Tourism Authority CEO: ‘It’s Very Hard But We Are Trying’

BASSETERRE, St.Kitts (Wednesday 15th September 2021)- Chief Executive Officer of the St. Kitts Tourism Authority Raquel Brown has highlighted ongoing efforts to attend to challenges of the cruise industry on the topic of economic generation for service providers.

“I could truly understand one ship coming in and persons needing to have that economic generation, and it’s very hard. I know it’s very hard... We are doing our best to really work with our tour operators, our taxi operators and our tour companies to bring them on line and when we get the green light, we’re going to incorporate. It is not our decision to incorporate; we have to work with the Task Force and the success of what happened yesterday and other ships.”

She was at the time speaking during an interview session on Wednesday 15th September 2021 on the ‘Island Tea’ morning show aired on WINN FM which came the day after the call of Celebrity Equinox at Port Zante, the first vessel to make such a docking there after an 18- month gap due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Port Zante was a bubble area for that call, which some individuals publicly criticized putting in place that type of measure.

“Yesterday, I count it as a success and story of hope, and hope means that we are able to move forward and really allow for other brands that are larger than the first that returned -Sea Bourn Odyssey- a success.”

Brown continued: “It’s not been easy because we’ve not been able to integrate back all of our stakeholders that enter the tourism industry for cruise; it’s been very difficult. It’s a phased approach just as we have with stayovers. Unfortunately, when cruise resumed in June we did not resume, and there was going to be a

phased approach ... and we would have hoped that by this time in September we would have gone through the phased approach or trials along with the Task Force and the Ministry of Health, and you would of have more persons working because we would have had which we do now more persons vaccinated.”

Brown also stated that there were also no tours to Nevis during the ship’s visit because all of the tours did not make it for travel approved.

“So I understand that it’s very very hard and we’re working with the Nevis Authority and the Nevis Island Administration and the Ministry of Tourism also, and we are trying...” she added.

In addressing current challenges, she pointed out that: “Unfortunately cruising did not resume and many persons-tour operators, tour companies, we’ve had several meetings with them from as early as March explaining with push back and understandably... that we would have had to have bubble vaccinated tours for this to work because at the time, the cruise lines were only allowing vaccinated persons and they were also not allowing persons outside of pre-booked tours-the tours that they actually sell.”

According to her: “Since

then we’ve seen many back and forth between the CDC [Centres for Disease Control and Prevention] and Governor DeSantis in Florida come to fruition and where we are now is that Governor DeSantis won the court ruling against CDC in respect of home porting from Florida which is why we only have few calls from Caribbean ports, and also unvaccinated persons could come.”

The Tourism Authority CEO said cruise cannot resume without vaccination.

“In June we were nowhere near above 70 percent of persons having their first shot and 66 percent of persons in the Federation having their second shot. We cannot resume cruise without vaccination.

For those persons who are going on the cruise ship as of right now until December 31st, the facts are this: By the ruling of the CDC, persons 12 and over must be fully vaccinated by either the one-dose series or the two-dose series so we do have to have vaccinated persons. Those persons who are under 12 are children.

“For us it has been a lot of back and forth with cruise lines to ensure the security and the success of cruise,” she noted.

In addressing some persons questioning why bubble vaccinated sites, Brown said: “We need to protect both the Federation-all of our persons who work in the tourism industry and their families so that we don’t create further strains on the health system then we hear we have to close down cruise for a while. That’s not our intention; it doesn’t work, they can go to other ports, and we’ve seen that for the last three months when we did not have ships here because of some challenges we have now to overcome. So we have to ensure that we preserve cruise because we understand what it means to the economy. It’s not been easy but at this point in time.”

She spoke about the antigen test for vaccinated travelers that is now allowed and for the unvaccinated the RT-PCR test, both of which are required within 72 hours of travel.

“It is a requirement and it is something that everyone has to keep safe,” Brown shared.

Negotiation Taking Place About Live Audience For Sugar Mas 50

BASSETERRE, St.Kitts (Wednesday 15th September 2021)-Chairperson of the St.Kitts-Nevis National Carnival Committee Shannon Hawley has indicated that negotiation is currently taking place in relation to hosting of shows with live audience for Sugar Mas 50 whereby individuals can be to be socially distanced amidst the COVID-19 pandemic.

Appearing live on ZIZ Radio on Wednesday 15th September 2021 during 'The Morning Show' with G-Cue, she touched on what can be expected this time around for carnival.

"What I've said in the past is that we'll build on the virtual experience that we created last year. This is not only because of COVID but the intention is to get as many people regionally and internationally logged on to St.Kitts-Nevis National Carnival. It's a way of promoting our national carnival. So the hope is to build on that virtual experience but it is also our hope to be able to have a live audience for the shows and that's something we're working out and we have to work out with both the task force and the Royal St, Christopher and Nevis Police Force."

Hawley continued: "Yes, we're in negotiation. We think that we have the opportunity to social distance for a pageant. There is no mix and mingling and jumping up. It's a whole different atmosphere, and we think that once we find a venue that is suitable enough to accommodate individuals who are socially distanced then we would make that presentation, and continue our negotiations with the Task Force."

Hawley's main reason for her in-studio appearance at ZIZ radio that morning surrounded the promotion of the royal reveal of this year's contestants for the Miss National Carnival Queen Pageant and the National Swimsuit Competition, slated for Wednesday 15th September and Thursday 16th September, respectively.

As explained, in keeping with the tradition, individuals applied and for the selection process, a series of auditions were done and the top five contestants were chosen thereafter.

Hawley in speaking about the usual well-anticipated National Carnival Queen described this year's contestants as "beautiful" but also added that they are "popular" saying this year they are "like the top of the top so we're really excited for the reveal of the National Carnival Queen contestants tonight..."

Further talking about the excitement surrounding the public reveal presentations, the carnival chairperson had this to say: "So for the next two days the public will get an idea, they'll be able to get a feel...to say 'Yes, that's the one, that's my girl', and follow these contestants on the road to Sugar Mas 50 so we're really looking forward to this."

"*Sugar Mas 50! Fun, Vibe, Energy!*" is the 2021-2022 theme.

Police are reporting that Allister Forde of Middle Island has been charged for the offences of Possession of Firearm and Possession of Ammunition.

As informed by the Police Public Relations Department, officers found one (1) Taurus G2C 9mm pistol, two (2) magazines and ten (10) 9mm rounds of ammunition in Forde's bag when he was searched at a vehicle checkpoint at the Southeast Peninsula on September 03, 2021.

Forde was charged on September 06, 2021, and has been remanded to Her Majesty's Prison.

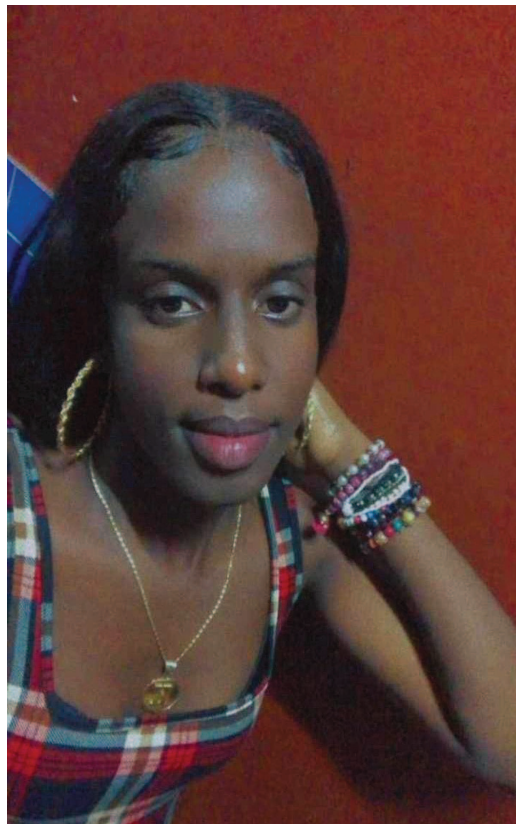
Driver Charged With Dangerous Driving In KK's Death

BASSETERRE, St. Kitts (Wednesday 15th September 2021)- A 35-year-old driver has been charged for the offence of Causing Death by Dangerous Driving concerning 21-year-old Keniqua 'KK' David of Saddlers Village.

Information from the Police Public Relations Department via a statement issued on Wednesday 15th September 2021 said on Tuesday, September 14, 2021, Kellian Hazel of St. Paul's was arrested and charged for the offence of Friday 27th August which killed the front seat passenger after the vehicle crashed into a container chassis in Bird Rock close to 1:00 am.

It was also reported that he was granted bail that same day in the sum of



\$50,000 with two sureties. His bail condition is that he is to report to the Dieppe Bay Police Station every Thursday between 6 a.m. and 6 p.m.

Notably, a police update in this matter comes days after David's funeral held on Friday 10th September.

"Severe craniofacial trauma as a result of a motor vehicular accident" was the findings of an autopsy performed by Resident Pathologist Dr. Adrian Nunez on Wednesday 1st September.

The deceased young mother was a front seat passenger of a vehicle that crashed into a container chassis in Bird Rock on Friday 27th August 2021, of which

she was a passenger.

Police say the accident involved motor jeep P6667, which is owned and was being driven by Hazel.

Investigations revealed that Hazel exited the parking lot of a club in Bird Rock and collided with a 40ft container chassis.

David was extricated from the vehicle by the St. Kitts and Nevis Fire and Rescue Services.

Both Hazel and David were transported to the JNF General Hospital via the Emergency Medical Service. Hazel was treated and discharged for injuries to his hand while David succumbed to her injuries close to midnight on August 27.

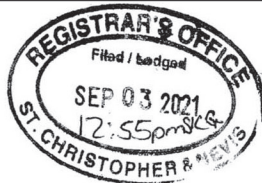

Haiti PM Fires Prosecutor Seeking Charges Against Him In President's Killing

HAVANA, 14 September (Reuters) - Haitian Prime Minister Ariel Henry on Tuesday replaced the chief public prosecutor who had been seeking charges against him as a suspect in the assassination of President Jovenel Moise, plunging the country into a fresh political crisis.

Moise was shot dead on 7 July when assassins stormed his private residence in the hills above Port-au-Prince. The 53-year old had been governing by decree for more than a year after Haiti failed to hold legislative and municipal elections amid a political gridlock and had faced many calls to step down.

His death has left Haiti in an even deeper constitutional and political crisis as it has only a handful of elected officials nationwide.

Henry, a political moderate and neurosurgeon whom Moise named prime minister just days before his death in an attempt to reduce political tensions, has sought to forge a new consensus between different political factions.

But allegations over his possible involvement in Moise's killing are now overshadowing that.

Prosecutor Bed-Ford Claude said last week that phone records showed Henry had twice communicated with a man believed to be the mastermind behind Moise's killing on the night of the crime.

That suspect, a former justice ministry official whom Henry has publicly defended, is now on the run.

Henry dismissed his request to discuss the matter as politicking and did not respond to the allegations.

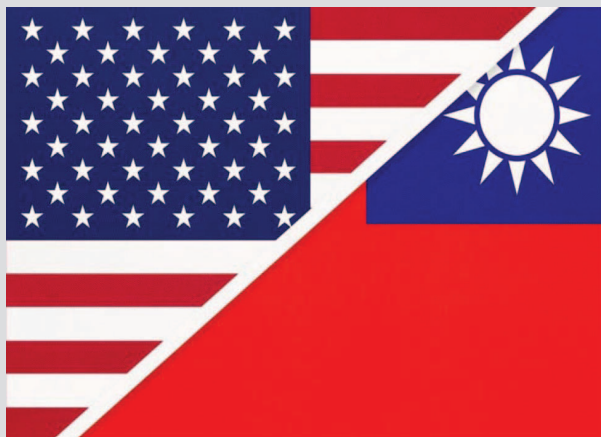
That prompted Claude to write on Tuesday to the judge overseeing the investigation into Moise's slaying and ask him to charge Henry as a suspect.

Biden 'Seriously Considering' Taiwan Office Name Change

Some involved in discussions fear name change would 'exacerbate tensions' between China and US.

TAIPEI (Taiwan News) - The Biden administration is reportedly considering allowing Taiwan officials to include "Taiwan" in the name of its de facto embassy in the US capital.

The Financial Times on Saturday (11 September) cited multiple sources as stating that the White House is "seriously considering" granting a request by Taiwan to change the name of its representative office in Washington, DC from the "Taipei Economic and Cultural Representative Office" (TECRO) to the "Taiwan Representative Office."

According to the sources, White House Asia adviser Kurt Campbell supports the name change.

The proposed change also reportedly has "wide support" within the National Security Council and

among State Department Bureau of East Asian and Pacific Affairs officials.

However, sources cautioned that a final decision has not yet been made, and that Biden must sign the request in the form of an executive order.

Two sources familiar with the matter said that a major "sticking point" during the internal White House discussions is whether the name change would be a "symbolic gesture" that would only serve to "exacerbate tensions between China and both The US and Taiwan for little real gain."

One person involved in the decision-making process stated that Taiwan had brought up the possibility of changing the name during the Trump administration but that Taipei did not submit a formal request until two months after Biden had taken office.

During a press briefing on Friday (10 September) a reporter asked State Department Spokesperson Jalina Porter if such a name change is indeed in the works. Porter responded that she did not have an announcement to make on the matter, but she stressed that "our support for Taiwan is rock solid, and we remain committed to keeping our ties with Taiwan."

If the name change is approved China is expected to respond with vitriol, as it has been orchestrating a campaign to stifle Taiwan's status as a separate country.

In July Taiwan announced that it would open a representative office in Lithuania called the "Taiwanese Representative Office in Lithuania."

China responded by recalling its envoy from Vilnius and imposing sanctions on the Baltic country.

He also wrote to Haitian migration services ordering them not to let the prime minister leave the country "due to serious presumption relative to the assassination of the president".

Later on Tuesday, a letter from Henry to Claude dated 13 September emerged in which he said he was firing him for "grave administrative error", without going into detail. In a separate letter dated 14 September he named Frantz Louis Juste to the post.

It remains unclear whether the order actually is valid as Haiti's 1987 constitution mandates that the prosecutor can only be appointed or fired by the president, a position that remains vacant.

SEEKING POLITICAL STABILITY

Decades of political instability as well as natural catastrophes have plagued Haiti's development. Its aid-dependent economy is the poorest in the Americas, more than a third of Haitians face acute food insecurity, and gangs have turned swathes of the capital into no go areas.

Claude had invited Henry on Friday to meet with him to discuss the phone calls with the suspect, noting that he could only summon the premier on presidential orders, but the country was without a president.

Haiti's Office of Citizen Protection demanded on Saturday Henry step down and hand himself over to the justice system.

Henry retorted on Twitter that "no distraction, invitation, summons, maneuver, menace or rearguard action" would distract him from his work.

The prime minister announced on Saturday that Haiti's main political forces had reached an agreement to establish a transition government until the holding of presidential elections and a referendum on whether to adopt a new constitution next year.

The agreement establishes a Council of Ministers under Henry's leadership.

A constituent assembly made of 33 members appointed by institutions and civil society organizations will have three months to prepare the new constitution.

Moise's own attempts at holding elections and a constitutional referendum were attacked for being too partisan. Critics called them veiled attempts at installing a dictatorship.

His supporters said he was being punished for going after a corrupt ruling elite and seeking to end undue privileges.

What Happens When Your Foot Falls Asleep?

An exercise physiologist explains how it's a problem of communication between your brain and your body.

Question: What happens when your foot falls asleep? - Helen E, age 8, Somerville, Massachusetts

Imagine you've just sat down to watch your favourite TV show. You decide to snuggle in with your legs crisscrossed because you find it more comfortable that way.

When the episode ends, you try to stand up and suddenly your right foot isn't working. At first you just can't move it, then it feels like it has pins and needles all over it. For a minute or two it feels uncomfortable and weird, but soon enough you are able to stand up and walk around normally.

What just happened?

I'm an exercise physiologist - a scientist who studies what happens to our bodies when we move and exercise. The goal of much of my research has been to understand how the brain talks to and controls the different parts of our bodies.

When your foot falls asleep, there is something wrong with the communication between your brain and the muscles in that area.

Every time you decide to move your body, whether it's standing up, walking around or playing sports, your brain sends signals to your muscles to make sure they move correctly. When the brain is unable to talk with a muscle or groups of muscles, some weird things can happen - including that part of your body getting that weird falling-asleep sensation.

It usually starts with a sense of numbness or tingling in that area. This sensation, which people often also call "pins and needles," is technically known as paresthesia.

Some people mistakenly think a lack of blood flow causes this feeling. They imagine the "asleep" feeling happens when your blood, which carries nutrients all over your body, is unable to get to your foot. But that's not right.

When your foot falls asleep, it's actually because the nerves that connect the brain to the foot are getting squished thanks to the position you're sitting in. Remember, it's these nerves that carry messages back and forth to let your brain and your foot communicate with each other. If the nerves have been compressed for a little while, you won't have much feeling in your foot because it can't get its normal messages through to your brain about how it feels or if it's moving.

Once you start to move around again, the pressure on the nerves is released. They "wake up" and you'll start to notice a "pins and needles" feeling. Don't worry, that feeling will only last

Chinese Ambassador To UK Barred From Parliament

LONDON (AP) - China's ambassador to Britain has been barred from Parliament and told he could not enter the building for a talk he was scheduled to give on Wednesday.

Commons Speaker Lindsay Hoyle said Tuesday it was not "appropriate" for the Chinese ambassador, Zheng Zeguang, to enter Parliament because China imposed sanctions against seven British parliamentarians over their criticism of Beijing's human rights record.

Zheng was due to attend a reception in the House of Commons organized by a cross-party parliamentary group on China.

John McFall, Hoyle's counterpart in the upper chamber, the House of Lords, agreed that the scheduled meeting "should take place elsewhere, considering the current sanctions against members."

China imposed sanctions on seven British politicians in March, including senior Conservative lawmakers Iain Duncan Smith and Tom Tugendhat, who have spoken out against China's treatment of its Uyghur minority in the far-west Xinjiang region.

The move came shortly after Britain, The US, Canada and The European Union sanctioned Chinese officials over Xinjiang.

The sanctioned parliamentarians welcomed the ban, saying allowing Zheng in the Parliament building would have been "an insult."

The Chinese embassy in The UK condemned the move and said it will harm the interests of both countries.

"The despicable and cowardly action of certain individuals of the UK Parliament to obstruct normal exchanges and co-operation between China and The UK for personal political gains is against the wishes and harmful to the interests of the peoples of both countries," the Chinese embassy said in a statement.

Now comes the important question: Is this dangerous?

Most of the time, when your foot, or any other body part, falls asleep, it is temporary and nothing to worry about. In fact, since it lasts for only a minute or two, you may not even remember it happened by the end of the day.

Even though it's not causing any permanent damage, you might still want to avoid the uncomfortable feeling that comes when your foot falls asleep. Here are a couple of tips that may help:

- Switch your position often.
- Don't cross your legs for very long.

- When you are sitting for a long time, try standing up every so often.

- You probably can't 100% prevent your foot from ever falling asleep. So don't worry when it happens every once in a while. It'll go away pretty quickly - and maybe it can remind you of all the important brain messages your nerves are usually transmitting without your even noticing.

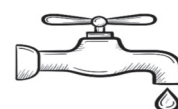

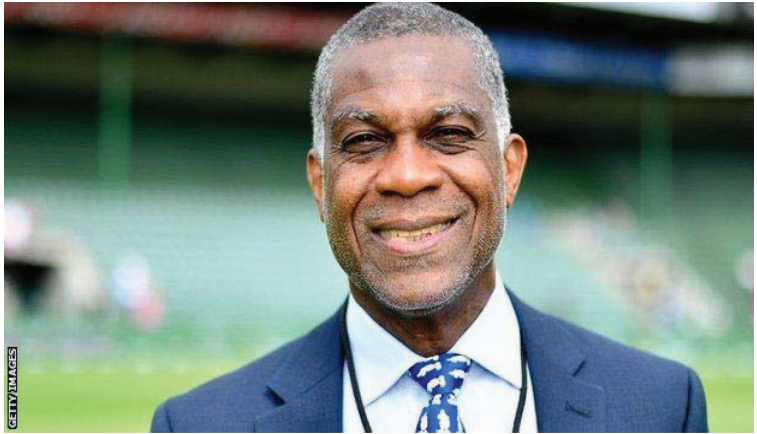

Michael Holding: West Indies great retires from commentary

Michael Holding has been involved with international cricket as a player and official since 1975

Michael Holding has retired from cricket commentary after more than 30 years in broadcasting.

Holding worked for Sky Sports for more than 20 years having retired from playing in 1987 with 391 international wickets.

The 67-year-old Jamaican is considered one of the greatest fast bowlers in history.

He was famous for his smooth run-up that earned him the nickname 'Whispering Death'.

Away from cricket, Holding has recently gained praise and attention for his anti-racism campaigning.

During an England v West Indies Test match in July 2020, Holding spoke on Sky Sports about the Black Lives Matter movement and the players from both sides taking the knee before play.

The footage gathered attention across the world and on social media.

He went on to publish a book called 'Why We Kneel, How We Rise' about racism and features other famous sportspeople such as Usain Bolt, Naomi Osaka and Michael Johnson.

Lasith Malinga: Sri Lanka bowler retires from T20 cricket to end career

Sri Lanka seamer Lasith Malinga, the most successful bowler in Twenty20 international history, has retired.

The 38-year-old, a World Twenty20 winner in 2014, took a record 107 T20 international wickets at 20.79 apiece.

He played only T20 internationals, having retired from Tests in 2011, one-day internationals in 2019 and franchise cricket this year.

In a video on social media, Malinga thanked his former team-mates and the teams he

has represented.

"I've had many experiences throughout my career, and I want to share all of my experience in the future, especially with young cricketers," he said.

Malinga, who last played a T20 for Sri Lanka in March 2020, was left out of the squad for the T20 World Cup starting on 17 October.

Known for his slinging action and accurate yorkers, Malinga took 390 wickets at an average of 19.68 in 295 games in all T20 cricket - a tally bettered only by Dwayne Bravo, Imran Tahir and Sunil Narine.

That included 170 wickets in the Indian Premier League, where Malinga won the title with Mumbai Indians in 2013, 2015, 2017 and 2019.

Malinga, who made his international debut in 2004, is also Sri Lanka's third highest wicket-taker in ODIs with 338.

He is the only bowler to take three hat-tricks in ODI cricket, and four wickets in four balls on two occasions.

He took 101 wickets at 33.15 in 30 Tests.
