## Editorial

# Are They Persons Of Substance Or Of Straw?

For some time now one of our major concerns has been that of the ever increasing cost of living in St Kitts and Nevis. As could be easily observed the present government, such as it is, showed little or no interest in the matter, the effects it was (and still is) having on our people, and what it portends for our future and that of our children.

Members of the government have clearly been more interested in themselves, their families, their political hacks, and their friends.

Yesterday morning our beloved comrade Marcella Liburd sent out a very interesting and illuminating post relating to the present state of affairs with the government, for which we are very grateful and thank her.

For example, she made the observation that, given the ongoing quarrelling amongst themselves, it seems as if the cabinet is made up of ministers who are in opposition to each other. Clearly, nothing good or productive could ever be achieved from such an anomalous grouping.

# SKNLP Leader Says Team Unity Has Failed

**BASSETERRE, St.Kitts (Wednesday 16th March 2022)**-Newly-elected Leader of the St.Kitts-Nevis Labour Party (SKNLP) Dr. Terrance Drew is of the view that the Team Unity government has failed.

“They (Team Unity) have failed the people significantly and so we are saying Labour offers the best option for our people.”

Dr. Drew was at the time speaking on the ‘Issues’ programme aired live on FreedomFM on Wednesday 16th March 2022 while addressing controversial remarks from two leaders of Team Unity namely Deputy Prime Minister Shawn Richards of the People’s Action Movement (PAM) and Premier Mark Brantley of the Concerned Citizens Movement (CCM) made about Team Unity Leader Prime Minister Dr. Timothy Harris of the People’s Labour Party (PLP) during the PAM convention held on Sunday 13th March in Cayon.

“I want to bring this to the fore because when Labour was talking about this people thought it was just politics until what happened on Sunday. When we said there was no fair share in Unity, there’s no equity in Unity, I think Sunday really brought those things to light. When we said there was rampant nepotism, imagine people in Unity speaking about nepotism, when we said there was corruption, imagine people in Unity speaking about corruption, when we say that people really don’t care about the people of St.Kitts and Nevis but themselves, we hear that on the stage by a major party in the Unity concoction. So this concoction they have failed.”

“What is Team Unity? I think that people are lost at this time, and we know they were a unit that came from different parties with the objective really to defeat the St.Kitts-Nevis Labour Party,” Dr. Drew expressed.

He went on to say that fast forward to seven years after Team Unity would have won the government in 2015 “and we are now hearing from that camp that there is no unity in Unity, and one of the hallmarks of the campaign pledges was fair share for all.”

According to Dr. Drew: “From its very inception, the St.Kitts-Nevis Labour Party has been saying that the Team Unity construct was a marriage of convenience, three parties coming together to take down Labour. And back in 2015, the three fractions knew that they would never be able to win on their own. They lacked the competence and the plans to capture the imagination of the people of St.Kitts and Nevis and so they came together as a marriage of convenience.

He continued: “In stepped the leader of Team Unity then who was senior minister of the St. Kitts-Nevis Labour Party administration set on a course to destroy the St.Kitts-Nevis Labour Party and to destroy the legacy of Dr. Denzil Douglas and to destroy the political career of Dr. Denzil Douglas. It was a plan that he had orchestrated to destroy our organisation but our organisation was led by a competent leader; a leader who held the organisation together despite the very undermining activities of the leader now and we survived.”

“We told the country that Unity was a marriage of inconvenience, that the leader of Unity was really not about the progress of St.Kitts and Nevis but it was really a self-centered activity. Many people suffered as a result. We saw rampant victimization against firstly people of Labour, comrades who had fought for the leader to be where he is were first to be hit.”

The SKNLP Leader mentioned names of women, stalwart families and others saying that “These persons suffered tremendously, families were hit hard by policies of victimization led by Team Unity.”

Dr. Drew also shared a principle of his at it relates to PM Harris and the SKNLP.

“I am not in politics other than to serve people. That I said during the internal campaign and I would say it again. I Dr. Terrance Drew, elected Leader of Labour cannot see Timothy Harris coming back into Labour. I cannot do that, and I want to make that clear: I don’t want there to be any blurry line or any petty politicking around that. I want persons to understand clearly that when I said it, it was not for any mileage within the party but it is because as a matter of principle I really believe that will not work.”

The SKNLP Leader, in further talking about the Team Unity, made claims about the corruption in the government.

“They went on and the government was formed and we saw corruption like we had never seen it before. As a matter of fact when you listen at what took place everybody is now trying to see who of them practice the most corruption.”

“Let’s look at it this way, the biggest scandal we would have had right after the 2015 elections was the stem cell. I have to remind the people of this Unity that is being spoken about that it has now come full circle and the information is clear for all of us to see. The stem cell scandal which took place at JNF where the private wing of the JNF hospital was used for an immoral illegal type of medical activity that was against the international norms and that was outlawed as matter of fact by institutions like the World Health Organization, the United States FDA, the European agency for the same functions as the FDA in the United States,” he stated.

Dr. Drew pointed to “scandal after sandal” under the Team Unity government.

“These things hadn’t really happened before like this in government in St.Kitts and Nevis and the people overlooked all of these things, and we are not upset with the people because there comes a time when the information is so glaring that the people of St.Kitts and Nevis are saying enough is enough.”

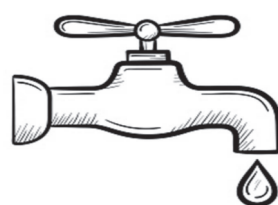

# The MeToo Movement Hits the Caribbean

The MeToo Movement has brought fresh attention to an old problem that plagued the workplace worldwide. Although it began in the United States, it has global reach. But it is hard to imagine that this movement would hit the Caribbean in a dramatic way when on January 17, 2022 a group of workers in St. Kitts and Nevis decided to march in protest of sexual harassment and other offences which focused on workers' rights.

The Journal of International Women's Studies defines Sexual Harassment to occur "when unwelcome sexual advances, requests for sexual favours, and other verbal or physical conduct of a sexual nature create an offensive and unpleasant working environment."

This was the environment in which workers from Parks and Beaches, a Kittitian workgroup, endured along with other workplace challenges. Park and Beaches protesters were ordinary people who were self-organized and self-motivated to march in solidarity with their co-workers who experienced sexual harassment at the hands of their supervisor.

They had had enough of the abuses and expressed their plight in colourful, yet serious tones. Dr. Janeille Matthews, Harvard scholar, argues that:

[M]ore than any other work place abuse, sexual harassment has resonated with the Caribbean public. As such, in places where workers are not protected from misconduct or discrimination, generally, sexual harassment has been the impetus for such protection.

For Parks and Beaches, their general complaints together with their sexual harassment complaints were heard and addressed.

The Parks and Beaches' boldness in drawing attention to sexual harassment was different. Never before in the history of St. Kitts and Nevis had a sexual harassment protest been mounted. This is an area not widely discussed publicly in Caribbean countries. In fact, legislation is sparse and so is the number of sexual harassment cases.

No known sexual harassment case has reached the courts in St. Kitts and Nevis, and if it did, it would have to be addressed along the lines of employment requirements. Generally, these legislations have no provisions in place for individuals who are at risk of sexual harassment. It is under conditions like these that sexual harassment thrive. Although some men experience sexual harassment, women are particularly vulnerable to these risks and many suffer, often in silence, often alone, and often away from



the eyes of the law.

Commonwealth Caribbean countries are dualist states with responsibility to domestic and international laws. Independent Caribbean countries have ratified international treaties which require States to protect women's rights and to create laws aimed at eliminating discrimination against women. Two such treaties are the Inter-American Convention on the Prevention, Punishment and Eradication of Violence Against Women "Convention of Belem do Para", and the United Nations Convention on the Elimination of All Forms of Discrimination against Women (CEDAW).

An estimated 35% of women worldwide experienced some form of sexual harassment. UN Women contends that sexual harassment is a form of discrimination based on sexual orientation and gender identity and that it affects both men and women.

To reduce the number of gender-based violations, some Commonwealth Caribbean States have enacted laws specifically to address sexual harassment. In Guyana and Trinidad and Tobago, sexual harassment is treated under anti-discrimination laws. Even more commendable, Belize, Barbados, and most recently Jamaica, have passed sexual discrimination legislation.

The dual responsibility of these States is met, in a sense, on paper. But in reality, the abuses continue unabated. In an interview with Ambassador Rosalyn Hazelle, former Director of Gender Affairs of St. Kitts and Nevis and former Expert and Rapporteur of CEDAW, she posited that while the Caribbean is not lacking in legislation, it lacks implementation strategies that are impactful.

Laws protect vulnerable citizens from sexual harassment abuses. But the protection must extend to workplaces beyond offices to include street vendors, waitresses, and even other vulnerable groups who could be harassed just by walking passed a "liming" spot. However, governments can begin now to strengthen legal institutions with the aim of addressing the needs of victims. It is nigh time for Caribbean governments to implement safeguards grounded in domestic and international laws to protect victims of sexual harassment and where possible prevent them. But Governments and legal institutions must first ensure that the mechanisms are in place; then ensure that they actually work.

The MeToo Movement has brought to the Caribbean, and specifically to St. Kitts and Nevis, the idea that women can boldly stand up against sexual harassment while feeling a shared connectedness with another person, somewhere, who had similarly been empowered to do so. Yet governments have a duty to protect them, still.

## Autopsy: [REDACTED] Teen Killed Himself

**BASSETERRE, St.Kitts (Monday 14th March 2022)**- An autopsy performed on the body of 19-year-old Nicholas Evans of Brick Kiln by Resident Pathologist, Dr. Adrian Nunez has stated no foul play is suspected.

"Dr. Nunez concluded that death was due to Visceral Congestion (Suicide)," was communicated via a police press release issued on Friday 11th March, one day after the autopsy was done (10th March).

Police say Evans was found hanging by the neck from a rope that was tied to a tree in the Brick Kiln Village area in Nevis on 8th March.

The District Medical Officer was summoned to the scene and pronounced him dead.

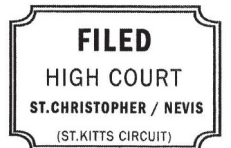

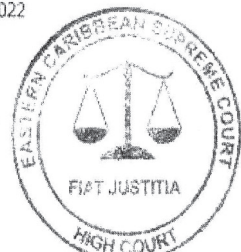

Notably, some people are of the view that Dr. Harris’ comments come as a response to remarks made by Premier Mark Brantley of the Concerned Citizens Movement (CCM) and Deputy Prime Minister of the People’s Action Movement (PAM) at PAM’s Convention held three days before on Sunday 13th March which has caused wide spread public debate about internal conflict levelled against Dr. Harris within the Team Unity government.

# Brantley, Shawn Publicly Say No To Third-Term Support For PM Harris

**BASSETERRE, St.Kitts (Wednesday 16th March 2022)**- Deputy Prime Minister Shawn Richards of the People's Action Movement Premier Mark Brantley of the Concerned Citizens Movement (CCM) have publicly indicated that they will not support Dr. Timothy Harris of the People's Labour Party (PLP) for a third-term as prime minister within of the three-party coalition government.

Speaking at PAM's convention held on Sunday 13th March 2022 at St. Mary's Park in Cayon, under the theme 'Keeping The Promise', Brantley who was the said following the last election, Dr. Harris was elevated for prime ministership "for a second and final term."

Seated at the front of the audience were PM Harris, PLP Deputy Leader Akilah Byron-Nisbett, her husband (and nephew of PM Harris) Alexis Nisbett and also Attorney General Vincent Byron (of PAM).

According to him (Brantley) "PAM and CCM could have formed a government without PLP"

Brantley pointed to the team Unity's "fundamental promise that no leader would serve more than two terms as prime minister. We all agreed that Team Unity will be led by Dr. Timothy Sylvester Harris...In those days it was one for all and all for one..."

"I want you to note that two terms was not guaranteed to any leader but it was agreed that no leader will serve more than two terms. Term limits was a critical part of the architecture and the new governance paradigm introduced by Team Unity," he also stated.

Brantley has described PAM as the "rock upon which Team Unity now stands."

Richards, during his remarks following Brantley's speech, expressed: "and not no third timothy cause I ain't see no third Timothy in de Bible! Not no third Timothy cause I ain't see no third Timothy in de Bible!"

Meanwhile, PM Harris when quizzed at PLP's press conference held on Wednesday 16th March about third term running The question about pushing for

third term had this to say: "I don't even know why this is even part of the conversation. We have just come out of an election. we are still working our way through the pandemic and every person involved in decision making ought to be focused on one thing at this point in time, the future of our people; keeping them safe, keeping them strong, putting the country back to work again so that our farmers can earn more, our fisher folks can live and feed their family."

He continued: "That is what our intention should be on... Elections are not due until 2025. I don't even know what will happen tomorrow or even tonight and we are focused on a political agenda when the focus really should be on the people, and my view on that had been made abundantly clear time and time again... and I've never said anything contrary to what statements have been made publicly so there is no need about a conversation for a third term. I have never spoken on a third term. There is no record anywhere about Timothy Harris speaking on a third term."



# MoENT Minister: Creative Arts Deserve More Attention

**BASSETERRE, St.Kitts (Thursday 17th March 2022)**-Minister responsible for the Ministry of Entrepreneurship, Entertainment & Talent Development (MoENT) Akilah Byron-Nisbett has expressed that the more creative arts are put into focus then creatives will thrive and reap benefits from their works.

She made the disclosure on Friday 11th March 2022, during the ministry's opening announcement press conference for its first project for 2022 dubbed 'Month of The Arts' -with focus on visual and literary arts- held at the Innovation Hub at the National ICT Center located at the C.A Paul Southwell Industrial Site.

"The ministry believes that the more we bring creative arts into focus, the more we show the possibilities, the more we will be able to create an environment that allows our creatives to thrive and reap benefits from their creative works. That is the aim of this Month of the Arts. This year as we said, the focus is visual and literary arts but next year it can any two... it could be music, dance or theater but whatever we choose of course, we would make sure we inform and we incorporate the persons who work in those different sectors so that they, too, can be part of what we are trying to create."

She explained that: "The idea behind the 'Month of The Arts' is to shine a spotlight on various areas of the creative industry. We at MoENT understand that it would not be feasible to highlight every arm of the creative industry in March and so it is our aim to focus on two areas within the industry each year."

Additionally, the MoENT Minister, said areas would be highlighted through a variety of mediums such as competitions, workshops, seminars, festivals.

"This year in particular, we decided to start things off by focusing on visual and literary arts; areas that we are all very much aware of but for which we believe not much emphasis have been placed. We all the work of artistes such as Vaughn Anslyn, Sasha The Artist and the list can go on and on and on, and we would have noted last year in particular that we would have seen an uptake in the number of persons who would have published various books or literary works."

She referred to Keimon Archibald- Lake who has published her first in a series of children's book 'Ma Lu's Visit' and Jihan Williams also published her first book 'Lifting The Weight Of Miscarriage'.

"So we believe that with these two areas [visual and literary arts], we need to be able to give them the due attention that they deserve and so they are the two areas that we would be highlighting this year," Byron-Nisbett added.

Byron-Nisbett said outside of the Month of the Arts, the Ministry continues to work on other projects and programmes that will be rolling out during the course of this year, quite a bit of programmes are geared mainly towards training and networking. We believe that if the industry is successful then we must ensure that our creatives are well equipped with all of the tool necessary to be successful and

to thrive."

MoENT Permanent Secretary Cheryleann Pemberton, in providing background information, highlighted: "We have a number of projects in the pipeline and we have decided to commence with the 'Month of the Arts'. This is to bring into sharp focus our very talented entrepreneurs in the Federation of St.Kitts and Nevis within the area of literary and performing arts. The Ministry was established a little over a year with the mandate to transform the entertainment, creative and innovative industry to St. Kitts and Nevis. Our aim is to provide that enabling environment for entrepreneurs to flourish, to be exposed and to monetize their talents."

She said four sectors have been carved out within the creative space referred to as the orange economy.

These sectors, Permberon informed, are film and photography, music and entertainment, technology and innovation and literary and performing arts.

Included on the MoENT Month of the Arts Calendar are: Spoken Word Extravaganza on 21st March, Music & A Message World Theatre Day on 27th March as well as School creativity campaign, story book and poetry book competitions 14th March to 14th April.



# NRP meets with Electoral Commission regarding irregularities ongoing at electoral office on Nevis

CHARLESTOWN, NEVIS, March 14, 2022 (Nevis Reformation Party)



- Leader of the Nevis Reformation Party (NRP) Dr. Janice Daniel-Hodge is sending a clear and concise message that the NRP will not sit back and allow the electoral process to be meddled with and has engaged the Electoral Commission regarding ongoing irregularities in the electoral process on Nevis.

In a discussion held with the Electoral Commission of St. Kitts and Nevis on March 12, 2022, Dr. Daniel-Hodge, accompanied by members of the NRP, called upon the commission to act expeditiously and investigate the operations of the Electoral Office on Nevis.

The erosion of confidence in the process and electoral officials, denied access to photo voters' lists, denial of access to records and forms contrary to law, the cleaning up and regularizing of the lists of registered voters that are seriously compromised, use of new electoral ballot boxes, and compilation of voters' list for elections, among other things, are among the many issues of concern to the NRP.

The Electoral Commission, at the end of the meeting, acknowledged the concerns raised and agreed to provide a response to the NRP within 14 days.

The Nevis Reformation Party will continue to agitate for free and fair elections, and a transparent electoral process. The NRP looks forward to receiving the Electoral Commission's response to the issues raised.

# Big Pharma vs Little Cuba - Why Cubans Trust Vaccines And How They're Helping Vaccinate The World

*Cuba is acting on the scientific fact that humanity will be safest when all who can be vaccinated are vaccinated. It is following the science and earning its trusted reputation.*

Vaccines could be saving the world from COVID-19, but they aren't. Almost everywhere, vaccine access or vaccine hesitancy are our Achilles heels. Vaccine access correlates to GDP, and higher income countries can strike deals with pharmaceutical companies. Vaccination programs also deploy less of these countries' health-care budgets - 0.8 per cent versus 56.6 per cent for lower-income countries.

By developing and administering its own vaccines, Cuba has ensured affordable coverage (0.84 per cent of health-care costs), despite the United States embargo blocking medical supplies, including during the pandemic.

That same blockade is impeding vaccine export from Cuba and has risked thwarting vaccine import to the island. Despite these challenges, Cuba is now one of the most vaccinated countries in the world.

## Cuba's public health

Vaccine hesitancy is rare in Cuba. Its COVID-19 policies and practices are fundamentally science-based. The Cuban government is garnering public support by protecting its citizens from grave illness and death; one of governments' primary mandates.

This small nation blocked an Omicron spike through its vaccinations and social hygiene measures. Not-for-profit and universal, Cuba's public health incorporates standardized, robust immunization schedules that have been the norm for decades. Many medicines and vaccines in the country are created by publicly funded national labs.

Factual, positive analysis on Cuba typically draws fire internationally, with critics objecting that its government controls information.

## Why Cubans trust vaccines

In December 2021 and January 2022, I asked open-ended questions directly to 40 Cuban residents - acquaintances, colleagues and friends from my more than 20 years studying Cuban culture and, since 2020, Cuba's COVID-19 response.

In January and February, I collected 40 anonymous responses via a VoIP survey with the assistance of my colleague Alejandro Mestre. While not statistically representative, this study is indicative. Every respondent - even government naysayers - wanted to be vaccinated.

As she rubbed the veins of her inner forearm, an office worker joked: "Yes, everyone has confidence in the vaccines. You know, sometimes I think, because the Cuban doctors know us, the vaccines have a component of us in them."

This widespread, popular confidence is based on lived experience.

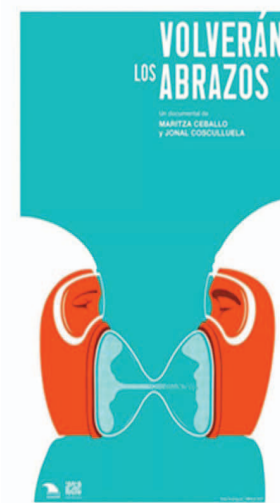
Since the 1960s Cubans have followed a robust vaccine scheme from childhood onward, with the subsequent experience of protection from contagious disease. In one respondent's words, "I am not sure of the effectiveness of this vaccine, nevertheless, I know that in my country we have been making globally recognized vaccines for many years."

Residents often compare Cuba with other countries. Many have travelled abroad, including those in the Henry Reeve Brigade - a group of Cuban medical professionals, deployed worldwide during major health crises with the mission of international medical solidarity - and confronted deadly outbreaks like COVID-19. Many also have loved ones abroad and see the difference between the low contagion rates in their country versus the higher rates in countries without widespread vaccination.

Inhabitants of this tropical, middle-income island have personal experiences with infectious diseases, including meningitis (Cuba developed a vaccine) and dengue (Cuba developed public health measures and

a medication, interferon alpha-2b).

## Why Cubans trust vaccines: Clear messaging

Messaging about the benefits of vaccination, and other public health practices, for individual and societal good is clear and constant in Cuba.

It includes news briefings from the national director of epidemiology, Dr Francisco Duran, infomercials, popular songs and billboards and human-focused documentaries about doctors in COVID-19 wards like *Volverán los abrazos* (hugs will return), and on the scientists developing vaccines, like *Soberanía* (which means sovereignty). Further, the respondents of my inquiry believe that Cubans don't pay much attention to fake news about vaccines that arrives from abroad via social media.

Although not mandated, vaccination is the norm. Primary care providers must obtain an informed consent waiver from patients who decline inoculation and there is peer pressure.

One interviewee wrote, "In the situation in which this pandemic has placed the world, there is no space not to get vaccinated. It is very egotistical." Another added, "The liberty of every person must not curtail the liberty of others."

Most Cubans trust in the expertise of their densely woven and interconnected web of health services. "In Cuba, one might die from lack of specialized machines or medicine, but not from lack of specialized, human care," said one respondent.

Even Cubans who are skeptical of their government in other areas stated that the only reason for Cuban medical experts to do their work is to save lives. In contrast, many talked about how financial interests play into health care in other countries, making it potentially less trustworthy.

## Cuba's vaccine rollout

In Cuba, the immunization campaign continues. Cuba began vaccinating children two years and older in September 2021, well before most other - and much richer - countries. It's now running Phase 2 clinical trials with children under age two.

Cuba is not putting its children at risk; it's using time-tested research - vaccine platforms used previously for other vaccines - to ensure everyone gets vaccinated as quickly and as safely as possible.

And, while subunit vaccines are considered slow to create and the US embargo slowed development and rollout, Cuba beat other protein subunit vaccines to the finish line.

Developers of US-based Corbevax scrambled for investors to enable research and development, while

Cuban national labs simply pivoted to meet the need.

Subunit vaccines have incredible promise as workhorses. Although harder to tweak than mRNA, they are cheaper, less finicky and have much longer track records, the latter of which is particularly relevant for vaccinating children.

While Cubans trust their health experts, the international pharmaceutical industry's track record - recently with their role in the opioid crisis - is fuelling popular skepticism towards vaccines, also among minority groups.

The idea that market-driven innovation facilitated mRNA technology is misleading. Hungarian-American biochemist Katalin Kariko, whose research enabled mRNA vaccines and who is a contender for a Nobel Prize, struggled for funding, as have other innovators.

Cuba continues working to stop the pandemic, exporting vaccines and transferring production technology to countries including Argentina, Bolivia, Iran, Mexico, Nicaragua, Syria, Venezuela and

Vietnam. It's acting on the scientific fact that humanity will be safest when all who can be vaccinated are vaccinated.

Cuba is following the science and earning its trusted reputation.

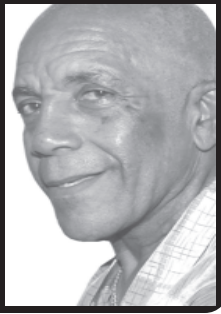

The draft for the men's Hundred and announcement of new women's signings has been pushed back a week to avoid clashing with Shane Warne's state funeral.

The new date will be 5 April as Warne's funeral will take place on 30 March, when the draft was initially scheduled.

Warne was head coach of London Spirit's men's side for the inaugural competition last season.

The former Australian bowler died in Thailand, aged 52, on 4 March.

"Shane was a much loved part of The Hundred and played an important role in launching the competition as head coach of London Spirit's men's team," a statement read.

"He will be hugely missed by everyone involved in the competition."

The second season of the 100-ball tournament begins on 3 August with defending men's champions Southern Brave hosting Welsh Fire.

Warne's former side Spirit will get the first pick in the men's draft after finishing bottom in 2021.

# Rod Marsh: Dennis Lillee leads tributes at former Australia wicketkeeper's funeral

Dennis Lillee said he would "miss my mate" as he led tributes to Rod Marsh at the former Australia wicketkeeper's funeral on Thursday.

Marsh died aged 74 after suffering a heart attack earlier in March.

The dismissal 'caught Marsh, bowled Lillee' occurred 95 times in Test cricket - a record partnership between a wicketkeeper and fast bowler.

"His cricket ability has been very well documented - it's the person Rod Marsh that I loved," Lillee said.

More than 800 people attended Marsh's funeral at the Adelaide Oval.

Marsh effected 355 dismissals - a world record at the time of his retirement - in 96 Test appearances for Australia from 1970 to 1984.

He and Lillee retired simultaneously in 1984 along with former captain Greg Chappell.

"It's taken me days to be able to write my thoughts down on this amazing bloke," Lillee said.

"People often ask me if I missed playing - my answer was no, I don't, but I do miss my team-mates of 14, 15 years.

"Gradually our friendship blossomed. I miss my mate and will keep remembering the good times. He was a one-off."

A recorded message from former Australia wicketkeeper Adam Gilchrist - who previously described Marsh as his "idol and hero" - was played to mourners.

Former team-mates John Inverarity and Bruce Laird also spoke.

Relays.

Dlodlo, who ran the first leg of the 4x100m final at the event in Poland last May, tested positive for testosterone at the South African championships in Pretoria a few weeks before the team's success in Chorzow.

The 23-year-old has been suspended for a two and a half years by the South Africa Doping Institute for Drug-Free Sport (Saids).

A spokesperson for Simbine, who finished fourth in the 100m at the 2020 Olympics in Tokyo, said he was devastated but that he would not be giving any further comment at this time.

It means Italy would be promoted to become men's 4x100m World Athletics Relays gold medallists, with Japan set

to get silver medals and Denmark moving up to bronze.

World Athletics has yet to comment on Dlodlo's case and disqualify the South African team.

Dlodlo's ban, which runs until 28 December 2023, was reduced from four years after he admitted the offence.

The sprinter missed out on competing at the Olympics last year after being informed of his positive test on 29 June and being provisionally suspended.

The sanctions will not affect South Africa's continental record for the 4x100m relay that the team, which included Dlodlo, set at the 2019 World Athletics Championships in Qatar.
