Editorial

Maintaining The Forward Momentum

Last week, from an historical perspective, we did a very briefly recap of the workers' struggles which have been the lot of mankind all through the ages.

Looking at some aspects of the American experience, we showed how tough those struggles have always been, and of the grave dangers faced by workers whenever they have sought to exert their collective strengths and bargaining powers. In numerous instances the re-actions of employers resulted in the deaths and serious injuries of many protesting workers.

Yet, in the face of such dangers, workers always found the inner strength to carry on the fight for improved terms and conditions of their employment.

It is our intention, and our hope, that knowledge of the historical struggles will always serve as encouragement for our members, and all other workers in our beloved St Kitts and Nevis, to maintain and exercise their determined efforts to advance their just causes, especially when living under a regime that favours employers.

But there have been many instances in which the actions of union leaders and officials have brought the movement into disrepute.

In The USA the abuse of union funds by the late Jimmy Hoffa provoked the anger of members, and led to actions by the late Senator Robert Kennedy (later US Attorney General under his brother, President Jack Kennedy) to investigate and jail Mr Hoffa.

There was also the case in The UK where a former General Secretary of The Trade Union Congress most egregiously abused their funds to support his excessively lavish life style.

of the workers and their movement. As is only to be expected, at such times employers and members of the general public always pounce on the criminal actions to berate the trade union movement.

Recovering from such setbacks is always increases the general difficulties of maintaining the momentum and advancing the movement and our cause.

In The United States The GOP onslaught, from the time of President Reagan, has weakened trade unionism. (Remember the case of the Air Traffic Controllers who went on strike to protest low wages and unreasonably long working hours. Mr Reagan abolished their union, PATCO.)

President Joseph Biden and his administration are trying, really hard, to keep his promises to assist the trade union movement with regaining its strength. In the vast majority of cases the progress is commendable, but the fight is a very tough one.

Such are the difficulties whenever the movement has to try to recoup lost ground.

Here in St Kitts and Nevis our trade union movement has a record of which we can and ought to be justly proud.

As our guest speaker pointed out at Sunday's Annual Convention the history of The St Kitts and Nevis Trades and Labour Union is one which, amongst other things, ought to inspire us to continue the struggle. Indeed, we should never tire in doing good.

We understand that large numbers of our membership are terrified at the prospect of losing their jobs because some employers are fiercely anti-union and are constantly looking for any excuse to fire them.

That makes them afraid to participate in union activities, but we urge them to be not afraid. There are in force laws designed to protect all workers from unfair or unjustified dismissal or other form of punishment.

We urge one and all to stand firm with their union. Alone you are weak and vulnerable, whereas there is strength in togetherness.

The Labour Spokesman commends our officials for bringing off another successful convention, and we call on all members, as well as all those persons desirous of joining up, to maintain strong hearts. The struggle is a tough but very rewarding one.

Let us all commit ourselves to maintaining the forward momentum of our historic trade union movement.

Drew Says SKNLP Has Democracy Not Animosity

BASSETERRE, St.Kitts (Thursday 4th November 2021)- Chairman of the St.Kitts-Nevis Labour Party (SKNLP) Dr. Terrance Drew, who is one of the three party leader nominees for the upcoming party's electoral conference, has highlighted that the party has no animosity in its leadership race but is rather about democracy in its bid to lead the government after the next general election.

"It is not a race of animosity. We are brothers, we are comrades, and we are presenting our platform to our delegates, and they are the ones who would decide who they see most fit to be the leader of the party and hence, the leader of the country."

Dr.Drew made the disclosure while making an appearance on Freedom FM's 'Issues' programme aired live on Wednesday 3rd November 2021, in reference to his fellow leadership nominees Parliamentary Representative for Constituency One Dr. Geoffrey Hanley and caretaker for Constituency Three Konris Maynard.

As indicated by him, at the annual conference slated for 28th November, fifty (50) delegates from each constituency will partake in the voting which is "part and parcel of the party democratic process in determining who will be the next leader..."

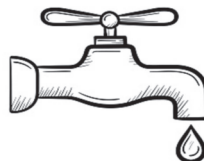
"So those out there who are thinking the party has these deep rooted issues that are fracturing the party, I want to tell them no. This is a party that is going to make 90 years in January 2022. It is possibly the oldest party in the Caribbean. I am researching some more to see when the parties in Cuba would have started, and not only is the party that old, the party has been very successful politically which means the foundation principles on which the party was founded that these principles are what hold the party together and outside of that what makes the party such a successful political organization, and 90 years and growing strong..." he outlined.

Party Chairman Dr. Drew is of the view that "This is speaking very good of the party that after so many years, the party can look within its ranks and find people who are worthy to be leaders of the party and leaders of the country."

"That speaks well of the party and so I'm very proud of what the party represents and after 90 years, it is still the most popular party in St.Kitts and Nevis, and from my own perspective, the party's foundational principles offer the best option for the people of St.Kitts and Nevis from a political standpoint, and that is why this party must be around for its people, should be kept around our people, should continue to grow and mature and allow these principles to become more perfected so that we can have a better democracy not just within the party but a more complete democracy even in the country itself because the St.Kitts-Nevis Labour Party is the party that has really established democracy in St.Kitts and Nevis; nobody can deny that," he added.

In relation to the current SKNLP leader and opposition leader, Dr. Denzil L. Douglas (Parliamentary Representative for Constituency Six), Dr. Drew described him as his "mentor" and "friend" whom he has had the opportunity to observe and learn from.

"I really don't want anyone to think there's any animosity between the comrade leader and myself; none whatsoever. There's no animosity between us and so people must understand that. And so I with him, had the opportunity to sit with leaders of countries, to sit with organisations in commerce and business and so forth, to sit with who are considered the top of the top in this world and I have had the opportunity to watch him and learn from him how he operates at these levels because one of the things I recognise is that Dr. Douglas has different levels of



He said the 50% discount has been introduced to help farmers currently experiencing challenges from the recent shortage of animal feed that is crippling sectors across the region.

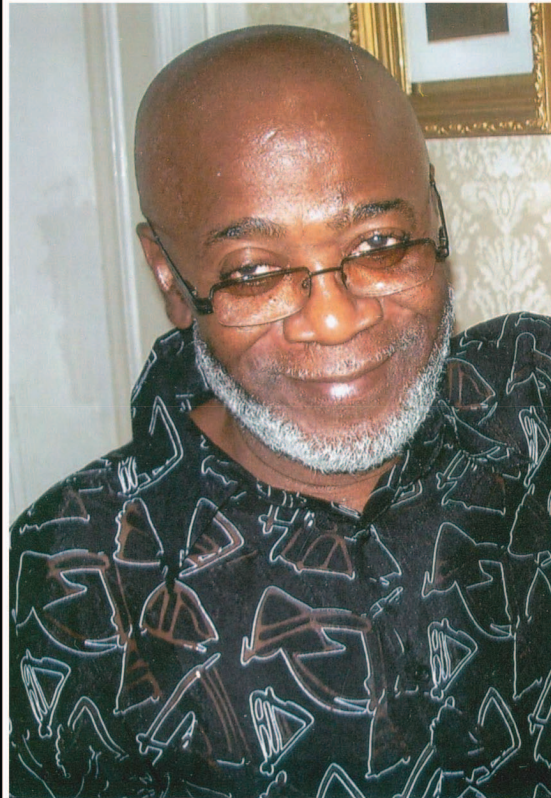
Permanent Secretary Collins along with other senior officials in the Ministry recently met with poultry and livestock farmers in efforts to provide further support to these farmers.

The consultations were held to provide alternative arrangements to source feed, given the delays in shipment caused by the reroute of vessels hampered by the current supply chain disruptions.

The 50% reduced rate on animal feed is set to run until December 31st 2021.

Basseterre, St. Kitts, October 29, 2021 (RSCNPF): Autopsies have been performed on the bodies of 21-year-old Shaheem Farrell of Church Ground and 23-year-old Xavia Howell of Braziers Estate. The autopsies were conducted by Resident Pathologist, Dr. Adrian Nunez, on October 28, 2021.

Dr. Nuñez concluded that Farrell's death was caused by hypovolemic shock as result of a single gunshot wound to the neck and that Howell's death was caused by severe head injury as result of a single gunshot wound to the head.

Investigations into the matter are ongoing.

Court To Stanley Knight: Do Not Commit Any Other Offences

Basseterre, St. Kitts, November 03, 2021, (RSCNPF): Jailed public figure 57-year-old Stanley Knight of Dorset Village, found guilty of indecent assault, was warned by the court not to commit any other offences at his recent sentencing.

Information coming from the police public relations department indicates that on October 29, 2021, Knight was given a suspended sentence of two years imprisonment.

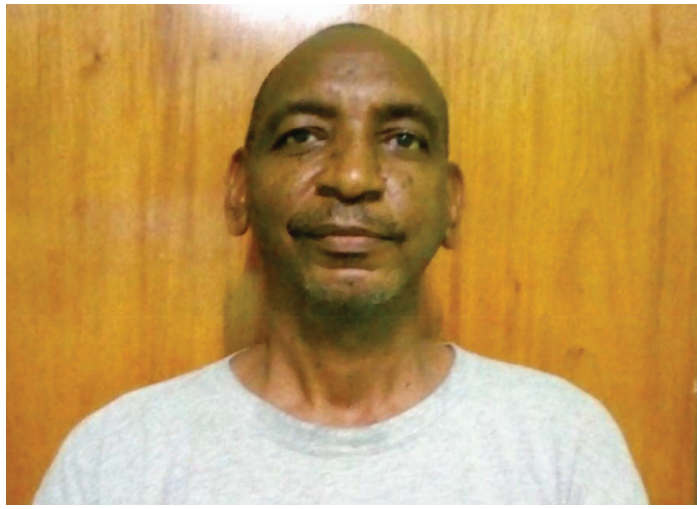
"He must not commit any offences during the next two years starting from October 29, 2021, or the two (2) years of imprisonment will be served, with one-third given off for good behavior. He is also to pay compensation of \$10,000 through the court in three (3) months. Failure to pay in the time given would result in him serving six (6) months in prison. No time will be given off the six (6) months," part of the police statement read.

On Monday 27th September 2021, Knight, an immediate past Permanent in the Ministry of Sports, Youth and Culture was found guilty of the offence of Indecent Assault by a majority verdict of 10-2 for the offence which was committed on October 31, 2018.

CHARGES LAID FOR ITEMS SMUGGLED INTO PRISON

He received those charges on October 27, 2021. Hutton was also charged for the offences of Possession of Cannabis and Possession of Cannabis with Intent to Supply. Those charges were laid on October 29, 2021.

All of the offences were committed on October 25, 2021. He has been remanded to Her Majesty's Prison.

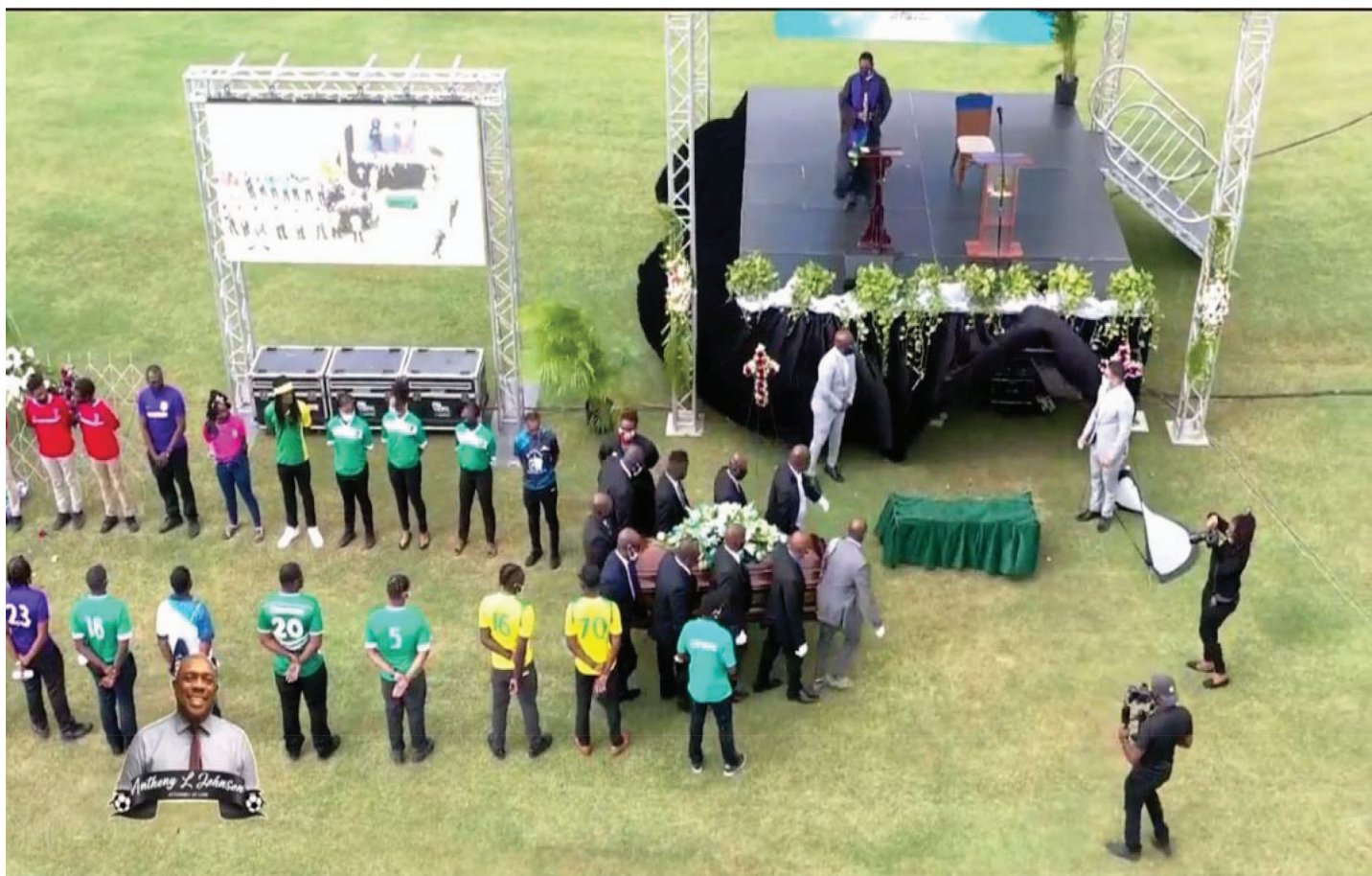

Anthony Johnson Gets Flowers For Being “so many things to so many different people”

BASSETERRE, St.Kitts (Thursday 4th November 2021)-Well known public figure, 54-year old attorney-at-law and former President of the St.Kitts-Nevis Football Association (SKNFA)

Anthony Lesroy Johnson was laid to rest following a ceremony which featured what appeared to be a marathon of sentiments shared in the presence of scores of individuals from all walks of life who gathered at the Warner Park Football Stadium on Tuesday 2nd November 2021 for the funeral service.

His son Shabazz Johnson, in delivering the eulogy, expressed “I’m still trying to figure out how he was so many things to so many different people. Everywhere I go, I’m now bombarded with persons reminiscing on the kind acts experienced through his hands...”

A highlight of the service was a song tribute done by well-known entertainer Maurice ‘EK’ Flanders of Real Right Entertainment with a rendition of the tune ‘People Like You’, originally done by reggae artiste Gramps Morgan. Many people found the song to be a fitting in saluting the type of person Johnson was.

responsibility as fathers, my father embraced his with reverence. This is a well-known fact. Despite the hard shell of male egos that tend to complicate relationships at times, our mutual love was never in question. The sacrifices associated with my own personal development will always be remembered.”

He continued: “While he was a father to me, he was a father figure to countless others, a friend, a mentor, a sponsor. I’m still trying to figure out how he was so many things to so many different people. Everywhere I go, I’m now bombarded with persons reminiscing on the kind acts experienced through his hands, whether it be the fellows who met me the other day and said ‘Boy, you farda is who buy us we set ah bikes enuh’. They could even remember the brand new box that they came in, and any male would remember that was a particularly touching event for them as a child craving such a gift.”

Attorneys, footballers, fete goers, vendors, performers and politicians were included on the list of those whose lives his father touched.

“Whether it’s the senior attorneys who would recall the support and advice given during their time as juniors right up to their seniority or the formal steps taken to first or even second their bar call. Whether it be the footballers, the referees and other members of the football fraternity who he became bonded to through a mutual passion for the sport whether it be the aspiring or seasoned politicians whose success could be attributed to his mentorship, orchestration and influence. Whether it be the fete goers, the vendors, the performers that were able to smile at the end of an Inception Fete or a Breaking Dawn event, whether it be the persons who experienced his heartiest laughter or a simple greeting in passing, he was never afraid to sacrifice.”

Shabazz shared: “I must admit it was often difficult at times to support all of his various ambitions knowing that it came with a direct cost to his personal health. It was never easy witnessing firsthand the detrimental effects of many missed meals as a result of a busy schedule but at the end of it, it’s as though servitude to others is what made him happy; it’s what he lived for.”

He continued: “He strived to help everyone but found it sometimes difficult to help himself. He clearly had a goal to reach to the top but on his way up, he never left out anyone; forever down to earth. He led by example through his tireless work ethic, through his unshakeable integrity, through his deep faith in God and his intense love for family and friends. It’s no wonder then that my father had no shortage of people who loved and truly cared for him. It’s a telling testament of his character.”

Shabazz recalled their conversation

“I’ve heard up there the streets are made of gold, And when you get there, there’s a hand to hold, I believe when your days down here are through, There’s a place up there for people like you,” are the lyrics of the chorus.

Shabazz told that his father was “born into humble circumstances” on the 12th March 1967 to mother Suzanna Agatha Johnson who became famous for her homemade tamarind jam, sugar cake and other treats which were a hot sell in her local Newtown community. His father Cedric Edmond Johnson was a linesman at the sugar factory and a part-time butler, who succumbed to sudden ill in 1979.”

“Perhaps it was this humble beginning that manifested into his desire to remain humble while achieving great things. He would often recount some of his life lessons fed to him by his extremely supportive mother. For instance: ‘Don’t grudge nobody for dey tings - cause you don’t know how dey get it.’ Despite his humility, he was firm in his beliefs,” he stated.

He talked about his father’s twenty-five (25) year legal career which spanned the borders of Tortola, BVI to St.Kitts-Nevis and even to Montserrat.

“The pinnacle of his legal career saw him pool together a formidable force in the firm of Johnson and Associates, and while he wasn’t physically with us yesterday to celebrate the highly anticipated fifth anniversary, his core values of honesty and integrity will remain with each and every member of the firm,” he noted.

According to Shabazz who is also a lawyer, his father took on the role of boss as if though we were all his children, standing by to celebrate every birthday, every anniversary, every childbirth, every wedding. In fact, while many males shy away from their

Combating cybercrime in the postpandemic era: Taiwan can help

In 2020, the COVID-19 pandemic ravaged much of the globe. In mid-May 2021, the Republic of China (Taiwan) saw a sudden rise in case numbers. When Taiwan needed help the most, partners such as the United States, Japan, Lithuania, the Czech Republic, Slovakia, and Poland, as well as the COVAX Facility, global allocation mechanism for COVID-19 vaccines, immediately pledged to donate or provided vaccines to Taiwan, allowing Taiwan to gradually bring the pandemic back under control. This is a testament to the international joint efforts to tackle the serious challenges brought about by the pandemic. The same joint efforts will be needed to address growing international cybercrimes in the post pandemic era, and Taiwan is willing to be part of that effort.

Increasing importance of cyber technology in the wake of the pandemic

Throughout the pandemic, Taiwan government agencies and private companies have closely followed antipandemic policies to prevent cluster infections. People began working from home and schools adopted virtual learning. Consumers turned to e-commerce, and online food ordering and delivery service platforms flourished. The pandemic has led to these changes in our lives, and while it is sure to abate in the foreseeable future, the spread of cyber technology will not. It has fundamentally altered the way we work, live, learn, and relax - resulting in an entirely new lifestyle.

However, our increased reliance on cyber technology has also made it easier than ever for criminals to exploit security vulnerabilities to commit crimes. Thus, cybersecurity will be one of the most important issues in the postpandemic era as it is essential to maintaining public safety worldwide.

Cybercrime transcends borders; transnational cooperation is the key.

As cybercrime transcends borders, victims, perpetrators, and crime scenes may be located in different countries. The most common cybercrime is telecom fraud, which utilizes the internet and other telecommunications technologies. Transnational cooperation is necessary to bring international crime rings to justice.

In 2020, Taiwan police used big data analytics to identify multiple Taiwan nationals who were suspected of establishing telecom fraud operations in Montenegro. Taiwan contacted Montenegro and proposed mutual legal assistance, enabling the Montenegrin Special State Prosecutor's Office to move forward with the case. Through joint efforts, Taiwan and the Montenegrin police forces uncovered three telecom fraud operations and arrested 92 suspects accused of impersonating Chinese government officials, police, and prosecutors. It is believed that the suspects scammed more than 2,000 people in China, causing up to US\$22.6 million in financial losses. This case highlights the features of transnational crime. The suspects were Taiwan nationals, while the victims were Chinese nationals. The alleged crime occurred in Montenegro and was perpetrated with telecommunications technologies. Thanks to bilateral police cooperation, the suspects were apprehended, preventing other innocent people from falling victim to the scam.

Child and youth sexual exploitation is another internationally condemned crime, with countries worldwide making every effort to prevent it and bring perpetrators to justice. In 2019, Taiwan police received information from the US National Center for Missing and Exploited Children's virtual private network Cyber Tipline indicating that a South African citizen in Taiwan was suspected of having uploaded large

quantities of child pornography to the internet. Following the lead, Taiwan police quickly located the suspect and searched his residence, seizing evidence of child pornography. Police also found photographs and videos of him sexually assaulting Taiwanese children. The illicit images were stored on servers located in the United States, and the alleged crimes were committed in Taiwan. As the victims in this case were under age, they were too young to adequately explain the situation or seek assistance. If Taiwan police had not received the leads, the suspect would likely have continued to assault more children. This case owes its success to transnational cooperation and criminal intelligence sharing, which can effectively curb crime.

Cybercrime involves cross-border investigations. However, jurisdictions and definitions of crimes vary among law enforcement agencies worldwide. Criminal rings understand this all too well and exploit the resulting information barriers, fleeing to other countries to decrease the likelihood of being caught. Like COVID-19, cybercrime can strike individuals in any country. Therefore, just as the world has joined forces to combat the pandemic, countering cybercrime requires the cooperation of international police forces assisting and sharing information with one another. Only then can more crimes be prevented and more cases be solved efficiently, allowing people worldwide to enjoy a safer life.

Taiwan police authorities have long strived to promote international cooperation in combating cross-border crime. In 2020, there were three prominent cases. Through the joint efforts of Taiwan, Vietnam, and the United States, transnational telecom fraud call centers were raided in January; the following month, a US currency counterfeiting ring was discovered; and 12 individuals suspected of involvement in human trafficking and violation of the Child and Youth Sexual Exploitation Prevention Act were arrested in July.

Taiwan police authorities have a specialized High Technology Crime Investigation Unit and professional cybercrime investigators. The Criminal Investigation Bureau (CIB) under the

National Police Agency of the Ministry of the Interior, also established a Digital Forensics Lab that meets international standards. The laboratory was issued the world's first ISO/IEC 17025 accreditation for Windows Program Analysis by the Taiwan Accreditation Foundation. In 2021, the CIB standardized its malware analysis procedures, in addition to establishing file analysis and network analysis mechanisms. Taiwan's expertise in combatting cybercrime will benefit global efforts to build a safer cyberspace.

Taiwan can help create a safer world.

The COVID-19 pandemic has underscored the fact that diseases transcend national borders and it can affect anyone - regardless of skin color, ethnicity, language, or gender. Distrust, disagreements, and a lack of transparency between nations accelerated the spread of the virus. Only when international partners provide mutual assistance and share antipandemic information, expertise, and vaccines can the world overcome the pandemic faster and successfully.

The Global Policing Goals were endorsed by INTERPOL member countries in 2017, with the stated purpose of creating a safer and more sustainable world. With this mission in mind, we must work together to combat crime - just as we have joined forces to combat the pandemic. No police agency or country should be excluded. To fight cybercrime and bolster global cybersecurity effectively, the world needs to cooperate. Taiwan needs the world's support and Taiwan is willing and able to help the world by sharing its experience.

As the entire world teams up to combat the pandemic this year, we urge the international community, in the same spirit, to support Taiwan's bid to attend the INTERPOL's General Assembly as an observer this year and participate in INTERPOL meetings, mechanisms, and training activities. Taiwan's pragmatic and meaningful participation would help make the world a safer place for all.

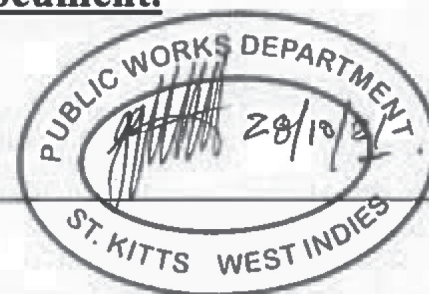

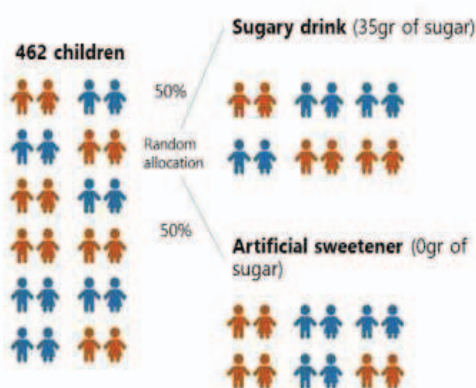

A new study in Health Economics finds that sugary drinks impact behavior and math scores of preschool children.

In the study, investigators randomly assigned 462 children to receive sugary drinks or artificially sweetened drinks, and they collected data before and after consumption.

Consuming one sugary drink tended to induce an initial 'relaxing' effect for boys, before making them more restless. Girls' behavior was not significantly affected.

Also, consuming one sugary drink seemed to have a negative effect on student achievement in math for boys and a positive effect for girls.

"Our study is the first to provide large-scale experimental evidence on the impact of sugary drinks on preschool children. The results clearly indicate a causal impact of sugary drinks on children's behavior and test scores," said corresponding author Fritz

Taiwan Could See US\$10 Billion In Investment By American Construction Behemoth Bechtel

Company sees Taiwan as full of potential opportunities and a great base for operations in Southeast Asia.

TAIPEI (Taiwan News) - Bechtel anticipates at least US\$10 billion in investment opportunities in Taiwan over the next 10 years, according to the company's head of Asia-Pacific operations, Richard W Freer.

The US' largest construction firm aims to capitalize on opportunities in the market as Taiwan aims to end nuclear energy by 2025 and reach net-zero emissions by 2050, according to Nikkei Asia.

In particular, Freer is eyeing opportunities in Taiwan's liquefied natural gas sector, which is one of the largest in the world, he told Nikkei in an interview.

Bechtel moved its regional headquarters from Shanghai to Taipei in 2019 to not only better position itself to take advantage of new openings in Taiwan but also in markets across Southeast Asia, a region that is witnessing a rapid increase in new energy projects.

The company is involved in the Australia-Asia PowerLink, one of the world's largest renewable energy projects, according to a Reuters report put out last month. Starting in 2027 the project will carry energy from a mega solar farm in Australia's sunny Northern Territory to Singapore.

Bechtel also expects tech manufacturing projects to boom across the region as more companies shift production out of China and into Southeast Asia, Freer told Nikkei. He added that his company is also leveraging its expertise in its home market to advise Taiwanese manufacturers looking to set up shop in The US as Washington pushes forward with its plans to revive the country's industrial base.

Freer indicated the new developments at Bechtel are a continuation of a long string of projects it has undertaken in Taiwan over the past few decades, which has given the company a deep familiarity with the country's business environment.

In the past Bechtel also worked on Google data

centers and Formosa Plastics petrochemical plants.

Bechtel feels at home in Taiwan and has a broad base of operations here, he said, adding that the high transparency of the

government's procurement process is a clear strength.

Heading The Ball Is Linked To Cognitive Impairment In Retired Professional Footballers - New Research

The potential long-term neurological effects of concussions and other knocks to the head in professional sport have attracted significant attention and research interest over recent years.

Confirmation in 2014 that former England footballer Jeff Astle died as a result of chronic traumatic encephalopathy (a form of dementia) - and that it was caused by regularly heading the ball - ignited a furore on the risks of this practice in particular.

New guidelines introduced this year limit the number of higher force headers professional English footballers are allowed to make each week in training to ten. These are usually headers following a long pass (more than 35 metres) or from crosses, corners or free kicks.

Similar guidelines had already been adopted across all children's football leagues in The UK. But the question remains: do headers really cause dementia?

Recent work carried out at The University of Glasgow by neuropathologist William Stewart and his team analysed the death certificates of Scottish men. They found higher rates of dementia among former professional footballers compared to the general population, with ex-footballers about 3.5 times more likely to die from a neurodegenerative disease, such as that which causes dementia, than men who didn't play football professionally.

Subsequent to that he worked in Dr Nunzio Pomara's Geriatric Psychiatry Division (at The Nathan Kline Institute for Psychiatric Research), and became a Research Assistant Professor in The School of Medicine (Center of Excellence on Brain Aging) of New York University. There he developed an interest in neuroscience and began researching brain ageing, Alzheimer's disease, and dementia. His research interests are in memory and neurodegenerative disorders. From 2016 to 2021 he served as Senior lecturer at LJMU, and in 2021 assumed his current appointment as Reader. Dr Bruno joined The Conversation on 11 September 2018.

Dr Andrew Rutherford, PhD, studied for his BSc(Hons) in Psychology (1980), and carried out his research for his PhD in Psychology (1986) at The University of Glasgow. Following graduation he took up a Post-Doctoral Research Fellowship in The Department of Psychology at Nottingham University, to work on cognitive aspects of "Stress". Next he moved to a similar position in The School of Mechanical, Materials and Manufacturing Engineering (also at Nottingham), on a research project (which he had co-authored) examining operators' mental models of advanced manufacturing processes, including robot movement. At the end of that research project he assumed a temporary lectureship on cognitive ergonomics (cognitive psychology applied to work situations) in the same school, and also held a part-time lectureship in human-computer interaction at de Montfort University. Dr Rutherford next became a Senior Lecturer in Psychology at The University of Keele, but in September 2017 he went into early retirement and assumed an appointment as Honourary Research Fellow in The School of Psychology. His main areas of research are: memory (particularly encoding and retrieval processes); the data analytic techniques of general and generalized linear modelling; and the neuropsychological consequences of football play, especially those related to football heading. The possibility that football head injury may be a risk factor in the early onset of dementia is a recent focus for his team's research. Dr Rutherford joined The Conversation on 15 February 2017.

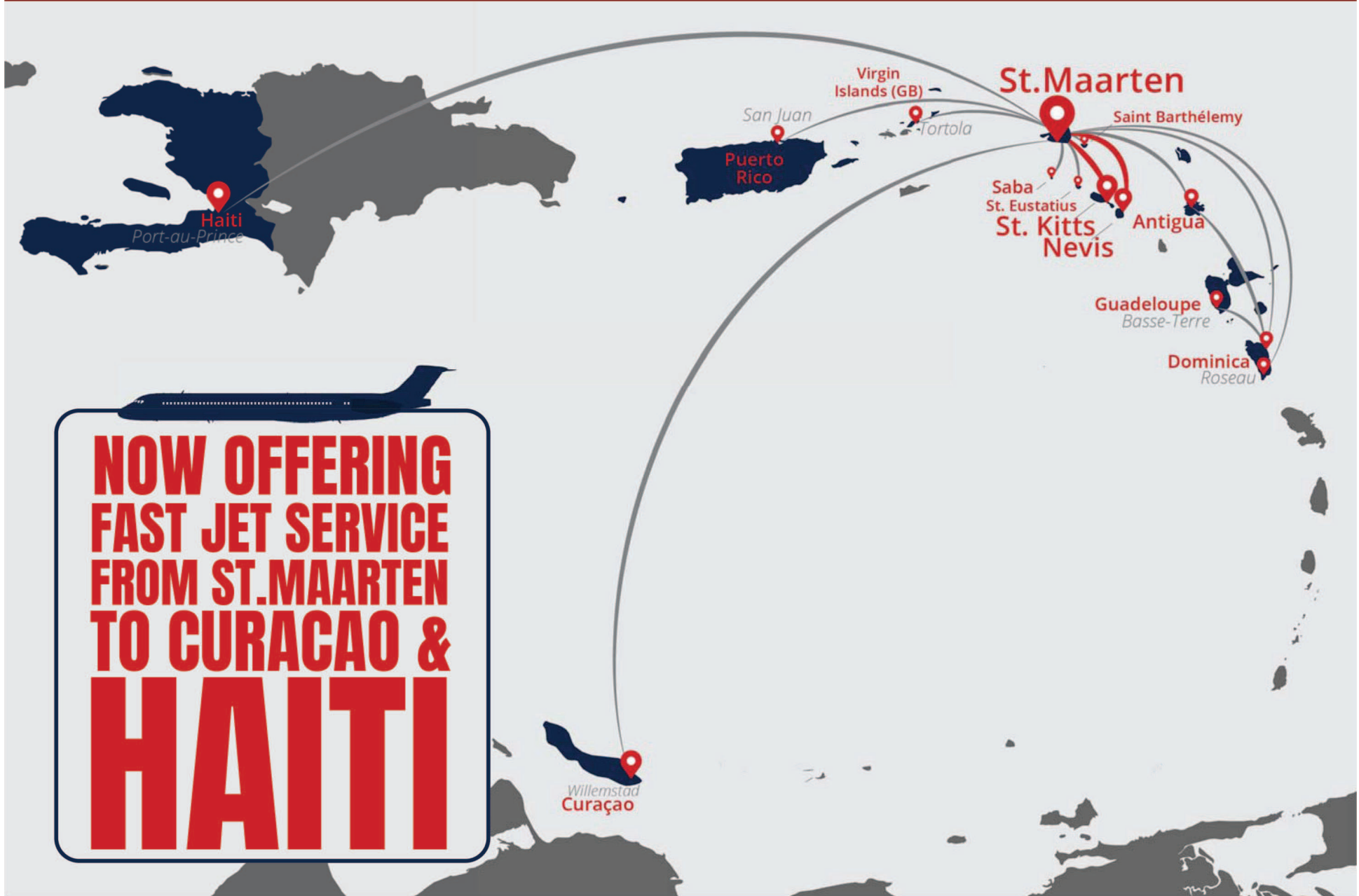
