Editorial

Please Do Not Stir Our People's Anger!

At page 11 of our edition of this newspaper paper for 24 June 2022, we carried an Associated Press article concerning the collapse of Sri Lanka's economy, which had been brought about, for the most part, through the corruption inflicted by top ranking politicians of that country, over an extended period of time.

That economic collapse has led to a total breakdown of the country's political, financial, trading, and health systems. For days on end, traditional and social media have been transmitting footages of an enraged Sri Lankan populace, storming and setting fire to the prime minister's residence, and their occupation of the president's palace, with a demonstrated determination to remain in place until the two top officers of state, and certain other lesser ones, resign or otherwise quit their appointments.

Reports and analyses have variously attributed Sri Lanka's ongoing dilemma to 'the dynastic' and systematic abuse of that country's institutions and resources by certain closely related 'political' families.

The prime minister resigned, as called for by the people, and an interim appointment was made by parliament. However the president did not do likewise, even though he had given the speaker of parliament an undertaking to that effect.

The people of Sri Lanka made it clear that they would not give up until both conditions had been met.

Indeed, on Tuesday, President Rajapaksa and an entourage tried to depart the country by way of the main airport, but officials and other civilians, hastily summoned to the facility, blocked him and his group from escaping the country in that manner.

Mr Rajapaksa and his group slipped out of Sri Lanka on a

Brantley Keeping Eyes On Law About 90 Days Elections Date

BASSETERRE, ST.KITTS (Thursday 14th July 2022)- Leader of the Concerned Citizen Movement (CCM) Premier Mark Brantley- a trained lawyer- says any attempt to disobey the provisions of the constitution which says election shall be held within-not over- 90 days after any dissolution of parliament “will be met with the full force of the law.”

Appearing on his weekly ‘On The Mark’ show aired on VON Radio on Wednesday 13th July 2022, while talking about “challenges to our democracy”, he addressed Prime Minister and Leader of the People’s Labour Party (PLP) Dr. Timothy Harris who is authorised to ‘ring the bell’ in setting a date for the upcoming general election.

“Today, I was alarmed to learn that Dr. Harris and his team fighting desperately as they are to cling on by their fingernails have decided that despite the constitutional provision that makes it pellucid that an election must happen within -Hear my language because it is the language of the constitution- an election must happen within ninety (90) days.”

Brantley, a fired federal minister of the Harris-led administration, pointed to section 48 (1) of the constitution that speaks to the date for an election and referenced the dissolution of parliament by PM Harris on 10th May.

“A general election of members of the National Assembly shall be held at such time within 90 days after any dissolution of parliament as the Governor General may appoint. At such time within 90 days, a general election of members of the National Assembly shall be held at such time within 90 days after a dissolution.”

“All of us know that the House was dissolved on May 10th, because the Speaker, the Hon. Michael Perkins had given notice that he intended to convene the House for purposes of hearing and debating of the Motion of No Confidence which would have brought the prime ministership of Timothy Harris to an end. We felt that he had already lost legitimacy since six elected members representing the majority had already written to His Excellency the Governor General indicating to him that we no longer repose trust and confidence but in response to that he [Dr. Harris] opted to give a big speech, dissolved parliament saying he fired six and beating on his chest saying he did a great thing...” he stated.

According to Brantley: “Section 48 of the Constitution makes it clear that an election must happen within 90 days after a dissolution; the dissolution was on the 10th of May so you start to count from the 10th of May in terms of 90 days. Now I’m hearing today that he [Dr. Harris] has persuaded himself that 90 days as specified in the constitution doesn’t mean that and that he has persuaded himself that he has 90 days to call the election meaning he has 90 days and so on the 90th day that is when he can declare when the election is going to be and therefore he seems to have persuaded himself that the election can be called outside as prescribed by the constitution.”

“So in my view if that is the plan then I’m to say reason has certainly fled a brutish heart because the constitution is clear. It is not written in any language that is subject to any misinterpretation; the language is clear. If you must do something within a particular period, you can’t seek to go outside that period. It didn’t say that the date for an election must be announced within 90 days, no. It says in section 48 (1) that the election must happen within those 90 days,” the CCM Leader added.

Brantley went on to highlight his schooling to become a lawyer linked to his intention to maintain law and order in this instance of the 90 days election provision.

“I think it is beyond a shadow of a doubt that we must have an election within that 90 day period not the announcement

of an election to happen sometime after that 90 days and so whoever is advising Timothy Harris of this foolishness, I would hope that he knows better but I’m to say to our people that a long time ago I spent some time behind the school house door learning to be a lawyer; some say that I was a good lawyer, and I’m here to say that my sobriquet in politics is ‘The Sheriff’. What is ‘The Sheriff’ known for? ‘The Sheriff’ is known for maintaining law and order and if there is any attempt to flout the provisions of the constitution, it will be met with

the full force of the law.”

Brantley expressed confidence in the judicial system saying: “One thing I’m happy about is that despite the efforts to corrupt all the arms

of government, that our judiciary remains incorruptible and I’m happy for that. The rule of law is still paramount in our country and so for those who are getting some false hope that they can continue to cling to power with this kangaroo cabinet of three members elected seeking to make profound and far reaching decisions for our country, I say to them that we will ensure that the constitution is followed, and so clearly Dr. Harris and his PLP are not ready for an election. Clearly, he dissolved the parliament and mash up de government with no plan as to what he will do but that is his problem not mine. What I will say is that the concerned Citizens Movement (CCM) has been ready, we are ready and we are simply waiting now on that date to be announced.”

SKNLP Leader to PM Harris: No Election Without Observers

BASSETERRE, ST.KITTS (Thursday 14th July 2022)- “I’m saying clearly if Timothy Harris doesn’t ask for observers to be here, I don’t know which elections we’ll have because we will not have an election without observers.”

So said Leader of the St.Kitts-Nevis Labour Party (SKNLP), Dr. Terrance Drew, in putting his party’s position to Prime Minister and Leader of the People’s Labour Party (PLP) Dr. Timothy Harris while speaking on the SKNLP-sponsored weekly ‘We Talk’ on Freedom FM aired on Wednesday 13th July 2022.

Dr. Drew, during that media session hosted by Maurice ‘EK’ Flanders, revealed to the nation that he has written to regional and international organizations asking for observers.

“...I want to alert the nation is that I have written as the leader of the party to multiple regional and international organizations asking for observers. I have received [response] already; CARICOM [Caribbean Community] has responded and they have said that they are ready, they are ready; they are just waiting for the government to ask for them to come in to observe the elections.”

He continued: “Last election we only had a handful of regional observers, just a few. We know that the OAS [Organization of American States] was denied entry when an arrangement could have been made to make sure that we have the observers here just like how we had observers from other countries in the region, we could have had the OAS as well but it was a deliberate act to block the OAS from coming here.”

Commenting on why observers have to wait on the government to be invited, the SKNLP Leader explained: “Generally what happens in elections, is that the government is the one who invites observers in. Observers are not allowed to come in into a country on its own. However, we inside the country will pressure the government to make sure they ask and I’m saying clearly if Timothy Harris doesn’t ask for observers to be here, I don’t know which elections we’ll have because we will not have an election without observers. We have to draw the line in the sand.”

Dr. Drew is further of the view: “That is why we have to make that office as independent as possible and for that office to make these calls...we can’t just leave because just like last elections. He [Dr. Harris] did not want anybody in here and he did all kind of things to make sure that we did not have any observers here.”

According to him, Dr. Harris: “must know that we are not going to accept the shenanigans that were accepted the last elections. He’s not going to use COVID as no pretext to shut down anybody from canvassing, he’s not going to COVID as no pretext to prevent people from coming in to observe the elections.

We are not going to allow these things to happen; our democracy is too sacred for us to be playing games with it. When you play with a democracy, you can lose it...we have to do all that we can do to protect our democracy.”

Dr. Drew criticized the kind of ballot boxes used in the June 2022 general elections.

“Last election, you had a transparent box. There are questions around that ...When we left Cayon, I remember the box could not even close and there were some ballots inside the box that it pushed the box up; they had to tape down the box with duct tape. I mean these are the kind of things that took place during the last elections...”

In speaking about protecting democracy here in St.Kitts-Nevis for generations to come, the SKNLP Leader remarked: “We have to do all that we can do to protect our democracy...we have to make sure that what we left for the generations after us is something wholesome so they can be proud of; something they can build on to forever continue to perfect our democracy.”

When quizzed about his party’s intention to address irregularities concerning the electoral system, Dr. Drew stated some areas that can be dealt with quickly.

“I think one of the better ways we can do it is to bring all political parties and interest groups to the table to look at what we have and see how we can make it better so that nobody is given an unfair advantage; that is one of the things that we have to do to look at where the loopholes are. One of the other things is to make the Supervisor of Elections much more independent; to be independent so that whatever decisions are made by the commission, people can have confidence that they are not influenced by

any political agenda as is at this point in time so that’s one of the things that we definitely have to look at.”

He continued: The other thing that we have to look at is to make sure that we have watch dog groups, and the watchdog groups can actually be the political parties as we have been doing to make sure that the rules and regulations are adhered to and are followed so what I would suggest is that all are brought to the table to do a review of the act that governs elections and to make sure that we are plugging the holes where they should be plugged because if everybody comes to the table, people would be discussing how to make sure that one person does not get an advantage over the other...”

The SKNLP Leader referred to a 2022 article in the New York Times which said democracy under threat in the Caribbean and Latin America.

“...and St.Kitts was pinpointed as the number one case study because they recognized how the government here used the COVID situation to suppress the democracy and give then Unity some sort of advantage to undermine the Labour Party, and undermine the whole democratic process and you’re right we have to seek more dependency of these things in order for us to preserve the democracy.”

“Only people-I would say- who are obsessed with power would not want more transparency and more openness, and the reason why you have to do this is sometimes you have to protect man from himself by putting rules and regulations in place so even if a man has a tendency to become a dictator, the system would not allow to become a dictator; the system is set up to prevent dictators from flourishing,” he said further.

Well-known Political Commentator Big Lice Says He Is Home With SKNLP After Political Lesson ... Publicly Apologizes To Douglas

BASSETERRE, ST.KITTS (Thursday 14th July 2022)-Well known political commentator and calypsonian Duncan 'Big Lice' Wattley of Cayon has expressed that he is "home" with the St.Kitts-Nevis Labour Party (SKNLP) having learnt his lesson about Prime Minister and Leader of the People's Labour Party (PLP) Dr. Timothy Harris.

Speaking at a rally event held at Carifesta Village in St. Peter's of Constituency Eight, on Friday 8th July 2022, to mark the occasion of the official constituency eight office openings for candidate Dr. Terrance Drew who is the SKNLP Leader, Wattley expressed such sentiments having called on members of the audience to say 'Welcome home Big Lice' before his endorsement of Dr. Drew.

He offered a public apology to the immediate former SKNLP Leader Dr. Denzil Douglas whom he invited on the stage saying "I beat up on this man so much it's all in good fate but you know I'm not a man to apologize but tonight I want to tell Dr. Douglas that I'm sorry that ah never listened to you. Ah sorry ah didn't listen you went I went with that vagabond. That nasty man from Tabernacle and so accept my apology and so you're the first person I ever apologize to."

Dr. Douglas responded saying "Apology accepted" to a cheering crowd.

Wattley's further comments to the audience saying "and so comrades that is how we do it and I want you all to say ...Welcome home Big Lice'...yes because you know I came out of a Labour house...my mother was a big Labour and she always warned me [that] one day you gonna bawl...' ah bawling now but let me get down to business..."

He touched on his affiliation with other political parties as he applauded the SKNLP as being the best.

It is no secret that I supported the People's Action Movement. It is no secret that I supported the Team Unity construct. I would not shy away from that. It is no secret that I sang calypsos against Dr. Denzil Douglas and the Labour Party. I am not gonna say I am sorry. I did a personal apology to him because I think I went after him a bit hard but that is human and that it is set up but what I want to tell you tonight is that having done all that, I realize that the only political party remember I tell you that I support everybody - that cares genuinely about the poor people, that cares about the little man, that cares about indigents is the St.Kitts-Nevis Labour Party and so I told you I went all around so I have been tried and proven and so if I say tonight that Dr. Drew should be the next prime minister; you better listen to me. I have been warning people here since 2016 about that...fellow from Tabernacle when I found out and nobody listened to me. You see where we are now? We have a small little dictator going on but only time will tell; he running out of time."

Wattley asked all those gathered and tune in via media to "that we need to understand that the state of affairs of this country is not normal and so we cannot put people who cannot be trusted back at the helm. The People's Action Movement, they had a chance and they messed it up. How could we now give them another chance ...Timothy has proven to be very dishonest and so we can't go back there and so I'm telling you the only obvious choice we have is to vote for Dr. Terrance Drew, to vote for the St.Kitts-Nevis Labour Party candidates..."

"Dr. Timothy Harris fooled us and I know how you feel because he was amongst you for so many years that you could not believe that a man from within could be soâ..." he shared.

Making his observations about the about constituencies Four and Seven he commented that it "means Labour can win all eight". He encouraged the SKNLP supporters that "...you need to stay vigilant; you need to stay alert..."

Wattley endorsed Dr. Drew "not only as the next representative for Number Eight but also as the next prime minister of St.Kitts and Nevis. Dr. Drew will be the next prime minister of this loving federation..."

Former Senior US Official John Bolton Admits To Planning Attempted Foreign Coups

WASHINGTON, 12 July (Reuters) - John Bolton, a former US ambassador to The United Nations and former White House national security adviser, said on Tuesday that he had helped plan attempted coups in foreign countries.

Ambassador Bolton made the remarks to CNN after the day's congressional hearing into the 6 January 2021 attack on The US Capitol.

The panel's lawmakers on Tuesday accused former President Donald Trump of inciting the violence in a last-ditch bid to remain in power after losing the 2020 election.

Speaking to CNN anchor Jake Tapper, however, Bolton suggested Trump was not competent enough to pull off a "carefully planned coup d'etat," later adding: "As somebody who has helped plan coups d'etat - not here but you know (in) other places - it takes a lot of work. And that's not what he (Trump) did."

Tapper asked Bolton which attempts he was referring to.

"I'm not going to get into the specifics," Bolton said, before mentioning Venezuela. "It turned out not to be successful. Not that we had all that much to do with it but I saw what it took for an opposition to try and overturn an illegally elected president and they failed," he said.

In 2019 Bolton, as national security adviser, publicly supported Venezuelan opposition leader Juan Guaido's call for the military to back his effort to oust socialist President Nicolas Maduro, arguing that Maduro's re-election was illegitimate. Ultimately Maduro remained in power.

"I feel like there's other stuff you're not telling me (beyond Venezuela)," the CNN anchor said, prompting a reply from Bolton: "I'm sure there is."

Many foreign policy experts have over the years criticized Washington's history of interventions in other countries, from its role in the 1953 overthrowing of then Iranian nationalist prime minister Mohammad Mosaddegh and the Vietnam war, to its invasions of Iraq and Afghanistan this century.

But it is highly unusual for US officials to openly acknowledge their role in stoking unrest in foreign countries.

"John Bolton, who's served in highest positions in the US government, including as UN ambassador, casually boasting about he's helped plan coups in other countries," Dickens Olewe, a BBC journalist from Kenya, wrote on Twitter.

Taiwan's First Domestically Made Submarine Expected To Be Launched Next September

TAIPEI (Taiwan News) - Taiwan's first domestically produced submarine is expected to be launched next September, a person familiar with the matter said on Tuesday (12 July).

The individual said the launch location has yet to be determined, adding that it will take at least one to two years after the launch to complete Harbour Acceptance Tests and Sea Acceptance Tests, according to CNA.

Ministry of National Defence (MND) Spokesperson Sun Li-fang said at a press conference Tuesday morning that submarine construction is one of the major national defence projects in the works. Ensuring the smooth execution of the entire project is a key task for the MND, Sun said.

According to the 2022 annual defence budget, the Navy has allocated NT\$49.36 billion (US\$1.69 billion) between 2019-2025 for the project.

The first submarine is expected to be completed by 2025.

After President Tsai Ing-wen took office in 2016 she promoted a number of national defence policies that focused on the domestic military production of aircraft, submarines, ships, and vehicles.

In addition to strengthening Taiwan's defence industry, these moves also boosted the country's defensive capabilities, per CNA.

What St. Ignatius Of Loyola (A Sixteenth Century Mystic) Can Teach Us About Making Good Decisions

Decision-making is a complex process. As individuals, working through our daily lives, we often take a number of shortcuts that may not always serve us well. For example, we make impulsive decisions when stressed or allow others to make them for us, at times with disappointing or disastrous consequences.

But most of us can do better. Among the many decision-making methods for life's big decisions, one that stands out is from an early 16th-century soldier-turned-mystic, St Ignatius of Loyola.

As a clinical psychologist I first became acquainted with Ignatian discernment during an internship program in spirituality, and have found it useful to incorporate it in my research on mindfulness and other reflective practices.

Ignatius uses the language of faith, but, I believe, anyone can apply his method to make more informed decisions.

Who was Ignatius?

Ignatius, baptized Inigo, was born into a noble family in the Basque area of Spain in 1493. After suffering a grievous leg wound during a battle with the French that affected his health for the rest of his life, Ignatius lay in bed for months reading and reflecting on his situation.

He realized that pursuing worldly honor was not as fulfilling as doing the work of God.

During the next year and half of reflection and prayer, he experienced a profound spiritual conversion, with spiritual insights that would form the basis of 'Spiritual Exercises,' a program of prayerful self-examination aimed at developing a deeper relationship with God.

He decided to serve God by becoming a priest, and, with two of his University of Paris colleagues, was given approval by the Vatican in 1540 to found the Society of Jesus also known as the Jesuits. The Jesuits are known for their work in education, with a network of schools and colleges, and for running guided retreats.

Perhaps lesser known is the fact that Ignatius also developed a method of discernment or decision-making that is still relevant today, and that can be applied by people of all faiths and adapted to those who are not religious.

1. Rely on reason and feelings

Ignatius advises creating a list, but also takes it a step further by urging people to listen to their feelings as they consider the pros and cons for each option.

Emotions act as compass points to one's deepest desires. So, he asks individuals to consider: Do some pros or cons stand out because they bring you a sense of peace, joy or hope? Or feelings of dread, anxiety or despair?

He advises probing the origin of the feelings to find out if they come, for example, from desires for power or greed, fear of what others may think, a desire to do good or to be selfless.

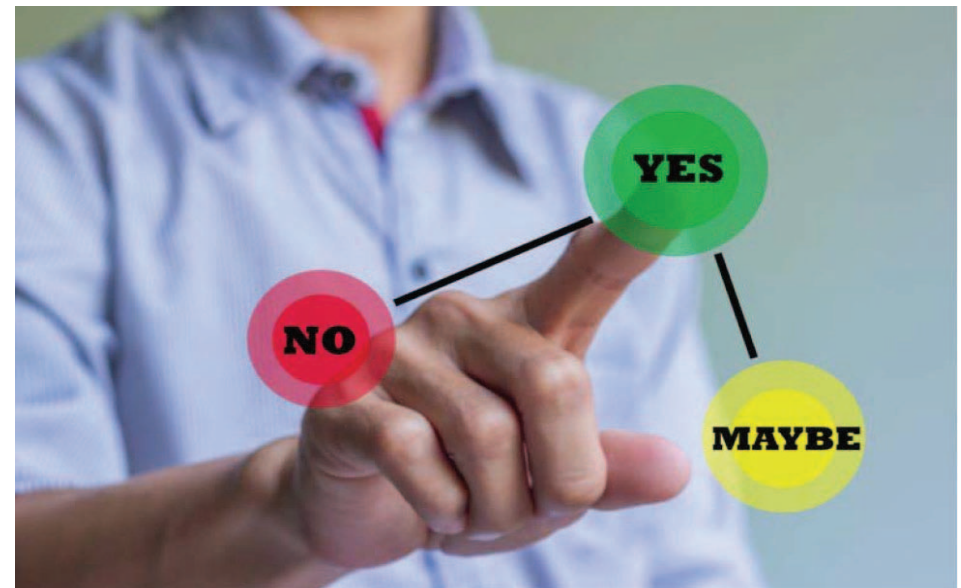
Ignatius teaches that freedom from attachment to a particular choice or outcome is essential. As Martin Luther King Jr said, "Faith is taking the first step, even if you can't see the whole staircase."

Ignatius also advises that individuals share their deliberations with a confidant, advice that he followed when making his own decisions. Modern psychological science too has found that the process of sharing emotions with others helps make sense of our thoughts and feelings.

He also urged people to make decisions for the "greater glory of God."

How can non-religious people use this advice? I argue they can consider how their decisions will affect the vulnerable, the poorest and the most marginalized.

2. Imaginative reflection

Ignatius offers three imaginative exercises if no clear choice emerges:

> Imagine that a friend comes to you with the same situation. They describe their choices, pros and cons, and their thoughts and feelings about these proposals. What would you advise them?

> Imagine that you are on your deathbed. Looking back at your life, and assuming you made the decision in question, how do you view it from that perspective?

> Imagine a conversation with the divine. Those who do not believe in a God could have an imaginary conversation with someone they loved and trusted and who has passed away. What does this person say to you about your options? Would they be pleased, disappointed or neutral about your decision?

Imaginative reflections like these offer clarity to decision-making by providing another perspective to the decision at hand.

3. Seek confirmation

Ignatius advises individuals to act on reason, feeling confident that they have invested their time and energy to make a good choice. But he also says that people should seek out additional information to see if reason confirms the choice. The emotions they feel following a decision, such as peace, freedom, joy, love or compassion, might give an indication if it is the right choice.

In today's hurried world, a 16th-century Catholic mystics' advice may seem quaint or his process tedious. However, many modern psychological approaches confirm the value of such reflective practices.

Spirituality Linked With Better Health Outcomes And Patient Care

Spirituality should be incorporated into care for both serious illness and overall health, according to a study led by researchers at Harvard T H Chan School of Public Health and Brigham and Women's Hospital.

"This study represents the most rigorous and comprehensive systematic analysis of the modern day literature regarding health and spirituality to date," said Tracy Balboni, lead author and senior physician at the Dana-Farber/Brigham and Women's Cancer Center and professor of radiation oncology at Harvard Medical School. "Our findings indicate that attention to spirituality in serious illness and in health should be a vital part of future whole person-centered care, and the results should stimulate more national discussion and progress on how spirituality can be incorporated into this type of value-sensitive care."

"Spirituality is important to many patients as they think about their health," said Tyler VanderWeele, the John L Loeb and Frances Lehman Loeb Professor of Epidemiology in The Departments of Epidemiology and Biostatistics at Harvard Chan School. "Focusing on spirituality in health care means caring for the whole person, not just their disease."

The study, which was co-authored by Balboni, VanderWeele, and senior author Howard Koh, the Harvey V Fineberg Professor of the Practice of Public Health

Leadership at Harvard Chan School, was published online in JAMA on 12 July 2022. Balboni, VanderWeele, and Koh are also co-chairs of the Inter-faculty Initiative on Health, Spirituality, and Religion at Harvard University.

According to the International Consensus Conference on Spiritual Care in Health Care, spirituality is "the way individuals seek ultimate meaning, purpose, connection, value, or transcendence." This could include organized religion, but extends well beyond to include ways of finding ultimate meaning by connecting, for example, to family, community, or nature.

In the study, Balboni, VanderWeele, Koh, and colleagues systematically identified and analyzed the highest-quality evidence on spirituality in serious illness and health published between January 2000 and April 2022. Of the 8,946 articles concerned with serious illness, 371 articles met the study's strict inclusion criteria, as did 215 of the 6,485 articles focused on health outcomes.

A structured, multidisciplinary group of experts, called a Delphi panel, then reviewed the strongest collective evidence and offered consensus implications for health and health care.

They noted that, for healthy people, spiritual community participation - as exemplified by religious service attendance - is associated with healthier lives, including greater longevity, less depression and suicide, and less substance use. For many patients, spirituality is important and influences key outcomes in illness, such as quality of life and medical care decisions. Consensus implications included incorporating considerations of spirituality as part of patient-centered health care and increasing awareness among clinicians and health professionals about the protective benefits of spiritual community participation.

The 27-member panel was composed of experts in spirituality and health care, public health, or medicine, and represented a diversity of spiritual/religious views, including spiritual-not-religious, atheist, Muslim, Catholic, various Christian denominations, and Hindu.

According to the researchers, the simple act of asking about a patient's spirituality can and should be part of patient-centered, value-sensitive care. The information gleaned from the conversation can guide further medical decision-making, including, but not limited to, notifying a spiritual care specialist.

Spiritual care specialists, such as chaplains, are trained to provide clinical pastoral care to diverse patients - whether spiritual-not-religious or from various religious traditions. Chaplains themselves represent a variety of spiritual backgrounds, including secular and religious.

"Overlooking spirituality leaves patients feeling disconnected from the health care system and the clinicians trying to care for them," said Koh. "Integrating spirituality into care can help each person have a better chance of reaching complete well-being and their highest attainable standard of health."

Syracuse VAMC from 1997 to 1998. Dr Cano's research has focused on the role of empathy and perspective-taking on individual and relationship well-being for a variety of dyads, including couples facing chronic illness, parents and children with illness, and also adjudicated adolescents. She has over 70 publications and has served as PI on grants from NIMH, NICHD, and NCCIH. George Wajackoyah spices up Kenya election with marijuana and snake venom

Once a street child in Kenya and a grave digger in the UK, George Wajackoyah has become a political sensation by running for Kenya's presidency on a promise to turn the East African nation into a major exporter of marijuana, snake venom and hyenas' testicles, although many question the feasibility of his plans.

The 63-year-old professor, who has a background in law, has proved to be the most eccentric of the four presidential candidates contesting the 9 August election.

Polls have ranked the Roots Party candidate a poor third - the latest one, released on 11 July, gives him just 4% of the vote.

But pundits say that for a first-time contestant he is doing

of town, but there is no doubt that he has captured the imagination of angry, disaffected youth in both urban and rural Kenya, cutting across all the regular ethnic, regional and party lines," writes Macharia Gaitho, a leading columnist with Kenya's Daily Nation newspaper.

On the campaign trail, Prof Wajackoyah tends to wear a tracksuit, T-shirt and headscarf rather than a smart suit - to show he is not part of the Kenyan establishment he accuses of rampant corruption

He also often gestures with his fingers as if he is smoking marijuana and drives crowds into a frenzy as he dances to reggae songs.

Prof Wajackoyah says if he wins he will pass laws to regulate the farming and production of marijuana for industrial and

medical use, to help solve two of Kenya's biggest problems - unemployment and a ballooning national debt.

He claims it could earn Kenya more than nine trillion shillings (\$76bn; £64bn) annually, and the government would "never have to borrow a single coin" again.

"Western countries have legalised bhang [marijuana]; why shouldn't we?" he adds.
