# SKNLP Leader Says Harris Disinvited 2020 Election Observers

**BASSETERRE, St.Kitts ( Wednesday 3rd August 2022)**- Leader of the St.Kitts-Nevis Labour Party (SKNLP) Dr. Terrance Drew has revealed that for the June 2020 general elections, Prime Minister and Leader of the People’s Labour Party (PLP) Dr. Timothy Harris “disinvited” the overseas observers from coming in, and also issued a “late notice” to invite this time around.

Speaking at a meeting held in public campaign rally held Cayon on Tuesday 2nd August 2022, he expressed: “Today I learnt that Timothy Harris only sent the invitation to the OAS on the 26th of July, late notice, and I believe in my heart that his objective was to say the notice was late to send a full team but I want to say that they’re here and they are ready to carry out their mission.”

He added: “Timothy Harris must not be allowed to steal the elections and this is why Timothy Harris is not the only one culpable. PAM is also culpable because in 2020, Timothy Harris and PAM came together to lock out the people from coming in to vote and they also lock out those who were to come in and observe the elections. I learnt today that the OAS was disinvited by Timothy Harris in 2020.”

Dr. Drew reported that he had a very important meeting that afternoon with the OAS (Organization of American States) observer team.

According to the SKNLP Leader: “Timothy Harris had really planned to conduct the elections without observers; Wanted to steal the elections from you the people of St.Kitts and Nevis. Thinking that because he’s Prime Minister, he’s lord over all of the subjects. He says he’s a ruler and not a leader, he has dictatorial tendencies, and that is why he wanted to conduct an election without observers. Can you imagine that?”

He outlined that both the PLP and People’s Action Movement (PAM)-no broken up from under the Team Unity banner-are both to blame for the 2020 matter pertaining to the election observers not being present.

“PLP and PAM decided that we should not have had observers in 2020 and that is why when people ask me ‘[Are] you sorry for PAM’ I say ‘No’. I can’t sorry for them because when Timothy Harris was fired by Dr. Denzil Douglas, they pick him up, dusted him off and presented him to the nation as a clean figure and made him prime minister, so how can you sorry for them? You can’t sorry for them. Even when I said I would not sit with Timothy Harris, they were afraid to say it that PAM had not declared that as yet and so when I listen to Dr. Simmonds speak, all I do is shake my head, shake my head because nothing actually makes sense, and that is why I am saying to you comrades and to the people of St.Kitts and Nevis that it is time to move on and it is time to go forward and we are saying that we will not accept any elections that does not follow the rules of what we are supposed to follow, and so we say to him no way in 2022 he will get away with it.”

The SKNLP Leader further stated that “We have also pressured him to invite the CARICOM observers

and tomorrow, I have a meeting with the CARICOM observers because we have to keep a close eye on Timothy Harris in the

country, in the region and internationally because he must not steal the next general elections from you the people of St.Kitts and Nevis.”

This media house gathered that the planned meeting did take place, according to information coming from the party’s public relations team.

# Elections Supervisor: Do Not Pretend To be Somebody Else On Polling Day ...Over 50,000 votes registered

**BASSETERRE, St.Kitts (Wednesday 3rd August 2022)**-Supervisor of Elections Elvin Bailey has shared details about the number of voters as per the eleven constituencies in St.Kitts and Nevis, which gives the total of 50,933 registered voters for the Friday 5th August 2022 polling day.

In an address on Tuesday 2nd August, he highlighted the information during his broadcast presentation in giving an update on polling stations as follows: 6366 voters (Constituency One), 5735 voters (Constituency Two), 4429 voters (Constituency Three), 3579 voters (Constituency Four), 3223 voters (Constituency Five), 3467 voters (Constituency Six), 3846 voters (Constituency Seven), 7370 voters (Constituency Eight) while for Nevis 6669 voters (Constituency Nine), 1845 voters (Constituency Ten) and 4404 voters (Constituency Eleven).

He pointed out that there are 38,015 voters on St.Kitts and 12,918 voters in Nevis for the total of 50,933 voters.

Meanwhile during a prior broadcast on Wednesday 20th July, Bailey warned the public about electoral offences which includes impersonating a voter.

“I appeal to the public to pay attention to the electoral offences; all of which carry prison terms and fines. These too will be published. I invite the public to join all electoral workers to ensure that the elections are peaceful and that each person gets one vote in the right place. All eligible voters duly registered are urged to exercise their franchise by voting on polling day. If you are not registered, do not attempt to vote and do not impersonate a voter. The public is reminded that COVID-19 regulations still exist and will be in place,” he stated.

The Elections Supervisor stated that any and all persons in line at the precinct of the polling stations will be allowed to vote and that anyone who comes in line after 6:00PM will not be allowed to vote.

He provided guidelines for voting as it relates to identification.

“Persons whose national identification cards have expired, persons who have misplaced or lost cards, persons whose cards are being held by others, once they are properly registered will still be able to vote upon presentation of any other government issued picture identification. These can be a passport, driver’s license or social security card.”

Bailey said other documents may be accepted but the person may be required to take an oath. The presiding officers and agents of the candidates will also be equipped with picture list to aid in identification of voters.

He said voters are asked to pay special attention to the instructions of the electoral officers in particular to those of the presiding officers and the conditions under which one’s vote would be inserted into the ballot box.

According to him, the law allows for persons who other than the electoral officers and agents to be allowed in the polling stations.

“Candidates are allowed to be present but they are not allowed to spend more than five minutes together with their agents. The candidate is not allowed to wander into any and all polling stations; only into those stations in which he/she is a candidate. I’m asking all candidates to respect this section of the law as it is written at section 80 in the National Assembly Elections Act,” he said.

Bailey went on further to say that the ballot boxes would be displayed, inspected and secured before the ballots are cast.

He said at the close of the polls ballot would be sealed and transported to the point of counting under armed guards and presence of appointed party agents.

“To this end, the political parties will be invited to appoint agents to witness all that goes on in the polling stations as well as at the count of votes cast.”

He said the ballots will be counted by the returning officers with the assistance of a designated presiding officer at an appointed place in each constituency. The place will be shared with you later. Results will be broadcast on radio, television stations and will be posted online. Eventually, a report will be the public libraries.

# Former PM Breaks Silence About Harris' Leadership Affecting Country

**BASSETERRE, St.Kitts Tuesday 2nd August 2022-** Former Prime Minister of the People's and retired politician Dr. Sir Kennedy Simmonds, in a recent address to the nation said he has chosen to break his silence due to the current affairs of St.Kitts-Nevis as he pointed finger of blame at Prime Minister and Leader of the People's Labour Party (PLP) Dr. Timothy Harris.

"Since I left office in 1995 after 15 years, first as Premier, then as Prime Minister of St. Kitts & Nevis, I have made few political speeches, except for a small sample of platform appearances, and a few at the annual convention of the People's Action Movement, PAM, a party that I co-founded in 1965. Though I have continued to support my party, I have generally stayed in the background, because that is what retired politicians and leaders are expected to do. However, the current state of affairs in my country has forced me to break my tradition and I can no longer remain silent," he remarked during his statement aired on 31st July 2022.

Sir Kennedy accused PM Harris of destroying the Team Unity coalition.

"...Timothy Harris destroyed all those plans. The coalition was dissolved because of two reasons and Timothy Harris is to blame for both. The reasons were greed. Greed to become wealthy. The second was his continued system of undermining all his colleagues."

He continued: "As Minister of Finance, he refused to fund many projects and programs even though they were approved by Cabinet. This caused supporters to feel that it was the PAM ministers who were not acting. But although the PAM ministers were fighting for their people the Minister of Finance kept refusing or delaying to support their projects."

He referred to a statement by PAM leader and fired former Deputy Prime Minister of the Harris-led administration saying: "As Shawn Richards once said, He (Timothy) would look them in the eye, and say yes, and next day begin the process of undermining them."

According to the nation's only living National Hero (Sir Kennedy): "St. Kitts and Nevis is now facing a general election that has come three years prematurely. It will be one of the most

contentious and divisive polls in our modern history. It is my hope however, that it would be exercised in a space of tranquility and that it would be peaceful."

"There are those who believe that this election might provide a much-needed political cleansing. If this is the case, then hopefully it may lead to a fresh start and a renewal of our faith in our democratic principles, decency, and other moral values, including transparency and trust," he

commented.

Additionally, he gave his view about what the August 2022 election should be about.

"This election must be about the people. All the people. Not just those in St. Kitts, but also those in Nevis. This election must be about the poor and struggling families, not just one family. This election must be about hope for a better future, not about a handout for today. It must be an election that seeks to safeguard the interests of all sub-cultures who now make St. Kitts and Nevis their home. It should also be an election that produces new leaders who can be trusted to deliver a genuine program of hope and prosperity for native Kittitians and Nevisians. But this election must also provide hope for immigrants who have now settled here from other Caribbean nations," he said

The St.Kitts-Nevis Labour Party (SKNLP) has accused the now broken up Team Unity coalition for the poor governance of St.Kitts and Nevis while being in office for the past seven years.

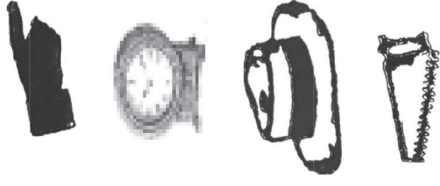

# Tourism Official Urges Public To Be Plastic Free Throughout The Year

**BASSETERRE, St. Kitts (Monday 1st August 2022)**- Citizens and residents are being encouraged to reduce the use of single use plastic here in St.Kitts-Nevis for the benefit of locals and visitors alike and to practice such throughout the year.

That call was made by Permanent Secretary in the Ministry of Tourism Carlene Henry-Morton during an interview with this media house following a march through the streets of Basseterre to mark the end of the month of activities for plastic free July held on Friday 29th July 2022.

Among those who participated in the event organized by the Ministry of Tourism in partner with the St.Kitts Sustainable Development Council were Early Childhood Development Unit, the St.Kitts-Nevis Youth Parliament Association (SKNYPA) and Ministry of Environment.

“It is not just about July. It’s about throughout the entire. We can intensify our efforts in July but we want the message to resonate throughout the entire year that all of us individually and collectively, we are responsible for making sure we reduce single use plastic in our homes, when we go to the supermarkets, wherever we are,” Henry-Morton stated.

She mentioned that “We can line our garbage can with our plastic bags” and also encouraged persons to find some way to be innovative and creative such as using plastic kits as plant pots so as “to reduce for now and eventually eliminate the use of plastic.”

Henry-Morton added: “It is detrimental to our environment and I wanted to spread the message as well that yes it’s the Ministry of Tourism and we want the guests to come but a lot of the things that we are doing it’s not just about the visitors, it is very much about the welfare our locals, our residents, our citizens. A healthy environment will continue to help a healthy lives and livelihoods so we want that message to go along with our young people, our parents, education [section] and all of the different organizations that’s supporting us, we want them to take that

message throughout the year.”

She touched on the yesteryears whereby individuals and families were accustomed to using recyclable bags which should be promoted as much as possible “where you can, you reuse, you reduce, you recycle.”

“Have a bread bag so that when you go to purchase your stuff from the bakery you have a bag. When I was younger that I what used to happen. As you heard me say earlier, people used to use the paper bag until it was ‘drunk’ because they got so soft so fast...we used to say [back then], I want a pound of rice and you produced that bag ....so the one [bag] that you bought last week, you brought back the same bag, and it was about saving money as well

because for each that that you use and you bought a new back, it was perhaps a cent or two more that they would charge you so if you could produce your own bag, you cut down and so that was a way of saving money so those are some of the things.”

The Ministry of Tourism official added: “It’s about saving money, it’s about making sure that we save the environment, it’s about making sure we have a healthy space for living and making us there is a healthy destination for our guests to enjoy so there are there are several and many advantages which are going to redown to everyone’s benefit when it’s all said and done.

Asked to comment further about children being the best messengers on the topic and her hopes for the future, she commented: “Ten years from now, these children are going to be fifteen and what we would like to see is that they don’t even have to think about whether or not they should reduce plastic; it’d be second nature. It would be part of them to just refuse plastic when they go to the supermarkets, it is just a part of them to dispose the garbage in a very responsible way; it’s just a natural part of them. Whenever they go to the beach and they see garbage on the beach, they pick it up. That is what we want to have and eventually these young people take home the message but they also take the message to their heart that they are our best ambassadors, they are our best destination stewards and whatever they’re doing, they are doing it in their own best interest and the best interest of the destination also.”

# South Africa Is Trapped Again - What Kind Of Leaders Can Set The Country Free

*Every South African who cares about the future of the country will agree with former president Mbeki that, to avert disaster, something must be done urgently about its deep socio-economic problems.*

Former South African president Thabo Mbeki recently painted a gloomy picture of the country and its prospects.

He said the governing African National Congress (ANC), led by President Cyril Ramaphosa, did not have a national plan to address the country's many socio-economic problems. These include high and growing unemployment, inequality, poverty and crime.

The official national unemployment rate is 34.5%. The country is also the most unequal in the world, and about 55.5% (30.3 million people) of the population live in poverty.

Mbeki served two terms as ANC president, from 1997 to 2007, and national president, from 1999 to 2008. South Africa enjoyed an average GDP growth rate of 4.2% during his tenure, making him and finance minister Trevor Manuel the most successful economic combination in South Africa's young democracy.

Yet the country's socio-economic problems, inherited from apartheid, persisted during his tenure.

Mbeki expressed concern about ANC politicians who did not serve the people of South Africa, but who were rather focused on self-enrichment. He also lamented the absence of a social compact - the collaboration between government, civil society organisations, communities, business and labour. And he pointed out the dire straits of local governments, especially those led by the ANC.

Mbeki lamented the high crime rate. He said South Africa was not well governed by the ANC, which has been in power since 1994. He warned that the country was ripe for its own Arab Spring - the uprisings that brought down the Tunisian government in 2011 and spread across the Arab world.

South Africa is indeed threatened by all these issues - especially by unemployment, inequality, poverty and a lack of cohesion. The Tunisian revolution was caused by high unemployment, inequality, food inflation, corruption, a lack of political freedoms and poor living conditions.

In my view, the country needs transformational leaders - who can inspire positive change in individuals and social systems - to fix its problems. Such leaders must be concerned about the country's problems and be involved in helping to fix them. They must help every member of society succeed.

Only transformational leadership can help bring about South Africa's renewal.

## The quest for renewal

Every South African who cares about the future of the country and its people will agree with Mbeki that, to avert disaster, something must be done urgently about the socio-economic problems he outlined.

However, people - including economists, political commentators, politicians, business people and policymakers - differ on what the objectives and methods of such a renewal effort should be. For example, some believe that the country's wealth is based on natural resources, capital, prestigious jobs and job creation. To them, redistribution of wealth, affirmative action, job creation and higher wages are the answer to the country's ills.

Others argue that South Africa is a poor country. So, wealth redistribution will at best make everyone poor. Therefore, economic growth is essential to grow the "cake" to be redistributed. To that end, the economy must be freed from state control so that entrepreneurs and businesses are motivated to make good money, invest more and thereby create jobs to make the country prosperous.

Of course, both these views have merit, but there are also blind spots that can severely damage development. We no longer live in the industrial age of the 20th century when the struggle between capital and labour reached its peak as a zero-sum game.

Although there is still a battle between capital and labour, in today's economy knowledge,

skill development, and pioneering innovation are the primary drivers of a country's prosperity.

This requires that all South Africans join hands and participate. And this construction work must be undertaken with great patience, adaptability, respect, humility and a lot of hope and courage.

For this to happen, the country needs transformational leadership.

## Transformational leadership

Transformational leadership is a process in which leaders and followers help each other to constantly advance to a higher level of morale and motivation.

The best form of transformational leadership was displayed by Nelson Mandela, the late first president of a democratic South Africa. He envisioned the country as a "rainbow nation" and rallied almost the entire nation - black and white - behind the realisation of his vision. But it faded over the years.

The futurist Philip Spies, however, describes the new South Africa as a ship that started sailing in 1994 with very good hope and direction, but froze in a pack of ice 28 years later, bringing the country's development to a standstill. This is the product of, among other things, class, race and ethnic polarisation and alienation of communities, and greed, elitist governance and corruption by privileged and favoured public servants and politicians.

Sadly, the current political leaders - and this applies to most political parties - are not very good 'ice-breakers'. Too many politicians are self-serving and interested in self-enrichment. They are often far removed - literally and metaphorically - from the citizens.

The large group of poor people in the country feel betrayed by democracy. Political liberation did not produce economic liberation.

While politicians defend their positions and privileges, the poor want to survive. These are two contrasting motives by people who experience reality completely differently.

The incompetence and corruption of so many officials and politicians force people to revolt. This in turn creates opportunities for criminal elements. This kind of leadership sucks humanity out of people. It incites emotion and hatred that leads to upheavals that have no respect for anything and anyone, as seen in the Gauteng and KwaZulu-Natal provinces in July 2021.

But transformational, moral leadership is future-oriented. It changes attitudes in people and motivates them to do exceptional things.

Renewal - how to break the ice's grip on the ship - carries dangers for the transformational leader. There will always be losers in a renewal process who can easily become disruptors, as seen in the transition to democracy in the early 1990s with certain right-wing political parties.

James Brian Quinn, the American academic and author, points out that transformational leaders must pay even more attention to the interests of those who may lose during a renewal process than to the programmes of change themselves.

Many so-called professional politicians are short-term oriented. This easily makes them "enemies" of longer-term development, therefore of the future of a country. That's because they need to survive politically. But leaders who are only long-term oriented can easily lose sight of the immediate needs. So, citizens stop following them.

Transformational leaders are dedicated to long-term development - built on good background analysis - while also trying to solve the immediate problems of a country and its people.

For such leaders, continuous self-examination, sharp observation, service to people, and dialogue are crucial in putting a country on the trajectory of a knowledge economy and sustainable development.

## Conclusion

If we measure the extent to which the country has skilled, capable and dedicated people who are building a vibrant, sustainable society, President Ramaphosa and the ANC sadly do not provide transformational leadership.

The country needs more than transformational leaders. It needs change management, a whole new design, which has the potential

# Why Some Heatwaves Prove Deadlier Than Others

LONDON, 2 August (Reuters) - Europe's record-breaking heatwave last month saw England and Wales register nearly 1,700 extra deaths in just one week, early data shows, while Portugal and Spain counted another 1,700.

The figures, which will likely change as records are updated, give the first indication of heat-related deaths when temperatures from London to Madrid hit nearly 40 degrees Celsius or higher.

The data for England and Wales released on Tuesday by Britain's Office for National Statistics counts registered deaths during 16 to 22 July against what would be expected over the same period, based on 5-year mortality averages.

The toll for the Iberian Peninsula from The World Health Organization (WHO) is also provisional.

But the figures from July came nowhere near the 70,000 heat-related deaths during a European heatwave in 2003.

Here are some of the factors that make some heatwaves deadlier than others.

## SITUATIONAL

When and where a heatwave hits matters.

The 2003 heatwave hit in the first two weeks of August, closing businesses,

wiping out crops and drying up rivers.

France's Paris region felt the effects most. Heatwaves are more intense in cities as concrete and asphalt absorb and retain heat.

The peak coincided with the traditional holiday period, when many children were out of school and families on holiday, in some cases leaving elderly relatives behind.

Of the nearly 15,000 people who died in France, more than 11,000 were over the age of 75.

"A fair number of people said goodbye to grandma sitting in her house and went on vacation," said Matthew Huber, a global expert on heat stress at Purdue University. "Normally, there would have been people checking in" on them.

Doctors were also on holiday. "Emergency services weren't so prepared, and they didn't have people on call," said Mathilde Pascal, a researcher with the French Public Health Agency.

France is now baking in its third heatwave of the 2022 summer, hitting wildlife as well as humans.

## ADAPTATION

After the 2003 disaster many European countries created heatwave action plans and began issuing early warnings. Experts say preparing for extreme heat can save lives.

"More people know what to do in response to a heatwave," said Chloe Brimicombe, a heatwave researcher at The University of Reading in Britain. But some countries are simply better equipped than others: almost 90% of US homes have air conditioning, compared with just 20% of European households, according to US federal statistics.

But technology can't always help. This year, Palestinians living on the crowded Gaza Strip are living through a searing summer heatwave that has been made worse by power cuts that leave them without electricity for as much as 10 hours a day.

Nearly a third of the US population was under a heat warning last month, with forecasts predicting more extreme heat this month.

People living in poorer communities and the homeless are at higher risk.

During last year's heatwave in Phoenix, Arizona, 130 of the 339 people who died were homeless, local health officials said.

Some US cities, including Phoenix, have hired 'heat officers' to help communities cope by handing out water bottles or guiding people to air-conditioned cooling centers.

"The risk of heat-associated death among our unsheltered neighbors is 200 to 300 times higher than the rest of the population," Phoenix heat officer David Hondula said.

## PHYSIOLOGICAL RESPONSE

People who live in warm-weather countries have typically acclimated to high heat. As a person is repeatedly exposed to high temperatures, they develop a lower heart rate and core body temperature over time, improving their tolerance.

So the temperature at which people start to die from heat-related illness varies depending on location, as does the related 'Minimum Mortality Temperature' (MMT) when all deaths from natural causes reach their lowest point.

"If you're living in India, the MMT is much higher than if you're in The UK," Huber said.

Recent research also suggests that the MMT of an area can increase as heat rises. For every 1°C rise in average summertime temperatures in Spain between

# Study Hints Even Simple Exercise May Help Aging Brain

**New research hints that even simple exercise just might help fend off memory problems.**

While physical activity helps keep healthy brains fit it's not clear how much it helps once memory starts to slide.

New research hints that even a simple exercise routine just might help older Americans with mild memory problems.

Doctors have long advised physical activity to help keep a healthy brain fit. But the government-funded study marks the longest test of whether exercise makes any difference once memory starts to slide - research performed amid a pandemic that added isolation to the list of risks to participants' brain health.

Researchers recruited about 300 sedentary older adults with hard-to-spot memory changes called mild cognitive impairment or MCI - a condition that's sometimes, but not always, a precursor to Alzheimer's. Half were assigned aerobic exercises and the rest stretching-and-balance moves that only modestly raised their

heart rate.

Another key component: Participants in both groups were showered with attention by trainers who worked with them at YMCAs around the country - and when COVID-19 shut down gyms, helped them keep moving at home via video calls.

After a year cognitive testing showed overall neither group had worsened, said lead researcher Laura Baker, a

neuroscientist at Wake Forest School of Medicine. Nor did brain scans show the shrinkage that accompanies worsening memory problems, she said.

By comparison, similar MCI patients in another long-term study of brain health - but without exercise - experienced significant cognitive decline over a year.

Those early findings are surprising, and The National Institute on Aging cautioned that tracking non-exercisers in the same study would have offered better proof.

But the results suggest "this is do-able for everybody" - not just seniors healthy enough to work up a hard sweat, said Baker, who presented the data Tuesday at The Alzheimer's Association International Conference. "Exercise needs to be part of the prevention strategies" for at-risk seniors.

Previous research has found regular physical activity of any sort may reduce damaging inflammation and increase blood flow to the brain, said Alzheimer's Association chief scientific officer Maria Carrillo.

But the new study is especially intriguing because the pandemic hit halfway through, leaving already vulnerable seniors socially isolated - something long known to increase people's risk of memory problems, Carrillo said.

It's a frustrating time for dementia research. Doctors are hesitant to prescribe a high-priced new drug called Aduhelm that was supposed to be the first to slow progression of Alzheimer's - but it's not yet clear if it really helps patients.

Researchers last month reported another drug that works similarly - by targeting amyloid plaques that are an Alzheimer's hallmark - failed in a key study.

While amyloid clearly plays a role, it's important that drugmakers increasingly are targeting many other factors that can lead to dementia, Carrillo said, because effective treatment or prevention likely will require a combination of customized strategies.

One example of a new approach: Sometimes in dementia, the brain has trouble processing blood sugar and fats for the energy it needs, John Didsbury of T3D Therapeutics told the Alzheimer's meeting. His company is testing a pill that aims to rev up that metabolism, with results expected next year.

Meanwhile, there's growing urgency to settle whether steps people could take today - like exercise - might offer at least some protection.

How much and what kind of exercise? In Baker's study, seniors were supposed to get moving for 30 to 45 minutes four times a week, whether it was on a vigorous turn on the treadmill or the stretching exercises. That's a big ask of anyone who's sedentary, but Baker said MCI's effects on the brain make it even harder for people to plan and stick with the new activity.

Hence the social stimulation - which she credited with each participant completing over 100 hours of exercise. Baker suspects that sheer volume might explain why even the simple stretching added up to an apparent benefit. Participants were supposed to exercise without formal support for an additional six months, data Baker hasn't yet analyzed.

"We wouldn't have done the exercise on our own," said retired agriculture researcher Doug Maxwell of Verona, Wisconsin, who joined the study with his wife.

The duo, both 81, were both assigned to the stretching classes. They felt so good afterward that when the study ended, they bought electric bikes in hopes of even more activity - efforts Maxwell acknowledged are hard to keep up.

Next up: Baker is leading an even larger study of older adults to see if adding exercise to other can't-hurt steps, such as a heart-healthy diet, brain games and social stimulation together, may reduce the risk of dementia.

1978 and 2017, for example, scientists found a 0.73°C increase in MMT, a study published in April in Environmental Research Letters journal said.

But with much still unknown about extreme heat and human endurance, scientists are not sure if the changes they are seeing in MMTs over time might also be related to people being more

aware of the dangers, or better equipped to deal with them.

"There are several possible explanations, and we still don't know which is the most important cause," Huber said.

# SKNLP Leader Dr. Terrance Drew accuses PM Timothy Harris of not wanting to invite international observers for August 5, 2022 poll

BASSETERRE, ST KITTS, August 3, 2022 - Political Leader of the St Kitts-Nevis Labour Party (SKNLP) Dr Terrance Drew said Sunday night, outgoing St Kitts and Nevis Prime Minister Dr the Hon. Timothy Harris had no intention to invite international and regional observers to monitor this Friday's general election in the federation.

Addressing a huge crowd of SKNLP supporters in Cayon, part of the St Christopher 8 constituency in which he is one of three candidates, Dr Drew informed he held discussions Sunday with members of a team of observers from the Washington-based Organization of American States (OAS) led by former Jamaica prime minister Bruce Golding.

"Timothy Harris had really planned to conduct the [2022] elections without observers [and] wanted to steal the elections from you the people of St Kitts and Nevis. Thinking because he is prime minister he is lord over all of the subjects. He said he is a ruler and not a leader. He has dictatorial tendencies and that is why he wanted to conduct the elections without observers," said Dr Drew.

He said during the meeting with the OAS Observer Team, he learnt that Prime Minister Harris only sent the invitation on July 26, 2022 to the OAS to monitor the August 5, 2022 poll.

"I believe his objective was for the OAS to respond that the invitation was too late to send a full team," said Dr Drew.

He said the OAS team is ready to conduct their mission.

Drew recalled the June 5, 2020 general election when Prime Minister Harris denied nationals who were either residing overseas or who were out of the country on vacation or business from returning to St Kitts and Nevis.

"I learned today that the OAS was disinvited by Dr Harris to monitor the 2020 general elections," Dr Drew told the crowd.

On June 5, 2020, the day of the general elections, OAS Secretary-General, His Excellency Luis Almagro expressed regret that the Western hemispheric organization was not in St Kitts and Nevis to monitor the June 5, 2020 general elections and reconfirmed the invitation was withdrawn by Prime Minister Harris.

"The #OAS has observed elections in the country since 2010. Regrettably the Gov't withdrew

the invitation to observe this time, though OAS team was #COVID-19 free and ready to deploy," Almagro said on twitter.

Almagro wished the people & political parties a democratic celebration."

The OAS chief also informed then Political Leader of the St Kitts-Nevis Labour Party, Rt. Hon. Dr. Denzil L. Douglas that the respected international organization had accepted Dr Harris' invitation by letter dated May 19, but the invitation was revoked on May 27.

Secretary General Almagro said in his letter to Dr. Douglas that "OAS/GS regrets that a practical solution was not put in place like was the case in Suriname to allow our observers to deploy but is respectful of the sovereign decision."

The Commonwealth Secretary General, Baroness Scotland also regretted the decision of prime minister Timothy Harris to impose a 14-day quarantine requirement on a Commonwealth Observer Team that made it impossible to send an observer mission to monitor the June 5 general elections.

At Sunday night's meeting, Dr Drew said the then St Kitts-based People's Action Movement (PAM) led by Shawn Richards was culpable in not allowing the OAS and Commonwealth teams to monitor the 2020 elections.

Dr Drew said he will lead a St Kitts-Nevis Labour Party (SKNLP) delegation in a meeting with a team of election observers from the CARICOM Secretariat on Monday.

Dr Drew has also called for the presence of observers from the London-based Commonwealth Secretariat, but it was not immediately known whether an invitation was extended by the outgoing prime minister.

US House of Representatives Speaker Nancy Pelosi and her congressional delegation touched down on 2 August in Taiwan on a two-day visit aimed at showing support for the country and deepening bilateral cooperation.

The group comprises Gregory Meeks, chair of the House Foreign Affairs Committee; Mark Takano, chair of the House Committee on Veterans' Affairs; Representative Suzan DelBene, vice chair of the House Ways and Means Committee; Representative Raja Krishnamoorthi, chair of the House Oversight and Reform Subcommittee on Economic and Consumer Policy; and Representative Andy Kim, according to the Ministry of Foreign Affairs.

Pelosi, the first woman to serve as speaker of the House, is a staunch supporter of Taiwan who has backed the country publicly on numerous occasions, the MOFA said. She has held the position since 2019 and previously during 2011 and 2007, the ministry added.

This is the first time in 25 years for a congressional delegation led by a U.S. House speaker to visit Taiwan, The MOFA said. It

follows a trip by Newt Gingrich in 1997, and further demonstrates rock-solid US support for Taiwan and its 23.5 million people, the ministry added.

Tenacious Jamaica took a stunning 57-55 victory over netball top seeds Australia to finish top of Pool A at the Commonwealth Games.

The Sunshine Girls overturned a five-goal deficit in the final period to earn the triumph in Birmingham.

The victory is, on paper, a shock, but based on Jamaica's performances so far it is no less than they deserve.

If England beat New Zealand later on Thursday (21:00 BST), they will face Australia in Saturday's semi-final.

That would be a repeat of the thrilling 2018 final, which England won 52-51.

Jhaniele Fowler scored 47 of her 50 attempts under the post and a dogged Jamaica defence, roared on by the crowd at the NEC, piled the pressure on Australia's shooters to take the final quarter 17-9.

Jamaica, who are ranked fourth in the world, have featured on the podium at the past two Commonwealth Games, both times in the bronze-medal position.

Meanwhile, Wales earned their second win of the tournament, beating Barbados 60-44.

Half-centuries from Reeza Hendricks and Aiden Markram helped South Africa to a 21-run win in the first of two Twenty20 internationals against Ireland.

Hendricks made 74 from 53 balls for his fourth successive Twenty20 fifty, and Markram 56 off just 27 deliveries, to help the Proteas reach 211-5.

Despite a fine batting display from Lorcan Tucker (78), Ireland fell well short of their target on 190-9.

The sides will meet again at Bristol on Friday.

Hendricks, who starred in his country's recent series win over England, continued his fine form during the day-night match.

The opener shared a third-wicket partnership of 112 with Markram, who smashed five sixes during his innings.

Spin bowler Gareth Delany claimed the wickets of Hendricks and Markram from successive balls in the 16th over -

Markram being caught at deep square leg before Hendricks holed out to point - but Ireland were unable to reach their total despite a spirited reply.

Tucker, batting at number three, managed seven fours and five sixes in an impressive knock of 78 from 38 deliveries, while 43 from George Dockrell further boosted the Irish cause.

Yet hope of a famous win was effectively extinguished when the pair fell in the space of three balls to Tabraiz Shamsi and Dwaine Pretorius respectively.

A target of 37 from the final two overs never looked like being achieved, with Proteas' 'death-bowling' specialist Wayne Parnell proving his worth despite being hit for six off the last ball off the innings by tailender Barry McCarthy as Ireland finished on 190-9.

Left-arm paceman Parnell returned figures of 2-36, having removed opener Andy Balbirnie, with stand-in Proteas captain Keshav Maharaj taking 2-29 with his left-arm spin and leg-spinner Tabraiz Shamsi 2-37.

South Africa suffered a setback before the match started, with captain David Miller ruled out by a back spasm, with fellow batsman Heinrich Klaasen taking his place in the XI.

Proteas fast bowler Kagiso Rabada had already been sidelined from both matches.

He has played 13 Test matches, 17 one-day internationals and 12 T20Is for England, taking a total of 86 wickets.

Archer made his international debut in 2019 and was part of the team that won the World Cup that summer, bowling the super-over in England's win over New Zealand in the final.

However, he last played for England in March 2021.

"It's been a difficult few months not being able to represent Sussex when the plan had been to return to the Sharks team after my elbow injury, so I am really happy to extend my contact and hope to be able to contribute to more Sussex victories in the future," Archer said.

Sussex head coach Ian Salisbury added: "Jof has achieved so much in world and international cricket since he made his debut with us in 2016.

"We love having him around the place, even when he is not playing, he is such a massive character and an extremely important member of our squad."
