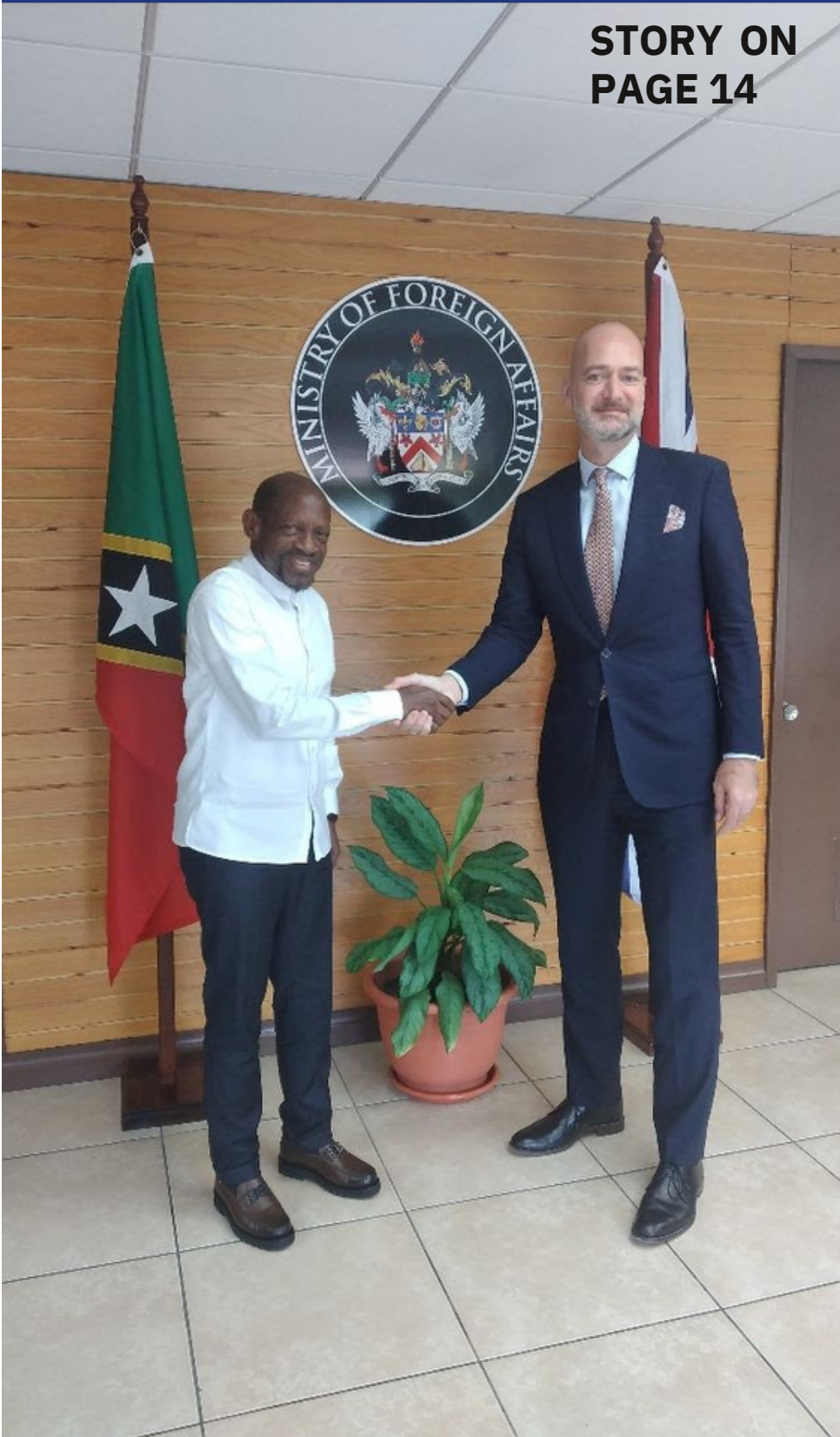

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Editorial

SCANDAL CONCERNS

On Sunday 27 November 2022, the nation's deputy prime minister and minister for social development, Dr. The Honourable Geoffrey Hanley, addressed the nation over ZIZ Radio and Television. He reported on certain aspects of the Poverty Alleviation Programme (PAP).

In the main, he disclosed several findings regarding the manner in which the programme had been run under the aegis of the former administration. Those disclosures were most troubling.

The minister reported that from an annualised budget of thirty-two and a quarter million dollars (\$32,250,000) some twenty-six million plus (\$26,000,000+) had been paid out by the end of July 2022. (Remember, general elections had been called for 5 August).

In and of itself that situation is a matter of grave concern.

With just above six million dollars (\$6,000,000) left on the programme it meant that government would have had to go back to parliament to request another four to five million dollars (\$4,000,000 to \$5,000,000) to take the problem to the end of the year. And that is a conservative estimate.

A number of matters are deeply troubling, mainly pertaining to the manner in which persons were identified and assessed for inclusion on the programme.

Payments to selected members of the civil service who earn much more than three thousand dollars (\$3,000) per month is truly alarming. So too was the disclosure that payments were being made to persons without social security numbers, and multiple payments to a large number of individuals who claim under several different identities.

A large number of persons also receive regular monthly payments even though they never filed any applications.

To us it seems that there was a massive attempt to 'buy' (worse yet, 'steal') the general elections. One shudders just thinking of what that would have meant had they been successful.

It appears as though serious crimes have been committed, at various levels, and in a number of ways, very likely going all the way back to the beginning of the regime's tenure and a full-scale investigation may be warranted.

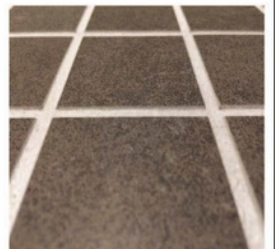
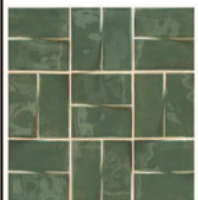

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Dept. of Education on Nevis to implement drug abuse prevention programme in primary schools January 2023

NIA CHARLESTOWN NEVIS (November 28, 2022) -- The Department of Education in the Nevis Island Administration (NIA) plans to implement an 11-part educational drug abuse prevention programme in schools in January 2023.

The programme which deals with drug abuse amongst minors will be held in partnership with the St. Kitts and Nevis National Council on Drug Abuse Prevention. On November 18, 2022, the department launched a drug abuse prevention programme dubbed "Living amongst the influence" which seeks to educate school counsellors on various strategies that could play a critical role in the fight against drug abuse.

Ms. Zahnella Claxton, Principal Education Officer in the Department of Education expressed satisfaction with the department's joint efforts with the council, particularly in light of the threat which drug abuse poses to the island's primary school students.

"Drug abuse use and abuse is a reality for us on the island and in the federation. It's not something that we want to become the norm, so it is important for us to act and to be proactive so that we can protect our children, and ensure that they are able to live healthy lives, that they are informed, that they are aware of the effects and that we as leaders, and of course, as counsellors would provide the psychosocial support. We want to make sure we know what we are looking for and what we can do to help as well," she said.

Mrs. Karimu Byron-Caines, Director of the National Council on Drug Abuse Prevention gave an overview of the drug situation amongst the island's youth, and expressed hope that the programme would prove beneficial to the primary school students.

"A very large percentage of our children begin experimenting with substances as early as nine years of age. Between nine and 11 is the first use of substances whether it's experimental but we have our children experimenting with different substances as early as primary school.

“So over the years the national drug council has been happy to support with psychosocial educational programmes to address our concerns with substances through training...We would have carried out UWI (University of the West Indies) certification for nearly 60 guidance counsellors and frontline workers in the area of drug prevention and intervention.

“Following that training we would have implemented a number of programmes targeted mainly at the high school levels but we realised that there remained a gap, and so we went back to the drawing board and figured it was time now, we are addressing those because bigger problems, issues at the secondary schools we feel the guidance counsellors there are equipped. They have tools online and otherwise to support them at that level, and so now we are coming to the root where it all begins, and so we developed this 11 session prevention education manual not only to educate about drugs and substances, yes that is included as well, but what the evidence is showing is that implementing life skills, along with children to understand their worth and the beauty in taking care of self is what actually assists and make greater impact with delaying or reducing the misuse and abuse of substances,” she explained.

Mrs. Byron-Caines stated that as a result the council came together with the support of the National Counselling Centre; Mrs. Michele de la Coudray-Blake, former Youth Counselling Psychologist; and Ms. Zhanela Claxton to develop the programme and they are introducing.

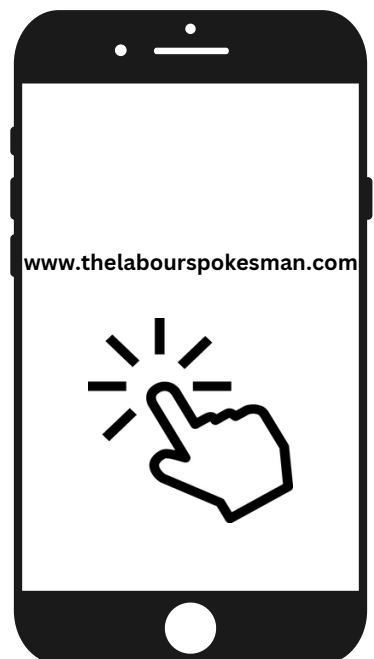

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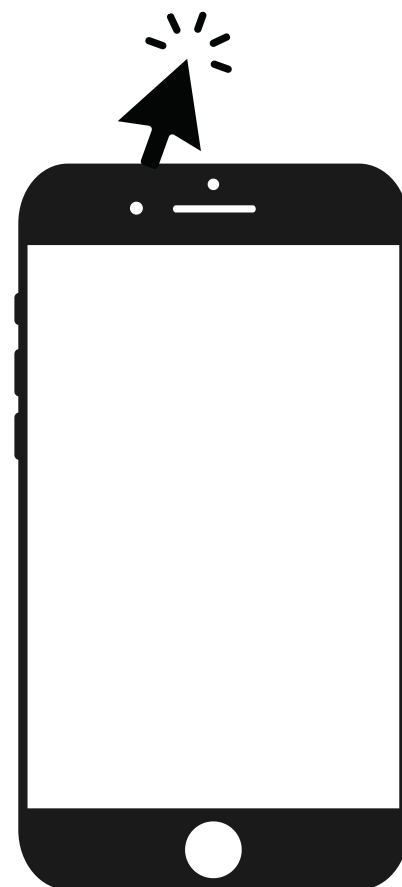

Sustainable agriculture: More women and youth to be involved to reduce high food imports

BASSETERRE, ST. KITTS, December 1, 2022 (MMS-SKN) --

The Federal Ministry of Agriculture, Fisheries, Marine Resources and Cooperatives is committed to joining other countries in the CARICOM region as they undertake to reduce the region's extremely large food imports by 25% in 2025. This will be achieved by ensuring sustainable agriculture where among others, more women and youth will be involved.

"In the agriculture and fisheries sector, it is important to support women in business particularly rural women folk and we have seen over the years how some women groups have been formed and thrived e.g. the Fahies Agricultural Women's Cooperative," said Extension Officer in the Ministry of Agriculture, Ms Jeanelle Kelly.

The agricultural official made the remarks on Wednesday evening, November 30, at the Gideon Force Organic Farm in Old Road where she was one of the panellists at 'The way forward for Sustainable Agriculture' panel discussion.

"Gender issues have been mainstreamed into almost all projects as a balance must be maintained in equitable access to resources that will support sustainability production, greater food security and greater development opportunities in rural areas," said Ms Kelly who was accompanied by Crops Programme Leader in the Department of Agriculture, Mr Ian Chapman.

She further noted: "We see youth involvement in agriculture as an avenue to help sustain the sector as we need to feed into the system as persons exit. So far for example we want to build an even stronger relationship with the Clarence Fitzroy Bryant College (CFBC) to show young people the avenues which they can engage in because agriculture is a science."

The panel discussion was moderated by one of the Federation's leading women farmers who is also the President of the Liamuiga Agricultural Cooperative Society, Mrs Telca Wallace.

This is due to the formal signing of a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between the two youth associations. SKNYPA's President Mauriel Knight and NYPAAB President Kamalie Mannix signed the MOU for their respective organizations after a joint mock parliament on Friday (November 25, 2022).

"It basically establishes and details the relation that SKNYPA and the NYPAAB will have," Mr. Knight said, noting that a virtual version of the joint agreement was signed in February this year.

President Mannix noted that several joint initiatives are spelled out in the memorandum. The most significant of which is an annual exchange. As such, SKNYPA will visit Antigua in 2023. However, plans for this event are shaping up to exceed original plans following a recent engagement with the Governor of the Eastern Caribbean Central Bank (ECCB) Governor, Timothy Antoine and other senior bank officials.

"They would have given the indication of support to the organization that they would want to finance and back a regional youth parliament sitting next year which will happen in Antigua and so looking at that then gives us the opportunity to extend the joint agreement not only to Antigua and Barbuda but then to the other islands in the OECS," President Mannix stated.

He expressed his belief that the organizations are on the verge of creating something that will have a far-reaching positive impact on the future of young people and the development of democracy in the sub-region.

Hon. Brantley thanked MSR Media for the excellent partnership in helping to develop and build this new industry on the island. MSR Media is presently filming its ninth feature film on Nevis, a drama titled “Strictly Confidential”.

Sustainable agriculture: More women and youth to be involved to reduce high food imports (Continued from pg 9)

Other panellists were the President of Gideon Force Organic Farm, Ras Sankofa Maccabee; Extension Officer/Farm Manager Indian Castle Fruit Tree Orchard, Ministry of Agriculture in the Nevis Island Administration, Mr Ronald 'Ras Bankie' King; President of the Sandy Point Agricultural Co-operative Limited (SPARKS) Mr Lionel 'Ras Trustme' Stevens; and a member of the Gideon Organic Farm, Elder Marcello Agard.

"To put my presentation into context, I want to start off with the concept of sustainable agriculture," Ms Jeanelle Kelly told members of the audience. "Simply put, 'Sustainable Agriculture' is farming - that is growing crops and rearing animals at a steady rate or level over a period of time that is not likely to damage the environment. So, it has to be maintainable, supportable, and workable to be considered sustainable."

The St. Kitts and Nevis Food and Nutrition Security Policy, Ms Kelly informed the audience, focuses on food availability, food access, food utilisation and food stability, adding that it also provides the framework to achieve food and nutrition security so that the population can function effectively.

She further advised that one area in particular that she wanted to shine a light on was the need to market locally grown foods so there is a greater uptake by citizens and residents, adding that there is need to sustain the local markets and encourage local cuisines for example at restaurants and hotels.

In her closing remarks, the Extension Officer said that if the government were to be successful in its mandate as highlighted by the Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries, Marine Resources and Cooperatives, the Hon. Samal Duggins, the government would have to encourage greater public-private partnerships as the government cannot do it alone.

"We are here to provide an enabling environment, but you as farmers, fishers, and agripreneurs have to invest in your business and seek out investors to make your business grow," advised Ms Kelly. "I would have touched on various aspects including policy, climate smart practices, training, sustainable financing mechanisms, de-risking agriculture, sustainable use of natural resources-land, soil, and water. These are some of the areas that we have to focus on to move agriculture forward in a sustainable (maintainable, supportable, and workable) manner."

NEW DRUG PREVENTION PROGRAMME TO BE ROLLED OUT IN PRIMARY SCHOOLS ACROSS ST. KITTS AND NEVIS

BASSETERRE, St. Kitts, December 01, 2022 (SKNIS) -

The National Council on Drug Abuse Prevention, in collaboration with the Ministry of Education, is set to introduce a new drug prevention programme in primary schools across the Federation.

The Living Above the Influence 11 Sessions Primary School Substance Use Education & Prevention Programme will be launched in the next school term in January 2023.

The programme was developed by the National Council on Drug Abuse Prevention and the Drug Prevention and Treatment Services Inc., a volunteer group that works closely with the Drug Council, with Clinical Review by the Director of the National Counseling Center, Mrs. Michele de la Coudray Blake.

It is designed to prevent or delay the use of substances among the “at-risk” students at the primary school level in the Federation through education and by equipping the students with tools and skills that will increase their capacity to make good, informed decisions when faced with substance use situations.

In a build-up to its eventual introduction, the National Council on Drug Abuse Prevention launched the programme’s manual to guidance counselors from the various schools across St. Kitts in November.

During that exercise, the guidance counselors received a detailed overview of the programme, which included lesson plans, homework and class activities, and monitoring and evaluation tools. The National Drug Council will support guidance counselors by facilitating sessions where or when that support is needed.

The Living Above the Influence 11 Sessions Primary School Substance Use Education & Prevention Programme will be rolled out in all grade 4 classes at all public primary schools in the Federation in January 2023.

Man Shot Dead Found By Driver

BASSETERRE, St.Kitts-(Wednesday 30th November 2022)-A man in his 30s recently shot dead in the Dieppe Bay community in St.Kitts died as a result of shock due to multiple gunshot wounds to his body.

Killed was 35-year-old Alvin Romney of Parson Ground whose body was found by a motorist in the area after the incident.

A police statement issued on Wednesday 30th November-five days after the deadly incident- informed that on that day an autopsy performed by Resident Pathologist Dr. Adrian Nuñez concluded that "death was as a result of hypovolemic shock due to multiple gunshot wounds to his body."

The Police received the report about the matter sometime before 9 p.m. The Police responded and, upon arrival, they observed that Romney had what appeared to be multiple gunshot wounds about his body

The District Medical Officer also visited the scene and pronounced him dead.

The scene was processed by personnel from the Forensic Services Unit and several items of evidential value were taken into custody.

Persons with information regarding this matter are urged to contact the Violent Crimes Unit by dialling 467-1887, 467-1888, 662-3468, their nearest Police Station or the Crime Hotline at 707 where information can be given anonymously. Investigations into the matter are ongoing.

Police are investigating Romney's shooting death which took place on Friday 25th November.

Reportedly, the young man's motionless body was found lying along the Island Main Road in Dieppe Bay by a motorist who was driving through the area on Friday, November 25, 2022.
