Editorial

YOUR VOTE COUNTS - EVERY VOTE MATTERS!

In June 2021, municipal elections were held for The City of Compton in California, USA. The seat for the Council's Second District was contested by Isaac Galvan and Andre Spicer. Galvan had been declared the winner by one vote, 855 to 854.

Spicer, a thirty-nine year old businessman, had protested the result, and eventually took the matter to court.

Last August, following investigations, the Los Angeles County District Attorney's Office had arrested Galvan, a democrat, along with five others, and charged them with conspiracy to commit election fraud and, one count of bribery, with intent to influence an election. The other four had been specifically accused of registering to vote and casting votes in Compton, even though they lived outside the city.

According to a Los Angeles Times report, prosecutors had also alleged that Galvan conspired with candidate Jace Dawson to direct voters from outside the council district to cast votes for him at the polls.

Galvan was further accused of attempting to bribe the county's top elections official with concert tickets, as she was counting ballots on election night.

Last Friday, the Los Angeles Superior Court issued its findings that four of the votes for Councilman Isaac Galvan were illegal, they having been casted by persons who didn't live in the council district. Judge Michelle Williams said that after deducting the illegal votes from Galvan's total, candidate Andre Spicer was the person actually elected with a legal vote count of 854 to 851.

She directed that Galvan be removed and Andre Spicer be installed on the City Council.

Responding to the verdict, Andre Spicer expressed his happiness that his efforts had at long last prevailed, especially as he had been fighting for a very long time to restore some measure of confidence in the city's electoral system.

He went on to point out that there had been rumours of voter fraud and schemes for years in Compton, and it worried him that the community had lost faith in voting. "I think this helps to get us engaged again," he said. "It's just a relief for the entire city to expose it, and hopefully, rid ourselves of it."

At the risk of seeming tedious, we of The Labour Spokesman are bringing this matter to the attention of ALL the people of St Kitts and Nevis, especially as it evokes memories of the 2015 general elections when one seat was 'lost' by a mere four (4) votes.

But not only was that one seat lost, so was the whole government. And, today, we are where we are, and our country has descended into the total mess and chaos in which we now find ourselves.

The Compton scenario also contains several of the electioneering problems with which we are now confronted, and have been, since the

run-up to the 2015 general elections.

SKNLP Leader Questions Why Other COVID-19 Workers Did Not Receive Extra Pay Like Task Force Members

BASSETERRE, St.Kitts (Friday 3rd June 2022)- “What happened to the nurses, the cleaners, the cooks who had to confront people with a virus we knew little about then and there was a lot of fear and anxiety; nothing for them?”

Such was a question posed by Leader of the St. Kitts-Nevis Labour Party (SKNLP) Dr. Terrance Drew, who is a trained medical doctor, during an appearance on Freedom ‘Issues’ programme aired live on Thursday 2nd June 2022.

He was at the time speaking on the topic of an honorarium payment to members of the National COVID-19 Task Force s totaling over \$60,000 collectively which became a public hot topic stemming from photo circulating social media showing twenty (20) names.

Senator Wendy Phipps addressed the topic the day before (1st June) during a cabinet press conference held at the NEMA Headquarters.

She pointed to “a very disturbing matter that would have been brought to my attention yesterday by five spate individuals who had seen it on social media and it has to do with the fact that there was a onetime honorarium that was paid to the task force for COVID-19.”

She said “The work of the task force was carried out-and is still being carried out by the way because we had a meeting up to last Tuesday- by a wide cross section of public sector, stakeholders with their own set of specialist skills, leadership [skills], professional know how and of course a heart of love for their own country and they gave without counting the cost, they gave without counting the amount of time they would have spent from family and friends, they gave up their leisure time, there were days and months when we came to this very room day after day after day during lock down when everybody else was in their

homes.”

“Over time the commendations of the task force went far and wide even as far as our diaspora and then over time it was though that there need to be a tangible way to say thank you to the people of this country who went above and beyond to keep all of us safe and they’re still doing that job,” Phipps added.

She informed the document seem was portion of a cabinet submission- #236 of 2021- was drafted on or about the 6th of December 2021, following almost two months of discussion in the cabinet and the Ministry of Finance as to an appropriate mechanism or frame with which to say thank you to the task force. The submission was finally dealt with [the 10th of] January.

Phipps continued: “The task force for COVID-19 is a task force that has provided stellar service to the country. Every single member state in CARICOM looked to our model and copied it because we had by their assessment what can be considered the best build out of a COVID response through the length and breadth of CARICOM.

The data also supports the type of yeoman’s service that would have been extended keeping our rates of deaths very low; up to now we only had 43 deaths and our case load is still relatively low in terms of serious infections and the need for hospitalization etc. Nobody when they joined the task force did it for what they could get out of it; it was national service. We were facing a crisis that could have wiped us out because we’re the smallest member state in CARICOM with the smallest pool of resources healthwise and otherwise.

Commenting on the topic Dr. Drew stated: “When you see what is coming out, I mean I am saying to myself, I remember when that all doctors they should get some sort of risk

pay. You cannot have these people dealing with a new virus then going home to their families and nothing at all. It had doctors who did not even have their health insurance up to date at that point.”

He spoke about the criticism he received when he addressed such matters during the pandemic.

“Doctors who were on PEP and facing a deadly virus and I spoke about those things and you know how they (the government) bashed me, said the worst things about me ...and it withstand it because I always know the truth would come out because I never lied about

anything that was taking place there, and now we’re seeing a list. I don’t know if there is a lot of people on that list who deserve that pay but Wendy Phipps coming and saying this is voluntary, and her pay was the largest.”

The SKNLP Leader continued: “What happened to the nurses, the cleaners, the cooks who had to confront people with a virus we knew little about then and there was a lot of fear and anxiety; nothing for them? The words put country about self were used but Wendy was not putting country about self alone, she was getting her big pay ...and now people ...they are recognizing that wow, this was all a farce all the time when you look at those thousands upon thousands of dollars they would have gotten and have doctors on PEP during a pandemic, doctors who can’t get a salary, doctors who are working for less than nurses, even the nurses would come and say ‘Dr. Drew the doctors working for less money than me’.”



Nineteen Storms Expected During 2022 Hurricane Season

BASSETERRE, St.Kitts (Friday 3rd June 2022)-Senior Meteorological Officer at the St. Christopher Air and Sea Ports Authority (SCASPA) Elmo Burke has informed that a total of nineteen (19) storms are expected for the 2022 Atlantic Hurricanes Season.

Making an appearance on the government’s ‘Working For You’ programme on Wednesday 1st June, he gave the forecast.

He said according to the Colorado State University “we’re anticipating about nineteen (19) storms, nine of which may develop into hurricanes and out of those nine, we’re anticipating four of those may develop into major hurricanes and when we say major hurricanes, we’re speaking about hurricanes reaching categories three, four and five.”

He pointed out that the hurricane season runs from June 1st to November 30th whilst adding “However, we recognize that there’s always a potential that you can have systems starting forming prior to June 1st and you can also have systems lasting beyond November 30th.

Burke went on to highlight what is being monitored so far.

“For this year, we would have recognized that quite a few

tropical waves would have come off the eastern African coast; some of those would have traversed across the Atlantic. Fortunately for us, none of those would have developed into any cyclone. However, on the Pacific side, we are now monitoring what would have been the first Pacific hurricane for this year, and that would have traversed in an eastward direction moving across Mexico.

Based on that trajectory, it’s expected to enter over into the Atlantic basin as a depreciated system, and when I say a depreciated system, I’m talking about something that is no longer a tropical cyclone. After that, it is anticipated that it’s expected to regenerate and as such we are anticipating it to become our first Atlantic system for this year, and the name for that would be Alex. So once, it forms into a tropical depression or tropical cyclone, it would be given the name Alex.”

Burke shared the definitions of such weather systems



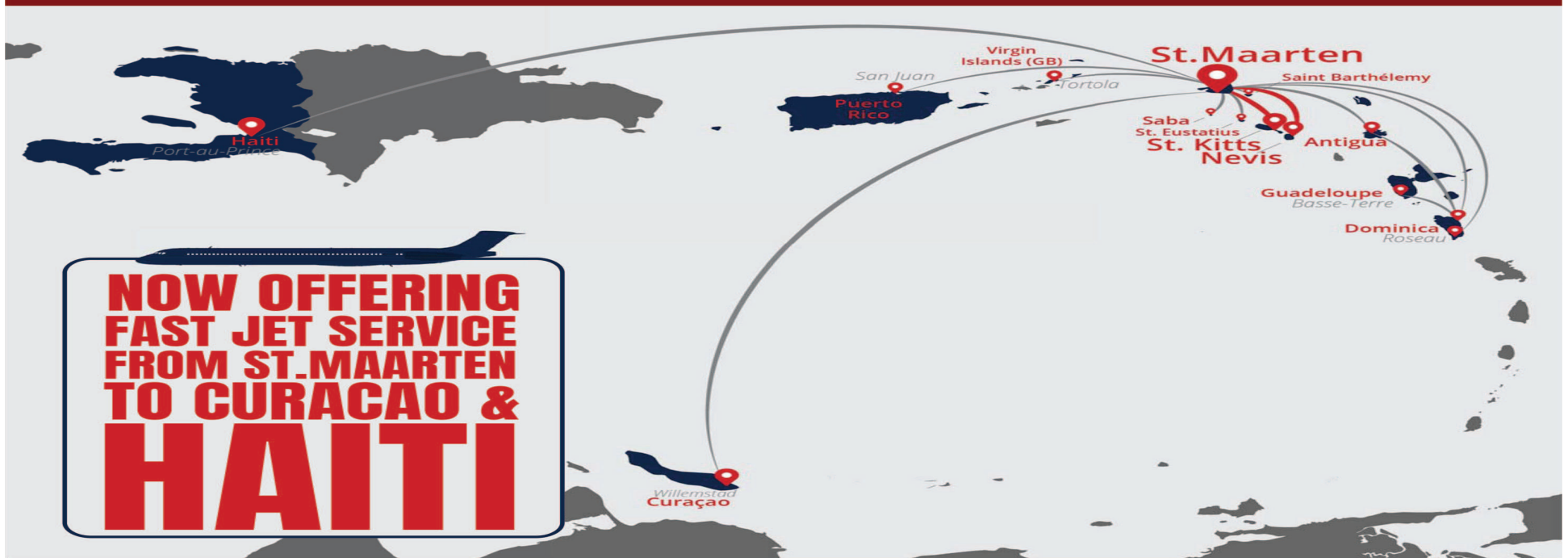

informing that a hurricane is a tropical cyclone with winds 75 miles per hour or greater.

“So once we sustained 75 miles per hour or greater sustained winds we classify it as a hurricane. A tropical storm is winds ranging from 39 to 73 miles per hour, and you can have a tropical depression that is not fully formed once you have winds less than 39 miles per hour...” he stated.

sacked for non-performance by this government. Go back to 2020 General Elections, you hear each and every and every one of them saying Dr. Harris has given sterling performance to this country."

Dr. Harris added: "Go back to the budget debate. Each and every one of them, approved it, was satisfied that it had adequate resources to do the people's work."

"What we had were lazy people; ministers who did not even know that it

was in a budget which they purportedly support. They did not know where certain revenues were included in a budget. Suddenly, they didn't know after seven years so let us not go into the fanciful field of political propaganda in which they are inviting us at this particular moment of time," he said further.

"You have heard from each of the ministers. You have heard the Attorney General; within days he was able to do that which had not been done in seven years while budgetary resources were being provided."

Always remember: PLP IS NOT LABOUR!

At a press briefing held in April 2022, former Prime Minister and Leader of the People's Action Movement (PAM) Shawn Richards- before he was fired- accused PM Harris of undermining him and other cabinet colleagues.

"Many of the projects to be undertaken by CCM, PAM and even the other PLP minister were frustrated and starved of money from the ministry of finance, and the reason was to make us look bad and make one man look good because later he would implement some measures and claim that only he was responsible," he commented.

"One man sat in a cabinet corner quietly and systematically undermining

his own colleagues not even his own other PLP colleague was spared because she too was undermined. The plot to undermine was to serve one purpose only and that was to claim responsibility for all of the success," Richards said.

In an address to the nation in May, PM Harris revealed that PAM government ministers Shawn Richards, Lindsay Grant, Jonel Powel as well as Mark Brantley, Alexis Jeffers and Eric Evelyn of the Concerned Citizens Movement (CCM) were stripped of their appointments as Ministers of Government.

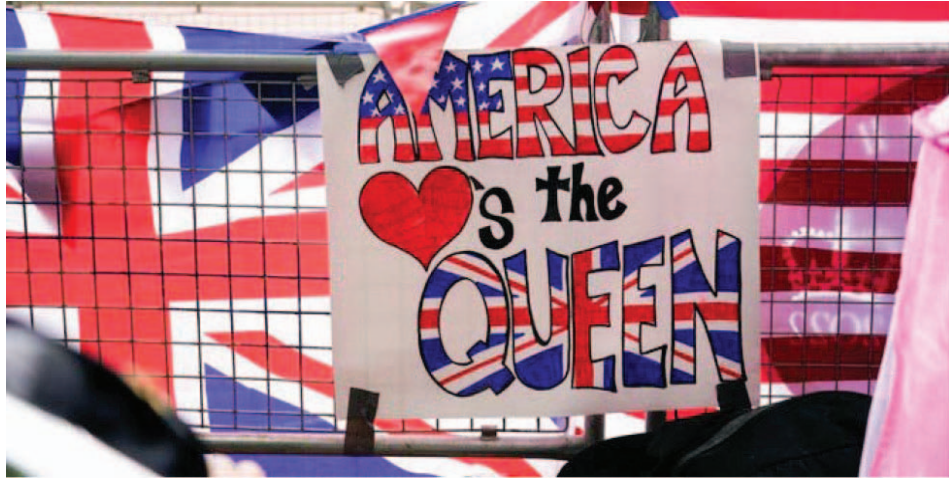

Starting on 2 June 2022, British subjects will be participating in street parties and other events marking the 70 years that the country's monarch has remained on

the throne. They won't be alone in expressing affection for the queen.

In America, Elizabeth retains approval ratings that would leave most political leaders envious. And even if the most high-profile US-based royalists - Prince Harry and his American wife Meghan Markle - intend to be in The UK for some of the ceremonies, many other supporters of Queen Elizabeth will be back in America, no doubt raising a cup of tea in her honor.

fascination with the British monarchy in the first place? It might seem strange, given the nation's decision to sever ties with George III in 1776. No royal family from any other nation has induced the same level of scrutiny or celebration.

It's important to recognize that British royals have been eliciting similar responses on American shores for the past 150 years.

In 1860, Prince Albert Edward - the future King Edward VII - staged a surprisingly successful American tour, during which he was mobbed by fans in cities including Chicago; Albany, New York; and Detroit. In 1939, King George VI and Queen Elizabeth made similar headlines when they ate their first hot dogs in Hyde Park, New York, urged on by President Roosevelt and his wife, Eleanor.

And then there was the frenzy surrounding Prince Charles and Princess Diana's visit to Washington in 1985. President Reagan may have mistakenly referred to

...Why Will So Many Americans Also Be Cheering Her On?

Diana as "Princess David," but no one will forget Diana's turn on the dance floor with actor John Travolta.

Of course, there's an element of pragmatism in the tradition of warm American receptions. After the American Revolution, the newly independent nation realized that it would need to maintain strong ties with the imperial motherland for diplomatic and security reasons; the War of 1812 proved to be the exception - rather than the rule - in 19th-century Anglo-American relations.

This "special relationship" would become only more vital during World War II and the Cold War that followed. President Roosevelt invited George VI to that picnic in 1939 not only to exchange pleasantries, but also to telegraph British and American unity in the face of German belligerence.

But the emotion on display during royal visits also suggests a deep affective tie. Although the American revolutionaries long ago rejected colonial government, there has always been a certain degree of ambivalence about the crown. The Colonists, after all, had felt an in-tense and personal relationship with George III, whom they regarded as distinct from the British Parliament, even as many came to question the concept of hereditary sovereignty.

As late as 1775 Alexander Hamilton would defend George III in his "The Farmer Refuted" on the grounds that George III was "king of America, by virtue of a compact between us and the kings of Great Britain." As Hamilton went on to explain, "(T)o disclaim the authority of a British Parliament over us, does by no means imply the dereliction of our allegiance to British Monarchs." In the wake of the Revolution, the routines, symbols, rituals and attitudes associated with the crown proved difficult to sacrifice.

These thorny aspects of the transition from colony to nation have been addressed in works by historians and academics Elisa Tamarkin, Brendan J McConville and, most recently, Eric Nelson. In 'The Royalist Revolution,' Nelson even goes so far as to suggest, provocatively, that the nation's founders crafted the American presidency with the image of a strong king in mind.

Not everyone will buy Nelson's thesis, but there's no denying that Americans have made their own political dynasties: Instead of the Windsors, we have the Kennedys, Bushes and Clintons.

In 2018 American actress Meghan Markle went one step further by marrying into the British royal family. Her relationship with the British press - and reportedly with some of her in-laws - hasn't been the smoothest, leading to a move across the Atlantic to The US for her and husband, Prince Harry.

But despite that one American's experience, Americans tend to look favorably on the family's head. A February 2022 poll of Americans found that 61% held a favorable view of Queen Elizabeth - the highest rating of any living member of the British royal family.



CDB Working to Accelerate Efforts to Increase Food Security

June 2, 2022, BRIDGETOWN, Barbados - The Caribbean Development Bank's (CDB) Vice President of Operations, Mr Isaac Solomon encouraged the Bank's member countries to prioritise food security initiatives while accelerating efforts towards the achievement of the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). Speaking at the CDB's food security seminar held on June 1, 2022, the Vice President expressed a desire for the relay of "tangible and implementable actions, to contribute to the Region's agenda to achieve food security and reduce its import bill by 25% by 2025" adding that "with less than 8 years left until 2030, it is imperative that the region accelerate all efforts towards the achievement of the SDGS and our development now."

The webinar which was attended by a cross section of global experts and participants, provided recommendations for coherent approaches to managing logistics and reducing processing and exportation costs of agri-food products within the Caribbean. Solutions proposed included deepening regional cooperation and integration which alongside the implementation of systems to accommodate seamless cross border trade, the application of digital solutions, simplification of procedures and increasing the efficiency in trade and logistics processes would positively impact food security stated Senior Trade Facilitation Officer at the International Trade Centre (ITC), Mr Pierre Bonthonneau.

According to Mr Bonthonneau, who presented at the seminar, the Caribbean can impact its current food import metrics and the availability of affordable food for citizens by making trade formalities more effective, pursuing greater investment in technology-based initiatives while also embracing trade reforms and robust private-public dialogue and engagement.


Several of these solutions are being supported by CDB which is funding projects targeting

connectivity, transport, digital interventions for trade and enhancing infrastructure at ports of entry. Creating an appropriate ecosystem to achieve the SDGs, according to the Vice President, requires innovation and responsiveness to address social, financial, environmental, institutional, and economic challenges of regional food security which is embedded in CARICOM's and CDB's agenda.

The ITC Senior Trade Facilitation Officer emphasised that both private and public sector entities have a responsibility to institute measures to make the pricing of commodities cost effective given the fact that two thirds of the world's population depends on imports to ensure a healthy diet. For the Caribbean region with its high food import bill, he indicated, solutions would revolve around regional coordination, regulatory convergence and leveraging information technology solutions.

Beyond this, remedies for building out the agri-food sector should leverage the World Trade Organisation (WTO) Trade Facilitation Agreement (TFA) which set binding obligations in countries to minimize red tape. This will allow border agencies to more effectively treat with perishable goods, pre arrival processing, rejected goods and reviewing and simplifying formalities so that the cost of agricultural products can remain affordable. Easing trade in agri-foods will positively contribute the region's vision to achieve at least five SDGs - zero hunger, gender equality, climate action, responsible consumption and production and life below water.

Also speaking at the webinar were Mr Nicholas Zephirin, Managing Director/Chief Executive Officer, Viking Traders Ltd. Saint Lucia; Mr. Stephen Farquharson, Technical Officer - Accreditation and Conformity Assessment at the CARICOM Regional Organisation for Standards and Quality (CROSQ) and Ms Erica Luke, Managing Director of Eric Hassell Shipping, Barbados.

Diabetes May Weaken Teeth And Promote Tooth Decay

- By Rutgers University

People with both type 1 and type 2 diabetes are prone to tooth decay, and a new study from Rutgers may explain why: Reduced strength and durability of enamel and dentin, the hard substance under enamel that gives structure to teeth.

Researchers induced type 1 diabetes in 35 mice and used a Vickers microhardness tester to compare their teeth with those of 35 healthy controls over 28 weeks.

Although the two groups started with comparable teeth, enamel grew significantly softer in the diabetic mice after 12 weeks, and the gap continued to widen throughout the study. Significant

differences in dentin3 microhardness arose by week 28.

“We’ve long seen elevated rates of cavity formation and tooth loss in patients with diabetes, and we’ve long known that treatments such as fillings do not last as long in such patients, but we did not know exactly why,” said Mohammad Ali Saghiri, an assistant professor of restorative dentistry at Rutgers School of

Dental Medicine.

The study, now published in Archives of Oral Biology, advances a multi-year effort by Saghiri and other researchers

to understand how diabetes affects dental health and to develop treatments that counter its negative impact.

Previous studies have established that people with both types of diabetes have significantly elevated rates of most oral health issues, both in the teeth and the soft tissues that surround them.

Saghiri and other researchers also have demonstrated that diabetes can interfere with the ongoing process of adding minerals to teeth as they wear away from normal usage.

“This is a particular focus of mine because the population of people with diabetes continues to grow rapidly,” Saghiri said. “There is a great need for treatments that will allow patients to keep their teeth healthy, but it has not been a major area for research.”

At Least Eleven And Thirty-three Missing After Agatha's Hit On Mexico

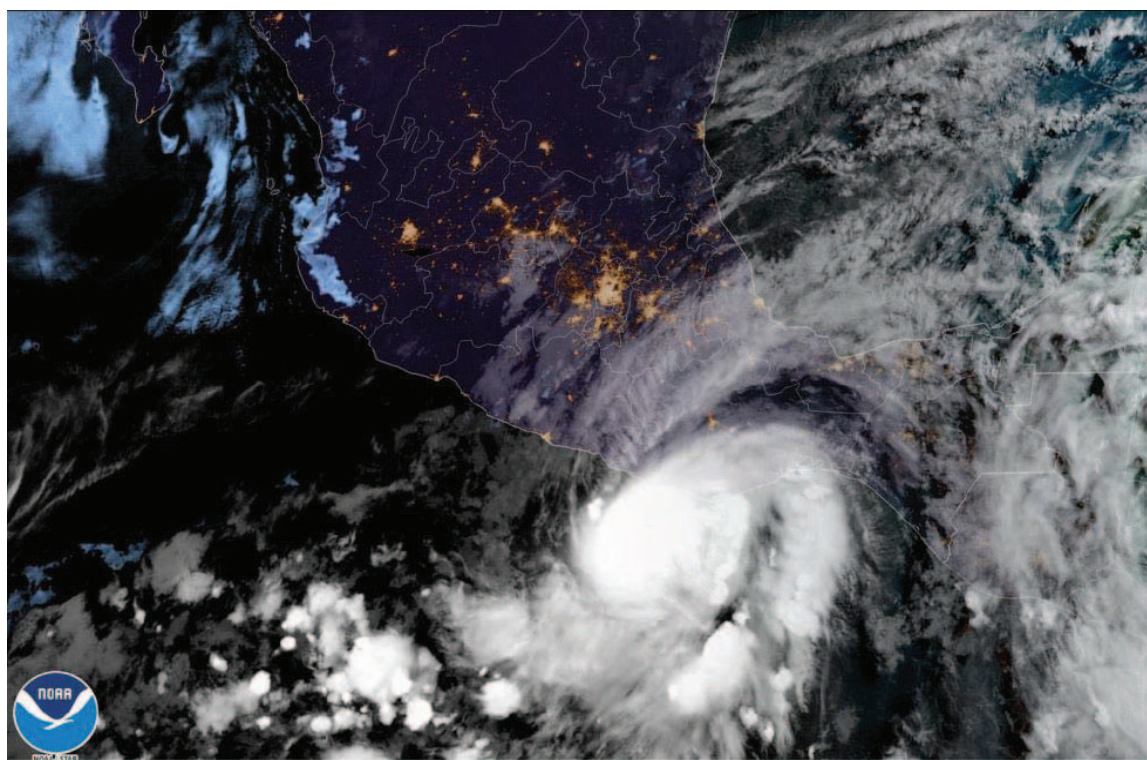
MEXICO CITY (AP) - Hurricane Agatha left at least 11 people dead and 33 missing in the southern Mexico state of Oaxaca, where it set off flooding and landslides, Governor Alejandro Murat said Wednesday.

More than 40,000 people in the state have been affected, primarily along the coast and in the mountains just beyond, Murat said.

Agatha was the strongest hurricane since records have been kept to come ashore in May in the eastern Pacific.

It made landfall Monday afternoon on a sparsely populated stretch of small beach towns and fishing villages as a strong Category 2 hurricane with maximum sustained winds of 105 mph (170 kph), but it quickly lost power moving inland over the mountainous interior.

Even as Oaxaca continued to search for the missing and clean up downed trees and flooded homes, Mexican officials were watching another large area of thunderstorms along the Caribbean coast of the Yucatan Peninsula that forecasters said could become a tropical storm later this week.

The US National Hurricane Center gave the system a 70% chance of becoming a tropical depression in the next 48 hours. As it took shape, it dumped heavy rain on southern Mexico and Belize.

President Andres Manuel Lopez Obrador said Defense Secretary Luis Cresencio Sandoval was headed to Oaxaca to oversee recovery operations.





Marsha gives committment to upgraded Basseterre Health Centre with new services

BASSETERRE, ST KITTS, June 2, 2022 - The commitment by Political Leader of the St Kitts-Nevis Labour Party (SKNLP) Dr Terrance Drew to revamp the healthcare system in the twin-island federation is getting solid support from the party's lone female candidate in the upcoming general elections.

We will renovate and expand the Basseterre Health Center and increase the services it offers. Some of the new services we will seek to make available at the health centre are blood tests and physical therapies. We will also make available more District Medical Officers in the Central Basseterre communities," she told supporters.

"Our elderly in the Central Basseterre communities will be better cared for under an SKNLP government. I will pursue the establishment of a day care center for the elderly and disabled persons in our communities, especially those who require supervision throughout the day. This will help to improve their quality of life by keeping them socially active. This is a benefit because many of these persons become depressed due to social isolation," said Henderson.

In a message to non-nationals inclusive of those in the Hispanic community, Henderson said their complaints of not having a voice will be heard.

"I want to assure our non-nationals: Labour has your back and I have your back. As the soon-to-be elected representative for C#2, I will ensure that your voices are heard. We will create a special ombudsman or mediator who will serve as the representative for our non-national community. This person will be charged with recording all of your concerns, reporting them to the responsible minister, and playing a vital role in the creation of solutions for you all," said Henderson.

She said the SKNLP is the party that cares for all and urged residents to check the track records of the 90-year-old.

"We leave no man, woman, or child behind," said Henderson, stating: "Whether you're on the Labour train or not, everybody will be moving."

The local attorney accused the outgoing administration and parliamentary representative, Jonel Powell of keeping Central Basseterre depressed and repressed. "Well, all that will end on my watch. Central, you deserve better. Your Labour Government will bring better and deliver."

She also pledged to deal with the lack of or inadequate recreational facilities, some of which are poorly maintained. "The communities of New Road and Shadwell don't have playing fields for recreation. Green spaces for relaxation and fun activities are of extreme importance as spending time in them has been proven to lower stress levels," said Henderson.

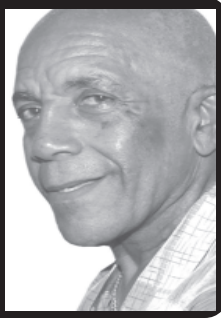

CWI pays tribute to David Holford, former West Indies allrounder

Tuesday, 31 May 2022 - ST JOHN'S, Antigua - Cricket West Indies (CWI) today paid tribute to David Holford, the former West Indies allrounder who passed away on Monday in his homeland Barbados. He was 82. As a leg spinner and lower middle-order batsman who played 24 Test matches between 1966 and 1977.

His finest hour came during the Lord's Test of 1966 when he made a magnificent unbeaten century, as part of a historic partnership of 274 with his cousin Garfield Sobers. In just his third

Test innings, Holford made 105 not out to help save West Indies from danger of 95-5 in the second innings. His best bowling figures were 5-23 against India in the first innings which helped set-up a victory at Kensington Oval in 1976.

He was also captain of Barbados and led them to the Shell Shield title, and briefly played for Trinidad and Tobago. After retirement Holford held several roles in the game. He was President of the Spartan Club, Director of the Barbados

Cricket Association, West Indies Selector and Manager of the West Indies team.

Ricky Skerritt, President of CWI paid tribute.

Skerritt said: "David Holford epitomized the values of cricket both on and off the field, and was the quintessential West Indies cricketer and ambassador. As a player he was a top quality allrounder and captain who gave his utmost at all levels. As an administrator, team manager and pitch curator he demonstrated his ongoing love for the game by his vision and dedication. He had a hand in the development of several young players across the region, not just in cricket but in several other fields of endeavor. David's legacy is therefore one of service and dedication to Barbados and West Indies cricket. CWI hereby extends our deepest condolences to his wife, Marva, and all family and friends."

Cricket fans to enjoy busy 'summer of cricket' with visits by Bangladesh, India and New Zealand

30 days of West Indies Men's international cricket from June 16 to August 21

Wednesday, 1 June 2022 - ST JOHN'S, Antigua - Cricket West Indies (CWI) today confirmed the full match schedule for the West Indies Senior Men's team from June 16 to August 21. This will see visits to the region by Bangladesh, India and New Zealand featuring all three formats of cricket.

The list of fixtures features 30 days of men's international cricket comprising two Tests, nine CG United One-Day Internationals and 11 T20 Internationals at 10 world-class venues. This promises to be a bumper "summer of cricket" for fans across the Caribbean as well as for the West Indies diaspora in the United States of America, when West Indies and India make a return to the Broward County Cricket Stadium in Lauderhill, Florida for two T20Is against India.

Bangladesh will tour the Caribbean from June 16 to July 16 and will face West Indies in two Test matches in Antigua and St Lucia as part of the ICC World Test Championship. The two Tests will be followed by three T20Is and three CG United ODIs in Dominica and Guyana. The first two T20Is will see a return to international cricket at the fully refurbished Windsor Park, where international cricket is being hosted for the first time since the hurricane damage of 2017. The Bangladesh home series will conclude with the third T20I and then three CG United ODIs at the Guyana National Stadium.

India's white-ball tour will commence on July 22 in Trinidad and Tobago with three CG United ODIs from July 22 to 27 at Queen's Park Oval, Port of Spain, followed by five T20Is in three separate venues. The first T20I on Friday, July 29 will be historic as the first ever Men's T20I to be played at the Brian Lara Cricket Academy in the south of Trinidad. The venue for the back-to-back second and third T20I matches is Warner Park, St Kitts, coinciding with Emancipation Day and Culturama holiday celebrations there. The eight-match India white ball tour concludes with an exciting weekend of back-to-back T20I fixtures at the Broward County Cricket Stadium in Lauderhill, Florida from August 6 and 7.

West Indies' summer of cricket climaxes with New Zealand's white-ball tour of the Caribbean, which has been rescheduled from 2020 following the COVID-19 pandemic. The BLACKCAPS will arrive in Jamaica to play three T20Is from Wednesday, August 10 to Sunday, August 14 before moving to Barbados for three day/night CG United ODIs. All nine CG United ODIs are part of the ICC ODI Super League with the West Indies aiming to qualify directly for the ICC World Cup in 2023.

"We are delighted to announce the match schedule for the men's international calendar at home for the rest of the year. We know our supporters will be delighted with the news that the matches are being played all across the region as well as those living in the USA will be able to see their favourite players in action," said Johnny Grave, CEO of CWI.

"This is the busiest year of cricket ever in the West Indies. In January we hosted Ireland and England in white ball formats, and also successfully staged the ICC Under 19 Men's Cricket World Cup 2022, which featured 16 teams traversing the region. We also witnessed the Apex Test Series, against England, which West Indies won in great style and with real fight."

Grave added: "The upcoming summer is expected to feature 30 days of top-quality entertainment for our fans as we look ahead to hosting three teams of differing styles in all three formats, which will sure to whet the appetite. We are mindful that COVID-19 is still present, and we again want to thank the various Governments and other stakeholders who have worked with us to ensure the matches will be played in a safe environment."

Tickets will go on sale available from Thursday June 3 via the new WINDIES TICKETS service, presented by Mastercard at <https://www.windiescricket.com/tickets/>. The Test matches against Bangladesh will be on sale initially with the white ball matches against Bangladesh, India and New Zealand being added in coming weeks. Tickets are available from just US\$6.00 for the Test matches against Bangladesh and from US\$10 for matches against New Zealand with a range of options from grounds admission to premium seats.

For the games against India in the Caribbean, tickets will start from US\$20 for grounds admission. Ticket categories and prices for the games in Florida will be

announced later in June. In addition to being able to choose and pay for your seats in advance, the service allows fans to save their purchased tickets to their device for ticket scanning at the venue, avoiding the need for queues and travel to the box offices. Fans registered for the WI Insider fanmail and on the WINDIES TICKETS service will receive promotional discounts across the games in the Caribbean.
