Dr. Drew Talks Better Conditions For Workers Under SKNLP Gov't

BASSETERRE, St.Kitts (Tuesday 3rd May 2022)- On the occasion of International Workers' Day (Labour Day/May Day), Leader of the St.Kitts-Nevis Labour Party (SKNLP) Dr. Terrance Drew has given his party's commitment to improve the quality of life of workers under an SKNLP government.

"The SKNLP-led government will put in place policies, programmes and services focused on the needs of people. We will do so using the [collaborative] approach and the reason is we want to [collaborate] is that we want everybody to come together to determine the direction of our country. That means workers, workers' representatives, employers and government will sit all at the same table to decide the direction of our country."

Such sentiments were delivered during his speech on Monday 2nd May 2022 at the Patsy Allers Play Field in St. Johnston's Village following the SKNLP-organised march whereby scores of workers, SKNLP party supporters, members of the sister organization the St.Kitts-Nevis Trades and Labour Union (of which the party historically emerged) as well as others passionate towards the cause and right of workers gathered. Many individuals were dressed in red-the affiliated colour of the labour movement.

Following a two-year pause due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the labour movement picked up its traditional ways of commemorate Labour Day also known as International Workers' Day or May Day.

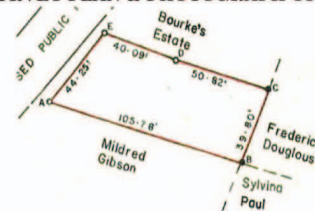

Slader and Eva Henderson also attended in lending support towards the championing of workers' right here in St.Kitts-Nevis.

According to Dr. Drew: "The struggle for justice of all workers continues. The struggle starts in very wombs of our own mothers, and I see my own mother here today. It continues with each delivery of each newborn; loving care from birth to maturity...finding fair work and earning wages and retiring in dignity and relative comfort, we believe that the struggle means we have to do these things so it is a struggle."

Dr. Drew highlighted that annual wreath laying ceremony that was held the day before visiting the gravesite of

fallen stalwarts of the labour movement which saw SKNLP and SKNT&LU paying their respect.

"Therefore as it is tradition, we gathered yesterday at the gravesides of those who went before us to pay respect and homage to them and declare before the world that we would never forget our ancestors because what they have left, we are obliged to improve and advance, and I say let us always pause to remember ancestors and our elders; they who shed blood, sweat and tears. They shed it yesterday so that we may have a better life today and a better tomorrow."

That day's SKNT&LU representatives included Mitchel Slader, George Dixon and Nadine Natta.

Dr. Drew continued: "I want you to hear clearly that they shed their blood for example at the Buckley's Uprising so that today we can live as free men and women here in St. Kitts and Nevis irrespective of our political, religious or any other type of association, and so we owe them a great debt of gratitude which we must repay by keeping the faith, by standing up for workers' rights every day not some days but standing up for workers' rights everyday... marching on Labour Day among other duties of our beloved movement, and so we're charged to continue the tradition. The SKNLP is proud to be associated with our sister organization the [St. Kitts-Nevis] Trades and Labour Union. We salute you for supporting the activities and the march."

In speaking to workers who participated in the march, he commented: "The reason why you marched today was for better; not just for yourselves, not just for your family, not just for your community but for your country as a whole because we really believe in the principles of 'Country above Self' and so we always think about those who also exist in this society."

"Labour Day is for all the workers of St. Kitts and Nevis but the message that we send is [that] the Labour Party, the Labour movement and we are bastion to guard and make sure Labour Day and workers' rights are defended and protected here in St. Kitts and Nevis...." the SKNLP Leader said.

PM Harris Appears To Respond To Cabinet Colleagues Following 10 Days of Mourning About “Fighting For Position”

BASSETERRE, St.Kitts (Tuesday 3rd May 2022)- Prime Minister and Leader of the People’s Labour Party (PLP) Dr. Timothy Harris appears to have given a response to his estranged colleagues who presently do not support him as head of the Team Unity Government and are trying to have him replaced by Deputy Prime Minister Shawn Richards of the People’s Action Movement (PAM).

At a PLP Labour Day concert event organized event held on the night of Monday 2nd May 2022 at the Douglas Play Field in St. Peter’s-without calling any names or speaking directly about the situation, PM Harris gave some comments which are believed to be replying to the six cabinet ministers of PAM and the Concerned Citizens Movement (CCM) who recently filed a motion.

In talking about highlights of Labour Day speech made earlier that day, he said “...we understand the challenges of the people! Certain people are fighting for position; I am fighting for you! Some people want a big man’s job but they are children! So I say on behalf of the People’s Labour Party, we are the only party that can welcome all of you. That is why tonight so many of you are here! Whether you’re PAM or Labour, CCM or NRP, the People’s Labour Party is the party for you!”

Meanwhile PLP Deputy Leader and Parliamentary Representative for Constituency Three (West Basseterre) Akilah Byron-Nisbett claimed that PLP is the only party that has been delivering for the people and will continue to do so.

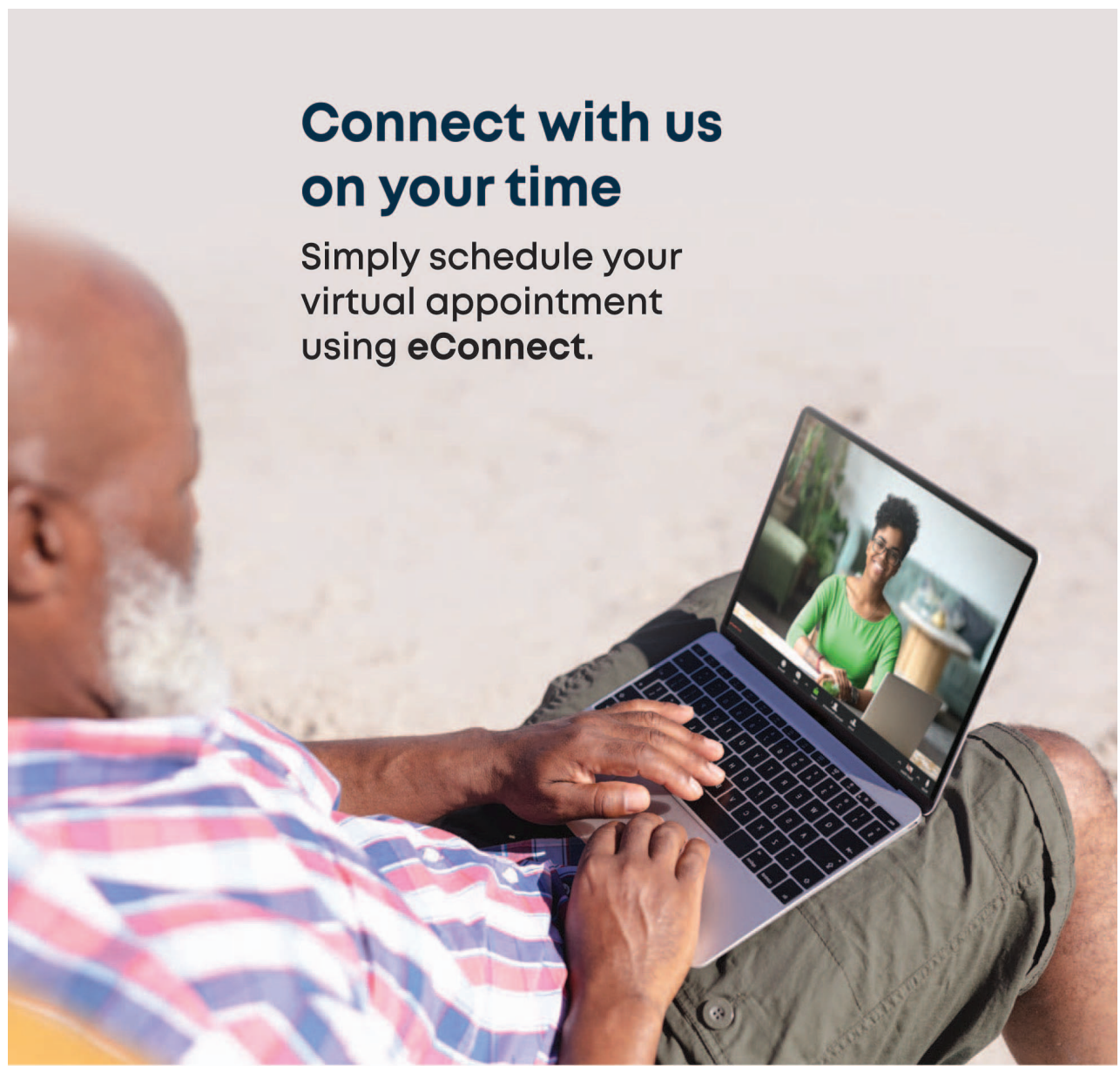
“This is our time! The time is now! The time is here! I’m sure you feel it in the atmosphere. This is time for PLP and PLP, we have one thing to say... We love we PLP! PLP is the only party delivering for the people and PLP will continue to deliver for the people in 2022, 2023, 2024, 2024, 2025, 2026, 2027...”

Comments from the two PLP officials came after the country’s 10 days of mourning for the death of former Nevis Premier, Ambassador Vance Amory who was buried on Saturday 30th April during a state funeral held in Nevis.

The length of time for national mourning was heavily debated in the public as some critics claimed such was used by PM has a political tactic amidst the drama of the internal issues within the Team Unity government.

At a recent press briefing, PAM Leader and the country’s Deputy Prime Minister Shawn Richards accused PM Harris of undermining his own cabinet.

“Many of the projects to be undertaken by CCM, PAM and even the other PLP minister were frustrated and starved of money from the ministry of finance, and the reason was to make us look bad and make one man look good because later [Dr. Harris] he would implement some measures and claim that only he was

responsible,” he claimed in part.

At that time, he publicly revealed a Motion of No Confidence was filed the day before (25th April) against PM Harris by members of Team Unity which was formally lodged with the clerk of parliament.

He shared the group’s expectation that in keeping with the rules of parliament that the motion will be placed on the Order Paper for an urgent sitting of Parliament and that a sitting of Parliament to hear the motion will be scheduled at the earliest possibility”

Notably, a leaked letter-dated 27th April- from the office of the clerk indicated that Speaker Michael Perkins in response said he is reviewing the resolution to ensure that it met the stipulated requirement in both the Constitution and standing order of the national Assembly which includes seeking independent legal

advice.

Meanwhile, another letter leaked dated 3rd May from the Governor General Tapley Seaton addressed to the elected representative highlighted that their communication requesting that the Prime Minister be removed and to appoint another minister in his stead has been reviewed noting that under the Constitution “no such power resides in the Governor-General and I am therefore unable to accede to your request.”

Astaphan Looks At Group Resignation In PM Harris Leadership Matter

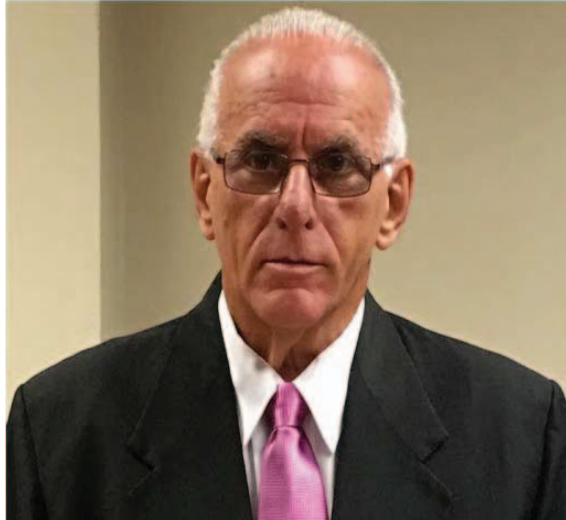
BASSETERRE, St.Kitts (Wednesday 4th March 2022) - Dwyer Astaphan, a well-known political commentator and former government minister is questioning why the current six government ministers who do not support Prime Minister Dr. Timothy Harris as head of the Team Unity administration did not submit a group resignation.

In his latest audio commentary aired on Tuesday 3rd May 2022, in looking at the present situation shared his opinion that "If this second interpretation is correct then the six gentlemen need to formally resign and amend their motion of no confidence or prepare a new one unless they're hoping that maybe the opposition Labour Party will file one..."

Astaphan stated: "With the collapse of Team Unity, things have been happening rapidly one after the other. We know that the Speaker of the National Assembly is seeking legal advice as to whether the motion of no confidence filed against the government and the Prime Minister on April 25th by cabinet ministers Brantley, Richards, Jeffers, Evelyn, Grant and Powell is in order. I think that if there is a defect in that motion of no confidence in the notice, it would be related to the fact that when it was filed, the six gentlemen were still members of cabinet. Maybe they are still members of cabinet today as we speak."

He continued: "I say this because there is a view that it would be at best awkward and at worst unacceptable for cabinet ministers to be signatories to a motion of no confidence against an administration of which they are members. People who hold that view think these six gentlemen should have first resigned from cabinet. Why didn't they sign a formal group resignation letter before their letter to the GG [Governor General] address their resignation letter to the Prime Minister, enclose a copy of that letter to the GG and then inform the country accordingly. Wouldn't that have removed any doubts and potential delays?"

"On the other had you might ask whether upon notifying the Governor General of their lost trust and confidence in the Prime Minister and their intention to bring a motion of no confidence against the government and



the Prime Minister, their employment at cabinet and their respective ministerial portfolios would have automatically ended. You may think that in their letter to the Governor General, the six gentlemen effectively and automatically terminated themselves as cabinet ministers there and then. Let's be realistic. How many of you expect them to go back to cabinet and those of you who believe they technically terminated themselves might therefore believe that from that date they should not be paid as cabinet ministers."

According to him, the present situation with a cabinet of five Harris, possibly Hamilton, Byron-Nisbett, Phipps and Byron instead of the eleven will raise questions relating to legal and or political validity of the actions and decisions of this those deeply decimated and diminished cabinet.

"So either by their letter to the Governor General, their cabinet membership for all practical purposes ended in which case therefore there may be no defect in their motion of no confidence or their membership did not technically end with their letter to the Governor General in which case the motion may be defective."

"If this second interpretation is correct then the six gentlemen need to formally resign and amend their motion of no confidence or prepare a new one unless they're hoping that maybe the opposition Labour Party will file one which is the way it is done under the west minister system, the opposition files motions of no confidence and I don't think it's any different here," he noted.

Additionally, Astaphan commented: "You may ask why the Speaker hasn't received the legal advice yet. It shouldn't be deep and heavy in law and it shouldn't take so much time to research and deliver..."

PM Harris: Income Support Programmes To Be Extended ...Talks Workers' Pay Increment

BASSETERRE, St. Kitts (Wednesday 4th May 2022)- Prime Minister and Minister of Finance Dr. Timothy Harris has announced that the government will extend the Income and Disability Support Programmes.

He made the disclosure during his Labour Day Message to the nation on Monday 2nd May 2022 which revealed that such support programmes will run for an additional three (3) months running up to June 2022 as one of the government's five short-term fiscal policy measures.

"This will further assist workers who remain unemployed, are on significantly reduced wages or have additional expenses from caring for children with disabilities. Several heads of households have told me how beneficial the disability support has been to their families. I am happy that my government will extend this support," he said about that specific measure."

In a separate announcement, PM Harris reported that "my government has determined that our civil servants, pensioners and STEP workers will benefit from an increase in wages, salaries and pensions at a rate of 10% retroactive to January 2022."

"This is another clear example of our investing in our people as we put more money in the pockets of a large number of our citizens and residents. These resources will translate to increased purchasing power for approximately 4,000 salaried Civil Servants, 1,064 Government Auxiliary Employees, 1,365 Pensioners and 2,800 STEP workers. This also has the great potential to propel increased economic activities which will in turn contribute to the economic recovery and stimulate job creation across the Federation," he expressed.

Moving on, Dr. Harris indicated that given the increasing inflationary pressures faced by the population, the short-term fiscal policy measures have been adopted for immediate implementation.

The other four areas as outlined by him include VAT and import duty removal and reduction of import fuel.

As reported by the Finance Minister, on April 13, 2022, the Government granted approval to amend the price build up for gasoline such that the increase in prices at the pump would be moderated. The Excise Tax on the importation of fuel was reduced from \$2.25 per gallon to \$0.95.

"This significant reduction will be in place from April to September 2022. The Government also granted an increase in the Gas Station Dealers Margin by \$0.30. In addition to the amendment to the price build up for gasoline, we will extend the Fuel Subsidy Programme for an additional six (6) months until September 2022. These measures are being done to mitigate the cost of fuel at the pump and to keep the cost of public transportation affordable for our people," he said.

Furthermore, according to him, the government will reintroduce the duty-free allowance that is usually permitted during the month of December on the importation of food items by non-commercial importers from May 01st to September 30, 2022.

This will be the longest period that such generous concessions have been granted to our people. This initiative would allow households to import 500 pounds of food items free of duties and taxes. This measure will benefit persons on low incomes who spend a higher portion of their earners on food," Dr. Harris commented.

Additionally, he shared that an eight-month cap will be placed on the freight cost that is used in the calculation of duties and taxes that are paid on the importation of goods.

"The cap will be set at the average freight cost for 2019, the



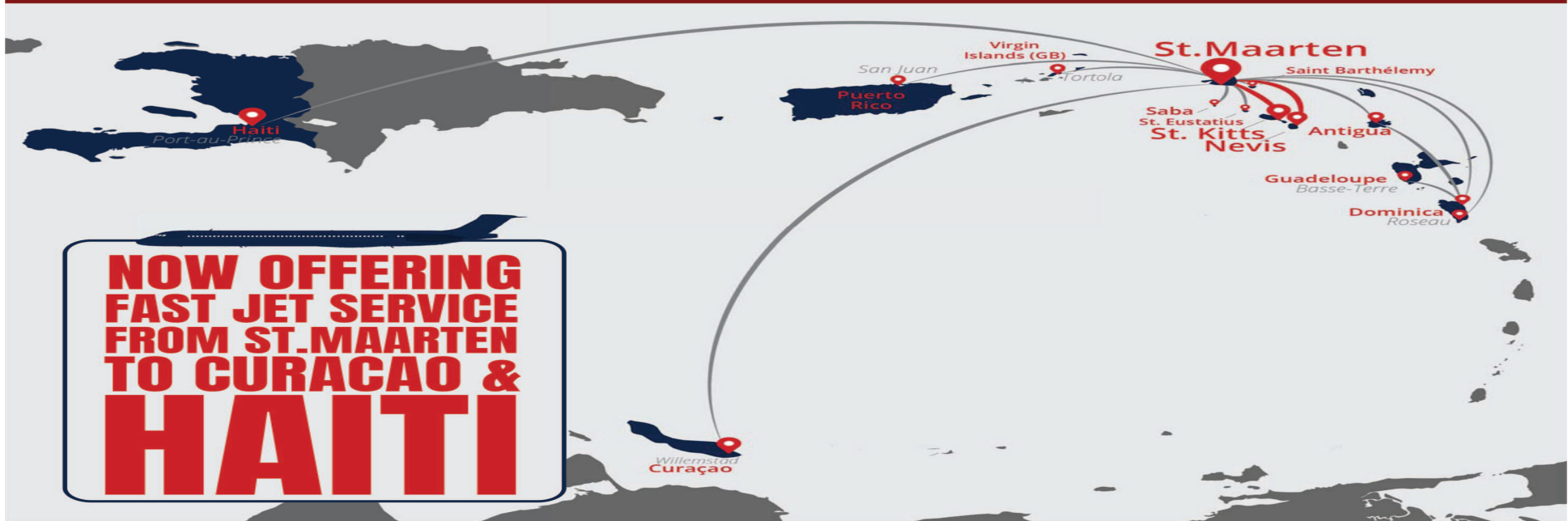

COVID Led To 15 Million Deaths Globally Not The 5 Million Reported - WHO

5 May (Reuters) - Almost three times as many people have died as a result of COVID-19 as official data show, according to a new World Health Organization (WHO) report, the most comprehensive look at the true global toll of the pandemic so far.

There were 14.9 million excess deaths associated with COVID-19 by the end of 2021 the UN body said on Thursday.

The official count of deaths directly attributable to COVID-19 and reported to WHO in that period, from January 2020 to the end of December 2021, is slightly more than 5.4 million.

The WHO's excess mortality figures reflect people who died of COVID-19 as well as those who died as an indirect result of the outbreak, including people who could not access healthcare for other conditions when systems were overwhelmed during huge waves of infection.

It also accounts for deaths averted during the pandemic, for example because of the lower risk of traffic accidents during lockdowns.

But the numbers are also far higher than the official tally because of deaths that were missed in countries without adequate reporting. Even pre-pandemic, around six in 10 deaths around the world were not registered, WHO said.

The WHO report said that almost half of the deaths that until

now had not been counted were in India. The report suggests that 4.7 million people died there as a result of the pandemic, mainly during a huge surge in May and June 2021.

The Indian government, however, puts its death toll for the January 2020-December 2021 period far lower: about 480,000.

WHO said it had not yet fully examined new data provided this week by India, which has pushed back against the WHO estimates and issued its own mortality figures for all causes of death in 2020 on Tuesday.

WHO said it may add a disclaimer to the report highlighting the ongoing conversation with India.

In a statement, issued after the numbers were published, the Indian government said WHO had released the report "without adequately addressing India's concerns" over what it called "questionable" methods.

The WHO panel, made up of international experts who

have been working on the data for months, used a combination of national and local information, as well as statistical models, to estimate totals where the data is incomplete - a methodology that India has criticised.

However, other independent assessments have also put the death toll in India far higher than the official government tally, including a report published in Science which suggested 3 million people may have died of COVID in the country.

Other models have also reached similar conclusions about the global death toll being far higher than the recorded statistics. For comparison, around 50 million people are thought to have died in the 1918 Spanish Flu pandemic, and 36 million have died of HIV since the epidemic began in the 1980s.

Samira Asma, WHO assistant director general for data, analytics and delivery for impact, who co-led the calculation process, said data was the "lifeblood of public health" needed to assess and learn from what happened during the pandemic.

She called for more support for countries to improve reporting. "Too much is unknown," she told reporters in a press briefing.

Strengthened School Lunch Standards Improved Obesity Outlook For Low-Income Children

Examining low-income children over two periods of time, researchers found that students who participated in the free or reduced-price federal National School Lunch Program after nutrition standards were strengthened showed less weight gain than children who participated in the earlier version of the program.

The findings are published in the journal JAMA Network Open.

“Our findings suggest that

improving nutritional standards for school lunches can help reduce the trajectory toward obesity among the low-income children who participate in federal school lunch programs,” said Andrea S Richardson, the study’s lead author and a policy researcher at RAND, a nonprofit research organization.

Obesity remains high among American children, with severe obesity growing particularly fast among low-income groups.

While school meals are a critical source of nutrients for low-income children, a growing body of evidence suggests that prior to 2010 they may have contributed to childhood obesity.

In response, Congress adopted the Healthy, Hunger Free Kids Act of 2010, which elevated nutritional standards for federal school lunch programs.

The healthier menus, which included increased fruit, vegetable and whole grain amounts, were adopted in 2012.

Researchers examined the influence of the healthier school lunch regulations by examining two groups of low-income children both before and after the adoption of the healthier school lunch standards. The two groups totaled about 5,960 children.

The study found that children who participated in the school lunch program before the nutritional reforms showed more signs of weight gain by the time they reached 5th grade, as compared to children who did not participate in the school lunch program.

Once the healthier nutrition standards were put into place, children who participated in the school lunch program did not show any differences in weight gain when compared to children who did not participate in the school lunch program.

The findings suggest the nutritional improvements prompted by the Healthy and Hunger-Free Kids Act may have eased the link seen previously between participation in subsidized school lunches and obesity among school children.


While the findings support the benefits of higher standards for school lunches, researchers said that many of the low-income students in the study still appeared to be headed toward obesity.

“Increasing access to school meals with more rigorous nutritional requirements that are culturally pleasing to children may be needed to achieve greater success in reducing child obesity,” Richardson said.







US Sanctions On China's HikVision Will Hit Over 180 Countries Including Taiwan

TAIPEI (Taiwan News) - The US is preparing to place sanctions on the world's largest surveillance equipment maker, Hikvision, in a move that would impact more than 180 countries that use the Chinese firm's gear.

The US is reportedly warning its allies of the coming changes, per a Financial Times report.

The measures could be disruptive for companies and governments around the world, since any entity that continues to do business with the banned company will violate US sanctions.

Washington has accused Hikvision of enabling the repression of Uyghurs in the country's Xinjiang region. Vietnam, The US, Mexico, The UK, and Brazil are the Hangzhou-based company's top export destinations, per TOP10 VPN.

Hikvision's products have been widely used in Taiwan too.

In 2019 Hikvision supplied roughly a third of Taiwan's security cameras, per UDN. Despite some city councilors raising concerns over the security risk, they have been used by Taiwan government departments and even the country's military.

In July of that year Taichung city councilors took issue with the high number of Hikvision cameras that watched over Taichung's Taiwan Boulevard, which had triggered data privacy concerns. In response the Taichung City Government requested the installation company to dismantle the equipment and replace them with cameras made by Taiwan companies.



Why COVID-19 Gaslighting By Politicians Is So Dangerous For Democracy

In the aftermath of the 6 January 2021 uprising at the United States Capitol building, the Republican Party faced a crucial moral test: whether to reject the baseless conspiracy theory that the 2020 general election had been “stolen” from Donald Trump, or to embrace that dangerous falsehood as official party dogma.

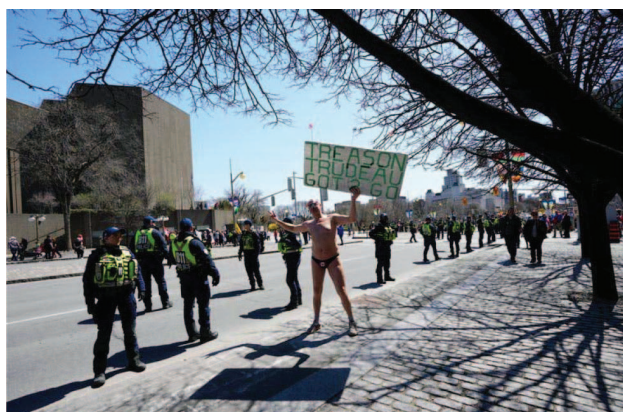
After gauging the political winds, the Republican Party cynically chose to embrace the falsehood, going so far as to ostracize party members who upheld the truth. In doing so, the GOP solidified its mutation from a political party to a political cult.

After two years of acknowledging the dangers of COVID-19, something eerily similar has happened with public health policy across the western world.

‘Live with it’

Federal and municipal governments in North America, Europe and Australia have begun lifting basic protections like vaccine and mask mandates, winding down public testing, ending contact tracing and withholding critical public health data, like case counts, hospitalization numbers, wastewater results, and even the size of local outbreaks.

Pandemic management has been transformed from a public health problem to an individual one.

The now-quaint 2020 slogan “We’re all in this together” has since been replaced with the dire

prescription - “Assess your own risk.”

Political leaders have reversed course, urging their constituents to “learn to live with COVID.”

The dismantling of pandemic infrastructure, however, suggests that those constituents must learn to live instead as if COVID-19 no longer exists.

By removing basic protections that enabled us to survive the pandemic for the last two years, public health policy has effectively been rewritten in light of the desires, demands and delusions of anti-maskers, anti-vaxxers and COVID-19 denialists.

Fiction vs. reality

Western politicians and public health officials have managed to craft a fictional universe in which we have reached endemicity, where infection is now “mild” and getting “milder” by the variant, where COVID-19 is “like the flu,” where mass infection builds a “wall of immunity” and where voluntary vaccination alone is our ticket out of the pandemic.

This sunny picture has numerous problems.

First, not only are we nowhere near endemicity, there would be nothing to celebrate about it if we were.

Second, the glib talk of mild infection overlooks COVID-19’s frightening vascular and neurological effects. Those infected by it are at increased risk of serious heart complications, including inflammation, acute coronary artery disease and cardiac arrest. Even mild cases can lead to changes in brain structure.

According to one recent meta-analysis, 43 per cent of COVID-19 survivors experienced symptoms of what’s known as long COVID, signalling a coming nightmare for public health, the economy and education.

For a supposedly mild disease, COVID-19 notably led to hospital collapse in both the United Kingdom and Canada in April 2022.

Public gaslighting

Yet none of these grim realities are acknowledged by politicians who insist that we “just move forward” and “get on with our lives,” and who repeat the “freedom convoy” talking point that we need not be “afraid.”

There’s a vast chasm between the COVID-19 fictions of politicians and the realities of hospital wards and long COVID clinics. The downplaying, dismissal and denial of these realities amount to public gaslighting, a reckless political manoeuvre with unsettling implications for the future of western democracies.

As it turns out, we are still living in a post-truth world. But this time it’s not Donald Trump who’s distorting reality.

Instead it’s federal and municipal governments across the political spectrum gaslighting their citizens and constituents, denying the reality and severity of a pandemic that, once again, is tearing through our communities at frightening speed, driven by a highly

contagious and rapidly evolving virus.

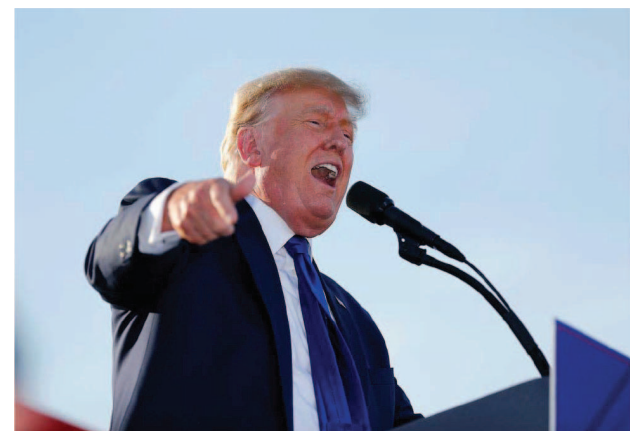
Undermining democracy

A functioning democracy requires some common ground upon which its citizens can agree. COVID-19 gaslighting erodes that common ground. It erodes trust in government and public health, as well as institutions, like school boards, that follow their cue.

It undermines the public authority of medicine and biomedical science to guide us through the pandemic.

Just as climate change has been subjected to “bothsidesism,” we now increasingly hear about “both sides” of COVID-19. When politicians encourage us to “move on,” COVID denialism becomes a respectable opinion.

Despite our habit of entertaining “both sides” of many issues, some things just aren’t a matter of political opinion: whether Trump won the 2020 election, whether climate change is real and whether we’re still in a pandemic.

Unfortunately, western political leaders and some public health officials have decided to indulge the worst kind of individualist impulse: the desire to choose your own reality, including the fantasy that the pandemic is over.

This is the unfortunate consequence of a market-driven society in which truth is just one more commodity, where the line between citizenship and consumerism is dissolved, and where many feel entitled to cancel election results and the pandemic alike just as they would an order from Amazon.

Erosion of trust

Perhaps, most tragically, COVID-19 gaslighting erodes our trust in each other. It feeds our mutual suspicion, paranoia, hostility and division. When infection risk is intrinsically social, the promotion of noxious ideological concepts like “individual choice” and “assessing your own risk” only encourages us to blame each other in the event of an outbreak.

COVID-19 gaslighting will only deepen our existing social divisions and exacerbate our culture wars, further

eroding our already fragile democracies.

As SARS-CoV-2 continues to evolve, surprise, disappoint and frustrate us at every turn, COVID-19 gaslighting will drive citizens deeper into isolated and self-enclosed silos, online and off-line.

It will further encourage the violent trolling of health-care workers and scientists, and feed dangerously reactionary politics.

Extremism is the only possible beneficiary of this erosion of public trust.

NICHOLAS POORAN APPOINTED WEST INDIES MEN'S ODI AND T20I CAPTAIN

Tuesday, 3 May 2022 - ST JOHN'S, Antigua - Cricket West Indies (CWI) today confirmed the appointment of Nicholas Pooran as the West Indies Men's One-Day International (ODI) and T20 International (T20I) captain, following the international retirement of Kieron Pollard.

Pooran will take over the captaincy for the West Indies ODI and T20I teams after being Pollard's deputy over the last year. The appointment will include the ICC Men's T20 World Cup in 2022 and the ICC Men's Cricket World Cup in October 2023. Shai Hope has been recommended to stand as vice-captain of the ODI team.

CWI's Director of Cricket Jimmy Adams said: "We believe Nicholas is ready for the challenge of leading our white ball teams given his experience, performances, and the respect he has within the playing group. The Selection Panel believes that Nicholas

has matured as a player and were impressed with his leadership of both teams when Kieron Pollard had been absent. The experience he has gathered playing in various franchise leagues around the world was also a factor in the decision to recommend him for the T20 captaincy."

Pooran has already captained the West Indies Men in Pollard's absence, leading them to a CG Insurance T20I Series win at home against Australia in 2021.

The left-handed wicketkeeper/batsman has eight half-centuries and an ODI century to his name. He has also scored eight T20I half-centuries for the West Indies Senior Men's team. He first burst onto the cricket scene representing the West Indies Under-19 team at the 2014 ICC Men's U19 World Cup, smashing 303 runs from six matches.

CWI President Ricky Skerritt congratulated Pooran on his appointment saying, "Nicholas Pooran is a specially gifted cricketer, and the right person to take over the white ball captaincy. We are confident that he will continue to climb the leadership learning curve speedily, and successfully. I appeal to all West Indies cricket stakeholders to give Nicholas the support and encouragement that he deserves."

Pooran expressed his delight in his appointment saying, "I am truly honored to be appointed captain of the West Indies team. I am following the

footsteps of several giants of the game who have created an amazing legacy for West Indies cricket. To be named captain is indeed the highlight of my career so far and I want to drive the team forward to accomplish great things on the field for our fans and loyal supporters."

Man City must ‘process’ semi-final defeat and ‘come back’ - Pep Guardiola

Pep Guardiola says Manchester City must “process” their remarkable Champions League semi-final loss to Real Madrid and “come back” as they look to defend their Premier League title.

City had a final spot snatched away from them in Spain as Real scored twice in stoppage time and again in extra time to come back from two goals down.

They lead Liverpool by a point in the league and face Newcastle on Sunday.

“It is tough for us, I cannot deny,” Guardiola said of Wednesday’s loss.

“We were so close to the Champions League final.

“Now we need to process that and come back, with our people at home and in the last four games we have.”

Real Madrid stun Man City to reach final - action and reaction

In one of the finest knockout ties in Champions League history, City looked to be emerging victorious after Riyad Mahrez’s goal gave them a 5-3 lead in the tie.

But two goals from substitute Rodrygo in stoppage time for a Real side who had previously not had a shot on target levelled it up before Karim Benzema’s penalty won it for the Spanish side in extra time.

“In the first half we did not have [the] game, we were not good enough. But we did not suffer much,” Guardiola told BT Sport.

“After we scored the goal we were better. We found our tempo and our game and the players were comfortable. It is not like in the last 10 minutes they attack and attack and you suffer. It didn’t happen.

“They put a lot of players in the box, with Eder Militao, Rodrygo, Vinicius Junior, Karim Benzema and they put in crosses and scored two goals.

“We didn’t play our best, but it is normal, a semi-final, the players feel the pressure and wanting to do it. Football is unpredictable, it is a game like this. We have to accept it.”

Guardiola has won the Champions League twice as a manager - at Barcelona in 2008-09 and 2010-11.

Since he joined City in 2016, they have been knocked out in the quarter-finals

Some opponents love to use ‘it’s coming home’ against England

It was intended as a “bittersweet love song” but led to suggestions England were arrogant and entitled.

Three Lions (Football’s Coming Home) has been a go-to chant for England fans since it was released before Euro ’96.

But reports on Thursday suggested the anthem - written by musician Ian Broudie, and comedians David Baddiel and Frank Skinner - might be ditched.

Responding to those stories, Euro ’96 hero Paul Gascoigne said it was a “nonsense” and that the Football Association had “totally lost the plot”.

The FA’s response was swift and unequivocal.

“Contrary to reports this morning, the FA still plays Three Lions at major Wembley matches and has never had any intention of doing otherwise,” it said.

“The song belongs to the fans and is about the hope of following the England team.

“It was requested by the FA to be played as one of our team songs at the 2018 World Cup and at the Euros last summer, and this is our plan going

forwards.”

So the familiar refrain of “football’s coming home” will continue, as - no doubt - will talk of perceived English arrogance.

But Baddiel once said: “I think the song is the opposite of arrogant. It’s a vulnerable song about magical thinking.

“What does happen is that when England are doing well, Football’s Coming Home itself becomes a kind of mantra pushing us towards victory.”

Germany fans have adopted the song too, and opponents love to use it against England when they can - Three Lions fans have painful memories of Italy defender Leonardo Bonucci screaming “It’s coming Rome!” into a camera after Italy won the Euro 2020 final at Wembley last summer.

But whatever your views, it looks as though the song is here to stay.

The creators behind 1996 anthem, Three Lions: Ian Broudie, Frank Skinner and David Baddiel.

The song was written in 1996 and got a rework before the 1998 World Cup

three times and reached their first final last season, losing to Chelsea.

‘They could blow up after this’

City’s attention now turns back to the Premier League title race, with Liverpool - the side they would have faced in the Champions League final had they got there - their challengers.

The Reds face Tottenham on Saturday evening, the day before City’s game with Newcastle.

With the lead at the top so tight with just four games to go, pundits have questioned just how much Wednesday’s loss may affect the reigning English champions.

“It is such a distressing loss,” former England defender Jonathan Woodgate told BBC Radio 5 Live. “What ramifications does that have on the league? They could blow up after this.”

Former Manchester City defender Joleon Lescott told BT Sport: “You have to be a bit lucky. We have seen Manchester City fall at this hurdle before.

“There is still a lot to play for. The fans have to play a part on Sunday, they have to lift this team.

“It’s been a long time since Pep Guardiola won the Champions League the first time, so I am sure this will be devastating for him.”
