## Editorial

# From Panama to Pandora

In 2016, the world was treated to the release of what became as 'The Panama Papers' a literal 'Treasure Trove' of documents which revealed the many ways in which the ultra-rich, wealthy and famous conceal their enormous holdings duck paying taxes in their home countries, and thereby depriving the citizens of immeasurable amounts of money that would have gone towards the development of their people and respective countries.

The papers had been accessed by several organisations of investigative journalists and showed how lawyers, accountants and other business professionals based in Panama City, Panama designed and made use of offshore corporate entities to serve their clients in their efforts to dodge all kinds of taxes levied in their countries.

Documents numbered in the tens of millions, and covered periods of more than twenty years. The identities of these involved stunned people everywhere especially in the underdeveloped countries. In particular, they showed how politicians, big business owners and other highly placed individuals had been able to deceive those whom they always claim to represent.

Particularly revealing was the number of 'leaders' of poor countries who were involved in the schemes. Millions of ordinary people were shaken to the core, and they lost all confidence in those who when campaigning, offered themselves to serve the people and being desirous of doing all manner of things to help the same people and make their lived better.

Once in office, it very quickly became clear that for so many of them, their real interests are in themselves, their relatives and a few friends of theirs. The votes of

the electorate were but a means to their very selfish (and self-centered) ends.

For most of us here in our beloved little country of St.Kitts and Nevis, the most hurtful affect of it all was the number and kinds of black African 'leaders' who were involved.

Now comes another disclosure, this time consisting of an even larger trove of documents and contents likely to have wide ranging repercussions. The very labelling, "The Pandora Papers" forewarns of what is likely to follow, especially when one recalls that when Pandora opened the box of mischievous no one was able to put them back in, or even to close the box. We shall just have to wait and see.

People of St.Kitts and Nevis should take no comfort in the fact that our country has not been identified, at least not yet should that be the case. But we are not in the clear. The island of Nevis in particular has been under international scrutiny for decades, and when the 'bubble' is pricked, it is very likely that there will be much weeping and wailing and gnashing of teeth.

St.Kitts, too, will most likely come in for its full share. Remember, dear people, the many warnings which have been given about the Citizenship by Investment programme, as operated

under the current government. That time appears to draweth nigh. So, too, does information about the money laundering scheme which was operated out of a certain consulate in Costa Rica.

Perhaps events currently ongoing in Dubai will feature in this new saga. But all of this, we the people of St.Kitts and Nevis, need to exercise precautions, especially as intolerance is at an elevated level and persons are being removed from the airwaves simple for exercising the very democratic rights and freedoms which the current administration has been publicly criticised for abusing in so many ways before getting into got into power.

Watch out people of St.Kitts and Nevis, watch out! The combination of 'Panama and Pandora' does not bode well for us. It is very much the case that time is indeed longer than twine, and whatsoever one sows, that is exactly what one will reap.

From 'Panama to Pandora' should open the eyes of us all.

# Arrested Video Blogger Says Evidence Video Is Missing

**BASSETERRE, St.Kitts (Friday 8th October 2021)**- Romnage 'Shaq' Benjamin of Shadwell, a well-known social media video blogger who is former police officer, has publicly reported that his live recorded Facebook video about an incident involving him, which is before the court, has "mysteriously disappeared."

In keeping with his social media style of news reporting and commentary, on Sunday 3rd October 2021, he posted a video on his Facebook page a day before his first court appearance whereby he talks about the missing video issue following the 20th August 2021 incident.

"Strange enough what baffles me is that the first video from the 20th of [August] mysteriously disappeared from my Facebook account... Now, I went back on my Facebook page to look at the video to get some information... and guess what? the video [is] gone, Benjamin states.

"Now, I did not receive any notification from Facebook that I would have violated any of their community rules or anything... but the video mysteriously, mysteriously gone...but it's a good thing I have backups so let them delete this one here," he added as the backup footage plays in the background of his video presentation.

In that 20th August footage, Benjamin captured his own arrest while on Church Street

in Basseterre during his coverage of a 'KITTITIAN LIVES MATTER peaceful walk' event using his phone.

He had accused a female senior police officer of "looking a reason to arrest me" during his live taping.

"I can't walk behind of the police! Imagine that! All over the world, you see persons are reporting information; bringing information to the people and they are recording also but here in St.Kitts, none of that!...She is looking a reason to arrest me "I cannot walk behind the police, I cannot video [tape]. All around the world persons are videoing, sharing the information but no not here in St.Kitts. St. Kitts is unique!," he was heard saying.

A police statement issued on Wednesday 25th August informed that Benjamin and two females namely Annivea Hutchinson of St. Paul's and Pretha Thom of Dorset Village "were charged, and subsequently received bail as a result of an illegal gathering that occurred on August 20, 2021."

Benjamin received a total of ten (10) charges- for the offences of Obstruction; Taking Part in a Public Procession Without the Written Permission of the Chief of Police; Taking Part in a Public March in the Daylight Without a Permit; Taking Part in a Prohibited Procession; Behaving in a Manner with Intent to Provoke a Breach of the Peace and Attending a Mass Gathering to wit a Public Procession.

He was also slapped with five (5) additional charges for similar offences committed on August 02, 2021.

On August 23, Benjamin received bail in the sum of \$15,000 with two (2) sureties. His bail conditions are that he is to report to the Basseterre Police Station every Monday between 6 a.m. and 6 p.m. and that any breach of the peace will result in the revocation of bail.

Likewise, the two females received bail the same day with the same conditions.

Benjamin, on Wednesday 25th August said in a video posted that his two phones were in police custody.

This media house had seen that 20th August video that spanned over 30 minutes, showing no less than 11,000 views and over 300 shares.

# Juvenile Gets Questioned In Deadly Headshot

**BASSETERRE, St.Kitts (Thursday 7th October 2021)**- Police say a juvenile is in custody assisting with the investigation into an incident in which 34-year-old Kishaun Ritchen of Newtown was fatally shot.

Such information comes in accordance with a press release issued on Wednesday 6th October 2021.

An autopsy performed on Ritchen's body on 29th

September by Resident Pathologist Dr. Adrian Nunez concluded that death was as a result of severe head injury due to a single gunshot wound to the head.

Local authorities had revealed in a first report that close to 8 p.m. on Thursday 23rd September, police officers responded to a report of a shooting incident in Newtown.

Upon arrival, Ritchen's motionless body was found lying in Agatha Johnson Lane.

Preliminary investigations so far have revealed that Ritchen, and another individual, were walking along the Lane when a masked gunman ran up

behind him and shot him.

He was pronounced dead at the scene by the District Medical Officer.

The scene was processed by personnel from the Forensic Services Unit and several items of evidential value were taken into custody.

Persons with information regarding this matter are urged to contact the Violent Crimes Unit by dialling 467-1887, 467-1888, 662-3468, their nearest Police Station or the Crime Hotline at 707 where information can be given anonymously. Investigations into the matter are ongoing.

# Zack Talks Positive Feelings After Death Rumour

**BASSETERRE, St.Kitts (Thursday 7th October 2021)**-A death rumour about public figure Winston ‘Zack’ Nisbett better known as ‘De Doctor of Culture’ has awakened his mindset about life and the people around him in positive and uplifting ways.

Such were the sentiments he shared when interviewed by this reporter on Wednesday 6th October 2021.

For him, he has been experiencing a moment of ‘receiving his flowers while he can still smell them’ as the popular saying goes, and is grateful for the outpour of love and support from individuals who have expressed happiness and relief that he still on the land of the living.

Upon answering his cellphone, Nibsett’s early on conversation was about him being out and about to buy some refreshment beverages for visitors to the Zack’s Historical-Cultural Library and Museum located at Buckley’s Estate.

The well-known cultural

preservationist also spoke excitedly about his ongoing visits to primary schools whilst adding that teachers and students have shown happiness to see him, especially during visits this week in light of that dark rumour.

“I’m elated... the response from people is overwhelming. When these things happen you get to know who is there for you, and I have been told not to take it lightly. People are still calling [me on my phone].”

He also spoke about an interaction he had while shopping at the nearby Best Buy supermarket in the community where he resides saying: “I went in Best Buy, and one of the cashiers she called me and said ‘Zack come over on this side’. When I got to her said she: ‘I feel so good I see you that’s why I said come over here. Come let me give you a hug’.”

When sked what he has to say the public about his energy level and mindset at this point, he expressed: “It energizes me more. It gives me the impetus to do more. You’ll see a lot more action out of the Doctor of Culture.”

As it relates to how the rumour got started, Nisbett suspects that it appears to have come about following the recent death of his “good friend” who carried the nickname ‘Doc’. However, in recalling some of the details linked to the rumour which he heard, he commented: “Some people are malicious; you can’t go with them.”

As gathered, the rumour led him to getting numerous calls from relatives, friends and well-wishers both at home and overseas.

According to Nisbett, in walking the streets while the rumour had been buzzing, he has heard persons making remarks as he passed like: ‘Me arm! How dey say he dead?!’

# NEOC Official: Hotel Rapid Testing Could Lessen Burden On Public Health Officers

**BASSETERRE, St.Kitts (Thursday 7th October 2021)**-Hotels in St.Kitts-Nevis offering rapid COVID-19 test services to guests as well as 24-hour and 48-hour quarantine and testing periods are among the recommendations agreed upon following recent discussions between hoteliers and the local officials.

“We will await the decision of the federal cabinet to advise the next regulations hopefully,” stated the task force chairman Abdias Samuel, who is of the view that testing at hotels would help current challenges and ease the burden on public health officers.

In speaking at the National Emergency Operations Center (NEOC) COVID-19 Daily Briefing on Wednesday 6th October 2021, he gave details stemming from the meeting which he said was one of the engagements for the past week to “discuss a number of matters that are affecting their service and their business.”

“One of the areas that would have been highlighted is the reduction in the quarantine period and I must inform you that several recommendations are before the members of the cabinet at this time for us to have the quarantine period reduced. There are recommendations of 48 hours and tests and 24 hours and testing. We will await the decision of the federal cabinet to advise


the next regulations hopefully,” he explained.

According to Samuel: “The Ministry of Health also would have agreed-represented by the Acting CMO [Chief Medical Officer] Dr. [Cameron] Wilkinson and others and the HEOC... we were notified at the task force level that indeed, we would also assist the hoteliers by allowing the hoteliers to be able to contract the services of the labs and having certified doctors and nurses conduct the swabbing of their guests we project would help us with the current challenges as well as easing the burden on our public health officers who are working extremely hard.”

Samuel outlined that in discussions with the hoteliers, the departure tests was also discussed.

“So as it is right now for you to depart the Federation depending on the destination you are going to, most destinations are requiring tests. Various destinations have varying requirements. For

example, some destinations would accept the rapid test, antigen test, PCR test etc. so we have now been in discussions with the hoteliers”

He said Dr. Wilkinson would have begun his discussions with the various labs “because eventually, in order to have an easement and also to enhance the experience of our guests and our tourism product, we are of the view that persons who will be departing the Federation should be able to undergo a rapid test or antigen test based on the destination and the acceptance of the destination going forward.”

Samuel continued: “So I think that is some welcoming news for the hoteliers so rather than having to do a PCR test to depart the Federation of St.Kitts and Nevis, you should be able now to do a rapid test, antigen test etc. So these are some of the recommendations that we accepted and have agreed upon; that’s the National COVID-19 Task Force in collaboration with the Ministry of Health and also supported by the Cabinet members.”

He echoed a statement by Dr. Wilkinson in hoping to have the WHO-approved test administered in St.Kitts-Nevis.

## Nevis Premier welcomes new 24-hour quarantine for international travelers

**NIA CHARLESTOWN NEVIS (October 07, 2021)-**

Premier Hon. Mark Brantley, Minister of Tourism in the Nevis Island Administration (NIA), has welcomed the new 24-hour quarantine protocol for international travelers in the hopes that the eased restriction would be the impetus needed for tourists to return to Nevis.

The government of St. Kitts and Nevis published Statutory Rules and Orders (SR&O) No. 38 of 2021 on October 06, which states that effective October 07, 2021, all arriving travellers who are fully vaccinated against the COVID-19 virus shall remain in a government approved COVID-19 hotel or quarantine facility or private residence certified by the National

COVID-19 Taskforce for a period of 24 hours, and a COVID-19 test sample would be taken within that period, and upon receiving a negative RT-PCR test shall be released from quarantine.

The previous SR&O stipulated a four-day quarantine period for fully vaccinated travelers.

Mr. Brantley said, "This is a welcomed development which allows Nevis to say to the world that it is truly now open for tourism business again. With this announcement we are hopeful that we can now have a good winter season and regain the economic momentum that we have lost to this pandemic. Our hoteliers are all happy at this announcement and we have taken a giant leap forward to restoring normalcy to our island."

Mr. Brantley is keen to see the many tourism industry workers who lost their jobs due to the COVID-19 pandemic return to work as soon as possible.

"I think this will be a shot in the arm for the tourism industry. A property like Four Seasons has indicated quite clearly that they are in a position to take on people if they can get the groups that they have scheduled to come."

Visitors to Nevis can vacation in place at any of the island's four travel-approved hotels- Four Seasons Resort, Golden Rock Inn, Montpelier Plantation & Beach, and Paradise Beach- and be free to explore the island 24 hours after arrival.

## UK eases COVID-19 quarantine, testing rules for fully-vaccinated travelers from St. Kitts and Nevis

**N I A CHARLESTOWN NEVIS (October 07, 2021) - -** Fully-vaccinated persons traveling from St. Kitts and Nevis to the United Kingdom will enjoy much-eased COVID-19 quarantine and testing requirements effective October 11, 2021.



Hon. Premier Mark Brantley, Minister of Foreign Affairs for St. Kitts and Nevis, says the UK's new policy will come as a major relief for persons in the Federation traveling to the UK and vice versa.

"I feel that this is a huge win for diplomacy for St. Kitts and Nevis as the UK government has today (October 07, 2021) announced that they will revise their travel system and that incoming passengers from St. Kitts and Nevis will as of October 11 be treated the same as incoming UK passengers. This means that they have recognized our vaccination program as being world-class.

"I believe that this now opens up the possibility of greater travel to and from the UK for our people and allows greater freedom for those from the UK to come and visit, and so we anticipate having robust visits from the UK for our upcoming tourism season," he said.

The Foreign Minister commended St. Kitts and Nevis High Commissioner to the United Kingdom, His Excellency Kevin Isaac in London and all of the officials in the Ministry of Foreign Affairs including Permanent Secretary Ms. Kaye Bass, who have been actively engaged on this matter.

According to the UK government, effective October 11, fully-vaccinated travellers coming from St. Kitts and Nevis will be required to quarantine for only two days and can now replace the day two PCR tests with cheaper rapid tests. They will no longer need to take pre-departure tests.

Previously travellers from the Federation were required to take a COVID-19 PCR test 24-72 hours prior to arrival from a CLIA/CDC/UKAS approved laboratory and had to vacation in place at a Travel Approved hotel for at least five days.

St. Kitts and Nevis is one of 47 destinations benefitting from the UK's revised COVID-19 quarantine travel rules.

#### SYMPTOMS

- The most common symptoms are fever, tiredness, and dry cough.
- Others are aches and pains, nasal congestion, runny nose, sore throat and/or diarrhea.
- Symptoms are usually mild and begin gradually.
- It can take up to 14 days for symptoms to appear.

#### TRANSMISSION

- Droplets from nose or mouth when infected people cough and exhale.
- Standing within one meter of an infected person.

# New rules aimed at ensuring racehorses do not enter food chain

Racehorses entered to run in Great Britain will have to be signed out of the food chain from January, BBC Sport can reveal.

The British Horseracing Authority (BHA) rule change will mean horses cannot be sent to abattoirs in exchange for money to be slaughtered for food.

Transporting horses to an abattoir to be sold for consumption was "not an approach that we should tolerate in our sport" and should not be "classed as euthanasia", said BHA director of equine health and welfare James Given.

In July, a BBC Panorama investigation found that 4,000 former racehorses - some once owned and trained by prominent figures in the industry and most trained in Ireland - were slaughtered in Great Britain and Ireland since the beginning of 2019.

Indicative data held by racing authorities suggests 12% of those would have been killed in Great Britain.

Given explained that one of the main reasons for the rule change was so that all racehorses could be treated with the most appropriate drugs if they were injured on a racecourse.

At present, any horse not signed out of the human food chain cannot be given certain drugs, such as painkiller phenylbutazone, or 'bute'.

From next year horses will still be able to be sent to an abattoir as a method of being put down humanely, but can no longer be sold for food.

The rule was proposed in January by the BHA's veterinary committee, but needed approval by the organisation's board and rules committee, which came last month.

It applies to all domestically trained runners in Great Britain, and will mean entries are not accepted if it has not been declared - via the Weatherbys app and the horse's passport - that the horse is not intended for human consumption.

The intention is for it to cover international runners, and the BHA is currently liaising with other jurisdictions.

However, a leading welfare charity warned that this was not the "welfare panacea it might appear" and warned an "underground trade" could still enable people to circumvent the rules.

Given told BBC Sport: "There are a number of welfare issues [behind this]. I think it is a great development.

"It follows on from work that was done last year by the Horse Welfare Board developing euthanasia guidelines and a decision-making tree to help people with what is a very difficult time.

"The four cornerstone stakeholder groups were all consulted and all unanimously agreed that this was the right and proper thing to do, and of course the Panorama programme highlighted even more its necessity."

In a statement, he added: "The transporting of horses to an abattoir to be sold for consumption should not, in my view, be classed as euthanasia and is not an approach that we should tolerate in our sport, which is why a rule preventing this practice is a positive step.

"I am confident that most British trainers and owners agree with me on this and already observe this principle."

Covert recording in the Panorama investigation raised concerns about the way horses were being killed at one of the UK's biggest abattoirs.

Other issues that were highlighted included horses being transported hundreds of miles from Ireland and some

carrying career-threatening injuries.

The abattoir, Drury and Sons, told Panorama they "take great care to maintain high welfare conditions and do not accept any form of animal abuse".

World Horse Welfare chief executive Roly Owers told BBC Sport: "This is an interesting development but like any change, it needs to avoid unintended consequences.

"Signing horses out of the food chain is not the welfare panacea it might appear and it will be important for the BHA to monitor the impact of this change and to act where necessary.

"Equally this change will make the need for lifetime responsibility and traceability for all former racehorses ever more important as the slaughterhouse will no longer be an outlet.

"And until there is a robust digital equine identification system there is still a risk that some racehorses will be entered into the food chain fraudulently in an underground trade that we know carries grave risks for equine welfare."

**BRIDGETOWN, Barbados - October 5, 2021:** The Caribbean Development Bank's (CDB) President, Dr Gene Leon will host the Prime Minister of Barbados, Hon. Mia Amor Mottley, as his featured guest on the second edition of The President's Chat scheduled for Friday October 8, 2021, at 11:00 am (AST).

The President's Chat is a discussion programme which the CDB launched earlier this year to promote high level dialogue on issues of regional significance between the Bank's President and thought leaders and decision-makers. Greenpeace argued in Scotland's highest civil court there had been "a myriad of failures in the public consultation" and the permit did not consider the climate impacts of burning fossil fuel.

The Court of Session ruling means operations will continue at the field. Greenpeace plans to appeal.

The UK government welcomed the outcome.

It follows a two-day hearing into the case last month.

Production from the development started in November after BP was granted approval by the Oil and Gas Authority (OGA) in 2018.

Greenpeace oilfield challenge 'opportunistic'

Judges urged to halt North Sea oilfield

Greenpeace said it was the first time an offshore oil permit had ever been challenged in court and that if it had won, the case would have had huge ramifications for other sites, such as the planned Cambo field off Shetland.

Ruth Crawford QC for Greenpeace said UK Business Secretary Kwasi Kwarteng had been "deprived" of information about the environmental impact of the development.

Ms Crawford said Greenpeace wanted proper public participation in important developments such as the Vorlich oilfield.

Roddy Dunlop QC, representing the UK government, said the challenges advanced by Greenpeace were "largely procedural and opportunistic".

Jim Cormack, representing oil firms BP and Ithaca, had previously told hearing that the challenge was "highly significant" and if the original decision was overturned, production from the field would have to stop until new consent could be obtained.

### 'Ongoing demand'

He said the works for which consent was granted had been implemented by BP and Ithaca at a cost of about Â£230m and the project was fully operational and in the production phase.

Three judges at the Court of Session - Lord President Lord Carloway, Lord Menzies and Lord Pentland - rejected Greenpeace's case.

The UK government said in a statement: "We welcome today's judgment which upholds the environmental decisions made by the Offshore Petroleum Regulator for Environment and Decommissioning.

"While we are working hard to drive down demand for fossil fuels, there will continue to be ongoing demand for oil and gas over the coming years as we transition to lower carbon, more secure forms of energy generated in this country."

John Sauven, Greenpeace UK executive director, said: "We will not give up the fight for the climate. Our intention is to appeal this ruling before the Supreme Court."

Ithaca said in a statement that it welcomed the decision handed down by the Court of Session to dismiss the appeal raised by Greenpeace.

# Newcastle takeover: Amnesty International urges Premier League to change owners' and directors' test

Amnesty International has urged the Premier League to change its owners' and directors' test "to address human rights issues" amid the Saudi Arabian-backed takeover of Newcastle United.

Approval for the takeover from the Premier League could come on Thursday.

A consortium would be in control of the club, not the Saudi state.

The state has been accused of human rights abuses, which Amnesty International says must be a factor in deciding whether the takeover proceeds.

"Instead of allowing those implicated in serious human rights violations to walk into English football simply because they have deep pockets, we've urged the Premier League to change their owners' and directors' test to address human rights issues," said Sacha Deshmukh, Amnesty International chief executive.

"The phrase 'human rights' doesn't even appear in the owners' and directors' test despite English football supposedly adhering to Fifa standards. We've sent the Premier League a suggested new human rights-compliant test and we reiterate our call on them to overhaul their standards on this.

"As with Formula One, elite boxing, golf or tennis, an association with top-tier football is a very attractive means of rebranding a country or person with a tarnished reputation. The Premier League needs to better understand the dynamic of sportswashing and tighten its ownership rules."

The Public Investment Fund (PIF), which is set to provide 80% of funds for the £300m deal and would be the majority owner, will be seen as separate to the state and therefore allow the takeover to pass the Premier League owners' and directors' test.

However, Crown Prince Mohammed bin Salman is also the chair of PIF - he was accused of ordering the death of journalist Jamal Khashoggi, which the Kingdom's leader denies.

Khashoggi's fiancée, Hatice Cengiz, has also urged the Premier League not to allow the move to go through, citing the involvement of the crown prince.

It is believed a resolution came after Saudi Arabia settled an alleged piracy dispute with Qatar-based broadcaster beIN Sports, which owns rights to show Premier League matches in the Middle East.

But sources have told BBC Sport that an agreement between the Premier League and the consortium was found prior to the news emerging on Wednesday.

With PIF deemed a separate entity, that, and any piracy issues, are no longer an impediment to the takeover in the Premier League's view.

Many Newcastle fans want current owner Mike Ashley to leave the club after a 14-year reign, which they believe has been plagued by a lack of investment and ambition.

The Premier League and Newcastle have declined to comment.



While the Embassy continues to provide emergency and mission-critical nonimmigrant visa services, these appointments are extremely limited. Routine visa services will resume as soon as possible but the Embassy is unable to provide a specific date at this time.

If the U.S. Embassy is unable to honor an appointment, applicants will receive an email providing instructions on how to reschedule their appointment for a later date.

If a MRV fee was paid, it will remain valid until September 30, 2022. MRV fees are non-transferable. The U.S. Embassy cannot accept MRV fees from outside our consular district.

The Embassy continues to process Interview Waiver (IW) and Renewal Interview Waiver (RIW) cases. The eligibility of this program was recently expanded, and applicants MAY now qualify to renew their visa by mail. To find the qualification to renew a visa by mail, please scroll to the additional RIW information below which details all eligibility criteria.

### Emergency Requests

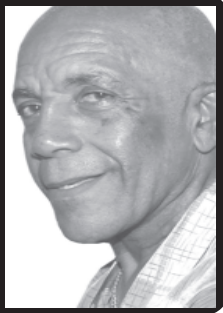

# Newcastle United takeover: How did it happen? What is the vision? What about Steve Bruce?

**Newcastle are 19th in the Premier League with three points - via three draws - from seven games**

**If you see #cans trending on social media in the next 48 hours, it is Newcastle United fans who will be responsible.**

The hashtag is a reflection of their joy, and getting the beer cans in, as a **£300m Saudi Arabian-backed takeover bid has finally reached a conclusion.**

The fact it has now happened after 18 months is a complete shock, too. Last week supporters were celebrating when they learned of a January arbitration date.

Now one of the most complicated takeovers in the league's history is over, fans can dream of a brighter future. It will be a future without owner Mike Ashley and one in which the club can compete with Europe's biggest teams thanks to the billions the Saudi Public Investment Fund (PIF) can provide.

There are many issues still to resolve, however. How will Saudi Arabia's human rights record reflect on the club? Will the Premier League explain how it came to a resolution with the consortium? How much money will Newcastle have to spend? And what of manager Steve Bruce?

For a fanbase and club which has lurched from one drama to another in the past two years, at least there is now a blank page.

## How did the takeover happen?

No-one was expecting the takeover to be completed this week.

The best anyone could have hoped for was January 2022, when arbitration between the consortium, led by financier Amanda Staveley, was scheduled in an attempt to settle a row with the Premier League about who would have control at the club.

The Saudi state has been accused of human rights abuses and was recently embroiled in a copyright row, which would have made it tricky for the takeover to go through based on the Premier League's owners' and directors' test.

So what the consortium needed to do was prove that the Kingdom's PIF, which would provide 80% of the money for the takeover, was separate to the state. Difficult, perhaps, when the ruling leader Crown Prince Mohammed bin Salman is also listed as PIF's chair.

## Newcastle's 14 years of lost hope under Ashley

But with legal assurances provided, that has happened. It is understood there will be consequences if those agreements are broken. The consortium can also demonstrate how PIF already invests in companies, including the McLaren F1 team, without state control.

The precursor to news of the takeover going through on Wednesday was Qatar broadcaster beIN Sports saying it had resolved its dispute about Premier League football matches being broadcast illegally in Saudi Arabia.

By proving there is separation between the Saudi state and PIF that issue becomes immaterial. But after claims that beIN had pressured the Premier League into blocking the takeover, the timing was interesting nonetheless.

## How have fans reacted?

Newcastle have had an average attendance of 48,366 at their three Premier League games this season

There is no doubt the vast majority of fans are celebrating the Saudi Arabian-led takeover, no matter the potential distractions

that come with it.

A Newcastle United Supporters' Trust (NUST) survey said this week that 93.8% of its members were in favour, down from 97% last year, and owner Ashley is told to "get out of our club" at nearly every match.

The situation has become toxic this season. Newcastle are winless, second bottom in the Premier League and the same fans' survey said 94% want Bruce to leave "in the best interests of the club".

The takeover, they hope, will wash away their pain. PIF's assets of £250bn dwarfs the wealth of Manchester City's Abu Dhabi owners and Paris St-Germain's Qatari owners, and can conjure up images of signing the likes of French World Cup winner Kylian Mbappe or recruiting Antonio Conte as a replacement for Bruce.

"Fans are absolutely delighted that the disastrous 14-year reign of Ashley is almost over," says Greg Tomlinson of NUST. "They are looking forward to having hope and belief in their football club for the first time in many years.

"We don't demand that the club is winning trophies next season. We just want growth and a football club that gets better. Fans have been beaten into the ground."

How will Newcastle manage human rights concerns?

Despite the Premier League's insistence that PIF is separate from the Saudi state, human rights organisations and campaigners still believe the connection is clear.

Amnesty International has urged the Premier League to change its owners' and directors' test "to address human rights issues".

Its UK chief executive Sacha Deshmukh said: "Ever since this deal was first talked about we said it represented a clear attempt by the Saudi authorities to sportswash their appalling human rights record with the glamour of top-flight football.

"Saudi ownership of St James' Park was always as much about image management for Crown Prince Mohammed bin Salman and his government as it was about football."

Other campaigners have told the BBC that the issue will not go away, even though the takeover is complete.

Lina al-Hathloul, whose sister Loujain was held in prison for protesting about women's right to drive, says protests could occur at St James' Park, which would "embarrass" Saudi Arabia.

Tomlinson says: "Clubs are bought and sold at the highest level by billionaires and sovereign states, and we have not had a say in that. But as a supporters' organisation we will always support inclusion and be against discrimination and abuse of human rights.

"We will use our influence to effect change where we can."

Managing the public relations of a Saudi Arabian-backed takeover will be a key item in the consortium's in-tray, and will likely continue long after the deal is completed.

But the country has already shown its capacity to handle those issues when hosting fights for British heavyweight Anthony Joshua, the Spanish Super Cup and an F1 grand prix set for 2023.

### What vision do the new owners have?

Backed by the wealth of PIF, the consortium is also made up of Staveley's PCP Capital Partners and British property investors the Reuben Brothers, who are also billionaires, so there is no shortage of money.

Staveley, who is from Yorkshire, has spoken in the past of her admiration for Manchester City, having been involved in the Abu Dhabi takeover 13 years ago. But she has also previously urged

caution about lavish spending, preferring to highlight how City's owners have invested in the city of Manchester.

So there is hope from locals that the Newcastle owners follow a similar template.

From a club perspective, one of the first items on the 48-year-old's agenda will be overhauling the structure of the club and improving its communications with supporters.

Ashley is rarely heard from, and any communication from senior figures often comes in the form of statements from managing director Lee Charnley, who is Bruce's go-to man when it comes to transfers.

But there is no chief executive tasked with running the club, there is no director of football and Bruce is the public figure who has to face weekly questions about everything from legal cases to lack of funds for players, which led to huge frustration in the summer.

## What now for Bruce?

Steve Bruce has won 29 of his 96 games as Newcastle manager, and averages 1.17 points per match

Bruce, a Newcastle fan himself, says he "only wants what's best for the club, and if that means a takeover, then great".

But with the new owners seeking to establish a bond with supporters, the 60-year-old's position will be under serious threat. Without any ability to sign players until January, a new big-name manager would signify their intent.

Staveley praised former Newcastle boss Rafael Benitez when she first made her move for the club in 2018. But the Spaniard has made a fine start with Everton this season. Other fans have said they would like former Juventus, Italy and Chelsea manager Conte, who is available.

Other managers on the market include former Chelsea boss Frank Lampard and former Sheffield United manager Chris Wilder. Current coach Graeme Jones could also work as an interim replacement.

After a poor start to the Premier League season, the most important objective will be maintaining the club's top-flight status.

But for a lot of fans the future suddenly looks brighter.
