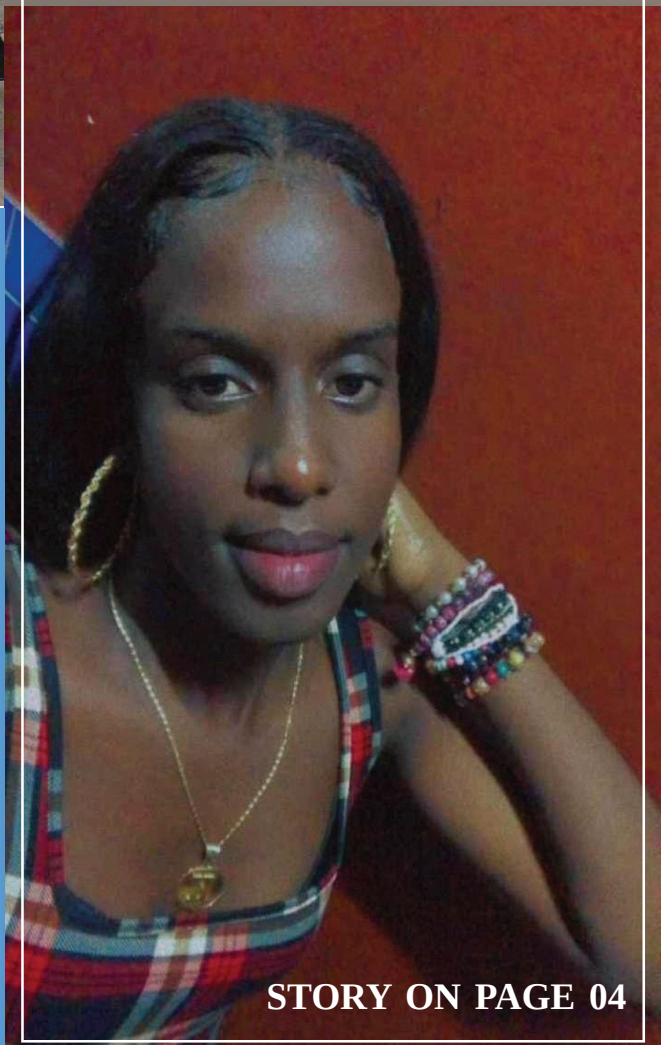

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Editorial

In The Crippling Grasp Of Corruption

Last month the African country of Zambia (formerly the British colony of Northern Rhodesia) held general elections. Mr. Hakainde Hichilema was returned as the new president, replacing Mr Edgar Lungu, who had held that office since 2015.

On Wednesday Mr. Hichilema told The BBC that he had inherited an "empty" treasury, with "horrifying" amounts of money having been stolen during the tenure of the outgoing administration. He also said: "People are still trying to make last-minute movements of funds, which are unauthorised, (and) which are not theirs, ..."

In the BBC interview, the new president described the treasury as "literally empty", adding that the "hole is much bigger than we expected ...", and also that the debt situation had not been "fully disclosed" by the former government. Mr Hichilema said

"There's a lot of damage, unfortunately, ..."

Last year, 2020, Zambia was 'plunged' into a recession for the first time since 1998, and, also for the first time, defaulted on a debt repayment.

Thus far the new president has not 'named' any officials, and Mr. Lungu previously denied all wrongdoing.

Mr. Hichilema won the election on a promise to tackle corruption and put an end to the financial and economic crisis that has seen Zambia's debt growing to hither fore unimaginable dimensions.

On several previous occasions we have commented on, and warned our people about, the outrageous malpractices of black leaders who promise their people all kinds of most wonderful things, then, once elected, proceed to rip off their people and their countries.

In the process they enrich themselves and a few others to unbelievable levels, while at the same time condemning the masses

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to conditions which become so terrible that tens of thousands (and even millions), finding themselves in conditions worse than anything ever experienced, have to indulge in criminal behaviour, just to stay alive. Very often, so many are compelled to migrate that their countries may never recover from their absence.

Over the years numerous authoritative sources have commented on the corruption of African leaders like Idi Amin, Jean-Bedel Bokassa, Mobutu Sese Seko (he who helped a certain European country to commit the most horrific murder of Patrice Lumumba, at the time one of Africa's most promising and democratic leaders), Robert Mugabe, and Sani Abacha, among many others.

Currently there is in South Africa the ongoing investigation of former president Jacob Zuma.

The corruption of those 'leaders' have always resulted in the most painful of experiences for their people, and always in most direct ways. It is because of such persons why the vast majority of African countries continue to have small, wealthy elites while the majority of the populations live in abject poverty and desolation.

Effectively they perpetuate the economic practices of the colonial era, always with even more devastating and debilitating results for their people.

On page 10 of this edition, we are carrying an article about certain aspects of the history of Haiti, with an emphasis on the betrayal of the Haitian people by persons who they, in each case, initially elected to be their leaders, but who, like so many Africans, descended into corruption, and, in each and every case, made matters infinitely worse for their people.

A few days ago Mr. Dwyer Astaphan, while commenting on certain prevailing circumstances in our country, made the observation that Britain, a former colonial power, is showing more respect for the legal and other rights of our people, other colonial persons, and the descendants of such migrants, than are being giving by the government here at home to our own people.

That observation, with which we concur, speaks volumes about those who have been elected to serve our people, but who instead practice that for which so many African leaders have become infamous.

From all of this there are many lessons to be learned by our people, and that we MUST do, especially as we are now firmly in the grasp of a most corrupt regime.

We call on the people of St. Kitts and Nevis to take stock of our current political and economic circumstances, so that we might immediately set about ridding ourselves of the SCHEME UNITY regime and the crippling grasp of corruption which they have on our beloved country.



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Former National Security Minister Dwyer Astaphan Says Police Escalated Protest Situation

BASSETTERRE, St.Kitts (Friday 3rd September 2021) - "It was they who escalated the situation not the civilians. There were too many police officers."

This is view of well-known social and political commentator Dwyer Astaphan, a former national security minister, who in his latest commentary recalled the outcomes of a protest -held on Friday 20th August 2021 dubbed 'KITITIAN LIVES MATTER peaceful walk' - as he openly criticised the conduct of the security forces who were under orders.

In summing up the nature of the protest which he linked to workers' grievances and one which did not breach the Public Order Act, Astaphan who is a lawyer by profession talked about the peaceful demonstrators as well as the security officers who overplayed their hand.

"The forces should not have pressured the civilians the way they did. They should not have caused the tear gas to be thrown," he expressed.

"Two Fridays, ago some people were down town Basseterre protesting. These are people who have been suffering for over a year; reduced from being paid monthly to weekly to hourly,expose to endless stress the workplace. Victims of

aggressive and inconsiderate language from certain employers, and from no less the Prime Minister and other government officials. These are people who have been under severe pressure to pay mortgages, rents, utility bills to feed and keep their families safe and healthy. Many have now lost their jobs, and with all of the pain and suffering, they are understandably frustrated, despairing, afraid and angry. Small business owners who succeed from the pockets of these workers are feeling it as well so they are suffering as well and the whole macroeconomic impact is being felt. I'm talking about people who have reason to be upset; the people who were on the streets two Fridays ago."

Astaphan continued: "Yet in spite of that they were peaceful, and any professional assessment of this situation at the time would have indicated that the protestors showed no signs of erupting into disorder or violence; none whatsoever,

and if I may say so myself having been in the area for a while, it was the security officers who overplayed their hand although I sensed that a number of them were not really happy or preferring to be there and doing that but they were under orders. It was they who escalated the situation not the

civilians. There were too many police officers. It was very muscular and I don't know what Customs and Defence Force personnel were doing there. The forces should not have pressured the civilians the way they did. They should not have caused the tear gas to be thrown. There was no meeting, there was no march, there was no breach of the Public Order Act as far as I could see, and they should not have arrested those three persons who I believe will get their charges lifted or defeated and who seem likely to receive some compensation if they bring legal action against the government."

"As I said, the soldiers should not have been there at all. They should have been summoned only if the situation showed signs of escalating, and I'm told soldiers were ordered back to base anyway, and I cannot see what authority a customs officer could have on a situation like that," Astaphan added.

He informed that he has looked at the Customs Act as well and that while the Police Commissioner can engage a customs officer to assist the police, the interpretation of that has to be to assist the police in customs related investigations not in general policing.

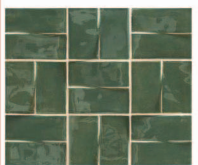
"I could be wrong but that is my take of it, and I don't believe a customs officer should have been present worst so accompanying a man to prison. Again, the people should have been warned about tear gas before it being discharged. You see escalating to tear gas takes the situation to a step where the next move is the use of weapon, and there was absolutely no evidence on the ground to justify things reaching that level," he noted.

According to Astaphan: "This willingness by decision makers to suppress the people's need to express themselves peacefully and this blatant lack of compassion and respect is only causing people's frustration and anger to increase."

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Young Mom Dies Hours After Fatal Crash

BASSETTERRE, St.Kitts (Friday 3rd September 2021)- Saddlers resident 21-year-old Keniqua David, a young mother of an infant, who had to be extricated from a vehicle that crashed into a container chassis, died more than eight hours later at the hospital, according to information from a police report.

She succumbed to injuries in the aftermath of an accident crash in Bird Rock on Friday 27th August 2021 of which she was a passenger.

Images of the accident scene as seen by this media house shows an extensively damaged vehicle.

Social media has been flooded with wordy tributes, memorial tattoos and the sharing of images of many fashionable photos of the young woman said to be known by the nickname 'Kay Kay'.

This media house understands that the deceased is well-known for her track and field abilities having been a star runner when she attended the Basseterre High School.

As gathered, her baby girl-believed to be under a year- is among her loved ones. Social media images include warm moments of mother-daughter bonding.

Police say the accident involved motor jeep P6667, which is owned and was being driven by Kellian Hazel of St. Paul's.

Investigations so far have revealed that close to 1 a.m., Hazel exited the parking lot of a club in Bird Rock and collided with a 40ft container chassis. The St. Kitts and Nevis Fire and Rescue Services had to be called to extricate David who was in the front passenger seat. Both Hazel and David were transported to the JNF General Hospital via the Emergency Medical Service.

Hazel was treated and discharged for injuries to his hand while David succumbed to her injuries close to midnight on August 27.

An autopsy has been scheduled to determine the exact cause of death.

Up to press time on Thursday 2nd September 2021, there was no update.

Latest COVID-19 Death Was Under Police Investigation

BASSETTERRE, St.Kitts (Friday 3rd September 2021)- Chief Medical Officer Dr. Hazel Laws, having revealed that St.Kitts-Nevis has recorded one additional COVID-19 related death making the count four, also indicated that the happening was under police investigation.

As disclosed by her during her presentation at the National Emergency Operations Center (NEOC) COVID-19 Daily Briefing held on Wednesday 1st September 2021: "On August 19th, a 59 year old individual with underlying comorbidities died at home."

Dr. Laws said the case was under police investigation and an autopsy was requested noting that the individual was COVID-19 positive at the time of death.

She said the final autopsy report received that day and released to the Police High Command "confirmed that the findings were consistent with COVID-19 disease."

The CMO stated that "the tracing of the contacts of this case is already done."

In addressing the current 474 active cases, she offered some health tips and general advice about keeping in contact with their case manager.

"We want you to boost your own immune system. You can do so by eating healthily meaning lots of fruits and vegetables. We want you to

maintain average hydration by drinking enough water. We want you to make sure that you get adequate rest and exercise in place along with taking your multivitamins and supplements."

Dr. Laws continued: "We also want you as an active case to stay connected with your case manager. So once you've been diagnosed with COVID-19, you will be assigned a case manager, and so that individual who is an experienced nurse, she will call you and she will keep in touch with you on a daily basis. If there is any change whatsoever in your health status, we want you to reach out to your case manager; she's just a phone call away, she's just a WhatsApp message away so we want you to stay connected with your case manager."

She said the Ministry of Health continues its COVID-19 testing adding "We test all our cases, we test all the contacts of our cases and we also conduct targeted and random testing."

The CMO said over 23,000 samples have been processed in the Federation between May to present and that the ministry will continue the COVID-19 testing programme.

Additionally, she informed that an additional lab is onboard for testing. It was shared that Quality Diagnostic Laboratory (QDL) is now on board in terms of providing testing capabilities for COVID-19 as have been provided by the Next Generation Lab and Avalon.

As of Wednesday 1st September 9:30 PM, a total of 499 active COVID-19 cases were recorded.

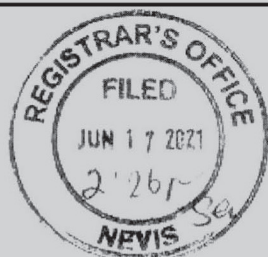

Education Minister Addresses Vaccination Through Schools

BASSETTERRE, St.Kitts (Friday 3rd September 2021) - Minister of Education Jonel Powell, in his response to a question posed to him during an appearance on an episode of 'Island Tea' morning show aired on WINNFM on Wednesday 1st September 2021, addressed vaccination of children through schools regarding the Pfizer jab suitable for persons ages 12 years and older.

"Well at this point we're not necessarily doing the vaccination through the schools. Parents are being encouraged to take their kids to the various health centres, and the reason for that is unlike with AstraZeneca, the Pfizer vaccine needs a much colder environment. It needs to be stored in -80 degrees so the facilities to maintain that are limited and that's why we can't really do it through the schools," he stated.

At the National Emergency Operations Center (NEOC) COVID-19 Daily Briefing held on the afternoon of Wednesday 1st September 2021, Chief Medical Officer Dr. Hazel Laws highlighted that the rollout for the Pfizer Biontech vaccine began that day which included teenagers among those who were vaccinated.

She mentioned that the vaccine has been fully approved by the US FDA and so it is safe.

Dr. Laws recalled that the Federation was in receipt of the first three batches of approximately 11, 7000 doses. Notably, that contribution has been made by the US government.

"So earlier this morning at approximately 11 O'clock, the Pfizer Biontech vaccine rollout took place at the Newtown Health Centre and in Nevis the rollout took place earlier that afternoon at the Charlestown Health Centre."

The CMO said a number of persons came forward and accepted the Pfizer Biontech vaccine for the first in the Federation today.

She went on to talk about the efficacy of that particular vaccine. With respect to efficacy, based on the clinical trials, a two-dose regimen of this vaccine given 21 days apart confers approximately 95% protection against symptomatic COVID, and this was realized in persons age 16 and over. Also, we have data coming out of a recent trial involving adolescents 12 to 15 years of age, and the data shows that an efficacy of a 100% would be achieved. Now in terms of effectiveness against hospitalisation, the efficacy is estimated at 87% and in terms of efficacy against the Delta variant which seems to be the most prevalent variant at present, the efficacy is estimated to be 88% so this vaccine is a good option."

She shared that accepters of the vaccine will be given two doses, and that based on the information from the manufacturers, the interval can range from 21 to 28 days

Dr. Laws pointed out that the targeting of persons 12 years and over noting "So today we saw some teenagers coming forward to receive the Pfizer Biontech vaccine."

She advised that will be administered by appointment only.

"... let me just explain the reason for this. Now, this vaccine is stored on a very cold refrigerator -80 degrees and so it has to be thawed, and so must have a list of individuals with appointments so we must know two- three days ahead who will be vaccinated so that we can know how many vials to defrost in order to administer this vaccine."

According to her, there is minimum of 14 days between administration of this vaccine and any other vaccine against conditions.

"For teenagers, they may be booked for other vaccines like the HPV vaccine. Please note a minimum of 14 days must elapse between this vaccine before receiving another vaccine."

The CMO said the Pfizer Biontech vaccine is safe for older persons, underlying conditions like diabetes, hypertension, asthma, liver and kidney disease as well as pregnant women, lactating females, persons living with HIV, persons who are immunocompromised and even persons who were previously diagnosed with COVID-19.

The new school year is slated to begin in the second week of September 2021 as children in St.Kitts are expected to return to the classroom in person.

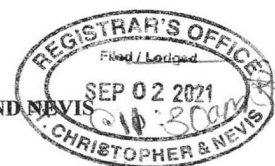

Assassinations And Invasions - How The US And France Shaped Haiti's Long History Of Political Turmoil

The powerful earthquake that struck Haiti on 14 August 2021, followed a long series of natural and human-caused disasters to rock the country. Unfortunately, if history offers any clues, earthquake relief efforts will be complicated by the nation's recent political unrest.

President Jovenel Moise was assassinated less than six weeks earlier, on 7 July. Many Haitians felt hatred for the controversial president who, while running for office, was bribed by the oligarchy that has run Haiti's economy since the 19th century.

Moise campaigned on a promise to feed the starving population. But he failed to ensure a fairer distribution of wealth. He soon became an unpopular president who increasingly ruled as an autocrat.

As a sociology professor who has written extensively on Haitian politics, I predicted Moise's assassination.

That's because Moise remained defiant in the face of mass protests in 2019, refusing to heed calls for his resignation amid fuel shortages and spiraling inflation.

There was also a palpable split between Moise and powerful business magnates as the country's economic crisis worsened.

Presidential assassinations in Haiti

Moise is the latest of five Haitian presidents to be killed in

office since the country's founding in 1804.

Power struggles and strong economic interests, both local and with other nations - mainly The United States - have motivated those assassinations. Throughout Haitian history The US has been actively engaged in undermining the legitimacy of Haitian leaders who refused to bow to American imperialism.

Jean-Jacques Dessalines, Haiti's founding father, proclaimed the country's independence from France on 1 January 1804, after a 12-year war.

One of his first executive orders was intended to prevent the abuse of land ownership. It called for a fair distribution of land among racial groups in a country that had won independence because of strategic alliances among Blacks, biracial people and a few white soldiers.

Dessalines is often portrayed by mainstream media as a cannibal and assassin. That's because he was abhorred by white Europeans and Americans - leaders of the global economic system who were intimidated by the Haitian Revolution.

Additionally, the elites in Dessalines' circle disapproved of the power he had concentrated, and they assassinated him on 17 October 1806.

His death accelerated Haiti's political disintegration.

The Monroe Doctrine and political assassinations

The 30 billion euros in today's currency that Haitian President Jean-Pierre Boyer agreed to pay France in 1825 as compensation for property losses during the war has destabilized the country.

It has also allowed foreign powers to undermine Haiti's sovereignty.

In 1823 The US passed the Monroe Doctrine, which says "that the American continents ... are henceforth not to be considered as subjects for future colonization by any European powers." The declaration, meant to keep Europe out of the continent, has justified US interventions in the region.

Between 1889 and 1891 The US unsuccessfully negotiated with Haiti to acquire the Mole St. Nicholas port, which would have given it a military foothold in the

Caribbean.

More than 20 years later the murder of President Vilbrun Guillaume Sam offered The US the perfect rationale to invade Haiti.

On the same day as Sam's assassination, 28 July 1915, Woodrow Wilson authorized the American warship USS Washington to invade Haiti. The US occupied Haiti until 1934.

During that occupation US officials altered Haiti's Constitution to allow foreigners to become landowners. That change also gave The US control of Haiti's customs agency and finances.

Racial discrimination and segregation were the norm in the US South at the time, and most US Marines sent to Haiti were Southerners, accustomed to Jim Crow.

This Southern influence among US Marines played a big role in Haitian history. During the occupation The US picked only light-skinned Haitians to serve as presidents. And, after 19 years in the country, The US left behind a racially divided society that remains intact today.

US-trained army

The US also trained the Haitian military ideologically to defend US interests. These forces eventually engineered many coups against Haitian leaders who were popular with locals but rejected by The US.

Between 1946 and 1950, under the presidency of Dumarsais Estime, Haiti enjoyed political and social stability. However, on 10 May 1950, Paul-Eugene Magloire, trained during the US occupation, overthrew Estime and changed Haiti's political trajectory.

Magloire established a corrupt political regime. Then the army provided support for US-backed Francois "Papa Doc" Duvalier, from his presidential election in 1957 to the establishment in 1959 of his dictatorship.

In 1959 Duvalier created the Tontons Macoutes, a paramilitary group trained by US Marines that killed more than 60,000 Haitians. The Duvalier regime, led by Papa Doc's son Jean-Claude after his death in 1971, lasted until 1986.

The Aristide era

Between 1991 and 2004, President Jean-Bertrand Aristide - who won over Haitians with his anti-imperialism - was overthrown twice by the Haitian military.

On 29 September 1991, the army, with CIA help, removed Aristide from power for his nationalistic views, and for his attempts to hold accountable powerful business leaders with strong ties to Washington.

On 15 October 1994, amid huge protests, the Bill Clinton administration restored Aristide to power, after Washington coerced him to sign l'Accord de Paris, an agreement to reinforce the implementation of market-oriented reform policies in Haiti that reduced local influence over the economy.

Aristide was forced to privatize social services and public institutions, and he had to facilitate the entry of foreign agricultural goods into the Haitian market. These moves undermined the economy and compromised Haiti's social development.

In 2000, Aristide again won the presidency. But a February 2004 coup, engineered by Washington and Paris, overthrew him once more.

Under foreign influence Haitian politicians have been unable to develop a stable society for their fellow citizens. Because of their lack of vision, and their erroneous conception of political power, they have given powerful transnational forces the opportunity to shape Haiti's political leadership.

Both Democratic and Republican US politicians have imposed on Haitian society a political leadership supportive of US interests but noxious for any nation-building project on the Caribbean island.

A Universal Equation For The Shape Of An Egg

Summary: Researchers have discovered a universal mathematical formula that can describe any bird’s egg existing in nature - a significant step in understanding not only the egg shape itself, but also how and why it evolved, thus making widespread biological and technological applications possible.

Researchers from The University of Kent, The Research Institute for Environment Treatment, and VitaMarket Ltd have discovered a universal mathematical formula that can describe any bird’s egg existing in nature, a feat which has been unsuccessful until now.

Egg-shape has long attracted the attention of mathematicians, engineers, and biologists from an analytical point of view. The shape has been highly regarded for its evolution as large enough to incubate an embryo, small enough to exit the body in the most efficient way, not roll away once laid, is structurally sound enough to bear weight and be the beginning of life for so many species. The egg has been called the “perfect shape.”

Analysis of all egg shapes used four geometric figures: sphere, ellipsoid, ovoid, and pyriform (conical or pear-shaped), with a mathematical formula for the pyriform yet to be derived.

To rectify this, researchers introduced an additional function into the ovoid formula, developing a mathematical model to fit a completely novel geometric shape characterized as the last stage in the evolution of the sphere-ellipsoid, which it is applicable to any egg geometry.

This new universal mathematical formula for egg shape is based on four parameters: egg length, maximum breadth, shift of the vertical axis, and the diameter at one quarter of the egg length.

This long sought-for universal formula is a significant step in understanding not only the egg shape itself, but also how and why it evolved, thus making widespread biological and technological applications possible.

Mathematical descriptions of all basic egg shapes have already found applications in food research, mechanical engineering, agriculture, biosciences, architecture and aeronautics. As an example, this formula can be applied to engineering construction of thin walled vessels of an egg shape, which should be stronger than typical spherical ones.

This new formula is an important breakthrough with multiple applications including:

1. Competent scientific description of a biological object. Now that an egg can be described via mathematical formula, work in fields of biological systematics,

optimization of technological parameters, egg incubation and selection of poultry will be greatly simplified;

2. Accurate and simple determination of the physical characteristics of a biological object. The external properties of an egg are vital for researchers and engineers who develop technologies for incubating, processing, storing and sorting eggs. There is a need for a simple identification process using egg volume, surface area, radius of curvature and other indicators for describing the contours of the egg, which this formula provides; and

3. Future biology-inspired engineering. The egg is a natural biological system studied to design engineering systems and state-of-the-art technologies. The egg-shaped geometric figure is adopted in architecture, such as London City Hall’s roof and the Gherkin, and construction as it can withstand maximum loads with a minimum consumption of materials, to which this formula can now be easily applied.

Darren Griffin, Professor of Genetics in The University of Kent and PI on the research, said: “Biological evolutionary processes such as egg formation must be investigated for mathematical description as a basis for research in evolutionary biology, as demonstrated with this formula. This universal formula can be applied across fundamental disciplines, especially the food and poultry industry, and will serve as an impetus for further investigations inspired by the egg as a research object.”

Dr Michael Romanov, Visiting Researcher at The University of Kent, said: “This mathematical equation underlines our understanding and appreciation of a certain philosophical harmony between mathematics and biology, and from those two a way towards further comprehension of our universe, understood neatly in the shape of an egg.”

Dr Valeriy Narushin, former visiting researcher at The University of Kent, said: “We look forward to seeing the application of this formula across industries, from art to technology, architecture to agriculture. This breakthrough reveals why such collaborative research from separate disciplines is essential.”

Taiwan Army To Bulk Up Machine Gun And Mortar Stockpiles



Weapons budgeted for 2022-2026 needed to repel potential invasion.

TAIPEI (Taiwan News) - According to the newly submitted 2022 defense budget the Army plans to procure 2,060 light machine guns and 87 120-mm mortars next year, reports said on Wednesday 1 September, 2021.

The aim of the new weapons would be to strengthen the military’s capability to resist an enemy landing and to block and strike back at an invading force, CNA reported.

The machine guns would cost NT\$428.89 million (US\$15.47 million), while the Army is budgeting NT\$157.39 million for the mortars, with both to be paid for from 2022-2026.

The Army described the latter as easy to use and precise, making them useful in the task to prevent the unspecified enemy from advancing.

Looking at the numbers, the Army said it is at an apparent disadvantage compared to the enemy force, but its efficiency and speed in using the weapons would give it an edge.

Choosing Personal Exercise Goals Then Tackling Them Immediately Is Key To Sustaining Change

When people set their own exercise goals - and then pursue them immediately - it's more likely to result in lasting positive changes, according to a new study at The Perelman School of Medicine at The University of Pennsylvania.

The results of this research are especially important because they were found among an underserved population that is at

particularly high risk of having or developing heart conditions.

The study was published in JAMA Cardiology.

"Most behavior change programs involve goal-setting, but the best way to design that process is unknown," said lead author Mitesh Patel, MD, MBA, an associate professor of Medicine at Penn, and vice president for Clinical Transformation at Ascension. "Our clinical trial demonstrated that physical activity increased the most when patients chose their goals rather than being assigned them, and when the goals started immediately rather than starting lower and gradually increasing over time.

These findings are particularly important because the patients were from lower-income neighborhoods and may face a number of challenges in achieving health goals."

This study consisted of 500 patients from low-income neighborhoods, mainly in West Philadelphia but also elsewhere in and outside of the city. Participants either had a cardiovascular disease or were assessed to have a near-10 percent risk of developing one within a decade. These high-risk patients stood to greatly gain from increased physical activity.

Patel's previous work at the Penn Medicine Nudge Unit often focused on the use of

gamification, a concept used to create behavioral change by turning it into a game. The work usually tested whether playing a game attached to physical activity goals could make significant increases against not playing a game, or between different versions of a game.

As with past studies, every participant was given a wearable step tracker that recorded their daily step counts through Penn's Way to Health platform. But what set this study apart from many of its predecessors was that the main outcomes of the research were less about participation in the games themselves and more about how goals were established, as well as when participants were encouraged to pursue them.

Once every participant got their wearable step counter, they were given a week or two to get used to it. This time period also functioned as a baseline-setting period for everyone's pre-intervention daily step count. After that, participants were randomly assigned to the control group, which didn't have step goals or games attached, or one of the gaming groups with goals.

Those in the gamified group also went through two other sets of random assignments. One determined whether they'd have input on their step goal, or whether they'd just be assigned a standard one. The second decided whether each participant would immediately start working toward their goals (for the entire 16-week intervention), or whether they'd ramp up to it, with minor increases in goals, until the full goals kicked in at week nine.

After analyzing the results, the researchers saw that the only group of participants who achieved significant increases in activity were those who chose their own goals and started immediately. They had the highest average increase in their steps compared to the group with no goals, roughly 1,384 steps per day. And, in addition to raw step counts, the study also measured periods of sustained, high activity, amounting to an average increase of 4.1 minutes daily.

Comparatively, those who were assigned their goals or had full goals delayed for half the intervention only increased their daily steps above the control group's average by between 500 and 600 steps.

"Individuals who select their own goals are more likely to be intrinsically motivated to follow through on them," said Kevin Volpp, MD, PhD, director of the Center for Health Incentives and Behavioral Economics. "They feel like the goal is theirs and this likely enables greater engagement."

The study didn't end when the researchers turned the games off. Participants kept their activity trackers, and in the eight weeks following the intervention, the group that chose their goals and started immediately kept up their progress. In fact, they achieved almost the exact same average in steps - just three less than during the active games.

"It is exciting to see that the group that increased their activity levels by the most steps maintained those levels during follow-up," Patel said. "This indicates that gamification with self-chosen and immediate goals helped these patients form a new habit."

Many programs, whether offered through work or by health insurance companies, offer incentives for boosts in physical activity. But these goals are often fairly static and assigned based on round numbers. Patel, Volpp, and colleagues believe this research suggests that adjusting goal setting in these programs can have a significant impact. And if these adjustments lead to gains among people with lower incomes, whom cardiovascular disease kill at 76 percent higher rates, that could be particularly important.

"Goal-setting is a fundamental element of almost every physical activity program, whether through a smartphone app or in a workplace wellness program," Volpp said. "Our findings reveal a simple approach that could be used to improve the impact of these programs and the health of their patients."

Speaking shortly after the congress, Mr. Harris said his team, though new will bring some new ideas to the table, building on the gains already made by the previous executive. "The previous executive has been doing a good job. Getting insurance (for the players) and we are just looking on building on it so that St. Kitts and Nevis can be a strong reputable nation in world football," he said.

I think we need to have fans back at our games because the fans bring the atmosphere so we want to have that solid atmosphere in football in St. Kitts and Nevis." Mr. Harris was congratulated by outgoing president Anthony Johnson, who during the congress spoke of the accomplishments of the SKNFA under his tenure.

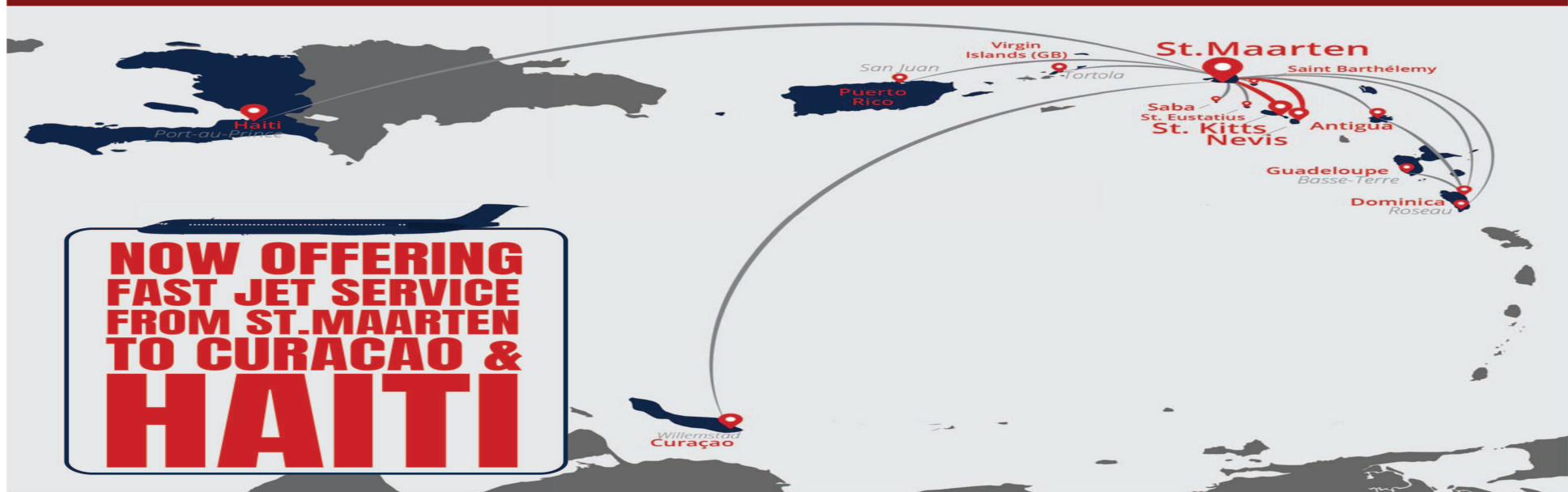
U.S. Immigrant Visa COVID-19 Vaccine Requirement Update
