Flow Senior Calypso Monarch Finalists shuffled as Lady Diva is Disqualified

Friday 13th January, 2023

The St Kitts Nevis National Carnival Committee (SKNNCC) received a formal complaint from a finalist in the Flow Senior Calypso Monarch Competition against Kimara "Lady Diva" Martin who placed second runner-up in the competition that was held on Thursday, December 29, 2022. The complainant claimed that the song entitled "D Power of

Black" sung by Lady Diva in the second round of the competition was previously performed in a competition in Trinidad by Ms Curlissa Charles-Mapp and as such was a violation of the rules of the competition.

Article 3(b) of the rules of the Flow Senior Calypso Monarch Competition states, "Calypsos entered in the SCMC must be original and must not have been entered in any previously SKNNCC-organized Junior or Senior Calypso Monarch Competitions and Soca (Groovy or Power) Monarch Competition and any calypso or soca competition whether regionally or internationally".

The rules further state that "where a calypsonian violates 3(a), (b) and (c) the penalty shall be disqualification of the Calypsonian

Trained Medical PM Offers Advice During Flu Season

BASSETTERRE, St.Kitts (Thursday 12th January 2023)- “It is recommended that you visit your regular doctor or the district medical officer at the nearest health centre if you develop any symptoms of the flu. Persons are also encouraged to remain at home until fully recovered and to wear masks to prevent the transmission of the virus if contracted.”

Such information has been provided by Prime Minister and Minister of Health Dr. Terrance Drew- a trained medical doctor- as shared via a post on his official Facebook page on Wednesday 11th January 2023, whilst advising about a gradual increase in RSV, COVID-19, and Influenza (Flu) cases caused by influenza type A virus in the Federation.

He highlighted that: “The Ministry of Health is monitoring the emergence of XBB.1.5 latest Omicron subvariant surging in the northeastern USA. This is the most transmissible variant that has been detected so far. The variant Omicron and its subvariants remain the dominant variants and they cause less severe disease.”

“St. Kitts and Nevis, as with the rest of the region, is in the middle of the 2022-2023 Influenza (flu) season which typically occurs between November to March each year. As the concerns over the influenza, Respiratory Syncytial Virus (RSV), and the new strain of the COVID-19 rise, the Ministry of Health seeks to advise the public on ways to address the symptoms and prevent transmission,” he also stated.

According to Dr. Drew: “Influenza (flu) is an acute and very contagious respiratory tract infection caused by influenza type A (H3N2) and type B viruses circulating in all parts of the world, and in the Caribbean sub-region.”

Additionally, he pointed out that: “The COVID-19

pandemic continues to impact us globally, the USA, Europe, the Caribbean region, and the Federation. There has been a gradual increase in RSV, COVID-19, and Influenza (Flu) cases caused by influenza type A virus in the Federation confirmed by laboratory testing.”

He recalled that in August 2022, he announced, as Prime Minister of St. Kitts and Nevis and Minister of Health, “that the mask mandates have been lifted within the Federation except that you are expected to wear a face mask when visiting the hospital or any

health facility. However, the public health measures such as mandatory isolation for persons who test positive for COVID-19 remain.”

“It is recommended that you visit your regular doctor or the district medical officer at the nearest health centre if you develop any symptoms of the flu. Persons are also encouraged to remain at home until fully recovered and to wear masks to prevent the transmission of the virus if contracted,” Dr. Drew added.

The Health Minister outlined that: “The Ministry of Health takes this opportunity to wish everyone optimal health, happiness, and success for 2023 and beyond.”

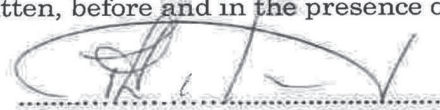

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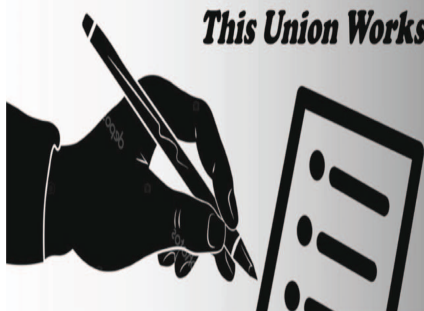

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Astaphan Comments On Near Nakedness, Sexual Dancing For Sugar Mas Parade

BASSETTERRE, St.Kitts (Wednesday 11th January 2023)- “What you saw on the streets of Basseterre just over a week ago was evidence of all of that. Women, many of them mothers, parading the streets in a state of near nakedness.”

Such is the view of well-known social commentator Dwyer Astaphan, aged in his 70s- as expressed during his latest commentary aired on Wednesday 11th January 2022, calling on women to stop degrading themselves wearing skimpy costumes and simulating sex through dance based on his observation of street parade during Sugar Mas 51 (St. Kitts-Nevis National Carnival).

“Now, don’t tell me that this is our culture, because it is not. It is imported crudeness from Brazil and Trinidad. Indeed, there’s nothing cultural about it. It is just vulgar and unbecoming and we are such copycats, even when we are copying behaviors that diminish us, we copy still” Astaphan remarked.

He questioned the response by a woman who took part saying: “One of them later told me she had done it to relieve stress. Now I can see jumping up and having a good time being a stress reliever. But how do these public displays of vulgar near nakedness bending over twerking, exposing your nether tenderness and having men ‘wuk up’ on you relieve stress? How does objectifying yourself with any number of men taking turns on your behind in front of the world relieve your stress? How can you do that and face your children? Is there perhaps a hidden devil in you which needs that sort of degradation to validate itself? Or are you unaware of the fact that you are indeed degrading yourself?”

Astaphan also stated: “Are you going to tell me that there are so many of our women in this country who are suffering from such a low level of self-esteem that they would make themselves a public spectacle like this? Having said that, though, a lot of people watching on are not seeing anything wrong with it, which suggests that their minds, too, have been compromised and corrupted. They say that this is what people do nowadays. Go with the flow. This is young people thing and people are freer than they used to be, free to express themselves. What is wrong with this is that if people are free to express themselves and to choose to do so in ways that degrade them and degrade the human condition in our country, then we are all on the way to hell in a handbasket.”

Astaphan said such is not a good direction for families.

“This is not a good direction for us as women, as men, as families, which to a large extent incite kids. Unfortunately, the word families is more a word than an institution, and this is where the

breakdown begins. Things are bad and getting worse. What will our children be seeing and doing ten, 20, 30 years from now? What we are doing now is triggering things to the next step of degradation and defilement, of the dignity of our Women and our people generally. Whatever happened to dignity and elegance? No, I’m not saying that there’s no room for little naughtiness, even in public. And I’m not a prude by any stretch of the imagination but we are contaminating our values and those of our children and our

society. The direction in which we are headed will destroy the psychological, social and cultural fabric of this country. What is worse is that the degradation is being perpetrated by and against women.”

He described women as the heart and soul of the human race.

“The woman is the heart and soul of the human race. She is the carrier and the nurturer of the human race. She is more often than not the backbone of the home and the family, which we know in more than enough instances, the home and the family are broken. In our country, she is our mother, and her body is the tabernacle of humanity. She is a person, yes, very attractive to us. Males are to most of us males. But she’s not just a body. She’s a human being with a soul and a mind. And she needs to respect herself. And she needs to be respected by us. She has to insist on that respect. And the behavior that you see being displayed does not represent insistence on being respected. If you are offended by what I say, I’m sorry but I have to say it. What went on at the carnival was disrespectful,” he told.

He questioned: “Tell me, would it be less fun for the revelers if our women dressed less skimpily and danced and the men took less crudely and vulgarly? Nothing is wrong with swaying your hips. Nothing is wrong with some gyration. But the crude and vulgar and simulating sex all over the street with the nation’s children looking on, that’s not good enough. And it must stop. And the men who engage in this practice. How would they like it if someone did what they do to these women, to their daughters? Is our culture now defined by woke up and crude vulgarity? If so, we have to change it.”

He expressed the view that following the death of the nation’s first Premier Robert Bradshaw in 1978, “this country started to fall from a state of morality to immorality then to amorality. Amorality is where in people’s minds, there is no difference between right and wrong. Conscience doesn’t play a part. It’s a dangerous condition. We change from values based living to prudishness, superficiality, selfishness, insensitivity, crudeness and vulgarity.”

For Astaphan such is “very troubling.”



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Men Attacked By Gunmen In Deadly Broad Daylight

BASSETERRE, St.Kitts (Thursday 12th January 2023)- Police on Nevis are investigating a shooting which recently occurred in the Bath Village area leaving a young man in his 20s dead while another in his 40s has been left wounded.
Dead is 26-year-old Javon Grant of

Maddens Estate while 45-year-old Javier Charles of Bath Village is injured. Police are investigating a fatal shooting incident that occurred in the Bath Village area on Wednesday 11th January 2023, about 4 p.m. Officers responded to a report that two persons were shot.
Police say investigations so far have

revealed that Charles and Grant were sitting in the vicinity of a bar in Bath Village, when two (2) armed, masked assailants approached and shot at them. The assailants then fled the scene.
Reportedly, Grant collapsed and Charles ran.
Both victims were subsequently transported in a private vehicle to the Alexandra Hospital. Grant was pronounced dead upon arrival at the hospital.
Police say Charles is warded in a stable condition and is being treated for injuries to his neck.
Reportedly, the crime scene was processed by personnel from the Forensic Services Unit and several items of evidential value were taken into custody.
The Police are urging persons with information about this incident to contact the Charlestown Police Station by dialling 469-5391, the nearest Police Station or the Crime Hotline at 707. Investigations into the matter are ongoing.

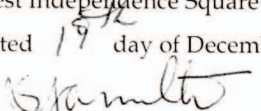

Persons Asked To be Vigilant Against Several Respiratory Infections Including COVID-19

Basseterre, St. Kitts and Nevis, January 11, 2023 [Press Secretary's Office]: St. Kitts and Nevis, as with the rest of the region, is in the middle of the 2022-2023 Influenza (flu) season which typically occurs between November to March each year.

As the concerns over the influenza, Respiratory Syncytial Virus (RSV), and the new strain of the COVID-19 rise, the Ministry of Health seeks to advise the public on ways to address the symptoms and prevent transmission.

Influenza (flu) is an acute and very contagious respiratory tract infection caused by influenza type A (H3N2) and type B viruses circulating in all parts of the world, and in the Caribbean sub-region.

The COVID-19 pandemic continues to impact us globally, the USA, Europe,

the Caribbean region, and the Federation. There has been a gradual increase in RSV, COVID-19, and Influenza (Flu) cases caused by influenza type A virus in the Federation confirmed by laboratory testing.

The Ministry of Health is monitoring the emergence of XBB.1.5 latest Omicron subvariant surging in the north-eastern USA. This is the most transmissible variant that has been detected so far. The variant Omicron and its subvariants remain the dominant variants and they cause less severe disease.

Prime Minister of St. Kitts and Nevis and Minister of Health, Hon. Dr. Terrance Drew announced in August of 2022 that the mask mandates have been lifted within the Federation except that you are expected to wear a face mask when visiting the hospital or any health facility. However, the public health measures such as mandatory isolation

for persons who test positive for COVID-19 remain.

RSV is a common respiratory virus that usually causes mild, cold-like symptoms. Most people recover in a week or two, but RSV can be serious, especially for children aged four years and younger and older adults.

The influenza virus causes mild to very severe illness which can at times be detrimental. The symptoms often occur within one (1) to four (4) days after becoming infected. Persons may experience some fever, sore throat, coughing, stuffy or runny nose, muscle, and joint pains (body aches), headache and sometimes dizziness, chills, loss of taste sensation and appetite, malaise & fatigue, or sometimes diarrhoea and vomiting.

Most persons recover from these flu symptoms within one (1) week.

However, some persons are at high risk of progressing and developing complications of the flu like ear infection, sinus infection, lung infection or pneumonia, and even worsening of underlying chronic medical conditions such as asthma, heart disease and diabetes.

It is recommended that you visit your regular doctor or the district medical officer at the nearest health centre if you develop any symptoms of the flu. Persons are also encouraged to remain at home until fully recovered and to wear masks to prevent the transmission of the virus if contracted.

The Ministry of Health takes this opportunity to wish everyone optimal health, happiness, and success for 2023 and beyond.

Malcolm Guishard, his birthday will actually fall on the 16th of January, so we decided to have celebrations which would focus on that date.

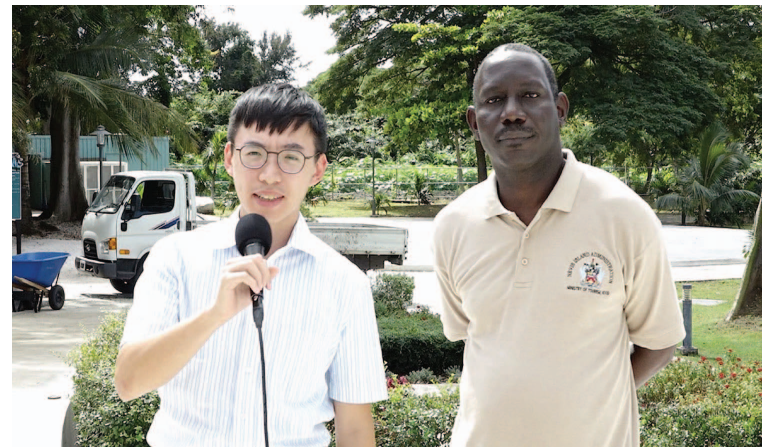

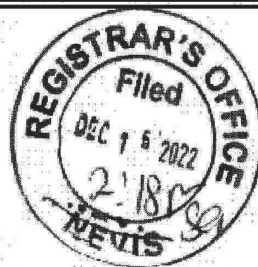
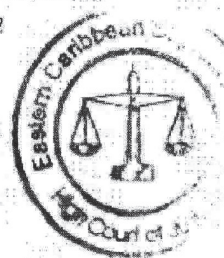

US Sending Delegation To Cuba To Restart Talks On Law Enforcement

By Matt Spetalnick and Dave Sherwood

WASHINGTON/HAVANA, 12 January (Reuters) - The Biden administration plans to send a delegation to Havana this month to restart US-Cuba talks on law-enforcement issues that were halted under former President Donald Trump, The US State Department said on Thursday.

US concerns about counterterrorism will be among the subjects addressed, a State Department spokesperson said. Trump placed Cuba on the US list of state sponsors of terrorism shortly before his term ended in January 2021, and the Biden administration has been reviewing this since taking office.

The meeting will be the first of its kind since the lawenforcement dialogue, which was started in 2015 under former President Barack Obama, was stopped in 2018 under Trump as he rolled back his predecessor's historic detente with Communist-ruled Cuba.

President Joe Biden has begun reversing some of Trump's policies but has maintained others, insisting the Cuban government must improve its human rights record.

"This type of dialogue enhances the national security of The United States through improved international law enforcement coordination, which enables The United States to better protect US citizens and bring transnational criminals to justice," the State Department spokesperson said in a statement.

But the official added that "this dialogue does not impact the administration's continued focus on critical human rights issues in Cuba."

A person in Washington familiar with the matter said the talks were expected to take place next week. The Cuban government did not immediately respond to a request for comment.

US and Cuban officials last year held rounds of talks, in Washington and Havana, focused on migration, as Washington sought to stem the flow of Cubans to The United States by land and sea.

The talks are expected to focus on combating cybercrime, terrorist threats and drug trafficking, among other issues, according to the source familiar with the matter.

US officials did not immediately respond to Reuters questions on whether the discussions were expected to include whether Cuba could be removed from the sponsors of terrorism list, which also designates Iran, Syria and North Korea.

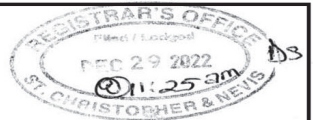
Cuba has called the US designation a "slander" and a false pretext to continue punishing the island nation economically.

The Biden administration last May kept Cuba on a short list of countries the United States says are "not cooperating fully" in its fight against terrorism. The State Department spokesperson said the coming talks "provides a forum to raise difficult matters and convey our concerns directly to the Cuban government."

The US delegation, expected to be "working level" officials, will have representatives from The State Department, National Security Council and Justice Department, including The Federal Bureau of Investigation, according to the person familiar with the matter.

Climate, Gender in Focus During Bilateral between CDB and Canada Government Officials

January 11, 2023, BRIDGETOWN, Barbados - Deepening collaboration between Canada and the Caribbean Development Bank (CDB) on areas of mutual interest such as climate action and gender equality, was on the agenda when Canada's Minister of International

Development, Hon. Harjit S. Sajjan visited CDB on Monday.

Minister Sajjan who is also Canada's Governor to CDB, framed the visit as an opportunity for both learning from and engagement with CDB officials.

"My trip here is about learning - learning from all of you on what areas we can better work together on towards achieving the Sustainable development goals. It's no secret that Canada has a

very strong approach [on gender] through our Feminist International Assistance Policy. I'd love to hear from you on how we can work together to ensure all development initiatives also contribute to gender equality. We've already seen a significant impact in the Caribbean and other parts of the world and hope to continue to work together in this area in a meaningful and tangible way," said the Minister.

Minister Sajjan stressed the importance of the Canada-Caribbean relationship, noting:

"The Caribbean is very important to Canada because of its cultural, economic, historic, and social ties. I can assure you that everyone, from the Prime Minister, to all of my cabinet colleagues will remain committed to partnership with the region," stated Minister Sajjan as he led off the bilateral meeting between his delegation and

CDB's team.

Canada and CDB have a long-standing partnership, as Canada was one of the founding members of the Bank back in 1970.

CDB President, Dr Hyginus 'Gene' Leon, welcomed the opportunity for engagement with an enduring friend of the Region.

He noted the bilateral came at a crucial juncture for the Caribbean in its development trajectory as it approaches deadlines for the Sustainable Development Goals while addressing the residual economic impact of the COVID-19 pandemic and ongoing climate vulnerability.

"The Bank is at a very important juncture and that is because the Region is at a critical point. We have little time; I'd argue even no time, to accelerate the development of the Region. There is an existential crisis on the climate front as well as the issue of access to finance to propel development and position our countries to be actors on the global stage with the means to promote and sustain the livelihoods of the people," he outlined.

"The only way we can do this is through building resilient economies," stressed Dr Leon.

UK And Japan Sign Defence Deal Amid Rising Concern About China

LONDON (AP) - The leaders of Britain and Japan signed a defense agreement Wednesday that could see troops deployed to each others' countries.

The two countries are strengthening military ties amid growing concern about China's increasing military assertiveness and designs toward Taiwan, which it considers a renegade province.

Prime Minister Rishi Sunak, UK, and Prime Minister Fumio Kishida, Japan, formally signed the agreement in the symbolic setting of the Tower of London fortress. The British government said the it "cements our commitment to the Indo-Pacific" region.

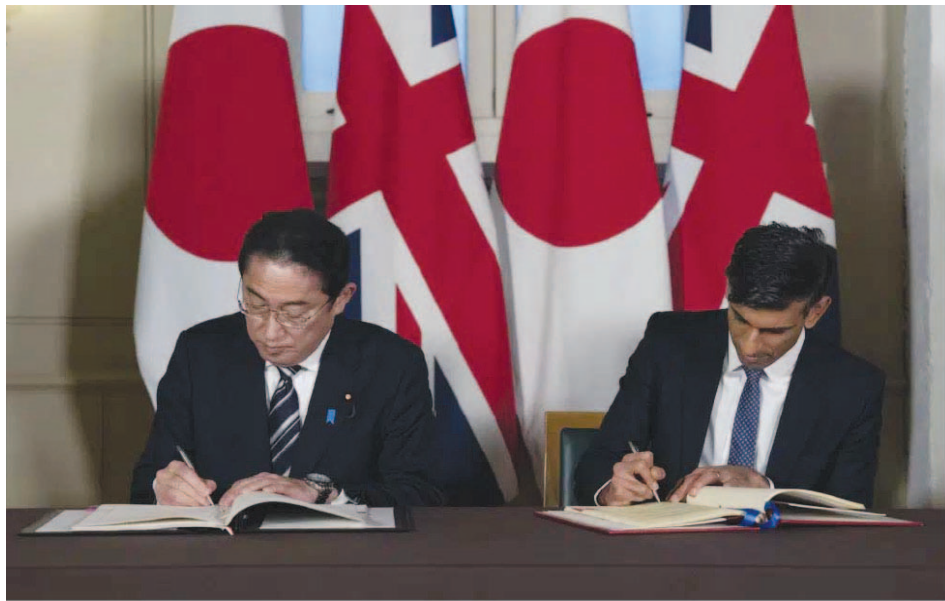
"The relationship between our two countries is stronger than ever, not just across trade and security, but also our values," Sunak told his Japanese counterpart.

Kishida, referring to the importance of security and cooperation between Japan and The UK, said he hoped he and Sunak would have a "strategic discussion."

The Reciprocal Access Agreement, Japan's first defense agreement with a European nation, allows the two Group of Seven countries to hold joint military exercises. The deal had been in the works for years and was discussed when Kishida visited then-Prime Minister Boris Johnson in London in May.

The British government said it will allow the armed forces of The UK and Japan "to plan and deliver larger and more complex military exercises and deployments."

The agreement reflects a new "Indo-Pacific tilt" in Britain's foreign policy following the country's departure from The European Union in 2020.

Britain sees Japan as its key East Asian ally.

"In this increasingly competitive world, it is more important than ever that democratic societies continue to stand shoulder to shoulder as we navigate the unprecedented global challenges of our time," Sunak said.

During their meeting at The Tower of London, a 1,000-year-old former palace and prison that houses the Crown Jewels, the leaders viewed Japanese armor presented to King James in 1613 by Shogun Tokugawa Hidetada of Japan to mark the first-ever trade agreement between England and Japan.

Japan has joined Western nations in condemning Russia's invasion of Ukraine and imposing sanctions against Moscow. Japan also has supplied Ukraine with helmets and other non-lethal military aid.

Japan is concerned Russia's invasion of Ukraine could have an impact in East Asia, where China's military has grown increasingly assertive and threatened to unite with Taiwan by force if necessary.

Concerned about rapid weapons advancement in China and North Korea, Japan

Brazil - Swift And Robust Response To The Insurrection Highlights The Strength Of Democracy

Brazil's state institutions, including the recently installed government of Luiz Inacio "Lula" da Silva, have reacted swiftly in the wake of the riots in Brasilia last weekend.

Hundreds of rioters have already been arrested, and the state governor of the federal district has been suspended for his sluggish and ineffective response.

Thousands of supporters of the ousted right-wing former president, Jair Bolsonaro, invaded the The Plaza Of The Three Powers - the heart of government in the country's capital - on Sunday 8 January. They swarmed into the presidential Planalto palace, as well as the national congress and federal supreme court buildings.

Policemen and journalists covering the riot were injured and weapons were stolen from the presidential security office. The bill for damage to public buildings, works of art and colonial-era furniture is likely to run into millions of reais.

While shocking, the riot was not unforeseen, like the storming of the US capitol in 2021. Academics, judges, journalists and politicians had all warned about its possibility. Much of Bolsonaro's support base had not accepted the result of last October's election and were openly discussing an attempt to seize back power.

The US Capitol attack was repeatedly held up as a cautionary tale.

The riots had varying degrees of support from various sections of Brazil's political right. This included from businessmen, landowners, some of the media and - in the most striking difference to The US - members of the armed forces and police.

Sections of the army appear to have been complicit. For months, anti-democratic groups had been allowed to set up camps around army barracks, which, on some occasions, have even defended the protesters against the intervention of state and

in December adopted key security and defense reforms, including a counterstrike capability that makes a break from the self-defense-only principle it has maintained since its defeat in World War II.

Japan holds the presidency of the G-7 this year, and Kishida is on a weeklong trip to visit allies including Italy, France, Canada and The United States, where he is due to meet President Joe Biden at the White House on Friday.

municipal security forces.

The army should also have been responsible for protecting the presidential palace, but were not deployed on Sunday until the rioters had already invaded the complex.

Similarly, the military police, who are responsible for patrolling assigned areas, also appear to have been supportive of the rioters. Police officers were seen taking pictures with rioters and there were reports that the military police even escorted some of them to the Plaza of the Three Powers.

Some media organisations, journalists and commentators have been accused of encouraging or defending the anti-democratic riot, notoriously the right-wing Jovem Pan and some of its contributors. But most journalists have been steadfast in their support for democracy and the rule of law.

Restoring order and democracy

Foreign governments expressed outrage at the violence, and members of The US congress demanded the extradition of Bolsonaro, who is currently in Florida, to Brazil.

Meanwhile Brazilian and international commentators have argued that this could be the beginning of the end of Bolsonarismo, because the episode will strengthen Lula's legitimacy and allow him to use emergency measures to shore up his position.

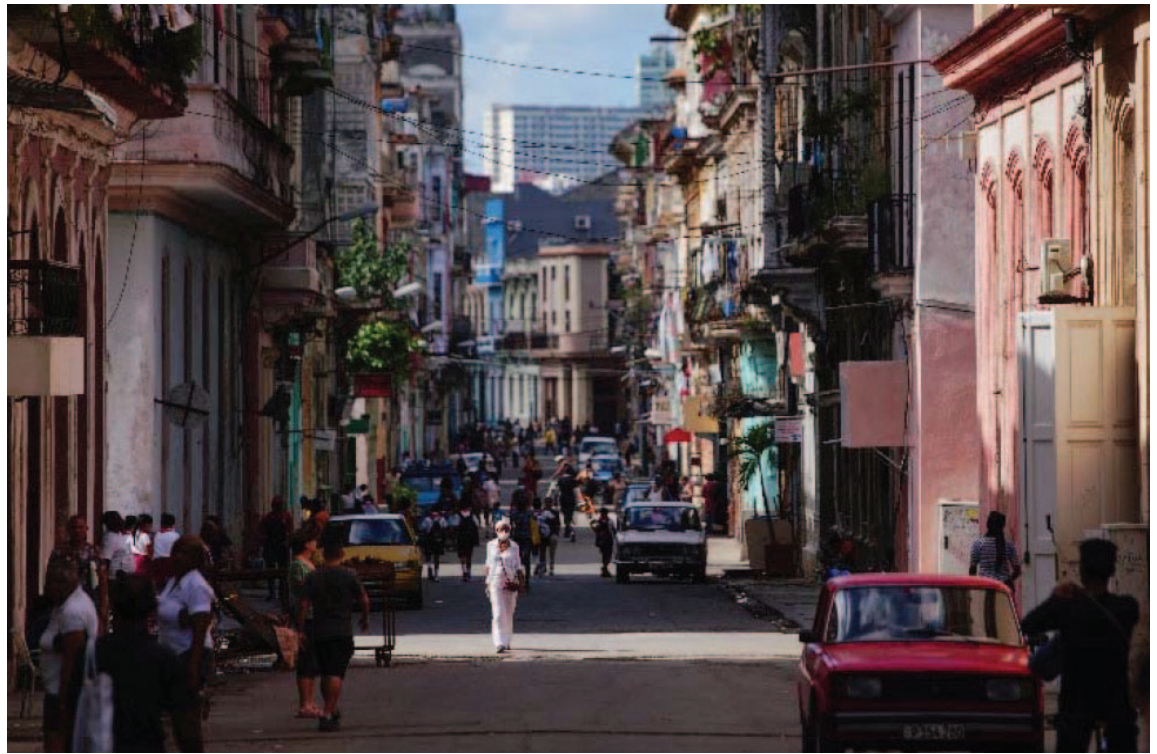
State institutions were swift to respond. The president issued a decree mandating federal intervention in public security in Brasilia. The number two in the justice ministry, Ricardo Cappelli, has been given responsibility for overseeing the state security.

Justice minister, Flavio Dino, told a press conference that the riot involved "acts of terror". He said the ministry would take necessary measures to ensure the maintenance of order in the capital and said Cappelli would be given all assistance to ensure this.

Supreme court judge Alexandre de Moraes suspended the governor of Brasilia for 90 days on the grounds of "gross misconduct" during the crisis. Moraes is responsible for leading

the investigation into anti-democratic acts. He also ordered the dismantling of the pro-Bolsonaro camps and roadblocks within 24 hours. Moraes argued that:

Every single responsible person will be held accountable for acts that threaten democracy, the rule of law and institutions, including wilful connivance - by action or omission.

Lula and the presidents of congress and the supreme court met early yesterday morning to discuss further measures.

After the meeting they published a note condemning the acts and stating that the three branches of government are "united so that institutional measures are taken, according to the law".

8 January has, if nothing else, highlighted the anti-democratic nature of Bolsonarismo. But it is possible to take a positive view of the swift and robust nature in which Brazil's institutions reacted to this direct attack on Brazil's constitutional order.

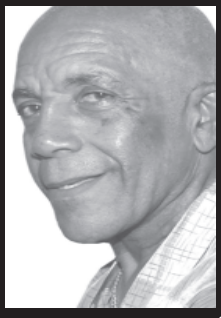

RENDER UNTO NO MAN, EVIL FOR EVIL!!

Dear reader, when Dr, Denzil Llewellyn Douglas returned to the Federation in 1986, after finishing his studies as a Medical Doctor at Jamaica Campus, of the West Indies University and performing his internship, he was not greeted too kindly by the Simmonds, PAM Administration. Lee Llewellyn Moore had just lost his second General Election as Leader of the St. Kitts-Nevis Labour Party and the Party was in shambles. Labour supporters welcomed him with open arms, for they saw him as the replacement to Lee Llewellyn Moore, who, though a Brilliant Scholar, having won the Leeward Islands Scholar, went to England to pursue STUDIES in Law. whilst a Scholar in England, he won the Commonwealth Debating Competition. On his return home as the Public Relations Officer for the Labour Party under the great Leadership of comrade Robert Llewellyn Bradshaw, he was greeted with much fanfare. Australia pull out of Afghanistan series because of Taliban stance on women and girls

Australia have withdrawn from a men's one-day series against Afghanistan in March because of the Taliban's restrictions on women and girls.

The three-match series was scheduled to take place in the United Arab Emirates. Cricket Australia said it took the decision after "consultation with relevant stakeholders, including the Australian government".

As a result, Afghanistan spinner Rashid Khan said he was considering pulling out of Australia's Big Bash League.

Khan plays for Adelaide Strikers in the Twenty20 competition.

"I take great pride in representing my country and we have made great progress on the world stage," Khan wrote in a post on social media.

"This decision from CA sets us back in that journey.

"If playing vs Afghanistan is so uncomfortable for Australia then I wouldn't want to make anyone uncomfortable with my presence in the BBL.

"Therefore, I will be strongly considering my future in that competition."

Taliban ban women from Kabul parks

The Taliban returned to power in Afghanistan in August 2021.

They banned girls from going to secondary schools and from studying certain subjects as well as telling them they could only choose universities within their province.

On 20 December, they then banned women from attending university, provoking international condemnation. A few days later, the Taliban banned women from working for local and international non-Governmental organisations (NGO).

"This decision follows the recent announcement by the Taliban of further restrictions on women's and girls' education and employment opportunities and their ability to access parks and gyms," said Cricket Australia.

"CA is committed to supporting growing the game for women and men around the world, including in Afghanistan, and will continue to engage with the Afghanistan Cricket Board in anticipation of improved conditions for women and girls in the country."

Former Australia captain Belinda Clark, who retired from the sport in 2005 after winning two World Cups, told BBC Sport's Stumped that it was a "reasonable move".

"It's a basic human right that people should be able to play sport," she said. "If you have a country without that basic human right then I think you have a problem.

"I know the ICC (International Cricket Council) is in a difficult position about how they might manage that among members but, if sport is not going to stand up and say you need to be equitable and providing opportunities for both genders, then who's going to do it?

"I don't want to overlay my cultural beliefs on to other people, but if countries

Married Zimbabwe cricket coaches die three weeks apart

Cricket in Zimbabwe is mourning the death of two married national team coaches who passed away within weeks of each other.

The couple are survived by two children.

Sinikiwe Mpfu, the 37-year-old assistant coach to the women's national team, passed away "suddenly" on 7 January, being pronounced dead on arrival at a medical facility after collapsing at her home in Masvingo.

The former international, who was nicknamed "Sneeze", was married to Zimbabwe's men's fielding coach, Shepherd Makunura, who died on 15 December after a long battle with illness, aged 46.

Mpfu was a talented all-rounder who was part of the history-making team that played the Lady Chevrons' first-ever international in December 2006.

"Sinikiwe's departure has left us shattered," said national women's team captain Mary-Anne Musonda.

"This is the least we expected just after burying her husband.

"There was always joy and laughter with her and she was an inspiration to many."

A statement from Zimbabwe Cricket described her post-playing career as "an integral part of Zimbabwe Cricket's game development structures" at both provincial and national levels.

Mpfu has been part of the technical teams that have seen Zimbabwe excel in women's cricket in Africa, earning one-day international status and recently finishing just one win away from qualifying for the ICC Women's T20 World Cup.

As head coach she guided Mountaineers Women to victory in the inaugural Fifty50 Challenge - Zimbabwe's provincial one-day championship for women - in the 2020/21 season.

"Death has robbed us of a genuinely warm individual," said Zimbabwe Cricket's managing director, Givemore Makoni.

"More importantly [she was] a loving mother...one of the pioneers of women's cricket in Zimbabwe who went on to excel as a coach at provincial and national levels.

"With her sudden passing coming just a few weeks after the death of her loving husband, who was also a part of our national team coaching setup, this is particularly a difficult and painful time for their young children, families, friends and the entire cricket fraternity."

Makunura and Mpfu were both products of the programme to develop black players and coaches, and they had looked set to serve the game in Zimbabwe for many more years.
