Editorial

Why Is Everything So Overpriced?

For a rather long time we of this newspaper have been trying to draw the government's attention to the fact that all is not well in the pricing of consumer goods at the supermarkets and groceries. We have tried to explain just how those practices have been hurting our people, both financially and economically.

Between last Friday's edition and today's, there has been an increase in the number of complaints reaching this paper. It seems clear that price gouging is being indulged in by the mercantile class, and that they are doing so ruthlessly and brazenly, apparently secure in the knowledge that the government are either unable or unwilling to do anything about it.

We are very worried about the effects which those practices are having, and will have, on all of our people, in the both the short-term and the long-term, especially to those who are not well off.

And, while all of this is going, it is clear that some members of the government could not care less. They are concerned about themselves and close family members, with maintaining their grip on power, and thereby preserving their ability to mercilessly fleece the country.

Rather than dealing with substantive matters and issues, some of them are taken with trying to mamaguy those of our people who have some kind of vested interest in keeping them in office.

Thus, on a weekly basis, we are 'treated' to all kinds of full page, stale photo imagery, suggesting that they are still united. There are also the unending outpouring of fanciful claims of success, and 'promises' to achieve meaningful development.

Our people know better, therefore those attempts insult our intelligence. Those who habitually insult in those ways should be thoroughly ashamed of themselves.

Admittedly, we can achieve more by working together, but that can never be achieved under 'leadership' that is utterly devoid

Dr. Drew Looking At Grant Being In Office After Police Charge ...Calls On PM Harris To Address Matter

BASSETERRE, St.Kitts (Friday 11th March 2022)- Leader of the St.Kitts-Nevis Labour Party (SKNLP) Dr. Terrance Drew, in looking at government minister Lindsay Grant still being in office even after being charged for beating police officer, is of the view that a regular individual would be on leave.

Speaking to Freedom FM on Wednesday 9th March 2022, he called on Prime Minister and Minister of National Security Dr. Timothy Harris to “apply standards that would have been applied if it was someone else.”

“It casts a dark cloud over the government and the country on a whole if Minister Grant is allowed to continue as a minister in a cabinet led by Prime Minister Timothy Harris. If he does nothing Prime Minister Harris will be seen as part and parcel of this whole situation where justice is not served and seems to many that Minister Grant is being given special favour.”

“I’m saying to the Prime minister of St.Kitts and Nevis, you have a sitting minister if government who is charged for beating a police officer. As far as I’m concerned, if it had been any civil servant or anybody who is under the direct management of the Prime minister, that person would have been relieved of their position and so we saying this should be the case as well. Minister Grant should be relieved of his ministerial duties until this case is resolved because had it been anyone else,” the SKNLP National Leader also stated.

According to Dr. Drew: “I would like to say that this is nothing personal against Minister Grant but really asking for justice in this case, and I’m asking that whatever would have been the course of action that for example a young man in Cayon or in Upper Monkey Hill would have had to go through that Lindsay Grant should go through the same

thing.

He continued: The rule of law should be applied equally across the board without fear or favour but allow justice to be served in every instance, and what we saw on that tape had it been somebody else, we know that the course of action would have been different.”

Dr. Drew highlighted that Grant was charged two months after the incident.

“We know, again, that if it was a regular and ordinary person who is not a minister of government that they would have been served with a summons or charged very quickly so we’re asking for justice in this case.”

“Lindsay Grant has finally been charged. I would say from the beginning that this has become an issue of interest to the public. The altercation between Minister Grant and the police officer and a tape had been revealed or released that demonstrated what that altercation was all about. We saw that Minister Grant was using aggressive language, ‘rarrtt up’ which people tried to trivialize,” remarked Dr. Drew.

He commended the officer “who called for backup when she realized the situation was escalating. To me, she also sought to act professionally and I would like to commend her for that as well because it must have been a difficult situation for her.”

The newly-elected SKNLP National Leader recalled protesting by himself at that time because “I was very concerned that such a grave issue would have been swept under the rug as we know other issues have been swept under the rug, and I was adamant that justice should be served in this case.

He noted that he made other appearances and also wrote on the issue.

He applauded other citizens who took the issue and presented it to the public including Jefroy Morrishaw who even organized a march in town where he (Dr. Drew) got the opportunity to say a few words.

Dr. Drew informed that he has written and delivered a letter to the Director of Public Prosecutions (DPP) and copied to a number of others within the government “and therefore I am waiting to see what would be the response.”

Zack Going Back To Old Days With Exhibition Plans

BASSETERRE, St.Kitts (Friday 11th March 2022)-Keeper of the Zack's Historical Cultural Museum and well-known cultural preservationist Winston 'Zack' Nisbett is currently in the process of turning back the hands of time in "recreating history" for a planned exhibition.

In an interview session with local reporters held on location at Buckley's Estate on Wednesday 8th March 2022, he explained that he is currently preparing the spruce up a section that will feature the old time ways of life of the yesteryears which includes the living quarters with the grass bed, flour bag curtains, oil stoves personal waste pails and bottle lamp.

Other old time days items that will be on display include things that have been housed at the museum as well as newly-donated ones including the old time radios, horse cart wheels, donkey crooks, latrine, basins, pails cameras, photographs, goose for ironing, enamel utensils like the cups and plates, ice cream maker, cane juicer and ice crusher.

Nisbett- who is known as the -Doctor Of Culture- informed that for the whole month of Black History Month in February, he had been "fully involved in explaining to schools and the communities what "real history is like."

"It's like back to basics, showing you what we used then in relation to what is now, and most of the things we have here are crucial to that era like the basin, the smaller basin, larger basin, pail and po" whilst noting that "there are many more stuff coming in so I am preparing it for that but the schools borrowed a lot of stuff... like the Molineux School where class by class came forward explaining and was explaining some of the things."

Nisbett is expected to start his primary school tour exhibition shortly so that the students can get a hands-on educational insight on the "historical value."

"It's value it is because most of those elder persons, they were raised up in this sort of thing. It was more economical then. The food was [tastier] because when you cook on a coal pot, the sentiment within the food, it was sweeter...it had the real taste," Nisbett added.

According to Nisbett, many people come by the visit especially on the weekends, and they are fascinated to see, and would indicate that they have certain old time items at their homes to bring in donation to the museum like radios and even ice cream makers and stoves with the oil bottle.

"What you see now is only a small portion because I'm trying to elaborate and trying to create a much better environment so that when visitors come, they [the items] would be labelled properly with a little joke along it like 'In the

days of old, the goose was gold' and that sort of thing," he expressed.

The 'Doctor of Culture' reflected on how individuals went about relieving body waste and the dumping system used back then.

"One of the most fascinating things of the yesteryear is the bore hole or latrine. I have one out there to show with the covering. The frame is made out of concrete and I can recall the days when you used to be tickled by the cockroaches. That is how it was then with the flour bag or crochas bag curtains. Those were the good old days."

He continued: "The pail, you had it in the house with a cover over it, and in the night when you belly trouble you, in those days much toilets weren't around, and so if you wanted to use the toilet, you had to go outside in the cane fields and what you had to do, and when you come back in you had a basin stand and you would wash your hands in that. In the pail is where people used to defecate and you keep it in the

house until morning, you take it up and you go on out and dump it in the field or in the latrine, and at sometimes people used to [transport] it on their head and you carry it down the bay and dump it. That is how people lived then so all that I'm bring back to show."

Commenting the importance of younger generation learning about the history of the old time days, Nisbett shared: "It is a significant thing because it shows them clearly that your parents [grandparents and others alike] had life hard; very, very hard and were still able to accomplish their goals which was to satisfy the

kids at home even though it was tough."

The basic foods that were used then were more indigenous to our health and so on...the sweet potato which is one of the number one foods because it has in beta carotene which is very good for eyesight, green fig/banana [has in] iron, you had things like the cassava meal porridge, arrow root porridge I was raised on, and when you're finished eating the arrow root porridge in the morning, you wouldn't need anything else for the day ...it was whitish, it was looking something like flour."

You say to the young people now that the healthy foods are more important like the papaya, breadfruit, the type of [meat] like the fish and that sort of thing, the okras, the tanya, dasheen...eaten by most of the older people but today the younger ones, they don't want to use those things. They (the younger ones) prefer to use the fast foods which would have a more metropolitan way of life. The drinks of the yesteryears, the vitamin c is important like the ginger beer, lemonade and those type of things. Today, they (the younger ones) prefer to buy a bottle drink like a bottle soda. Nothing is wrong because these businesses are getting sales but we need to stick to the basics."

Grant: 'Inside Gov't Politics After Me In Last Lap Incident'

BASSETERRE, St.Kitts (Friday 11th March 2022)- "My information has led me to the inescapable conclusion that elements within the same government in which I serve are hard at work to not only orchestrate charges against me but perhaps to achieve some narrow political gain by seeking to wrongfully implicate others."

So said Government Minister and Deputy Leader of the People's Action Movement (PAM) Lindsay Grant say in a pre-recorded speech on Saturday 5th March 2022, two days before he was charged by police in relation to the Las Lap Bar in Bird Rock in January 2022.

"I believe I have waited long enough. I am therefore calling on the authorities either to charge me and allow me to have my day in court or to exonerate me," he said in a video posted on his official social media page via Facebook.

According to Grant: "I am aware also that considerable political pressure is being exerted on the authorities to charge me with some offence. I am equally aware that the name of my party leader the Honourable Shawn Richards was included in police reports on the incident even though the honourable gentleman had nothing to do with the matter and was not even present when it occurred."

Grant added: "I assure you that this push for formal charges against me just as the unfortunate naming of my party leader in police reports of this incident when he was not even present at the time has little to do with the law and has everything to do with the unfortunate politics of our time."

I am well aware of the political climate in which we find ourselves today and I'm also mindful of the malevolent efforts of a misguided few who for personal power and self aggrandisement continue to destroy the fabric of unity that we all have fought so hard to weave." Grant expressed confidence that he did not breach the law and that he respects the rule of law.

"I wish to make it clear that I am confident that I have committed no breach of the law, and I and my many witnesses stand ready and willing to defend myself if and when any formal charges are levelled against me. But I have been waiting for two months to allow the legal process to take its course and to date I am not aware of what is happening. However, throughout this period I have said nothing publicly on this matter.

"I have the utmost respect for the rule of law, for the maintenance of law and order, and also for the men and women in uniform who protect us every day. Our police and security forces have always had and will continue to have my fullest support. However, I accept that the exchange with the police officers during the incident was unfortunate. I also accept that I am to be held and quite properly so to a higher standard of behaviour than others due to my position. I accept that my constituents and the people of my beloved country expect only the best behaviour privately and publicly from their elected representatives."

"While I have waited for two long months, and while I am ready, willing and able to defend myself, I believe that the incident should never had happened and for that I apologise publicly and unreservedly," Grant stated.

Astaphan On Political Climate: ‘Country Cannot Be Best Served Like This’

BASSETERRE, St.Kitts (Friday 11th March 2022)-Well-known social and political commentator Dwyer Astaphan is of the view that St.Kitts-Nevis cannot be best served under the Team Unity government country in the current political atmosphere due to the “bad blood” happenings in the coalition that is neither a team nor united.

He made the observation in his latest commentary-dated 9th March 2022.

“Team Unity, a term I use very loosely because they’re neither a team nor are they united, are preparing themselves for an election but they have a problem, they don’t trust each other, they don’t love each other, they do not respect each other, they’re not a team- as I said...”

According to him: “The bad blood is at a boiling point; a point of no return as we see PAM and PLP preparing for the possibility of running candidates, each

of them, in all eight constituencies, and even if they do not do that, the cat is already out of the bag. The people of the country already know that there is no team in Team Unity and there is no unity in Team Unity. It’s a motley crew; very body tugging in a different direction at each other’s throats.”

Astaphan expressed that “The country cannot be best served in circumstances like this, and the chances of improving are between slim and zero and in any case there are so many other issues that will guide voters...”

BASSETERRE, St.Kitts (Friday 11th March 2022) -A male teenager has been discovered dead hanging by the neck from a tree.

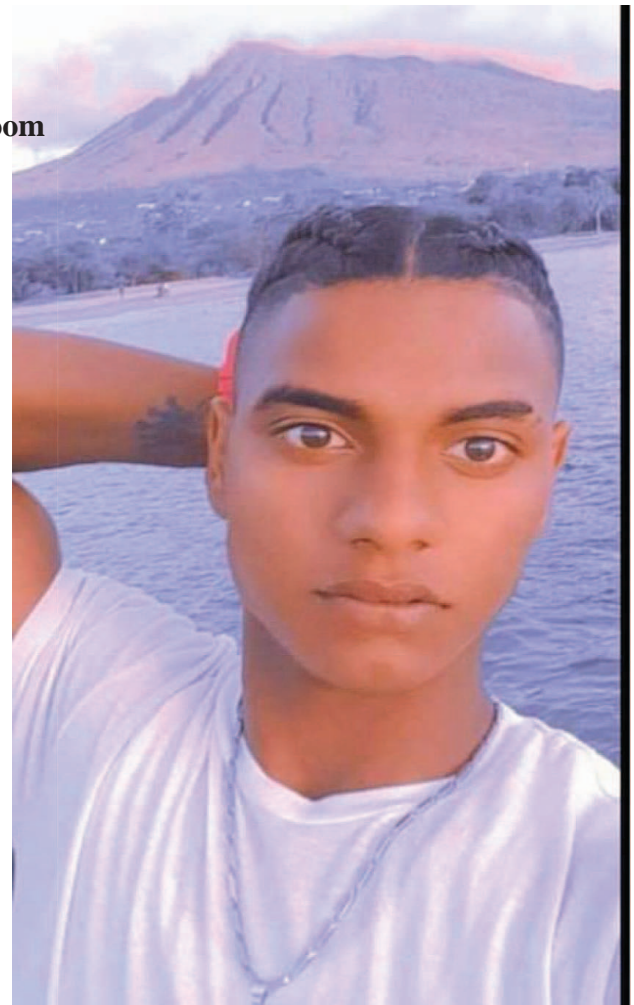
Dead is 19-year-old Nicholas Evans of Brick Kiln in Nevis.

Permit Program ranks 1st overall out of the 26 programs considered. Police: Complaint Said Grant “Beat” Female Officer ...Lawyers Say Accusation “Baseless” According to

BASSETERRE, St.Kitts (Friday 11th March 2022) - Allegation of an altercation made by a woman police officer accusing government minister Lindsay Grant following an incident at Las Lap

Bar in Bird Rock in January 2022 has been filed in a police complaint, about two months later.

A summons to defendant document seen by this media house dated 2nd March 2022 to Grant speaks to a complaint made that “you on Saturday the 08th day of January 2022 at Basseterre in the Parish of St. George in the Magisterial

District “A” in the Federation of St. Christopher and Nevis did beat Kerese Howe a member of the Royal St. Christopher and Nevis Police Force while in the execution of her duty.”

The People’s Action Movement (PAM) party, however, of which Grant is the Deputy Leader, has communicated that lawyers say the charges are “baseless”.

The document does not include the date when the officer’s complaint was made which some members of the public have been questioning.

According to police information, the incident involves three police officers. As understood from videos on the night in question, the officers were on COVID-19 protocol duties.

In one of the cellphone footage videos circulated via social media on 10th January, the woman police officer is heard saying in part: “Ah here by Las Lap and because I am here and we speaking to Mr. Grant, he got all kinda tings goin onâ€the minister of government, I am not playing with him...”

In that 0:45 seconds video, she is seen while talking on her

cellphone call with-according to reliable information reaching this media house- is her superior who is a superintendent.

A PAM press statement from Leader Shawn Richards on Tuesday 7th March indicated: “We have learnt that the police have moved in to charge our colleague and MP Lindsay Grant for the alleged conduct during a much-publicized incident a few weeks ago.”

It was also expressed that the PAM “stands for truth and clarity. Indeed, we are determined to provide Hon Grant with all the legal assistance he may need in the matter.”

Richards is claiming that there have been attempts by some to seek political points in the matter.

“Hon Grant has retained counsel, and his lawyers have expressed confidence in successfully defending the matter. They have described the charges are baseless. Indeed we are aware of a political sub text to the entire issue, and here have been naked attempts by some to seek political points. That is why in many ways, we are glad that the charges have been brought-and we call for a speedy trial so that the real story will be told and some of the real intent exposed through the legal system, which we have extreme confidence in.

In addition, he said: “We support the police in doing their work, but we think that it has been unfortunate that professional officers have been put under so much pressure to escalate a situation, in what is an apparent attempt to embarrass the Member of Parliament, and to undermine people’s faith in members of Team Unity.”

Four Black Women Who Have Advanced Human Rights

Around the world the activism of Black women has been instrumental in shaping social justice agendas and promoting human rights. Their work has improved the health and welfare of women and girls, protected the environment, and elevated the voices of the oppressed, both in their communities and further afield.

As researchers who focus on women and children's wellbeing and rights, we have come across the work of many such Black women. The four introduced here are inspirational - for the changes they brought about, for their work ethic, and for their passion to improve the everyday lives of marginalised or oppressed groups.

Efua Dorkenoo

Ghanaian-British women's rights activist Efua Dorkenoo (1949-2014) was a pioneering leader in the global movement to end female genital cutting.

As reported in The Guardian's obituary of Dorkenoo, it was while working as a staff nurse at London hospitals that she learned of the medical complications faced by women who had undergone the practice.

In 1983, she co-founded the Foundation for Women's Health, Research and Development, a women's rights organisation which works to stop violence against women and girls.

She also became the World Health Organization's first technical expert on female genital cutting.

Marielle Franco

Brazilian human rights activist Marielle Franco (1979-2018) drew on her experiences growing up in Mare, a favela (slum) in Rio de Janeiro, to campaign for the rights of favela residents, many of whom are Black. Much of her activism focused on addressing police violence and military intervention in the favelas.

Franco's campaigns on these issues, as well as her work to improve the lives of poor Black women in the favelas, made her one of the most-voted-for members of Rio city council's 2016 local elections. She was assassinated less than two years later. Her legacy has ensured that four women closely connected to her have also recently been elected to political office.

Wangari Maathai

Professor Wangari Maathai (1940-2011), a Kenyan environmentalist and human rights activist, was the first African woman to win the Nobel Peace Prize in 2004.

From her previous training and practice in veterinary anatomy, she came to recognise the connection between environmental degradation, poverty and conflict.

In particular, through her work she saw the negative

impact of environmental degradation on the lives of women who were the main producers of food in this context.

Recognising that these conditions resulted in more drought, loss of biodiversity and increased poverty, she founded the Green Belt Movement in 1977. The focus of this movement is on poverty reduction and environmental conservation through tree planting. By 2004, the movement had expanded to over 30 countries and has now planted more than 51 million trees in Kenya alone.

Ngozi Okonjo-Iweala

Nigerian economist and politician Ngozi Okonjo-Iweala is the first woman and the first African to be appointed as director-general of the World Trade Organization.

She worked previously as a development economist at the World Bank, where she led several projects that provided support to low-income countries during the global financial crisis of 2007-08 and the world food price crisis of 2008-09.

As two-time finance minister of Nigeria, she worked to reduce corruption.

She has supported young people in Nigeria by launching programmes such as Growing Girls and Women in Nigeria, which has helped women to gain skills and employment. She has written several books and is the co-author of *Women and Leadership: Real Life, Real Lessons*, published in 2020.

There are many more women that are creating change in diverse ways in their communities or beyond, often in the face of great adversity. We encourage you to look around your local community and find more Black women to add to our list.

Kremlin Tells United States To Await Response To 'Economic War'

LONDON, 9 March (Reuters) - The Kremlin accused The United States on Wednesday of declaring an economic war on Russia that was sowing mayhem through energy markets, and put Washington on notice it was considering its response to a ban on Russian oil and energy.

Russia's economy is facing the gravest crisis since the 1991 fall of The Soviet Union after the West imposed heavy sanctions

on almost the entire Russian financial and corporate system following Moscow's invasion of Ukraine.

Kremlin spokesman Dmitry Peskov cast the West's sanctions as a hostile act that had roiled global markets, and he said it was unclear how far turbulence on global energy markets would go.

"You see the bacchanalia, the hostile bacchanalia, which the West has sown - and that of course makes the situation very difficult and forces us to think seriously," Peskov told reporters.

"We see that the situation on energy markets is developing rather turbulently - and we don't know how far that turbulence will go," Peskov said.

He declined to outline the exact nature of Russia's response. President Vladimir Putin, Russia's paramount leader since 1999, will hold a meeting with the government on Thursday to discuss minimising the impact of sanctions, the Kremlin said.

The West's attempt to cut off Russia - one of the world's biggest exporters of oil, gas and metals - has hit commodity markets and raised the spectre of spiralling inflation across the world.

Russian President Vladimir Putin says the "special military operation" is essential to ensure Russian security after The United States enlarged the NATO military alliance to Russia's borders, and supported pro-Western leaders in Kyiv.

Ukraine says it is fighting for its existence, and The United States, and its European and Asian allies have condemned the Russian invasion.

China, the world's second largest economy, has called for restraint but President Xi Jinping has cautioned that sanctions will slow down the world economy.

Asked about the Kremlin's comments, White House deputy national security adviser Daleep Singh said: "This is brutal and needless war of aggression. We've said all along, if the aggression

escalates, so will the costs."

"I wouldn't call it an economic war. This is our way of demonstrating resolve," Singh said.

ENERGY POWER

Russia said on Monday that oil prices could shoot up to over \$300 per barrel if The United States and European Union banned imports of crude from Russia. Brent hit \$139 on Monday, its highest since 2008.

Russia says Europe consumes about 500 million tonnes of oil a year. Russia supplies around 30% of that, or 150 million tonnes, as well as 80 million tonnes of petrochemicals.

Asked about a ban on Russian oil and energy imports announced by US President Joe Biden, Peskov said Russia had been, was and would be a reliable energy supplier.

Moscow would, though, now think very seriously about a response, Peskov said.

"The situation demands a rather deep analysis - those decisions announced by President Biden," Peskov said. "If you are asking me what Russia is going to do - Russia is going to do what is necessary to defend its interests."

"The United States definitely has declared economic war against Russia and is waging this war," he said.

Six Healthy Steps To Preventing Colon Cancer



Colon cancer can be a devastating diagnosis, but there are a number of steps you can take to reduce your risk of tumors, an expert says.

Colorectal cancer is the third-leading cause of cancer in The United States, and The American Cancer Society estimates that 106,180 cases of colon cancer and 44,850 cases of rectal cancer

will be diagnosed in 2022. It's estimated that there will be 52,580 colorectal cancer deaths in the United States this year.

"When people are healthy, they don't think about preventing illness," said Dr Vi Chiu, director of gastrointestinal oncology and molecular precision programs at Cedars-Sinai's The Angeles Clinic and Research Institute in Los Angeles.

"But this old adage is still true: An ounce of prevention is worth a pound of cure. We have the tools to prevent this disease," Chiu added in a Cedars-Sinai news release.

As part of Colorectal Cancer Awareness Month in March, Chiu outlines six ways to reduce your risk of colorectal cancer.

- > Get screened. When detected early, colorectal cancer is highly treatable. Adults at average risk for colorectal cancer should begin screening at age 45, while those with parents, grandparents and siblings who have had

medicalcolorectal cancer should begin screening at age 40, or 10 years before the diagnosis of the youngest first-degree relative. The three main types of screening are colonoscopy, fecal immunochemical test (FIT)-DNA test, and FIT-only test. Colonoscopy "is the gold standard for detecting precancerous growths," Chiu noted. "I strongly recommend it over other screening options."

- > Diet. Research shows that diets rich in fruits, vegetables and whole grains are associated with a lower risk of colon or rectal cancer. Try to eat only small amounts of beef, pork and lamb, and eat fewer processed meats, like hot dogs. Eat whole grains, such as oatmeal, brown rice, popcorn and whole-wheat bread, Chiu advised. Adequate vitamin D intake is also important. A large international study found that people with low levels of vitamin D had a higher risk of getting colorectal cancer.

- > Get active. Exercise could reduce the risk of colorectal cancer because it may reduce inflammation in the body and boost the immune system, according to Chiu.

- > Watch your weight. Being overweight or obese increases the risk of colorectal cancer.

- > Avoid or limit alcohol. "Alcohol can cause intestinal damage. It is a toxin whose byproduct can damage DNA," Chiu said. "The gut may develop inflammation, and the gut immunity is weakened. This can lead to colorectal cancer development." Limit alcohol consumption to no more than one drink per day.

- > Don't smoke. A 2020 study in the British Journal of Cancer found that smokers had a 59% higher risk of colorectal cancer and former smokers had a 19% higher risk, Chiu said. People who stopped smoking more than 20 years ago did not have an increased risk.

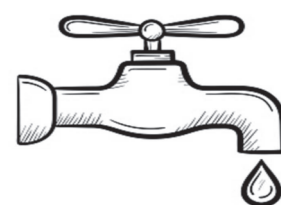

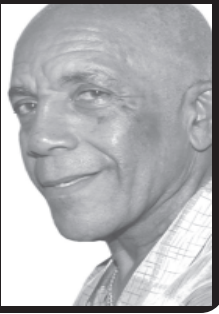

“There is no political party on Planet Earth, which is capable of looking after the interest of the poor and the rich at the same time, for the rich who would be the upkeep of that party and, he who pays the piper, calls the tune. Cockroach has no cause to be at fowl’s party, because it will be gobbled up? It is therefore in the best interest of the poor to form or to join a political party, which will really look after their own welfare. Luke 16: 13 in the KJV version of the Bible declares, “No servant can serve two masters at the same time; either he will love one and hate the other, cling to one and despise the other!!” - Kennedy Earle Clarke

Whenever the topic of the 10th June 1967 is discussed, the PAM supporters always come up with the excuse that there were no convictions, but, how and when could there be convictions if the estate managers, overseers, business men who participated in the attempted coup were the jury on the cases which were brought against the perpetrators? Were these pillars of society going to bring these errand boys who were working on their behalf “GUILTY AS CHARGED” and have them sentenced to prison? There was this young man who was a tailor in East Basseterre whose mother was the dry cleaner of the white people’s clothes. He was on the choir of the Methodist Church.

He had an altercation (war of words, disagreement) with a drunken man who was very disgusting when he had in his oil (rum). The disgustingness of the man was so great that day that the tailor became frustrated and struck him to the back of the head with a piece of board, thus knocking out his left eye? The tailor was arrested, charged, bailed and the case slated for the Grand or Supreme Court. On the day of the trial, the jury consisted of those whose clothes the tailor’s mother dry-cleaned and members of the church choir, who found him “NOT GUILTY,” despite the overwhelming evidence provided against him? No judge has ever condemned the verdict brought by jurors, since that piece of legislation was passed?

If the little, poor, working-class man, who was jumping up with joy when the cases were withdrawn by the Guyanese Prosecutor on the advice of the Government, and who was totally devoid of his history and the struggles waged on his behalf, so that he could now believe that he has arrived socially, could never begin to comprehend (understand) the dire (dreadful, horrible) consequences awaited him, were the attempted coup successful?

In 1971, Michael Oliver Powell spokesman on the P.A.M platform and one of those exonerated (cleared, when the cases were withdrawn in 1967), became President of the St. Kitts Taxi Association, when Kennedy Earle Clarke, who, along with Pedro Douglas formed the same St. Kitts Taxi Drivers Association, Pedro as the President and Kennedy Earle as the Secretary and first

Taxi Representative on the Tourist Board?

Remember that Taxi men were encouraged to say the most horrible things about Mr. Bradshaw, the Labour Party and the country with the result that visitors on returning home would spread the word that St. Kitts is not a good place to visit. After Michael O. Powell became a Taxi Driver, the talk banded (rumoured) around that they did not want any Labour man to lead their Association. This meant that Earle Clarke the Secretary, who stencilled (produced) a booklet and distributed it free of cost, with the sole intention of assisting Taxi Drivers in improving the service they rendered to the visitor, had to go, because he was the only Labour man who was on the executive?

None of us are that blessed to predict what tomorrow holds for us and we are advised to perform good deeds always, so that we will encounter goodness, for the many tomorrows we spend on the planet. In 1972 a USA citizen visited the island and wanted to bring the second largest tourist ship the “Ille de France,” here and he was recommended to me a Taxi Driver. I gave him a Tour of the island, pointing out all the historical sites and he was quite impressed? A few days before the ship was to arrive, another representative arrived to ask if all was well and I gave her a tour also and assured her that all is well.

Two days before the arrival of the boat an emergency meeting was held by the Taxi Association demanding that, if I do not turn over the handling of the tour to the Taxi Association, they would boycott the boat! I went up to Government Headquarters to inform the Minister of Tourism about the boycott and for him to announce on Radio Z.I.Z, that the Second Largest Tourist ship in the world, will be visiting St. Kitts on the 14th November with 1400 passengers and 1400 hundred crew members and he was advising all shops which cater to tourists to be opened on that day. I also went around the island requesting owners of private cars to come and assist me with the passengers, because the Taxi Association planned to boycott the boat?

I was very popular in 1972, having trained the St. Kitts Netball Team for the Caribbean Netball Tournament which was held here in St. Kitts, where the Champion Trinidad team, beat us by 2 points. The Renown Cricket Team of which I was President and Trainer, won its 5th back-to-back (consecutive) championship? Private cars came out in their numbers and each one of them was well rewarded with jobs for their patriotic effort. The Tourists were so completely satisfied with their visit to St. Kitts that, on their return home, they praised up St. Kitts on Television, Radio, Newspaper and by whatever means possible, thus causing other citizens to charter ships to come and visit the island!


Eight years later 1972-1980, P.A.M, formed the Government and Michael Oliver Powell who boycotted my Tourist Ship, was presented with the Portfolio of Minister of Tourism and hired the same man who brought the Ille de France to St. Kitts, to help advertise St. Kitts as Tourist destination? As was to be expected, when the man reached Government Headquarters to meet with the Minister of Tourism, he began asking for me?

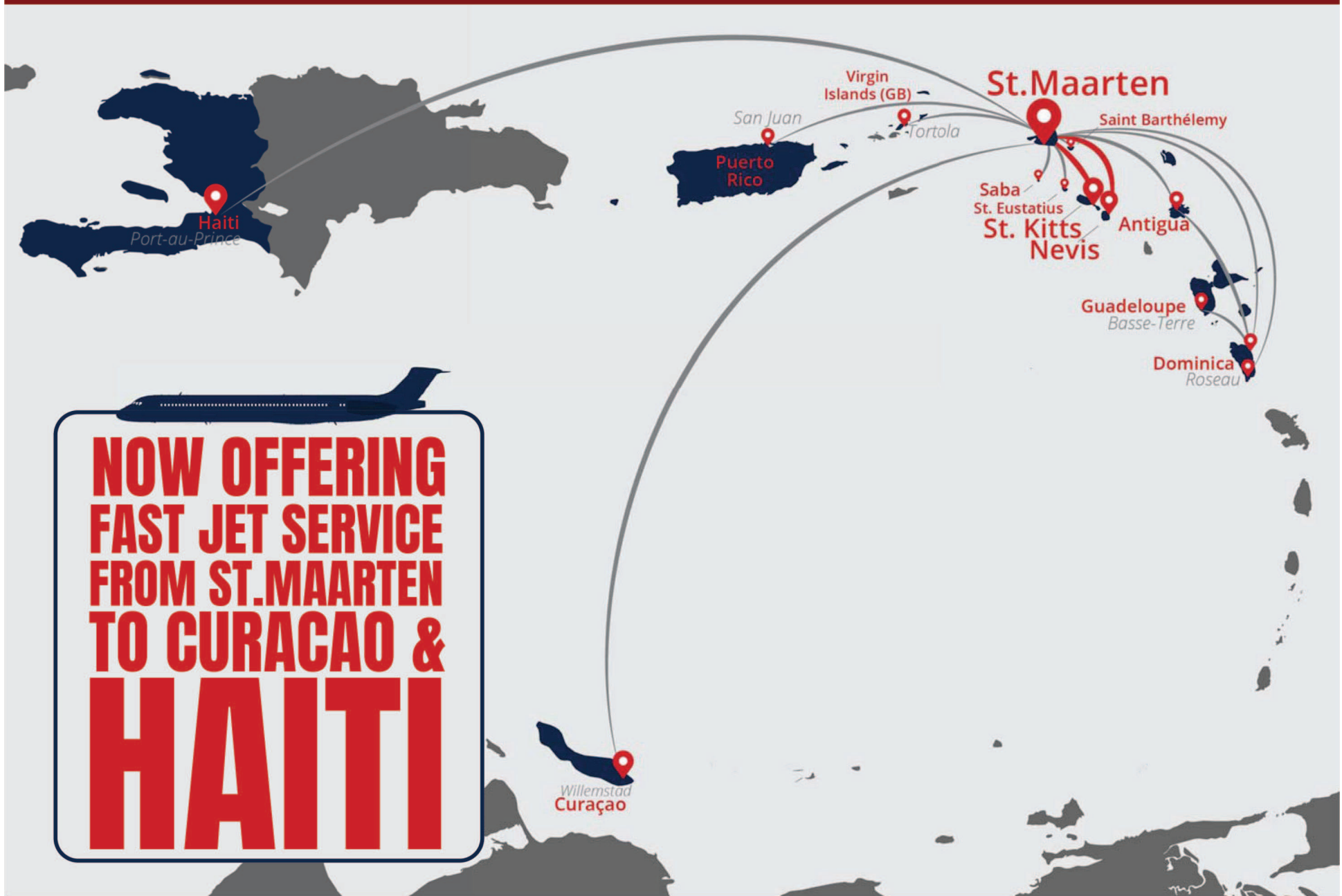
