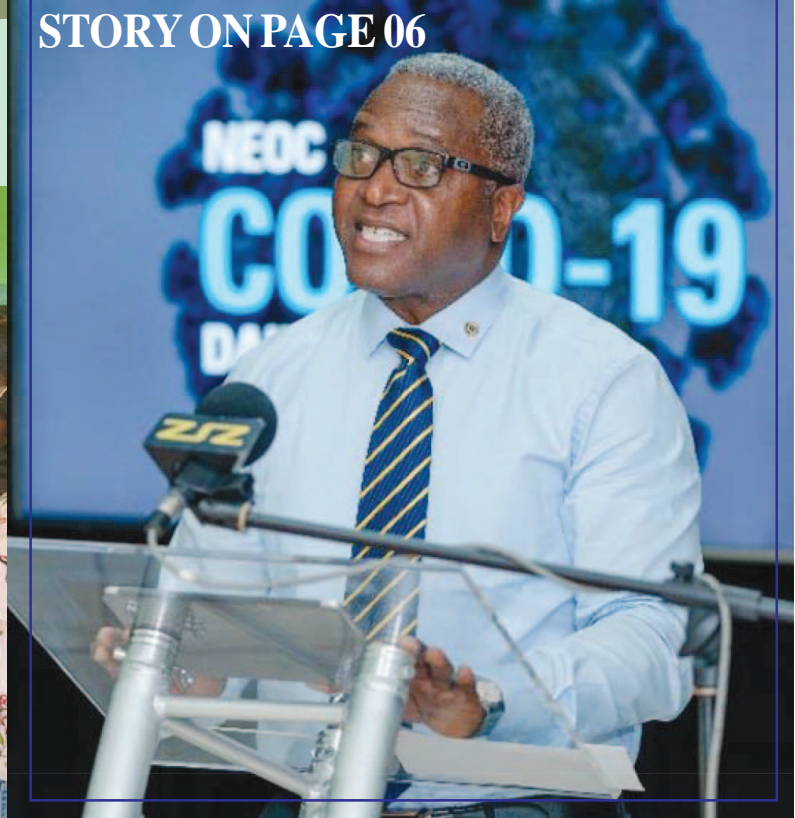

- Members of the bus association fraternity in St.Kitts have yet to be contacted to give input on the way forward concerning the government's recently implemented 50% capacity measure for the public transportation system.

President of the West Line Bus Association Nicholson 'Rambo' Webster speaking on Freedom FM's 'Issues' programme aired on Wednesday 9th June 2021 gave an update, sharing that the capacity confusion- which lasted 'over a week' before being cleared up- could have been avoided if representative(s) of the bus associations were part of the

transportation board.

'We have a situation and I have been keeping quiet on it since January where they formed a new transportation board last year. The bus associations was never invited to nominate its members. That is what was supposed to happen; the bus associations

nominate two people to represent them on the board. That was not done.”

Webster continued: “As a result of that if this was done, we would of have proper representation by the board and there was not going to be any confusion because there was confusion over how many people is half capacity. Now, some bus have 14 passengers, some bus have 15 passengers so when you say half of capacity, there is confusion between 7 and 7.5. Now if we had sit down now and come up with the nest formula which would have been two per row and one in the front. It’s only after I heard that people were calling them (the board) after the fact they come out and change and everyday was some change; some people saying 8 [passengers], some people saying 9 and then the task force telling you one thing and the police telling you a next, and nobody knew what was going on for over a week.”

As understood from Webster, to date the confusion has been cleared up. He said 9 passengers are allowed for a 15- seater bus.

He has expressed that the right thing should have been to involve the bus drivers initially.

“We have not been invited to sit and come up with the measures for a collective response as it relates to community spread. It is a very,

very important point, and one of the reasons why it is important is because when you listen to the rhetoric on the road, you would get the impression that the bus men and bus drivers are unreasonable but if you’re going to have an industry that is going to be impacted but you who is telling people out there do the right thing are not doing the right thing to consult with the folks.”

Webster revealed during the live interview session that “Up to now to this date, I have not received any calls from anybody to sit down and discuss a way forward.”

The West Line Bus Association President is of the view that having not consulted the bus associations to put

together “a proper plan to mitigate what is happening as it relates to community spread

then that speaks volume of you [those in authority].”

On Friday 28th May 2021, bus drivers of the West Line Bus Association and Sugar City Bus Association gathered for a meeting in response to the capacity announcement made by Prime Minister Dr. Timothy Harris on Tuesday 25th May.

CMO Talks Workplace Safety, Vaccination Rate In Outbreak Factors

BASSETERRE, St.Kitts (Thursday 10th June 2021)-Chief Medical Officer Dr. Hazel Laws has listed two areas linked to the current virus outbreak in St.Kitts-Nevis, namely the vaccination rate as well as workplaces not following the COVID-19 prevention and control measures.

She provided such details on Tuesday 8th June 2021 while appearing on 'Leadership Matters' aired on ZIZ having given an update from the Ministry of Health that a total of twenty-five (25) additional cases were recorded within the past 24 hours resulting in 66 active cases.

In addressing factors driving the outbreak, Dr. Laws, who is a member of the National COVID-19 Task Force, stated: "Based on the information gleaned through contact tracing, we realize that the private and public entities and individuals, they are not adhering to the COVID-19 prevention and control measures for example the wearing of the facemask, hand sanitisation and evaluating employees upon arrival at work at the beginning of the workday. What we found is that a number of employees are showing up and are coming to work while experiencing flu-like and COVID like symptoms."

"Another factor is that the vaccination rate still remains below the herd community threshold," she added.

As part of the ministry's way forward, she pointed out: "We need to engage the key stakeholders to help public and private entities improve and adhere to the COVID-19 prevention and control measures. We must press on with our national COVID-19 vaccination programme."

In relation to the report on cases, she said: "Last evening, we recorded 19





additional cases of COVID-19 and today, received positive results for an additional six cases. These 25 cases bring the total of COVID-19 confirmed cases 119 with 105 cases for St.Kitts and 14 cases for Nevis. We have registered 53 recoveries so far and four hospitalisations.”

Dr. Laws said all four patients are stable and that there are no COVID-19 related deaths.

The CMO disclosed: “The most recent cases include one imported case from the Dominican Republic and one case from the Tyrell Williams Primary School which is now cleared from an outbreak at this time. One case in particular is also

responsible for transmitting the virus to nine contacts. Such a case is referred to as a super spreader. A significant number of the recent cases are involved in the gaming sector. Approximately, seven entities have been impacted through the contact tracing process. Approximately, 1460 individuals have been engaged by the Ministry of Health through the contact tracing process.”

According to her, 870 of these individuals have been received from self-quarantine and a remaining 590 are to be tested and discharged.

In highlighting five areas of successes and positives, she addressed prevention of the virus spreading in schools, contact tracing, low positivity rate, no COVID-19 related deaths so far and the national vaccination programme.

“So far we have prevented the spread of the virus in our schools. So six schools have been impacted so far and they have all been cleared from an outbreak. Secondly, the contact tracing process is working. We have identified cases. We’ve reached a number of contacts and prevented a significant number of cases already. Our robust contact tracing process is preventing an expansion of this problem.”

Dr. Laws added: “At present, the positivity rate is still acceptable low. It stands at 1.6 % approximately. There are no COVID-19 related deaths so far. This reflects the state of readiness of our health system. The Ministry of Health has updated its clinical guidelines that provides the roadmap for care delivery of the persons impacted by COVID-19. Our national vaccination programme is successful with 63.4% of the target population covered by the first dose and 27.1 % of the target population fully vaccinated.”

Speaking to the way forward, the CMO outlined that the Ministry of Health is strengthening the contact tracing process by increasing the cadre of staff or personnel who will be engaging the contacts of the cases.

Additionally, she talked about increasing testing capacity, noting that a mobile unit will be added to the fleet and also increasing the number of case managers who will be supported by the A&E [Accident and Emergency] physicians.

An isolation site and mobile app were also mentioned.

“We are establishing a COVID-19 isolation site and we hope to launch the SKN mobile app that’s going to help us monitor cases and contacts.”

Dr. Wilkinson Frowns Upon COVID Death Rumour

BASSETERRE, St.Kitts (Thursday 10th June 2021)- "You could imagine how tough that was on the patient, on the patient's family et cetera [etc.]. I even got calls and WhatsApp [messages] from in the UK [and] North America asking if we got our first death..."€

So said Medical Chief of Staff at the Joseph N. France General Hospital and member of the National COVID-19 Task Force, Dr. Cameron Wilkinson when he appeared on the Tuesday 8th June 2021 episode of 'Leadership Matters' on ZIZ in addressing an area of concern on the topic of fake news in the Federation during the COVID-19 pandemic.

This media house understands that a photo of a male COVID-19 patient had been circulating via social media, specifically WhatsApp messenger, claiming that he died from the illness.

Rumours going about indicated that St.Kitts-Nevis had recorded its first COVID related death.

"This morning, as I do most mornings, I called the specialist working on the private ward to find out how the patients were doing, and I found that all four were stable and doing fine. I updated the CMO [Chief Medical Officer - Dr. Hazel Laws], and I was shocked and surprised when I saw circulating on social media; this news that one of the patients died with a picture, and I think it is very tough on persons when they're in the hospital fighting a deadly disease like this and then turning the corner and doing well for persons to be spreading fake news with a picture saying that the person is dead," Dr. Wilkinson said.

He continued: "€ You could imagine how tough that was on the patient, on the patient's family et cetera [etc.]. I even got calls and WhatsApp [messages] from in the UK, North America asking if we got our first death, and for someone to be

doing that it must be a malicious attempt at what we're doing and I want to [say to] persons that we can have disagreements but we don't need to be enemies and we don't need to misconstrue the information and especially when someone is in the hospital and fighting to get better, let's try and keep them out of those and stick to the facts."

Commenting on a caller's question about the government's response to fake news, Prime Minister Dr. Timothy Harris said: "Well, I think in large measure that is why we're here tonight in part to be able to bring the facts and to have the authorities and those most knowledgeable to inform the people. So part of our response to the fake news is to keep the public abreast with what is happening in the country, to be transparent about it and to explain as much to the people so that they understand."

"There will always be unfortunately, as we see it play out, some whom for selfish motives, and for their own political agenda would want to have bad news in the country.... Some have resorted to politicising the efforts even of professional people in doing such a marvelous job of protecting our country," he added.

Zack Highlights Importance Of Early Stage Cultural Awareness

BASSETERRE, St.Kitts (Thursday 10th June 2021) - Well-known Cultural Preservationist Dr. Winston 'Zack' Nisbett continues to play his part in cultural awareness involving the nation's youths which he says is important in keeping culture alive in St.Kitts-Nevis.

"It is imperative that we preserve our cultural heritage and to motivate and instill cultural awareness at an early stage [through youth education]," he says.

According to him, such will instill the sort of longevity within the schools and also enable families to financially benefit as well especially during the tourism season when the children showcase their talents to the visitors.

Nisbett shared his thoughts on the topic during an outing at the Tucker Clarke Primary School's (formerly Newtown Primary) may fair held on Friday 19th May 2021 at the school's premises which included performances featuring students of grades one and two doing the May Pole Dance and the Cake Walk featuring the Japanese girls characters.

Nisbett, informed reporters that he has been charged with the responsibility by the Ministry of Culture over the past four (4) years in terms of preparing the schools.

"The Ministry of Culture conducted a programme through the schools and it was intentionally to get culture alive and awaken in the schools. Most of the schools have cultural affairs. Some have [troupes like] David and Goliath, the Mummies, the Clowns, the Bull..."

Nisbett said the Tucker Clarke Primary students learnt the cultural routines in three (3) days saying: "Trust me. Let us give them a round of applause because they have done well. The short practices and the dedication and the intention within. We used Grade 2 and 1 in the primary schools, and we are destined to go into the private schools as well."



Child labour rises to 160 million - first increase in two decades

GENEVA (ILO News) - The number of children in child labour has risen to 160 million worldwide - an increase of 8.4 million children in the last four years - with millions more at risk due to the impacts of COVID-19, according to a new report by the International Labour Organization (ILO) and UNICEF.

Child Labour: Global estimates 2020, trends and the road forward - released ahead of World Day Against Child Labour on 12th June - warns that progress to end child labour has stalled for the first time in 20 years, reversing the previous downward trend that saw child labour fall by 94 million between 2000 and 2016.

The report points to a significant rise in the number of children aged 5 to 11 years in child labour, who now account for just over half of the total global figure. The number of children aged 5 to 17 years in hazardous work - defined as work that is likely to harm their health, safety or morals - has risen by 6.5 million to 79 million since 2016.

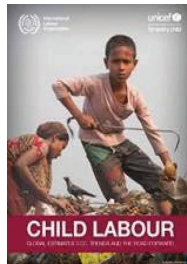
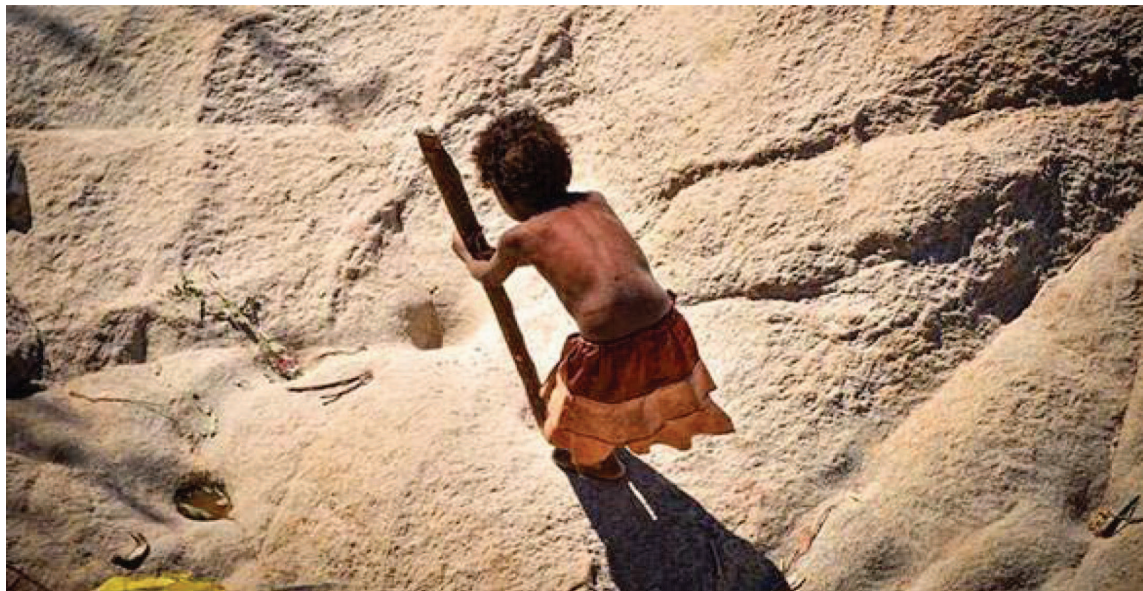

“The new estimates are a wake-up call. We cannot stand by while a new generation of children is put at risk,” said ILO Director-General Guy Ryder. “Inclusive social protection allows families to keep their children in school even in the face of economic hardship. Increased investment in rural development and decent work in agriculture is essential. We are at a pivotal moment and much depends on how we respond. This is a time for renewed commitment and energy, to turn the corner and break the cycle of poverty and child labour.”

In sub-Saharan Africa, population growth, recurrent crises, extreme poverty, and inadequate social protection measures have led to an additional 16.6 million children in child labour over the past four years.

Even in regions where there has been some headway since 2016, such as Asia and the Pacific,



and Latin America and the Caribbean, COVID-19 is endangering that progress.

The report warns that globally, nine million additional children are at risk of being pushed into child labour by the end of 2022 as a result of the pandemic. A simulation model shows this number could rise to 46 million if they don't have access to critical social protection coverage.

Additional economic shocks and school closures caused by COVID-19 mean that children already in child labour may be working longer hours or under worsening conditions, while many more may be forced into the worst forms of child labour due to job and income losses among vulnerable families.

“We are losing ground in the fight against child labour, and the last year has not made that fight any easier,” said UNICEF Executive Director Henrietta Fore. “Now, well into a second year of global lockdowns, school closures, economic disruptions, and shrinking national budgets, families are forced to make heart-breaking choices. We urge governments and international development banks to prioritize investments in programmes that can get children out of the workforce and back into school, and in social protection programmes that can help families avoid making this choice in the first place.”

Other key findings in the report include:

- The agriculture sector accounts for 70 per cent of children in child labour (112 million) followed by 20 per cent in services (31.4 million) and 10 per cent in industry (16.5 million).
- Nearly 28 per cent of children aged 5 to 11 years and 35 per cent of children aged 12 to 14 years in child labour are out of school.
- Child labour is more prevalent among boys than girls at every age. When household chores performed for 21 hours or more each week are taken into account, the gender gap in child labour narrows.
- The prevalence of child labour in rural areas (14 per cent) is close to three times higher than in urban areas (5 per cent).

Children in child labour are at risk of physical and mental harm. Child labour compromises children's education, restricting their rights and limiting their future opportunities, and leads to vicious inter-generational cycles of poverty and child labour.

To reverse the upward trend in child labour, the ILO and UNICEF are calling for:

- Adequate social protection for all, including universal child benefits.
- Increased spending on free and good-quality schooling and getting all children back into school - including children who were out of school before COVID-19.
- Promotion of decent work for adults, so families don't have to resort to children helping to generate family income.
- An end to harmful gender norms and discrimination that influence child labour.
- Investment in child protection systems, agricultural development, rural public services, infrastructure and livelihoods.

As part of the International Year for the Elimination of Child Labour, the global partnership Alliance 8.7, of which UNICEF and ILO are partners, is encouraging member States, business, trade unions, civil society, and regional and international organizations to redouble their efforts in the global fight against child labour by making concrete action pledges.

During a week of action from 10 - 17 June, ILO Director-General Guy Ryder and UNICEF Executive Director Henrietta Fore will join other high-level speakers and youth advocates at a high-level event during the International Labour Conference to discuss the release of the new global estimates and the roadmap ahead.

PRESS RELEASE: DETOXING SKIN: OVERCOMING CHALLENGES POST - COVID

The International Women’s Day 2021 theme Women in Leadership: Achieving an equal future in a COVID-19 world has ramped up the necessity for reassessing the role of women globally. The United Nations Development Programme has been proactive in collaborating female-owned businesses - Verve Connections (NGO), and Brice-Roberts Business Consulting Services - by supporting this year’s auspicious, award-winning International Women in Employment and Business (WEB2) conference which will again be hosted by Windsor University School of Medicine.

With the key theme “Detox and Thrive - “Sustaining Yourself and Business Post-COVID”, this conference is at the forefront of increasing the visibility of women in the workplace and this year intends to deepen the engagement of women in the quest to reduce the range of physical and psychological hazards in the environment, given the deleterious consequences for women’s health. Indeed, the severe impact of the pandemic cannot be overlooked. More than ever, we are required to detox our minds, our bodies, our relationships, our home and work environments and even our wardrobes!

The keynote address will be given by our first female Kittitian oncologist, Dr Merisa Grant-Tate, who has direct experience of managing the impact of unhealthy environments on the steady rise in cancers. Recent research in Europe links increases in the incidence of cervical cancer to rising temperatures. Dr Tzivion stated that “Increasing public awareness through education, outreach and research combined with improved prevention, early detection and treatment will have a strong impact on alleviating this critical discrepancy.”

Ilis Watts, the National Co-ordinator for the SGP commented

that a few chose to co-sponsor the conference because the GEF Small Grants Programme continues to support communities, including women, and their desire to live and thrive in a changing climate.”

Prof Jeune Guishard-Pine, one of the organisers of the conference sees it as timely, citing her university colleague in saying: “Our genes are significantly linked to our immediate environments whether it be at home or in the workplace. The same environment that gives us all the good stuff can take away our overall well-being. We all need to learn how to achieve a better life and how to maximise the benefits of both our home and work environments whether it be the physical spaces or the people we share those spaces with”.

What is evident is that it takes great leadership to adapt and sustain the changes that need to be made in all

Unfortunately, for this Federation it has been 365 Days of Regret, Failure and Disunity.

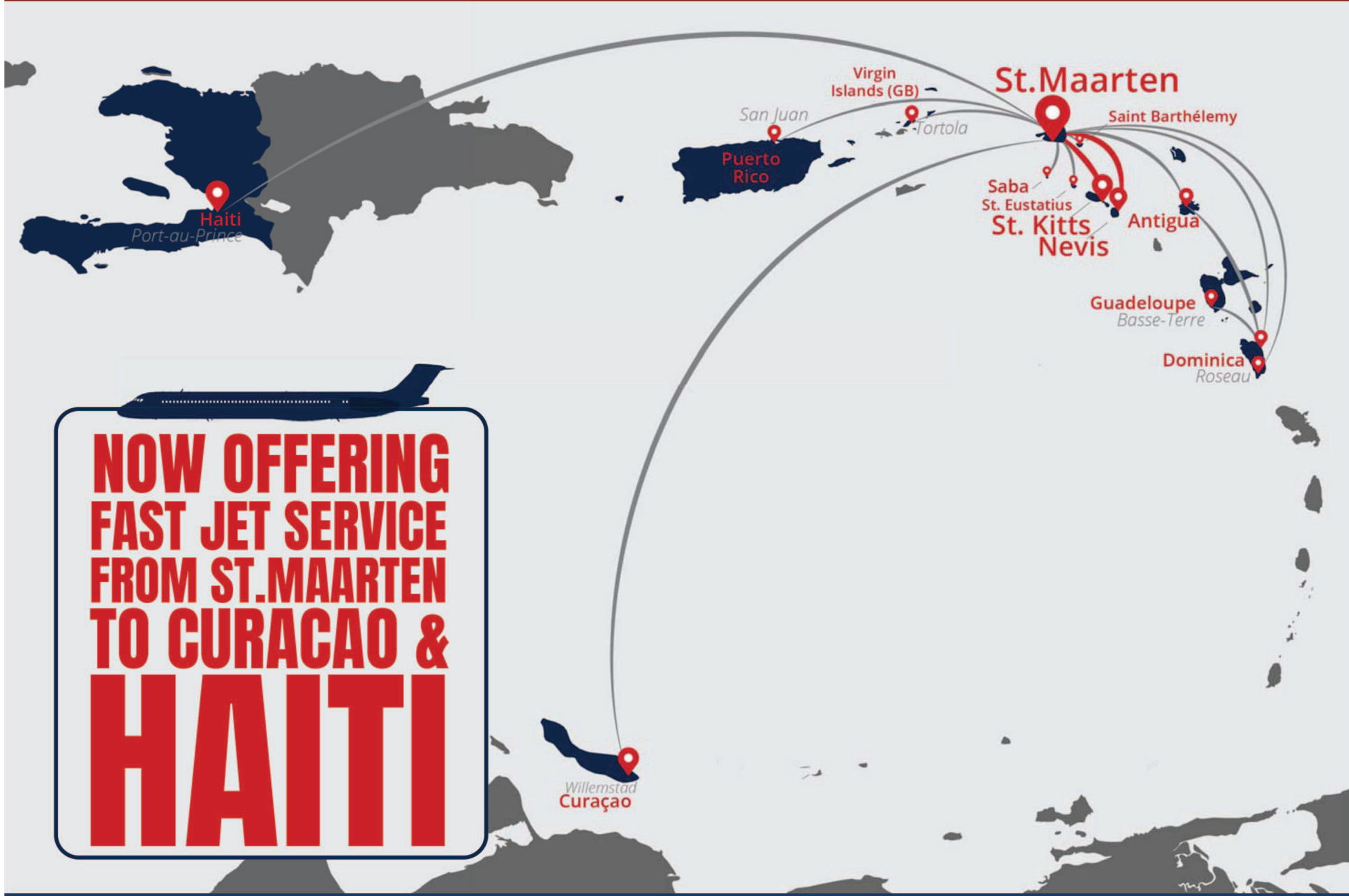

Oceans - the last frontier for OECS States

- As the Organisation of Eastern Caribbean States (OECS) celebrates 40 Years of Integration for Progress and Sustainability, the ocean is being touted as “the last and best hope for a prosperous and sustainable future for Member States.”

So says Chamberlain Emmanuel - Head of the Environmental Sustainability Division at the OECS Commission. Addressing a Mapping Ocean Wealth virtual seminar to mark June 8 as World Oceans Day, Emmanuel said the OECS has been at the forefront of championing the Blue Economy approach in the region. He cited the formulation of the St. George’s Declaration of Principles for Environmental

Sustainability in 2001, the adoption of the Eastern Caribbean Regional Policy (ECROP) in 2013, and the launch of the Caribbean Regional Oceanscape Project (CROP) in 2017, as “significant milestones in our journey towards effective ocean governance and sustainable ocean economies.”

Emmanuel credited regional and global partners for helping the OECS on the journey to transitioning to a Blue Economy. He said: “With support from the World Bank, the Global Environment Facility, the Government of Norway, The Nature Conservancy, The Commonwealth Secretariat, the Caribbean Regional Fisheries Mechanism, the Caribbean Natural Resources Institute, and other key regional and international collaborators, we are strengthening the capacity of our Member States in the areas of ocean governance and marine spatial planning, and we are enhancing the enabling environment in support of a Blue Economy.”

Emmanuel surmised that the Mapping Ocean Wealth Seminar provided an ideal forum “to showcase, share, and strengthen our knowledge and capacity to manage and explore the untapped possibilities of our vast ocean space, and to further the process of making the shift from Small Island States, to embracing our potential as large ocean economies, supporting life and livelihoods.”

World Bank Senior Environmental Specialist and Task Team Leader for the CROP - Sylvia Michele Diez, commended the OECS for having made great strides in strengthening Blue Economy knowledge and analytics in the region. She singled-out the OECS as a Blue Economy model to other regions. She underscored that The World Bank has been a longstanding partner

of the OECS on the Blue Economy. Diez characterized the natural assets in the coastal and marine environment in the OECS as major drivers of growth in terms of revenue, jobs, food security, and coastal resilience.

Speaking directly to the relevance of the Mapping Ocean Wealth initiative, Diez said some of the innovation and science that The Nature Conservancy (TNC) has developed for the OECS, give a better understanding of the seascape, and will guide the expansion of ocean activities in a way that is more responsible and sustainable. Diez says it is critical to expand ocean data because in the absence of data, it becomes extremely difficult for countries to manage oceans, formulate policies, and minimize negative impacts. The Mapping Ocean Wealth seminar discussed ocean mapping data, tools, maps and models which make ocean science more accessible to policy makers at the national and regional level, and give a better understanding of the true value of the coastal environment.

Director of The Nature Conservancy in the Eastern Caribbean - Dr. Sherry Constantine, described the work undertaken by TNC for the OECS as transformative and designed to advance marine spatial planning and Blue Economy initiatives in the region. TNC’s work includes the production of several maps downscaled to the country level, including maps of coral reefs for recreation and tourism; coral reefs for fisheries value; distribution and value of recreational fisheries; and nature dependent tourism.

Among the findings is that Coral Reefs in the five CROP participating countries attract 143,100 visitors and generate US\$118.3 million in revenue annually. Nature dependent beaches in the five countries generate US\$318 million per annum. Whale and Dolphin watching in Dominica, Grenada, Saint Lucia, and St. Vincent and the Grenadines generate US\$6.2 million annually. Given these statistics, OECS States were asked to carefully balance coastal development and conservation and to weigh the ‘opportunity cost’ of ‘losing nature’ to ‘development.’ Globally, coral reefs generate US\$36 billion in revenue annually.

The virtual seminar was attended by marine and coastal planners and data managers, representatives from various sectors including fisheries, environment, blue economy, green economy, as well as tourism stakeholders in the OECS. Global and regional partners collaborating with the OECS on various Blue Economy initiatives also attended the virtual seminar which was held under the theme for World Oceans Day 2021, ‘life and livelihoods.’

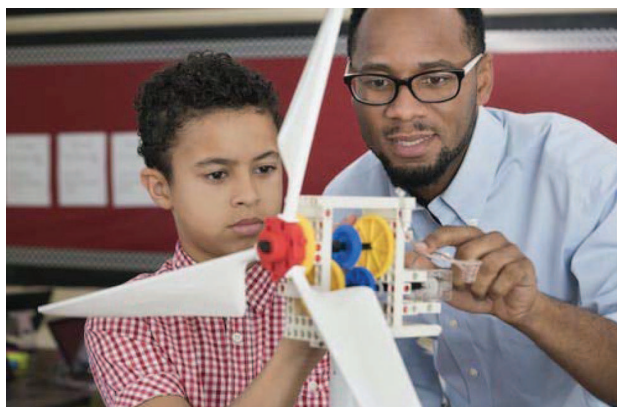

Three Ways Schools Can Improve STEM Learning For Black Students

Applying cultural sensitivity in teaching STEM to Black students can help them engage in the sciences more. Pro-Black STEM classes can lead to more Black scientists.

Editor's note: STEM is an acronym for Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics

Black people make up just 9% of the STEM workforce in The US. As a scholar who studies how STEM educators can more effectively reach Black students, I want to help all people develop an understanding of how anti-Black racism is a significant barrier for Black students learning STEM.

Who works in STEM? Black and Hispanic Americans are vastly under-represented in STEM.

Ethnicity	US Workforce	STEM Employees
White	69%	65%
Asian	13%	6%

Many scholars have argued that our current ways of teaching STEM are bad for everyone because only the experiences and contributions of white people are discussed, but the negative effects are greater for Black people.

Teachers frequently question the intellectual ability of Black students and prevent them from using their cultural worldviews, spirituality and language in the STEM learning setting.

Still, Black people continue to boost STEM knowledge across the world.

It is time to generate new teaching practices in STEM that affirm Black students in a way that connects with their lives.

1. Talk about Black excellence

The projection of ideas about who can who can pick up STEM concepts is important. Research has shown that many people think of engineers as white men; therefore, seeing Black STEM professionals in person or via media representation can build inspiration among Black youths.

Although Black representation is essential, it alone

won't address the barriers Black students face. These barriers include racial stereotyping, stressful academic culture and other social and cultural factors. Some of these issues are not unique to Black people, but together they can create a particularly harmful experience for Black students. When teachers celebrate the successes of Black people in STEM, they can also discuss the resources and opportunities these individuals had or did not have while navigating racism.

Many Black people throughout history have achieved advanced STEM knowledge.

Dr Patricia Bath, an ophthalmologist who developed laser technology used in treating cataracts, and Steven Townsend, who has advanced awareness of the benefits of breastfeeding, are just two examples. But Black contributions to STEM predate American enslavement. Recalling this history normalizes Black success across STEM disciplines.

Educators must be mindful of how they tell Black success stories in STEM.

When educators reduce examples of Black excellence to just a few people, it perpetuates the myth of Black exceptionalism, the idea that Black people who are capable of success are rare. Individual success stories can also portray these people as being successful without assistance or serve as limited representations. Instead, teachers can share varied examples of successful Black scientists, technologists, engineers and mathematicians, including local residents and family members of their students.

2. Emphasize social skills

Although STEM professions require both social and technical knowledge, technical skills are typically valued more than social skills.

Math and science instruction often encourage competition and rigor, which constrains students' ability to value differences in experience, style and problem-solving approaches.

This also limits students' ability to see how math and science knowledge can solve social problems.

Furthermore, traditional math and science teaching has punished Black students for how they speak and live. This happens when teachers focus more on using scientific language than on displaying scientific understanding. Therefore, many Black students become disengaged and lose interest.

STEM education in its current form pushes Black students away instead of addressing the racial and socioeconomic problems within STEM classrooms and broader society.

Black youths tend to have a strong sense of social realities and a "soulfulness" that causes them to focus more on people than objects. STEM educators can train Black youths to utilize their emotional strengths in designing problem-solving technologies that are both effective and humane.

For example, Black-centered design, a race-conscious application of human-centered design, allows Black people to use their cultural knowledge to provide scientific solutions to problems in their community.

However teachers choose to do it, Black identity and culture should be seen as an asset to STEM education and careers.

3. Teach with sociopolitical awareness

An abundance of resources can help teachers develop curriculum that highlights the ways culture influences how we learn and practice STEM.

One example is The Woke STEM Teacher, a website where educators can get tools to include social justice topics in their STEM curriculum.

Teachers can design or use enjoyable exercises that prompt students to use STEM knowledge to solve problems relevant to their lives outside of the classroom. This allows opportunities for students' communities to be used as spaces for STEM learning.

Also, the creativity of Black students may look different from that of other students, so it is important to develop a supportive approach.

Educators have used hip-hop, cosmetology, and double-Dutch to demonstrate Black intelligence in STEM.

I believe these simple steps are powerful ways to shift STEM education toward better appreciating and elevating the knowledge and contributions of Black people in STEM.

President Biden's Vaccine Pledge Ups Pressure On Rich Countries To Give More

The United States on Thursday raised the pressure on other Group of Seven leaders to share their vaccine hoards to bring an end to the pandemic by pledging to donate 500 million doses of the Pfizer coronavirus vaccine to the world's poorest countries.

The largest ever vaccine donation by a single country will cost the United States \$3.5 billion, but Washington expects no quid pro quo or favours for the gift, a senior Biden administration official told reporters.

US President Joe Biden's move, on the eve of a summit of the world's richest democracies, is likely to prompt other leaders to stump up more vaccines, though even vast numbers of vaccines would still not be enough to inoculate all of the world's poor.

G7 leaders want to vaccinate the world by the end of 2022 to try to halt the COVID-19 pandemic that has killed more than 3.9 million people and devastated the global economy.

A senior Biden administration official described the gesture as a "major step forward that will supercharge the global effort" with the aim of "bringing hope to every corner of the world."

"We really want to underscore that this is fundamentally about a singular objective of saving lives," the official said, adding that Washington was not seeking favours in exchange for the doses.

Vaccination efforts so far are heavily correlated with wealth: The United States, Europe, Israel and Bahrain are far ahead of other countries. A total of 2.2 billion people have been vaccinated so far out of a world population of nearly 8 billion, based on Johns Hopkins University data.

US drugmaker Pfizer and its German partner BioNTech have agreed to supply The US with the vaccines, delivering 200 million doses in 2021 and 300 million doses in the first half of 2022.

The shots, which will be produced at Pfizer's US sites, will be supplied at a not-for-profit price.

"Our partnership with the US government will help bring hundreds of millions of doses of our vaccine to the poorest countries around the world as quickly as possible," said Pfizer Chief Executive Albert Bourla.

'DROP IN THE BUCKET'

Anti-poverty campaign group Oxfam called for more to be done to increase global production of vaccines.

"Surely, these 500 million vaccine doses are welcome as they will help more than 250 million people, but that's still a drop in the bucket compared to the need across the world," said Niko Lusiani, Oxfam America's vaccine lead.

Researchers Identified The Protein Responsible For Cancer's Aggressiveness

Prostate cancer is the second most common cancer among men, according to The American Cancer Society. It's also one of the trickiest cancers to diagnose and treat.

But new research from The University of Georgia has identified a protein that appears to prevent the cancer from spreading to and colonizing the bone, providing a new target for future therapeutics.

"Unfortunately, prostate cancer that has spread to the bone is very aggressive, often lethal and very difficult to treat," said Dr Brian Cummings, corresponding author of the study and head of the College of Pharmacy's pharmaceutical and biomedical sciences department. "Even in cases of successful treatment, the patient's quality of life is severely lessened due to bone loss."

Prostate cancer that hasn't spread beyond nearby organs has nearly a 100% survival rate, meaning almost all of these patients will live at least another five or more years after their initial diagnosis and treatment. But for men whose cancer has spread to other organs or the bone, that five-year survival rate plummets to 30%, according to The American Cancer Society. In The US about one in every eight men will be diagnosed with prostate cancer, and more than 34,000 men die each year from the disease.

The new study, published by Scientific Reports, focused on cancer-associated fibroblasts, which are the most abundant type of cell in tumors and are responsible for cancer growth and spread. The researchers found that knocking out a specific protein, called glypican-1, could prevent tumor cells from spreading into nearby bone.

The study supports a previous report from Cummings' laboratory suggesting that this protein may prevent tumor growth. The researchers found that the protein doesn't alter the cancer cells themselves. Instead it affects a group of neighboring cells called fibroblasts.

Fibroblasts are cells that help make up connective tissues in people and animals. But fibroblasts can also be present in cancerous tumors, where they facilitate cancer growth and spread.

"We need a transformation toward more distributed vaccine manufacturing so that qualified producers worldwide can produce billions more low-cost doses on their own terms, without intellectual property constraints," he said in a statement.

Another issue, especially in some poor countries, is the infrastructure for transporting the vaccines which often have to be stored at very cold

temperatures.

Biden has also backed calls for a waiver of some vaccine intellectual property rights but there is no international consensus yet on how to proceed.

The new vaccine donations come on top of 80 million doses Washington has already pledged to donate by the end of June. There is also \$2 billion in funding earmarked for the COVAX programme led by The World Health Organization (WHO) and The Global Alliance for Vaccines and Immunization (GAVI), The White House said.

GAVI and The WHO welcomed the initiative.

Washington is also taking steps to support local production of COVID-19 vaccines in other countries, including through its Quad initiative with Japan, India and Australia.

To determine the glypican-1 protein's role in helping cancer spread, the researchers combined human prostate cancer cells and human bone-derived cells to examine how the cancer cells transformed the fibroblast. Then they genetically modified the cancer cells and the fibroblast to knock out the protein. Without the protein, the prostate cancer cells had problems transforming the fibroblast.

The study was the first to demonstrate such a role for glypican-1 and suggests that this protein may have the same effect on tumor growth in people.

"Part of the significance of this study is that it demonstrates how cancer cells are able to change their environment in ways to facilitate their own growth," Cummings said. "Prostate cancer cells alter their environment so that they can colonize bone. This study identifies a role for a protein that appears to inhibit the harmful changes that prostate cancer makes to the bone."

"This protein appears to stop the ability of cancer cells to change their environment, which decreases the cancer's aggressiveness. The fact that this protein is found in the bone, where many aggressive prostate cancer cells reside, further increases the potential impact of this work."

Foreign Minister Wu Talks Taiwan-Japan Partnership At FCCJ Event

Foreign Minister Jaushieh Joseph Wu said on 3 June 2021 that Taiwan will continue enhancing its relationship with Japan and contributing to peace and stability in the Indo-Pacific as a reliable partner and force for good in the global community.

The international landscape has gone through tremendous changes in the past few years, with Taiwan becoming a focal point of the ideological rivalry and strategic competition between democratic and authoritarian powers, Wu said.

Taiwan is committed to building even stronger cooperative relations with Japan, The US and other like-minded partners to meet current challenges and safeguard the shared values of freedom, democracy, human rights and the rule of law, he added.

Wu made the remarks via video link during a news conference organized by the Foreign Correspondents' Club of Japan in Tokyo.

According to the minister, China is exploiting COVID-19 to

impose its agenda on other parts of the world by deploying vaccine diplomacy as well as economic and military influence.

Given the country's front-line role in opposing China's coercion and military threat, Taiwan fully understands its responsibility to protect its sovereignty and preserve its democratic way of life, Wu said, adding that the government and people are absolutely committed to self-defense.

Solidarity and cooperation are critical in deterring authoritarian aggression, he said, citing as an example Japan's efforts to take on regional issues through the Global Cooperation Training Framework, which the country has participated in as a full member since 2019.

The minister also thanked the government of Japan for its strengthened support of Taiwan, including its unequivocal call for Taiwan's inclusion in the World Health Organization.

Mentions of maintaining peace and stability in the Taiwan Strait made in joint

His personal mission is to invest in the prosperity of black and urban youth, by helping young people develop their physical, mental, and spiritual capacities so that they may become mature individuals and active members of society. With a keen awareness of the debilitating effect of systemic racism on the lives of black Americans, Dr Holly advances his mission through designing educational experiences that stimulate young people's intellectual growth, cultural competence, and socio-political consciousness. 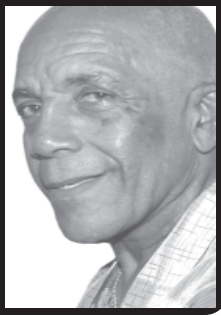

WAS THERE A 10TH OF JUNE IN 1967? PART (1)

“No volume of history is insignificant. Especially the worst chapters.” Terri Guillemet:

Dear Reader, I pose the question, “Was there really a 10th of June 1967 in St. Kitts, where armed Anguillans came by boat to assist PAM (The People’s Action Movement) in the OVERTHROW OF THE 1966 LAWFULLY ELECTED LABOUR GOVERNMENT OF THEN PREMIER ROBERT LLEWELLYN BRADSHAW?” I am relying heavily for my HISTORIAL FACTS on A BOOK written by TWO ANGUILLANS - Colville L. Petty and A. Nat Hodge - who have presented a clear, detailed, vivid, precise account what took place in St. Kitts on Saturday, 10th June, 1967. Before going into the meat of my presentation, let me give a brief history about the joining of Anguilla to St. Kitts.

In 1825, many, many moons before Comrade Bradshaw was born (16|09|1916), ACT #21 of 1825 was passed, adjoining Anguilla to St. Kitts, which was the larger of the two islands. The Freeholders (owner or proprietor of land) objected to this union, for they felt that they would be relegated to the dictates of St. Kitts Legislature, although they would have had a representative there. In August 1872, Anguillans petitioned Queen Victoria that they be ruled directly from Great Britain their Colonizer and again in 1958, almost 4000 Anguillans signed a letter to the Governor of the Leeward Islands, petitioning him that the Union between St. Kitts and Anguilla be dissolved.

Comrade Robert L. Bradshaw came and met the Union between St. Kitts and Anguilla intact and Nevis was annexed in 1883, after the sugar industry failed due to severe droughts and a disastrous fire. It might be interesting to learn that Nevis was the most prosperous island at one time, both economically and culturally. The reason why the sugar industry in Nevis failed, was due to the fact that a severe drought occurred and the clay soil of Nevis became heated and burnt the roots of the sugar canes. St. Kitts on the other hand, possessed soil from the various pre-historic volcanic eruptions and so, was able to endure the drought much longer. The volcanic ash from the eruptions, was more suitable for the cultivation of sugar cane.

It must be borne in mind, that this annexation of Anguilla in 1825 and Nevis in 1883, was purely the work and the will of the Colonizer - Great Britain and that Black People who were voiceless and voteless, had no say in it. It grieves my heart to hear the enemies of the Working Class attributing the backwardness of both

annexations to the spitefulness of Comrade Bradshaw and the Labour Party, with the Comrade promising bone in rice and pepper in soup to both Nevis and Anguilla. The enemy which accused Comrade Bradshaw of issuing those statements could never pinpoint a day, date, place, or event, on which those threats were issued. Comrade Bradshaw had candidates running for Elections in both Nevis and Anguilla for the LABOUR PARTY, so, why would he foolishly go and make those treacherous threats which could harm the political prospects of his candidates?

In returning to the subject at hand, I must confess that it was only on the formation of the People’s Action Movement (PAM) that all these allegations surfaced, because PAM was an extended arm of the aristocrats (the anti- Working-Class element of the society) our former enslavers who begrudged Comrade Bradshaw in fighting them for better working and living conditions on behalf of the once enslaved. It is a testifiable fact that the Founder of PAM, A black man, was often time referred by our former enslavers as only black of skin, but white of mind and the only black person whom they respect.

You see, dear reader, they were infuriatingly (very annoying, worrisome) and

mortally afraid that we, whom they once enslaved, living standards would be improved to their level. That is why they were so fearful of Mr. Bradshaw who could not be bought or sold and who stood to defending the Rights of the Working Class, like the needle to the pole, (unmovable and unshakeable) as all Champions of the Workers world-wide should be. After the 1935 Buckley’s Uprising and Trade Unions and Political Parties were legalized with the visit of the Lord Moyne Commission of Inquiry to St. Kitts, the Masses were all voteless. Only those who worked for a certain salary or who owned property, were allowed to enjoy this right.

The LABOUR MOVEMENT fought tooth and nail in its effort to ensure that this privilege became a RIGHT for the Working-Class of the land to enjoy. They succeeded in doing so in 1952, much to the chagrin (annoyance) of those who enjoyed the privilege before. This was another reason for infuriating our former enslavers for their privilege, was now transformed into a RIGHT for their enslaved to enjoy, thus causing More HATRED AND SCORN to be heaped upon Comrade Bradshaw and the Labour Movement. Their inmost fears were being manifested vividly, because their former enslaved were treading the road of progress, for our former enslavers believed that it was their God-Given right to have us as hewers of wood and drawers of water for them..

Not only were the shackles and chains removed from their hands and feet, no longer were their enslaved working under slave-like conditions from sunrise to sunset, not only were their former enslaved granted the right to vote like them, Mr. Bradshaw and the Labour Movement were demanding that cash be paid as bonus at the end of the year, instead of the usual pittance they paid to their workers. Our former en-slavers could not stomach that. Paying their former en-slaved workers in CASH, thereby presenting them with the purchasing power to accumulate material things even though these things were bought from their businesses, because they owned the land and the businesses as well?

Our former enslavers were incensed at these progressive moves for their workers because they visualized them wearing garments like them and decorating their trash houses like their mansions. So, when our Colonizer- Great Britain decided to thrust a form of semi- Independence (Statehood in 1966) upon us, these oligarchs were furiously enraged. The same Comrade Bradshaw, the Champion of the Working - Class Struggle, would be in control of the island and they could not stomach that thought, that idea. PAM was formed and it started boasting that it was introducing A NEW POLITICAL PARADIGM (new model) into the country. The new Party (PAM) began demonizing Comrade Bradshaw, calling or labelling him a dictator. They boasted that they represent the rich and Comrade Bradshaw represented cane cutters, drain sweepers, domestic servants and other poor people.

It is surprising how the poor Working-Class shouted and clapped in glee, when this statement was uttered, thinking that they were a part of the persons PAM claimed they represented.

England: Kick It Out and Football Supporters' Association urge fans to 'drown out boos'

England fans are being urged "to drown out boos with applause" by the Football Supporters' Association and Kick It Out during Euro 2020.

England's players were booed before their two friendlies in Middlesbrough last week while taking a knee, which they do to highlight racial injustice.

"We would urge you to think about how booing impacts the players," said Kick It Out chief executive Tony Burnett.

"The issue we all want to address is tackling discrimination in football."

The chief executive of the anti-racism organisation added: "That's something we can and should all get behind."

"Gareth Southgate and the England players have made their position really clear - they are taking the knee as an anti-discrimination gesture, it is in no way linked to any political organisation.

"All of us England fans, myself included, want to see England succeed in the Euros, so we are asking for fans at the games to drown out boos with applause and show the players we are behind them."

England open their Euro 2020 campaign against Croatia at Wembley on Sunday (14:00 BST).

"I'd shout to the fans to make sure you continue doing that because we want to be behind these players.

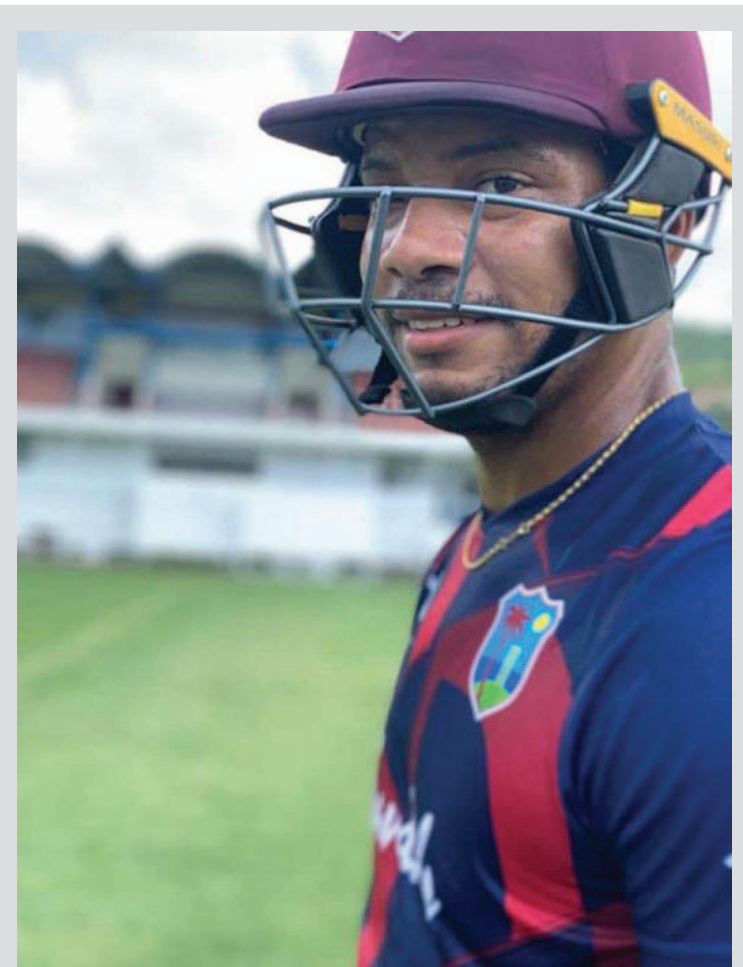
"They're taking the knee for the right reasons, so back them to do well in this tournament. They need all the help they can get."
