Beware!

Economic Woes Ahead

Last week we sought to draw our readers' attention to the truly horrific effects which corruption in government can have on virtually every aspect of national life and well-being, illustrating just how those negatives impact generations well into the future.

As examples we used the current situations in Sri Lanka and South Africa, both of which continue to evolve and have been receiving extensive coverage at the global level.

This week we wish to alert you, the people of St Kitts and Nevis, to another economic danger very likely to pose a threat on a global level.

At page 8 we are carrying an article, republished from the Australia edition of The Conversation, in which Dr John Hawkins of The University of Canberra, warns of the looming threat of 'stagflation'.

Dr Hawkins is a world-renowned specialist in the area of applied economics and finance, with many years of experience in central banking and the Bank for International Settlements, colloquially known as 'The central banks Central Bank'. He is therefore taken very seriously by financial authorities the world over.

Let us hope that ours will take him just as seriously.

Stagflation is that economic state of affairs arising from the combined effects of 'stagnation' and 'inflation' occurring simultaneously. The last time the world experienced that phenomenon was in the early nineteen-seventies (1970s), when the major oil exporting countries of the Middle East severely reduced supplies to The US and other nations which supported Israel.

Almost overnight The price of oil increased four-fold.

Dr Hawkins and many other experts are of the opinion that, while the current situation is very challenging, matters may not become as severe as they were at the time of the first oil crisis, mainly because it may be possible to contain the inflationary factor.

Nevertheless, because food and energy supplies are bought so frequently, they contribute to what is known as 'inflationary psychology', and the frequent increases in prices lead to demands for higher wages, amongst other considerations.

These pressures cause repeating effects that eventually drive matters to the point where economic and financial demands cannot be satisfied (known as a wage-price spiral, in which higher prices drive demands for higher wages, which employers then pass on in higher prices.)

Most ironically, attempts to break the cycle usually requires higher interest rates, which in turn drives economies into deeper recession.

The combined effects of COVID-19, an unanticipated strong rebound, the pronounced switch in demand from services to goods, the setbacks in the global supply chain, and now the war in Europe, appear to have combined to bring about continually increasing prices of "oil, gas, food, fertilisers and other commodities." These all lead to stagflation.

Added to all of that is the fact that, as a direct consequence of COVID-19, there has been a marked decline in China's labour productivity, which has resulted in the loss of one of the most important and impactful 'boost to global economic growth and restraint on global inflation.'

According to the findings and recommendations of the experts, as contained in the report of the Bank for International Settlements, extensive financial vulnerabilities, particularly debt, were major factors contributing to the severity of the early seventies experiences, and a key lesson learnt was that "the long-term costs of doing nothing outweigh the short-term pain of bringing inflation under control."

They advocate that central banks and

governmental authorities need to 'raise interest rates enough to bring inflation down, but not enough to cause a recession.' It means governments must do away with handouts or tax cuts to help people with cost-of-living pressures. In their words "Expansionary fiscal policy will only make things worse. Assistance must therefore be strictly targeted to those who most need it."

This particular warning seems to be aimed directly at that which currently passes for a government here in St Kitts and Nevis, an entity which has quite literally drained the nation's resources, financial and otherwise, indulging s they have been for so many years, in hand outs and other forms of economic subjugation of our people.

When Labour is returned to government, as indeed it must soon be, Dr Drew and his administration will be confronted by economic and financial problems of gigantic proportions, all engineered at the local level by the shenanigans and skulduggery of the First and Second fellow.

And that will most likely be at the time when stagflation sets in.

But Labour has a sound history of dealing with such problems. In the early nineteen seventies, with Mr Bradshaw as premier, and Mr Southwell as finance minister, St Kitts and Nevis not only weathered the storm, but achieved economic growth which made us the envy of the region.

Such abilities are in our political and administrative DNA. We did it before, and we can (and will) do it again.

But first, we MUST rid the country of the naked emperor and his underlings.

When that day comes we MUST all go out and VOTE FOR THE HAND!

SKNLP Leader Calls On Members of Public To March For National Issue In Standing Up For Overseas Voters

BASSETERRE, St.Kitts (Thursday 30th June 2022)- Leader of the St.Kitts-Nevis Labour Party (SKNLP) Dr. Terrance Drew is calling on members of the public, despite political affiliations, to partake in a march slated for Friday 1st July 2022 in helping to bring attention to a national issue in standing up against the blocking of overseas voters.

During his appearance on Freedom FM for the Party's sponsored 'We Talk' weekly programme claimed that a tactic used by Prime Minister Dr. Harris for the 2020 General Elections, during the COVID-19 pandemic, is being planned once again for the upcoming 2022 polls.

"We are marching primarily in solidarity with our overseas nationals because what is happening, we know that in 2020 the then Unity government used the COVID situation to deny our nationals and citizens the opportunity to come home and vote. We can remember those famous '14 days who out, stay out' and those kinds of things really in violation of people's rights."

The SKNLP Leader went on to say: "Today St.Kitts and Nevis is probably the only country where people in the OECS are asking for permission to come home. Imagine you have to do a COVID test, upload it on a website and you have to wait for somebody to give you permission to come to your country of birth."

Countries that are on from such restrictions such as Trinidad, Barbados, Guyana, Antigua and Dominica were mentioned as well as the US.

Dr. Drew stated: "The world is moving on. However, we know the restrictions in St.Kitts and Nevis are not scientifically based. They are not based on sound economic principles; they are based on political expediency meaning Harris is looking for political advantage and he's doing so by denying the people or to put up some roadblock to vote so we are already up to the plan and trick that he's going to be using that when people want to come home to vote they would have gone and applied and upload their information, their information would be ignored and no permission will be sent and so they will not be able to come to our country."

"That should not be. That is going to hit us in the gut democratically and we would not and we should not accept it. This is not a Labour Party's issue; this is a national issue and all of our people should be involved, and that is why I am inviting everybody to the march," the SKNLP Leader added.

Touching on present national issues, Dr. Drew spoke about the political atmosphere of instability.

"Our government, it has fallen and as a result of that there is political instability. What we see happening is a veneer; it is not what is a true reflection of what is happening, it is just a veneer. There is a lot of tumbling under what is happening and people are watching and asking themselves the pertinent questions as to where St.Kitts and Nevis really going."

He continued: "It is not only our people who are watching but we are being watched from around the region. I just did an interview a day ago with a Grenadian newscast- and people there and throughout the Caribbean are very interested in what is happening in St.Kitts and Nevis and so we have to say to the Caribbean that what you're seeing here in St.Kitts and Nevis at our political system is more stable than it seems and we have

to send a strong message after this next general elections that we are mature people and we are of course capable of governing ourselves. A question of governance and whether you can govern yourself is one of the questions being asked because after an election and a government falls before two years, it is a serious serious political crisis even if you

support one side or the other, that is a fact."

"We are inviting everybody to the march. We are inviting PAM, we are inviting CCM, we're inviting independents, we're inviting all patriots, we're inviting even those who are within the PLP ranks; all are invited to the march," the SKNLP Leader said.

As understood the march is scheduled to start at Greenlands Park in Basseterre at 2:00PM as is being dubbed 'Freedom March.'

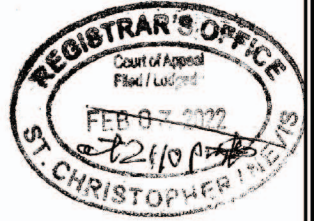

Dr. Wilkinson Says Pandemic Is Not Over

BASSETERRE, St. Kitts (Thursday 30th June 2022)- Dr. Cameron Wilkinson, Medical Chief of Staff at the Joseph N. France General Hospital and member of the COVID-19 National Task Force is cautioning members of the public that the pandemic is not yet over.

Speaking at the Cabinet Press Conference on Wednesday 29th June 2022, he provided supporting comments to statements made by the Chief Medical Officer Dr. Hazel Laws who has disclosed that the present increase in positive cases are similar to those seen during the middle of the fourth wave.

“While some people are walking around like COVID is over, for us in health it is not only are we seeing positive cases in the general population but also among the health care workers, and right now as we speak, we have a number of nurse both from the main institutions and in the community centres who are out positive with COVID. We have a number of doctors including a specialist who are out with COVID and so what it means is that if we don’t continue to act and act proactively, our healthcare system will be under threat and that is the backbone of every decision that we make, and so while I understand that there are some persons who would like to see us throw caution to the wind, we need to make sure that we’re there to protect each and every citizen because every life is important,” Dr. Wilkinson stated.

Dr. Laws shared numbers in relation to what has been

happening saying “Locally, we are seeing an upsurge in COVID-19 cases.”

“The total number of new cases June 22nd to 28th 2022, is 90. So over this past week, we’ve added 90 newly laboratory confirmed cases of COVID-19 to our tally. The preceding week June 15th to June 21st, we’ve added 59 cases so it goes without saying that there is an upsurge in COVID-19 cases, and it’s even more evident if you look at the tile we disseminated; we added 30 cases yesterday, the day before yesterday Monday, we added 27 newly confirmed cases of COVID-19. The last time we saw these numbers or these daily counts was towards the 20th of January this year when we were in the middle of wave four. €€

According to her, the total number of COVID-19 cases reported by the Federation so far is 6022 cases. She said 5876 recoveries and that at present 103 active cases are being monitored.

“It’s been a while, it’s been a few months we’ve been monitoring any active cases. We are happy and are lucky that our death toll as it relates to COVID remains at 43.”

Also, she reported that one person was admitted at the JNF General Hospital and another at the Alexandra Hospital adding that it has been a while since any hospitalizations.

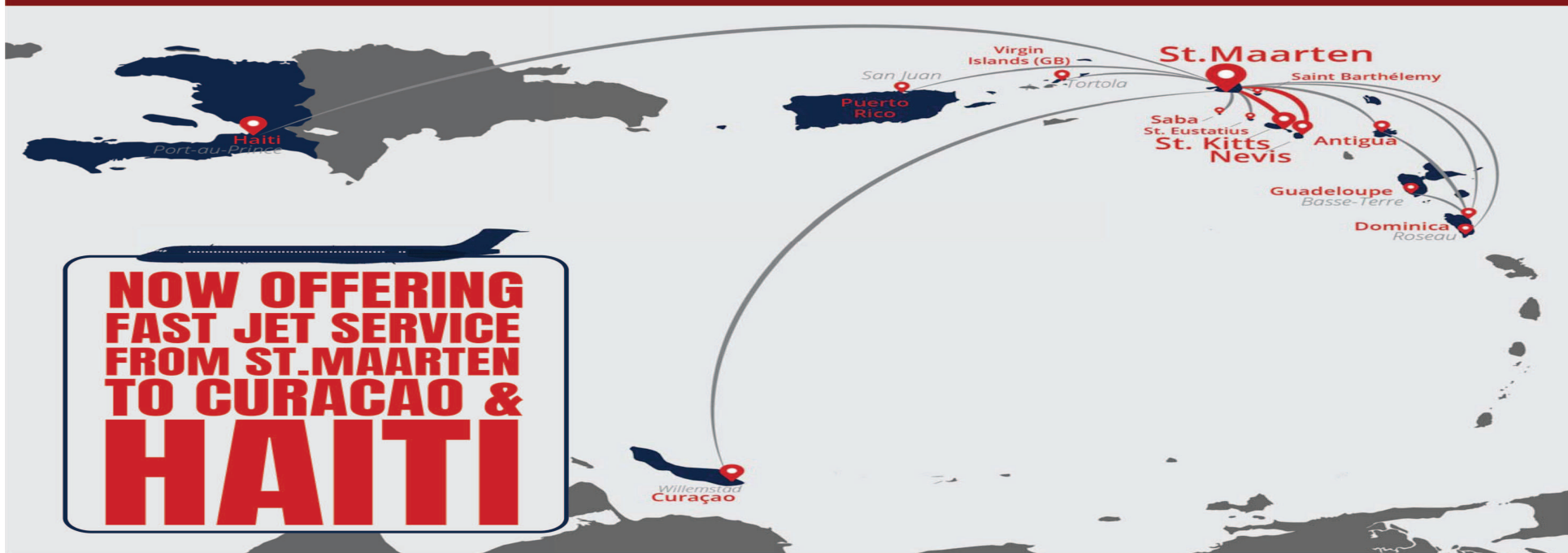
Dr. Laws said the local surge in cases is not surprising because we’ve had over 700 mass events approved in the Federation over the last three months; the most recent of these mass events was Music Festival which we just enjoyed this past weekend. For Music Festival or preceding in June 16 and June 26 4402 inbound travellers came to St. Kitts noting that 56% of these individuals came from the United States of America.”

The CMO pointed to data that the US is experiencing a surge in cases driven by the BA 4 and BA 5 sub variants of the omicron.

Brantley, Shawn To PM Harris: Stop Building Prison, Get Public Opinion About It

BASSETERRE, St.Kitts (Thursday 30th June 2022)- Premier Mark Brantley is questioning why the building of a new prison has been given a top pick from amongst other projects that were approved by Cabinet when the PAM-CCM-PLP fractions of the Team Unity government were all together for the December 2021 Budget presentation.

Labelling the new building project a “scam of all scams”, Brantley the Leader of the Concerned Citizens Movement (CCM) asked “How did the cost of the prison jump from EC\$88 million- thatâ€™s the estimated cost, to a provision of 2.4 billion,” while speaking at a live joint press conference hosted by the People’s Action Movement (PAM) and CCM on Monday 27th June 2022 at the St.Kitts Marriott Hotel.

In May, PAM and CCM government members were fired by Prime Minister and Leader of the People’s Labour Party (PLP) Dr. Timothy Harris.

Both parties (PAM and CCM) are currently calling for the prison project to be halted and for the government to carry out public consultations.

According to Brantley: “I have heard the argument that cabinet approved the jail and it seems a very interesting argument that anything good that has happened in the country, Timothy Harris says ‘I did it’ [and] anything that is questionable he says ‘The cabinet did it’. Well, who was the head of cabinet, and this jail project was one of a number of projects that were discussed and ventilated in the cabinet. The question I think the press and the public must ask is why has Timothy Harris made the jail a priority. That to me is a fundamental question. He has not made Basseterre High School a priority. That was a cabinet decision. He has not made drilling for water a priority so that the people of Cayon and surrounding areas can get a regular supply of water after all these years of suffering. That was ventilated and agreed in cabinet.”

Brantley went on to highlight universal health insurance and access to healthcare as other areas not prioritised by the Harris-led administration. “I have said that any leader anywhere in the world who prefers to fund incarceration over education is a failed leader,” Brantley stated.

He was alluding to the constructing of a prison versus the

start of the new Basseterre High School.

The CCM Leader underscored his view on the matter whilst touching on the conditions at the current prison.

“I have heard some people say the current conditions at the prison are not good, and that we therefore need a new facility. I do not oppose that view. I feel that a humane government must look out for all members of the community even those who have made mistakes and find themselves incarcerated. However, I cannot see that any government in the world would make that a priority over education, over health care, over training and development for our young people, over building people, and so in my view a new prison cannot be at the top of the agenda, and when we start to evaluate this new project, we will start to understand why it has been plucked out of the bag and elevated to the top, and I believe that all of us should be outraged about this.”

Additionally, Brantley expressed the view that “Any leader that make those type of decisions and prioritises the incarceration, the locking up

over their education, over their health care, over the development of new industries in the country tells you that that is leadership that has lost its way and leadership that is concerned only with self, with family and with securing wealth.â€™

Meanwhile, PAM Leader and former Deputy Prime Minister Shawn Richards says both parties will continue to challenge policies not representative and inclusive of the needs of people.

“PAM and CCM cannot [and] will not stand by and watch this administration build prisons instead of people. PAM-CMM will continue to interrogate and challenge plans and policies that are not representative and inclusive of the needs of our people. We take our responsibility to represent you seriously and we will continue to advocate on your behalf.”

He continued: “PAM and CCM on behalf of the people that we still represent and the people we hope to represent after the upcoming elections are taking on this challenge with confidence to defend the priorities of the people. We call for better use of the people’s resources. We call for the Citizenship By Investment programme to be better managed and used to enhance the lives of people across this Federation. PAM and CCM is pushing back on unfair, undemocratic and fiscally irresponsible policies. That is why we’re calling on the Harris administration to immediately halt the 2.4 billion dollars Harris prison project and begin a period of national consultation with the people who elected you into office to represent their interest.”

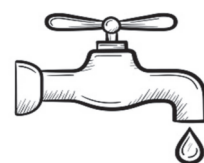

Assistant Secretary of State for Western Hemisphere
Affairs at the United States Department of State:

The Summit of the Americas Hits Home: Our Relationship and My Family History

How fitting that the United States hosted the Ninth Summit of the Americas in June, when we celebrate Caribbean American Heritage month.

Through a coincidence of timing, the Summit of the Americas took place at the same time as my own, long-planned family reunion in Barbados. This confluence of events led me to reflect on my history and the generations of ancestors that led me to the Summit in Los Angeles. My paternal grandfather, Charles Nichols, was born in Saint George, Barbados in 1877. He worked on the Panama Canal with others from the Caribbean; particularly 75,000 Bajans, the largest nationality group to labor on this great engineering project. Through this work, he earned enough money to emigrate to the United States with his wife, Julia King, and their children. My father was born in Brooklyn, the youngest of eleven and the second to be born in America. As the youngest son of a youngest son, myself, I am proud that my roots connect me so strongly to the Caribbean.

Events like the Summit of the Americas recognize the ties that bind our hemisphere together, and I feel grateful to reflect on the values and the heritage that we share with our Caribbean neighbors. I count myself as a member of the Caribbean diaspora that helped build the United States. Our country continues to benefit from this community's many contributions. We will rely on this support, ingenuity, and energy in implementing the promises of this Summit. We are committed to supporting our Caribbean kin and neighbors, and to implementing the ambitious goals that President Biden and Vice President Harris have set for us. We have already begun this work and it will continue in the weeks and months.

During the Summit, the President and Vice President co-hosted their Caribbean

counterparts for an in-depth and substantive meeting that will further strengthen our partnerships with the region. Our Caribbean neighbors spoke of their economic challenges stemming from the COVID-19 pandemic, the impact of climate change, food and energy insecurity, and lack of access to low-cost financing. Seized with these challenges, President Biden and Vice President Harris committed to working with the Caribbean Community (CARICOM) and the Dominican Republic to form three high-level committees tasked with developing immediate and concrete, joint, and near-term solutions.

The first of these committees, which I will co-chair for the United States, addresses the critical issue of food security. Food and nutrition insecurity are on the rise in the Caribbean, with approximately 67.5 percent of the population experiencing moderate or severe food insecurity. To address these challenges, the United States and CARICOM will launch a Caribbean Zero Hunger Plan to promote food and nutrition security in the Caribbean. President Biden also announced the United States will provide \$28 million in new food security assistance to Caribbean countries.

The White House also pledged to strengthen our engagement on energy and climate change. Building on Vice President Harris's April 29, 2022, meeting with Caribbean leaders, the United States launched the U.S.-Caribbean Partnership to Address the Climate Crisis 2030 (PACC 2030) to facilitate renewable energy infrastructure development, including by increasing access to financing, and to bolster the region's resilience to climate based natural disasters.

The leaders stressed the need to strengthen security cooperation and engagement, including countering small arms trafficking. The United States and Caribbean countries will build on the longstanding Caribbean Basin Security Initiative (CBSI) through broader engagement in combatting trafficking in persons, cybersecurity, and cybercrime. The United States, the Dominican Republic, and CARICOM member states support the development of national action plans to counter firearms trafficking. These national action plans will help the United States more effectively tailor our support to CBSI member countries to address trafficking of illegal handguns and assault weapons throughout the region. We also agree on the importance of acceding to the Treaty of San Jose concerning illicit maritime and air narcotics trafficking. This treaty provides states with a valuable legal mechanism that facilitates international cooperation to disrupt illicit maritime trafficking and transnational criminal organizations in the Caribbean. We encourage Caribbean countries that have not yet acceded to the Treaty to consider doing so.

It is of no small consequence that Vice President Harris, a daughter of Caribbean heritage, co-chaired this meeting with the President of the United States. 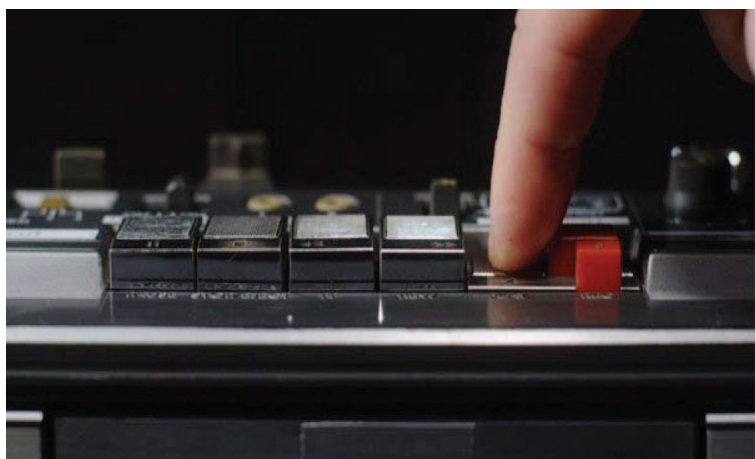

Nineteen-Seventies Style Stagflation Now Playing On Central Bankers' Minds

We are at a dangerous tipping point in 'inflationary psychology', says the central bank for the world's central banks.



“Stagflation” is an ugly word for an ugly situation - the unpleasant combination of economic stagnation and inflation.

The last time the world experienced it was the early 1970s, when oil-exporting countries in the Middle East cut supplies to The United States and other supporters of Israel. The “supply shock” of a four-fold increase in the cost of oil drove up many prices and dampened economic activity globally.

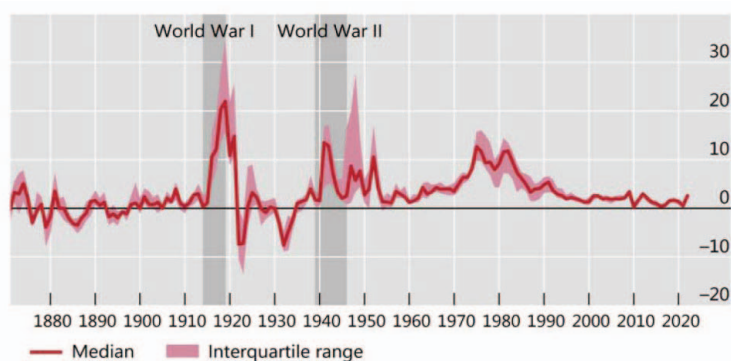
Stagflation was thought left behind. But now there is a real risk of it coming back, warns the central bank for the world's central banks.

“We may be reaching a tipping point, beyond which an inflationary psychology spreads and becomes entrenched” says the Bank for International Settlements (BIS) in its latest annual economic report.

By “inflationary psychology” it means that expectations of higher prices lead consumers to spend now rather than later, on the assumption waiting will cost more. This increases demand, pushing up prices. Thus expectations of inflation become a self-fulfilling prophecy.

The danger of stagflation comes from this inflationary cycle becoming so entrenched that attempts to curb it through higher interest rates push economies into recession.

What's driving inflation

As well as its own expert staff, The BIS brings together expertise from its member central banks, such as The US Federal Reserve, The European Central Bank, The Bank of England, and The Reserve Bank of Australia. So its views are worth paying attention to.

Its report makes clear its experts, like most forecasters, have been surprised by the extent of the rise in inflation.

This is a global phenomenon, which the report attributes to a combination of an unexpectedly strong economic rebound from the COVID-19 lockdowns, a sustained switch in demand from services to goods, and supply bottlenecks exacerbated by a shift from “just-in-time” to “just-in-case” inventory management.

Then there is Russia's invasion of Ukraine.

The war's effect in driving up the price of oil, gas, food, fertilisers and other commodities has been “inherently stagflationary”:

Since commodities are a key production input, an increase in their cost constrains output. At the same time, soaring commodity prices have boosted inflation everywhere, exacerbating a shift that was already well in train before the onset of the war.

The only bright note is that BIS expects these price surges to

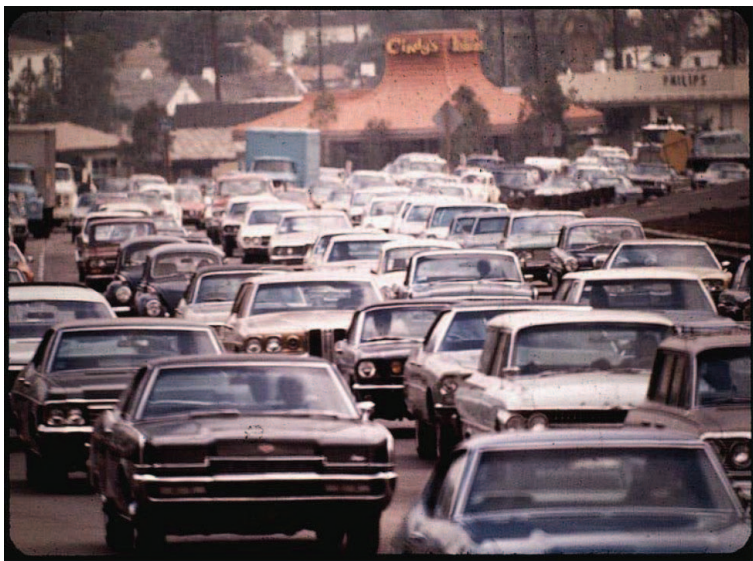

be less disruptive than the oil supply shock of the 1970s.

This is because the relative impact of the oil supply shock was greater due to economies in the 1970s being more energy-intensive.

There is also much more focus now on containing inflation, with most central banks having a clearly stated inflation target (2% in Europe and the US, 2%-3% in Australia).

What are the biggest dangers?

But the current situation is still very challenging, the report says, because increases in the price of food and energy are particularly conducive to spreading inflationary psychology.

This is because food is bought frequently, so price changes are notable. The same goes for fuel prices, which are prominently displayed on large roadside signs.

There is also the risk in many economies of a wage-price spiral - in which higher prices drive demands for higher wages, which employers then pass on in higher prices.

Central banks face what Reserve Bank of Australia governor Philip Lowe has called a "narrow path".

To achieve a "soft landing" they need to raise interest rates enough to bring inflation down. But not enough to cause a recession (and thus stagflation).

How to avoid a 'hard landing'?

The BIS report cites an analysis of monetary tightening cycles - defined as interest rate rises in at least three consecutive quarters - in 35 countries between 1985 and 2018. A soft landing was achieved in only about half the cases.

A key factor in the hard landings was the extent of financial vulnerabilities, particularly debt. Economies with hard landings on average had double the growth in credit to GDP prior to the interest-rate rises.

This factor contributes to

BIS concerns now. As the report notes:

Unlike in the past, stagflation today would occur alongside heightened financial vulnerabilities, including stretched asset prices and high debt levels, which could magnify any growth slowdown.

Furthermore, the slowdown in China's labour productivity is removing an important boost to global economic growth and restraint on global inflation.

But a key lesson from the 1970s is that the long-term costs of doing nothing outweigh the short-term pain of bringing inflation under control.

This means governments must curb handouts or tax cuts to help people with cost-of-living pressures. Expansionary fiscal policy will only make things worse. Assistance must be strictly targeted to those who most need it.

There is also a need to rebuild monetary and fiscal buffers to cope with future shocks. This will require raising interest rates above inflation targets and returning government budgets (close) to surplus.

Cannabis Use Linked To Heightened Emergency Care And Hospital Admission Risks

Recreational cannabis use is linked to a heightened risk of emergency care and hospital admission for any cause, finds research published in the open access journal BMJ Open Respiratory Research.

The findings prompt the Canadian researchers to call for curbs on the rising levels of recreational cannabis use world wide as a result of its legal reclassification in various countries: it's not as harmless as some people might think, they say.

Cannabis is the most commonly used mind altering drug worldwide and its use is on the rise.

While cannabis contains similar types and quantities of volatile compounds and tar as tobacco - compounds that are implicated in the development of smoking-related airway disease - the evidence on its respiratory health harms is inconclusive and hotly contested.

In a bid to shed further light on the issues, the researchers looked at potential associations between use of the drug and more serious illness, as indicated by numbers of emergency room visits or hospital admissions for respiratory health reasons.

The researchers linked national health survey and health records data for 35,114 Ontario residents, aged 12 to 65, spanning the period January 2009 and December 2015. Ontario is Canada's most populous province and ethnically diverse.

Those who admitted to cannabis use within the previous 12 months (4,087) were matched upwards to three people who said they had never used it, or used it only once and more than 12 months ago (10,395), taking account of 31 factors.

These included personal information; several physical and mental health conditions; indicators of general healthcare use; previous emergency room visits or hospital admissions for respiratory health issues; tobacco smoking history; problem drinking and other substance misuse; previous contact with a respiratory clinician; previous lung function testing; previous prescription med use for a respiratory problem; and previous flu vaccination.

Emergency room visits and hospital admissions for any reason, as well as death from any cause, were assessed up to 12 months after the date of cannabis use reporting.

Analysis of the data showed that the overall odds of dying from any cause and an emergency room visit or hospital admission for a respiratory issue didn't differ significantly between the two groups.

When the data were further stratified by gender, previous hospital care for a respiratory problem, smoking, and a diagnosis of asthma or COPD, no significant differences emerged between the two groups either.

But cannabis users had significantly greater odds (22%) of an emergency room visit or hospital admission for any cause. And respiratory health reasons were the

second most common cause (14%) after acute trauma (15%). This is an observational study, and as such, can't establish cause. And the researchers acknowledge that they weren't able to differentiate between medical and recreational cannabis use, potency and quantity, or whether cannabis was eaten or smoked.

The study also relied on individual recall for cannabis use rather than objective assessment.

"Further research is needed to confirm our findings, but our results suggest that cannabis use is associated with increased risk for serious adverse health events, and therefore, its recreational consumption in the general population should be discouraged," conclude the researchers.

Ketanji Brown Jackson Sworn In As First Black Woman On US Supreme Court

WASHINGTON, June 30 (Reuters) - Ketanji Brown Jackson was sworn in on Thursday as a US Supreme Court justice, making history as the first Black woman on the nation's top judicial body, while joining it at a time when its conservative majority has been flexing its muscles in major rulings.

Jackson, 51, joins the liberal bloc of a court with a 6-3 conservative majority. Her swearing in as President Joe Biden's replacement for retiring liberal Justice Stephen Breyer came six days after the court overturned the 1973 Roe v Wade landmark that legalized abortion nationwide.

Associate Justice Breyer, at 83 the court's oldest member, officially retired on Thursday.

"With a full heart, I accept the solemn responsibility of supporting and defending the Constitution of the United States and administering justice without fear or favor," Jackson said in a statement.

A Reuters/Ipsos poll this week found that a majority of Americans - 57% - holds a negative view of the court following the abortion ruling, a significant shift from earlier in the month when a narrow majority held a positive view.

Jackson is the one hundred sixteenth (116th) justice, sixth woman, and third Black person, to serve on the Supreme Court since its 1789 founding.

"I am glad for America," Breyer said in a statement. "Ketanji will interpret the law wisely and fairly, helping that law to work better for the American people, whom it serves."

President Biden appointed Jackson last year to The US Court of Appeals for The District of Columbia Circuit, after she spent eight years as a federal district judge. At the time of the ceremony, Biden was flying back to Washington from a NATO summit in Madrid.

Like the three conservative justices appointed by the Democratic president's Republican predecessor Donald Trump, Jackson is young enough to serve for decades in the lifetime job.

"I am pleased to welcome Justice Jackson to the court and to our common calling," Chief Justice John Roberts said at the ceremony.

The Senate confirmed Jackson on a 53-47 vote on 7 April, with three Republicans joining the Democrats in support of her. Jackson's appointment does not shift the court's ideological balance.

"It has taken 232 years and 115 prior appointments for a Black woman to be selected to serve on the Supreme Court of The United States," Jackson said at an 8 April 2022 event celebrating her confirmation. "But we've made it."

Biden has aimed to bring more women and minorities and a wider range of backgrounds to the federal judiciary. Jackson's appointment fulfilled a pledge Biden made during the 2020 presidential campaign to name a Black woman to the Supreme Court. With Jackson's addition, the Supreme Court for the first time has four women on the bench.

Breyer in January announced his plans to retire, having served since being appointed by Democratic President Bill Clinton in 1994. Jackson served as a clerk for Breyer early in her legal career.

The court issued its final two rulings of its current term on Thursday, including one powered by the conservative justices that put limits on the federal government's authority to issue sweeping regulations to reduce carbon emissions from power plants.

Jackson joins a liberal bloc that has found itself outvoted in numerous major rulings this term, not only on abortion rights, but on gun rights, expanding religious liberties, and other matters.

Jackson will participate in arguments in cases for the first time when the court's next term opens in October.

One major case for the coming term gives the conservative justices an opportunity to end affirmative action policies used by colleges and universities in their admissions processes to increase their enrollment of Black and Hispanic students to achieve campus diversity.

defending Taiwan's democracy, and the free world must unite in the face of authoritarian expansionism, Foreign Minister Jaushieh Joseph Wu said on Tuesday 28 June 2022.

Taiwan draws three lessons from Russia's brutal invasion, Wu said. The threat of authoritarianism, the importance of asymmetric combat capabilities and civil defence, and the need for democracies to stand with Ukraine, he added.

Wu made the remarks during the Brussels Forum organized by Washington-based think tank German Marshall Fund of The United States. Other participants in the session included US Senator Chris Murphy, and Laura Thornton, director and senior fellow at GMF's Alliance for Securing Democracy.

GMF is a nonpartisan public policy organization

promoting understanding and cooperation on issues critical to transatlantic and global interests. The foundation's Brussels Forum is one of the pre-eminent platforms for addressing shared challenges.

According to Wu, Taiwan's democracy is facing unprecedented challenges from China's cognitive warfare as part of ongoing efforts to undermine the people's confidence. The government is mounting a coordinated response with local media and nongovernmental organizations to track and respond to disinformation, as well as heighten public awareness, Wu said.

Regarding China's economic coercion, Wu said bans on Taiwan's pineapples and groupers are in line with those affecting products from Australia, The Czech Republic, and Lithuania.

Democracies must unite and support one another to overcome such tactics, he added.

In a tweet on its official Twitter account, The Ministry of Foreign Affairs said "Minister Wu hammered home a powerful message at the #BrusselsForum: Taiwan's democracy is under threat. #China's cognitive warfare, cyberattacks, & hybrid & military activities are relentless. But our country stands strong & the people united. #Taiwan is an #IslandOfResilience!" (DL-E).

starting immediately and into the future.”

A partnership between the Federal Government of St. Kitts and Nevis and the Government of the Republic of China (Taiwan) has resulted in the establishment of the St. Kitts and Nevis Solid Waste Management and Recycling Project which was officially launched in March this year. The aim of the project, which is funded by the Taiwan International Cooperation and Development Fund (ICDF), is to help in the management and the reduction of waste.

Accompanying Ambassador Michael Lin on the Children’s Parade on Friday June 24, was Manager of the St. Kitts and Nevis Solid Waste Management and Recycling Project, Ms Joyce Chang.

“Our focus now is to raise the awareness of every child in this country to start to do recycling in school, and back home they could teach their parents to do recycling,” said Ambassador Lin. “For the young kids to start to know how to recycle all these material, that will help to reduce all the amount of garbage that is created daily, because on average, according to research done by Ms Joyce Chang, in St. Kitts and Nevis everybody produces 1.7 kg per day, which is higher than average that is produced in other neighbouring countries.”

The Ambassador noted that the parade would teach the school children to start the idea of how to reduce, reuse and recycle resources as all the material that is thrown in the landfill is just garbage, but if it is recycled and reused, it could become a resource

just like the PET (polyethylene terephthalate) bottles, aluminium cans or metal cans.

He pointed out that if one were to visit the landfill in St. Kitts or the landfill in Nevis one would note that they are actually overwhelmed, which was a pointer that people in St. Kitts and Nevis produce too much garbage that could be reused, and recycled.

“In Taiwan everybody has to do the recycling, and we have specifically PET (polyethylene terephthalate) bottles and glass bottles, metals, plastics and paper,” observed His Excellency Michael Lin. “But now in St. Kitts we are starting from the PET bottles, metal cans, and aluminium cans.”

The St. Kitts and Nevis Solid Waste Management and Recycling Project has points where such items are collected on specific days of the week both on St. Kitts and on Nevis. Points in St. Kitts are in Conaree at the Airport Roundabout, Buckley’s in front of Best Buy Supermarket, and in Dieppe Bay along the Island Main Road, while in Nevis the collection point is on the empty lot between Delta Gas Station and Ole House Cafe in Stoney Grove.

“After collecting all these materials, they will be stored at the landfill both in St. Kitts and Nevis, and then we can ship it out for the final treatment in the United States and several different countries,” said the Ambassador. “The money we generate could be put back into the economy, and we could provide financial assistance to the schools or to the communities. That is a target we would like to achieve.”

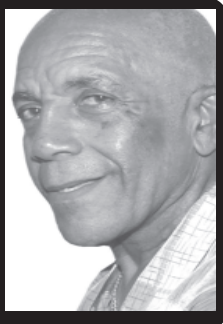

CWI confirms West Indies contracted players for 2022-2023

ST JOHN'S, Antigua - Cricket West Indies (CWI) has confirmed the international retainer contracts for the West Indies Men's and Women's players for the 2022-2023 season. A total of 36 players have been offered contracts for the period - which runs from 1 July 2022 to 30 June 2023.

This is in addition to 90 players across the region who are contracted to Territorial Board Franchise Squads.

The West Indies Men's contracted player list sees fast bowler Jayden Seales, left-arm seamer Obed McCoy and allrounder Odean Smith awarded international retainer contracts for the first time. The West Indies Women's contracted player list sees allrounders Mandy Mangru and Jannillea Glasgow along with batter Rashada Williams awarded international retainer contracts for the first time, all of which are development contracts.

For 2022-23, CWI has changed the Men's retainer contract structure to offer player contracts across all formats of cricket, compared to specific red or white-ball contracts in previous years. The offer of retainer contracts to all players follows an Evaluation Period of performances from 1 April 2021 to 31 March 2022, which is also supported by statistics from the previous 2019 - 2020 Evaluation Period. This allows for all players to be appraised immediately after the Evaluation Period and provides a notice period before new contracts start on 1 July 2022. The system is designed to reward hard work and performance results.

West Indies Men's Lead Selector, The Most Honourable Dr Desmond Haynes said: "Congratulations to all the players who have been offered contracts. We think this is a dynamic group, with the right mixture of experience and youthfulness to properly represent the people of the Caribbean. With general retainer contracts, it gives us a pool of talented and dedicated cricketers, who can take West Indies cricket forward in years to come."

West Indies Women's Lead Selector, Ann Browne-John said: "The selectors have placed a great focus on the young developing players because these are the ones who will help to build the team as we look towards the future. The panel believes that the combination of experienced players and the emerging players will give a good base as we continue to prepare teams for international matches and the T20 World Cup early next year."

CWI Director of Cricket, Jimmy Adams stated: "I am delighted for all the players who have been offered retainers for the upcoming period. This represents a significant investment in the ongoing development of our international players whilst also ensuring our best players are available for selection."

West Indies squads named for T20Is and CG United ODIs vs Bangladesh

Rovman Powell the new T20I Vice Captain

ST JOHN'S, Antigua - Cricket West Indies' (CWI) Selection Panel today announced the West Indies Men's squad for the upcoming three-match T20 International Series and the three-match CG United One-Day International Series against Bangladesh.

Rovman Powell has been announced as the new Vice Captain for the T20Is while left-arm fast bowler Obed McCoy returns after recovering from injuries. There are also recalls for experienced wicket-keeper batter Devon Thomas and allrounder Keemo Paul. In the CG United ODI Series squad, there is a call up for left-arm spinner Gudakesh Motie.

Lead Selectors the Most Honorable Dr Desmond Hayne said: "We know Rovman's history. He has captained the West Indies before and is also the captain of his CPL franchise. Our role is to look at future leaders as well and we have identified a few, including himself, who we will be putting programmes around to ensure we keep them involved in that aspect of the cricket."

"Thomas is a very versatile cricketer, who has been knocking on the door in all formats. He has been doing well in franchise cricket and with that level of talent, we must ensure we keep him interested. He brings a lot to the table and is basically a four-dimensional player, he can bat, bowl, he is brilliant in the field, and he can keep wicket as well. McCoy has done exceptionally well in the IPL and enjoyed a successful stint in England as well, so we are confident that he is back to his best in terms of playing and fitness," Haynes added.

"Generally, we have to start looking at the bigger picture of getting these players playing together as often as possible in preparation for the ICC T20 World Cup later down in the year. We need to ensure we are fielding a very strong side for that tournament."

The T20I Series opens with back-to-back matches on Saturday, 2 July and Sunday, 3 July at the Windsor Park in Dominica. This will see a return to international cricket at the fully refurbished venue, where international cricket is being hosted for the first time since the hurricane damage of 2017. The Series climaxes with the third and final match on Tuesday, 7 July at the Guyana National Stadium. The CG United ODI Series will be played at the Guyana National Stadium on Friday, 10 July, Monday 13 July and Thursday, 16 July.

Online ticket sales are now live via the new WINDIES TICKETS service, presented by Mastercard, at www.tickets.windiestickets.com. Fans can purchase in advance without the need to travel to box offices to save tickets to their mobile phones which can then be presented for scanning at the stadium entrance. Fans who register for the WINDIES TICKETS service and purchase tickets will also receive offers and promotions for future games.

In Dominica, there is great excitement on the Nature Isle for the return of international cricket with tickets available in three price categories providing a range of viewing positions for every budget. Ticket prices range from US\$6 (EC\$15) for the Mound/Grounds, to US\$15 (EC\$40) for the standard seats and US\$25 (EC\$70) premium seating in the Shillingford Stand.

In Guyana, the prices will range from US\$6 (GUY\$1200) for



the Mound/Grounds, to US\$15 (GUY\$3000) for the Orange Stand or US\$25 (GUY\$5000) for the best seats in the Red and Green Stands, as the fans in Guyana welcome the busiest "Summer of Cricket" to the South American mainland.

Fans can watch live on ESPN Caribbean and listen to live radio commentary on the Windies Cricket YouTube channel.
