed out, time and again, the prime minister withholds vital and critical information, and constantly fails to function like a

caring leader, and who is 'ultimately committed to the wellbeing of all'.

In light of those considerations, and others, Dr Douglas refused to participate in the 'show biz' roll out (so-called) 'photo gallery parade' of the vaccine, indicating that he would never participate without knowing if the entire population would be vaccinated, and how soon. "As an MP and Leader of the Parliamentary Opposition, my conscience would not permit me to secure myself at the expense of my people."

He has made it clear that, while he supports vaccination as a public health good, he rejects the politics of divisiveness that Prime Minister Harris is promoting, especially during these emotionally tough and economically difficult times. Dr Douglas re-asserted that he believes strongly in vaccine equity, but he wants to make sure that 'the poor and the rich alike, old and young, the sick and the healthy have equal access to the best vaccines affordable to us'.

Our Comrade Leader further pointed out that, instead of providing the population with helpful answers, Dr Harris and followers have acted in bad faith. He insists that:

"Any government vaccination program must be fair and balanced. Dr Harris should know that information about the vaccination type and process must be honest, straightforward and scientifically sound!

"This is not just good public health practice - it is the right and just approach to good governance. I will continue to encourage our people to adhere to all the healthcare protocols needed to stay safe, wise and positive. Rest assured that we shall defeat this pandemic with our peace of mind intact, and our faith strengthened and renewed. We strongly support vaccination but resist the divisive attitude and defects in the Harris Administration Vaccination Rollout Plan."

We of this newspaper call on the government to stop playing politics with our people's health.



# DPP Meets Media To Address Party Politics Criticism Concerning Drew Vs Hamilton Court Case

**BASSETTERRE, St.Kitts (Friday 26th February 2021)-** "I do not make decisions based on political wishes or political pulls."

So said Director of Public Prosecution (DPP) Valston Graham, when he appeared before members of the media for a press session held on Thursday, 25th February 2021, at his law chambers located at South Independence Square in Basseterre.

He sought to "bring clarity and a bit more information" behind his recent stepping in a court matter involving a private criminal complaint brought against elected government minister Eugene Hamilton of the People's Action Movement (PAM) by Dr. Terrance Drew of the St. Kitts-Nevis Labour Party (SKNLP) concerning allegations of bribery in the lead up to the June 2020 General Elections.

Pointing to the constitution of St. Christopher and Nevis, the DPP talked about being the custodian and guardian of control of criminal prosecution indicating "I consider it to be inconceivable, absolutely nonsensical that the Director of Public Prosecution must sit back and allow a prosecution that alleges bribery against an elected official to just be pursued in a private capacity."

"So the purpose of me calling you today is simply to dispel any suggestions whatsoever that my taking over the matter has anything to do with being a political ally of PAM, Shawn Richards or Eugene Hamilton. PAM is a political Party of which I am not a member. Is Shawn Richards my friend? Yes. Eugene Hamilton is

not my friend... I don't know him... except for him being a member of National Assembly. There are persons out there who read Facebook, who listen to the news, read you guys' articles or listen to your broadcasts who are not really seized with the facts. I have not done nothing that the Constitution doesn't empower me to do," DPP Graham told the media.

Both Dr. Drew and Hamilton competed for the Constituency Eight seat in the elections.

"In November of last year, Dr. Drew brought a private criminal complaint against Mr. Hamilton...two as a matter of fact, charging him with bribery; they are criminal prosecutions. Those matters have only came to my attention last week and they were scheduled and brought before the court on Monday of this week. Those matters having come to my attention...Section

65 of the Constitution of the Federation of St. Christopher and Nevis places me as the custodian and guardian of control of criminal prosecution in this Federation," DPP Abraham commented.

He said that section of the Constitution subsection 2 (B) says "that I can take over any prosecution instituted by any authority and subsection C says I can continue the prosecution or I can discontinue a prosecution."

According to the DPP: "Having heard of the matter with Dr. Drew and Mr. Hamilton, I asked the court to stand the matter down so that I can be ready and come to make an appearance."

Mr. Delano Bart Queen's Counsel appeared for Dr. Drew and for Hamilton, Natasha Grey.

"I have not made any decision where the matter is concerned contrary to what some people believe. What I've simply said to the court is that I have asked that Mr. Bart on behalf of Dr. Drew, to provide me with disclosure of the evidence that he has to substantiate the allegations and charges of bribery. My intention is, once I'm provided with that evidence is to analyze it. If it

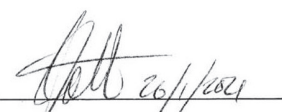

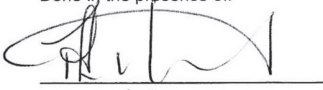

makes out a case that says Mr. Hamilton has bribed somebody, I have no difficulty in prosecuting it. I have had no difficulty in prosecuting persons regardless of their political affiliation or not prosecuting persons because of their political affiliation," DPP Graham stated.

Furthermore, he noted that subsection 65, 2 (c) "that says I can continue or discontinue has not yet arrived. I would await the disclosure. Once I am in receipt of that disclosure, I would examine it like I do in all criminal matters and then I would make a determination as to the future of the matter."

"I am not no political pundit. In fact I don't like politics, period. Do I have political friends on both sides of the aisle I do; like we all do. I do not make decisions based on political wishes or political pulls," he added.

DPP Graham, in speaking to instances of his fairness in the office he holds, made mention of the matters relating to Leader of the SKNLP Opposition and former Prime Minister Dr. Denzil Douglas in the diplomatic passport case as well as the recently discontinued firearm license renewal issue involving SKNLP candidate Leon Natta- Nelson.

"Now I'm not seeing the clam of Facebook pundits who are going around and saying I am Labour because I am not Labour neither am I PAM nor Unity. I am simply a public servant doing the best that he can do. It's as simple as that," he noted.

The DPP stated: "The future of the matter rests in the hands of Dr. Drew and his attorney. I have asked that they provide me with the evidence that they have. Once they provide me with that evidence, I would assess and I would make a determination as to whether or not that particular prosecution goes forward or whether or not the evidence reveals there's a greater need for me to ask the Commissioner of Police to make a more widespread investigation into any allegation of bribery (concerning) the 2020 elections and I have no difficulty in doing that..."

As understood, the magistrate has put the matter to Monday 1st March 2021.

**WHY I SUPPORT VACCINATION**

As a medical doctor, and indeed a former Prime Minister who provided political leadership of the PANCAP (Pan Caribbean Partnership) managing the HIV/AIDS pandemic in the region, I am deeply committed to effective public health policies and practices. I also know the critical importance of proper public health education and awareness initiatives that promote understanding and transparency, and encourage feedback to secure our people's support to accept the government program. Of equal priority, I have a passion for working with different stakeholders - NGOs, private sector, faith-based and community organizations, and Opposition Parties, to achieve the goal of excellence in prevention, testing, teaching, tracking and a clear Rollout Vaccination Plan. This is needed to encourage wellness, to boost immunity; to promote prevention and to reduce the spread of diseases.

Since last year, we have encouraged the Harris Administration to collaborate with the Opposition in the fight against Covid-19. Prime Minister Harris has flatly refused when several doctors and I shared practical advice on how to use the Public Health Act, instead of a State of Emergency, to balance democratic rights and public health protocols for positive results.

Just last week Thursday, the 18th of February, during the meeting of the National Assembly of our Parliament, while calling on the government to provide a clear Vaccination Rollout Plan to be shared with our citizens, I was rudely interrupted and prevented from doing so. Clearly the government was failing miserably to communicate its plan to the general public. On such a vital matter, where people must find creative solutions between preserving their lives and maintaining their livelihoods, Prime Minister Harris prefers to operate a secret society. He withholds critical information rather than functioning like a caring leader who is ultimately committed to the wellbeing of all.

Not only did I invite the government to disclose its Vaccination Rollout Plan, I sought clarification on the storage of the vaccines while the storage facilities were being prepared as reported by the Prime Minister. Clarification on the efficacy of the Oxford AstraZenica Vaccine that the government had secured was also sought. Further, I requested information on behalf of thousands of residents and citizens, about the original source of the vaccines. It was absolutely necessary to have supporting scientific data, based on the many associated risks and adverse reactions related to age and pre-existing medical conditions.

The country still wants to know if this was the same vaccine type for which Prime Minister Harris "made a down payment of US\$800,000 taken from the Treasury of SKN" in December 2020. Also, a number of questions are being asked - Were the Medical Association, the St Kitts and Nevis Nurses Associations, other Frontline workers in the Covid-19 fight, the Workers Unions, etc invited?

It is important to get clarity on these issues because I am interacting with hundreds of people who are fearful and anxious about the safety of vaccination, and demand urgent but reliable answers.

Instead of providing the population with helpful answers, Dr Harris and his cronies acted in bad faith. They openly refused to cooperate. Up to late Saturday evening, I did not receive credible answers and clarification on the important information I was seeking.

In light of these circumstances, I refused to take the vaccine yesterday during the photo gallery parade, without knowing whether the entire population would be vaccinated and how soon. As an MP and Leader of the Parliamentary Opposition, my conscience would not permit me to secure myself at the expense of my people.

While I support vaccination as a public health good, I reject the politics of divisiveness that Prime Minister Harris is promoting, especially during these emotionally tough and economically difficult times.

I believe strongly in vaccine equity, and I want to make sure that the poor and the rich alike, old and young, the sick and the healthy have equal access to the best vaccines affordable to us.

Any government vaccination program must be fair and balanced. Dr Harris should know that information about the vaccination type and process must be honest, straightforward and scientifically sound!

This is not just good public health practice - it is the right and just approach to good governance. # High Risk Groups In SKN Encouraged To Book COVID-19 Vaccination Appointment

**BASSETTERRE, St.Kitts (Friday 26th February 2021)**-Chief Medical Officer Dr. Hazel Laws is encouraging individuals who fall in the high risk priority groups that comprise Stage One of the vaccination to make an appointment to get their health care jab.

She made the disclosure on at the launch of St.Kitts-Nevis' National COVID-19 Vaccination Rollout held on Monday 22nd February 2021 at the Newtown Health Centre in St.Kitts with the Oxford/AstraZeneca vaccine donated from the government of Dominica having supplied 2,000 doses for adults 18 to 80 years old.

"We will be using an appointment system, and so interested individuals who are in the groups that I would have just described, you are asked to go to the nearest health centre to make an appointment or if you care too, you can call 311 and you will be give an appointment between 24 to 48 hours of your making that call," Dr. Laws said.

She continued: "We want every citizen and resident who is eligible to receive the vaccine to take the vaccine. By taking the vaccine, you are not only protecting yourself but those around you and those who are too young and too frail to take the vaccine themselves. Vaccinating our people is crucial to curbing the spread of COVID-19 infections. The end of the pandemic is dependent on rapid vaccination. #GetTheFacts #GetTheVax #GetTheOxfordAstrazenecaCOVID19Vaccine."

Dr. Laws, in speaking about how the programme will be conducted stated: "We will be starting with a phased approach this afternoon in terms of the roll out of our COVID-19 vaccination programme."

"The goals of our programme are 1. To decrease the death and serious disease 2. Preserve function in society and 3. Reduce the extra burden COVID-19 is having on our people who are already facing disparities," She remarked.

As told Group 1 (A) comprises of healthcare workers who are at high or very high risk of exposure to the virus including all specialists and internists,

doctors and nurses on the COVID-19 ward, those working in the operating theatre, those working Intensive Care Unit, those working in Accident and Emergency and those personnel who go out daily to take COVID-19 samples ( the COVID-19 testers), the health centre nurse managers and personnel working on ambulances and all those physicians working in private health practice because they are also on the front line.

(B)- border protection staff along the corridor of containment including port health workers, immigration, customs, front line workers including those in ground transportation-taxis drivers and the front line workers in the hotel industry.

(C) Executive arm of government and essential workers outside of the health sector including the police, the defense force, coast guard as well as fire and rescue.

"and then we have to target the older adults who are at extremely high risk of severe COVID disease who include older adults with two or more chronic conditions such as diabetes, respiratory conditions like emphysema and asthma,

renal disease, autoimmune... conditions," the CMO added.

She informed that "persons who are over 80 can still receive this vaccine. However we are recommending that they go to their regular practitioner or physician and be evaluated to determine their suitability for receiving this vaccine."

"We are also advised by the Pan American Organization to always keep a stock of vaccines just in case we have an outbreak," Dr. Laws

noted.

It is understood that over 50 individuals were vaccinated that day and they are expected to get a second shot in 10 weeks.

The first to receive the vaccine in St.Kitts-Nevis was Chief of Staff at the Joseph N. France General Hospital and member of the National COVID-19 Task Force Dr. Cameron Wilkinson.

Government Ministers including Prime Minister Dr. Timothy Harris, Health Minister Akilah Byron-Nisbett and Attorney General took their jabs.

Vaccination was expected to continue during the course of the week at the Newtown Health Centre, Basseterre Health Centre, Sandy Point Health Centre and the Tabernacle Health Centre in St.Kitts.

In Nevis- Charlestown Health Centre, Gingerland Health Centre and the Combermere Health Centre.

# SKNT&LU Attends NEOC Stakeholders Meeting ...CMO Shares Info On Post Vaccination

**BASSETERRE, St.Kitts (Friday 26th February 2021)**- Workers' organization The St.Kitts-Nevis Trades & Labour Union (SKNT&LU) was among other representative groups and associations invited to attend a Stakeholders Meeting organized by the National Emergency Operations Centre (NEOC) which was held at the Ross University Auditorium located in West Farm, St.Kitts.

Chief Medical Officer Dr. Hazel Laws gave an update on the symptoms being experienced locally concerning about seventy (70) persons who took the COVID-19 vaccine at the launch of the programme the day before (Tuesday) at the Newtown Health Centre.

"When I woke up this morning I started making calls to persons who would have received the same. Quite a bit of persons said 'I'm fine. Did you really give me something yesterday?'"

Dr. Laws continued: "Others complained of tenderness or pain at the injection site, some said they felt cold last night. I think about two or three persons complained of experiencing chills. About four or five said 'Hey, I had a bad fever but I took two paracetamol tablets and I was fine'. Some complained of a little feeling of fatigue or malaise this morning, some said 'I just have some body aches and pains. One particular person said I'm experiencing mild headaches and I think most or all of the persons who were vaccinated yesterday, they all came out or went to work this morning. So that just gives you an overview of the post vaccination symptoms being experienced by our own people who were vaccinated yesterday."

The CMO is advising all to continue the non-pharmaceutical measures in helping to control the spread of the virus.

"We must continue our

prevention measures of wearing our face masks, maintaining hand hygiene and making sure we are as we are approximately distanced from each other when in an enclosed space and avoiding crowds as much as we possibly can. Ladies and gentlemen, we must

continue these measures until we would have achieved herd immunity threshold."

Dr. Laws informed that in St.Kitts-Nevis, forty (40) cases have recovered noting that there is only one active case, and that the individual remains in isolation and is stable.



Notably, no COVID-19 related deaths have been recorded in the Federation.

The event was held under the theme: **SAFEGUARDING ST. KITTS**

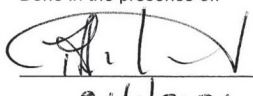

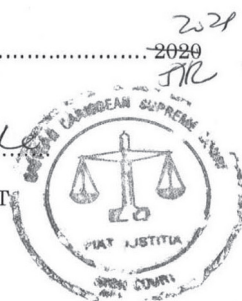

project on safeguarding ICH, St.Kitts and Nevis I think is doing quite well in the English speaking Caribbean to receive funding from the UNESCO ICH Fund and we very proud of that..." she highlighted.

Phillips went on to say: "It's been a real wonderful experience because in our culture, we would recognize that we have been safeguarding for years with the inception of the Department of Culture, we as a Caribbean people, we have been keeping our traditions alive through oral history, through performance, through dance, through the art forms, through the food that we eat; all these are intangible culture heritage. Traditions in the cultures that we keep alive, and when I say we, it's people in the community who keep it alive. It's not St.Kitts Department of Culture or Nevis (Cultural) foundation, we assist and give support to the people in the community to keep it going..."

"That's what basically ICH is, it's the intangible part...we always see built heritage sites but we don't really think about the intangible part of our culture; we take it for but it's the food that we eat every day, it's the food that our parents prepared for us from the culture in the island that we grew up in so we're pleased



with this project to build capacity to continue safeguarding it and over the two years, we have learnt about ICH and we've brought an awareness about, we've tried to share with the public through

various seminars that we've had..."

Phillip talked about the work put in saying: "We've been trying to build capacity... by training people in the community to help us do the documentation process. We've been able through the projects to train people in the community how to conduct interviews, how to do oral documentation with audio recorders to using a digital or video camera to document, and that's actually the first step because what we've found a lot of our traditional holders tend to be mature in age and if we don't recognize this sometimes we miss that opportunity to talk to them to learn about our own history and culture before they pass away so what is critical for us is to meet these individuals who are keeping history and heritage alive, to document it and from there have a conversation with people in the community about how do you want to safeguard it and how do you want to protect it and why is that important-it's who we are. It's a part of our identity."

Additionally, she outlined the importance of keeping history and heritage alive.

"...we need to be able to transfer this knowledge to the next generation whether you transfer it to your children or teachers educate children that come to school or our young adults we get them involved in it so that they feel a part of it. Sometimes, teenagers sometimes grow away from our traditions and there is a lot of outside influences so this is why it is important and when document the intangible cultural heritage it's preserved and it's there for anyone else who wants to come after that tradition bearer has passed on and revive it or for the next generation to learn...for example what are the steps that The Actors did, or the Mocko-jumbie or the Masquerade or how is it the National Dish is made. How are they going to learn unless we leave something behind for them to research, for them to see?"

# Chipmakers In Drought-hit Taiwan Order Water Trucks To Prepare For 'The Worst'

TAIPEI (Reuters) - Taiwan chipmakers are buying water by the truckload for some of their foundries as the island widens restrictions on water supply amid a drought that could exacerbate a chip supply crunch for the global auto industry.

Some auto makers have already been forced to trim production, and Taiwan had received requests for help to bridge the shortage of auto chips from countries including the United States and Germany.

Taiwan, a key hub in the global technology supply chain for giants such as Apple Inc, will begin on Thursday to further reduce water supply for factories in central and southern cities where major science parks are located.

Water levels in several reservoirs in the island's central and southern region stand at below 20%, following months of scant rainfall and a rare typhoon-free summer.

"We have planned for the worst," Taiwan Economy Minister Wang Mei-hua told reporters on Tuesday. "We hope companies can reduce water usage by 7% to 11%."

With limited rainfall forecast for the months ahead, Taiwan Water Corporation this week said the island has entered the "toughest moment".

Taiwan Semiconductor Manufacturing Co Ltd (TSMC), the world's largest contract chipmaker, this week started ordering small amounts of water by the truckload to supply some of its facilities across the island.

"We are making preparations for our future water demand," TSMC told Reuters, describing the move as a "pressure test". The chip giant said it has seen no impact on production. Both Vanguard International Semiconductor Corporation and United Microelectronics Corp signed contracts with water trucks and said there was no impact on production.

Vanguard said it has started

a drill to truck water to its facilities in the northern city of Hsinchu. Taiwanese technology companies have long complained about a chronic water shortage, which became more acute after factories expanded production following a Sino-US trade war.

# Diet High In Poor Quality Carbohydrates Increases Heart Disease And Death



A global study of people living on five continents has found a diet high in poor quality carbohydrates leads to a higher risk of heart attacks, strokes, and death.

The higher risks of a diet high in poor quality carbohydrates, called a high glycemic diet, were similar whether people had previous cardiovascular disease or not.

The study, published in the New England Journal of Medicine today (24 February 2021), is the largest of a geographically and dietary diverse population on this issue, as previous studies have chiefly focused on high income Western countries.

A total of 137,851 people aged 35 to 70 years old were followed for a median of 9.5 years through the

Population Urban and Rural Epidemiology (PURE) study run by the Population Health Research Institute (PHRI) of McMaster University and Hamilton Health Sciences.

The research team used food questionnaires to measure long term dietary intake of participants and estimate the glycemic index (the ranking of food based on their effect on blood-sugar levels) and glycemic load (the amount of carbohydrates in a food times its glycemic index) of diets. There were 8,780 deaths and 8,252 major cardiovascular events recorded among the participants during the

follow-up period.

The investigators categorized dietary intake of carbohydrates depending on whether specific types of carbohydrates increased blood sugars more than others (high glycemic index) and compared this index to the occurrence of cardiovascular disease or death.

Those people consuming a diet in the highest 20 percent of glycemic index were 50 percent more likely to have a cardiovascular attack, stroke, or death if they had a pre-existing heart condition, or 20 percent more likely to have an event if they did not have a pre-existing condition.

These risks were also higher among those people who were obese.

"I have been studying the impact of high glycemic diets for many decades, and this study ratifies that the consumption of high amounts of poor quality carbohydrates is an issue worldwide," said first author David Jenkins, professor of nutritional sciences and medicine at the University of Toronto's Temerty Faculty of Medicine, who is also a scientist in the Li Ka Shing Knowledge Institute of St Michael's Hospital, Unity Health Toronto.

"PURE study papers have already indicated that not all carbohydrates foods are the same. Diets high in poor quality carbohydrates are associated with reduced longevity, while diets rich in high quality carbohydrates such as fruit, vegetables and legumes have beneficial effects," he said.

PHRI research investigator Mahshid Dehghan added: "This study also makes it clear that among a diverse population, a diet low in both its glycemic index and load has a lower risk of cardiovascular disease and death."

Most fruits, vegetables, beans, and intact whole grains have a low glycemic index, while white bread, rice, and potatoes have a high glycemic index.

"The present data, along with prior publications from the PURE and several other studies, emphasize that consumption of poor quality of carbohydrates are likely to be more adverse than the consumption of most fats in the diet," said Salim Yusuf, senior author of the study.

"This calls for a fundamental shift in our thinking of what types of diet are likely to be harmful and what types neutral or beneficial."

Yusuf is also the principal investigator of the PURE study, executive director of the PHRI, and a professor of medicine at McMaster.

# What Are The Origins Of Lent?

In late winter, many Christian denominations observe a 40-day period of fasting and prayer called Lent. This is in preparation for the spring celebration of Easter, a religious holiday commemorating the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead.

The word "Lent" has Germanic roots referring to the "lengthening" of days, or springtime. But facts about the early origin of the religious observance are not as well known.

As a scholar who studies Christian liturgy, I know that by the fourth century, a regular practice of 40-day fasting became common in Christian churches.

## Early Christianity

The practice of fasting from food for spiritual reasons is found in the three largest Abrahamic faiths: Judaism, Christianity and Islam. In all three, refraining from eating is intimately connected with an additional focus on prayer, and the practice of assisting the poor by giving alms or donating food.

In the Gospels, Jesus spends 40 days in the wilderness to fast and pray. This event was one of the factors that inspired the final length of Lent.

Early Christian practices in the Roman Empire varied from area to area. A common practice was weekly fasting on Wednesday and Friday until mid-afternoon. In addition, candidates for baptism, as well as the clergy, would fast before the rite, which often took place at Easter.

During the fourth century, various Christian communities observed a longer fast of 40 days before the beginning of the

three holiest days of the liturgical year: Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Easter.

## Spiritual renewal

As Christianity spread through Western Europe from the fifth through 12th centuries, the observance of Lent did as well. A few Lenten days were "black," or total, fast days. But daily fasting came gradually to be moderated during most of Lent. By the end of the Middle Ages a meal was often permitted at noon.

Also, bishops and theologians specializing in church law specified restrictions on the kinds of acceptable food: no meat or meat products, dairy or eggs could be consumed at all during Lent, even on Sundays.

The idea was to avoid self-indulgence at this time of repentance for one's sins. Marriage, a joyous ritual, was also prohibited during the Lenten season.

Today, Catholics and some other Christians still abstain from eating meat on the Fridays of Lent, and eat only one meal, with two smaller snacks permitted, on two days of complete fasting. In addition, they also engage in the practice of "giving up something" during Lent. Often this is a favorite food or drink, or another pleasurable activity, like smoking or watching television.

Other activities are also suggested, in keeping with the idea of Lent as a time for spiritual renewal as well as self-discipline. These include making amends with estranged family and friends, reading of the Bible or other spiritual writers, and community service.

Though some practices may have changed, Lent in the 21st century remains essentially the same as in centuries past: a time of quiet reflection and spiritual discipline.

# India v England: Hosts win astonishing third Test in two days

**England succumbed to a 10-wicket defeat against India inside two days of an astonishing third Test in Ahmedabad.**

On a scarcely believable day when both sides collapsed and 17 wickets fell in two sessions, India completed the quickest Test win since 1935 not long into the final session.

England began the day with a thrilling fightback, turning India's overnight 99-3 into 145 all out.

But, faced with a first-innings deficit of 33, England were bowled out for 81 as India's spinners ran riot once again.

In a frenzied start to their second innings, England lost Zak Crawley and Jonny Bairstow within three balls - both bowled by Axar Patel.

Ben Stokes and Joe Root briefly calmed the raucous atmosphere but their dismissals in consecutive overs sparked a sorry procession to England's lowest Test total in India.

Spinners were responsible for every wicket to fall on the day - and 28 of the 30 in the match - Joe Root taking 5-8 in the first session, Axar 5-32 and Ravichandran Ashwin 4-48, including his 400th Test scalp.

India cruised to their target of 49 inside eight overs, an incredible game wrapped up before the

floodlit conditions of a day-night Test could have an impact.

Victory gave India, who lost the first Test, an unassailable 2-1 lead in the series with one match to play and ended England's hopes of qualifying for the World Test Championship final this summer.

If the first day of this Test was remarkable - England bowled out for 112 despite winning the toss - the second was one of the most incredible in recent memory.

Neither side got to grips with a turning pitch, at least not until India's chase when England were demoralised after their second collapse of the game.

The 17 wickets fell in 53 overs for the loss of 127 runs, the match over with almost 30 overs remaining on the second day.

The fact Root, a part-time off-spinner, claimed such extraordinary figures showed the difficulties faced by batsmen. The spinners found extravagant turn but wickets often fell to deliveries that skidded on.

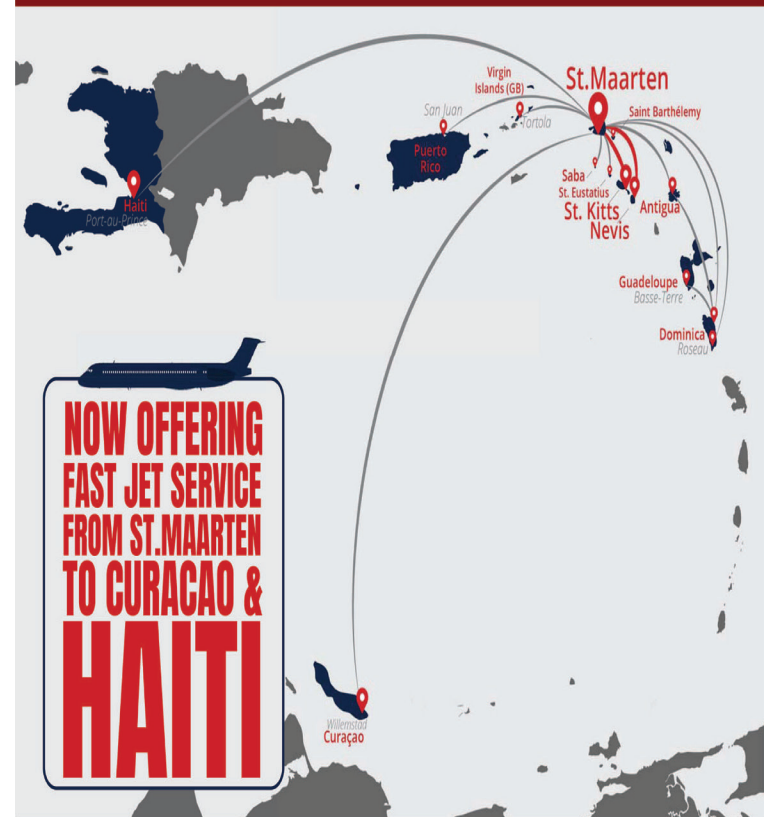
Although England's fightback brought them back into the contest, the skill and relentless accuracy of Axar and Ashwin proved too much for a side that also collapsed twice in the second-Test defeat.

Had England mustered another 100 runs India would have had a difficult chase.

Instead, under little pressure, Shubman Gill and Rohit Sharma cantered to victory in one-day mode to the delight of the crowd in the world's largest cricket stadium.
