SKNLP Leader Keeping Eyes On Electoral Office Activities

BASSETERRE, St. Kitts (Thursday 12th May 2022)-Leader of the St.Kitts-Nevis Labour Party Dr. Terrance Drew says he will be making daily visits to the Electoral Office located on Central Street in Basseterre due to concerns that the party has.

Via a live broadcast outside that office on Thursday 12th May 2022, he expressed: "So far we know a lot of things that should not be happening are happening in and around the Electoral Office and I am here to say to the people that this should not be so I'm asking all fair-minded people, our patriotic citizens, people who want to see democracy preserved in St.Kitts and Nevis to make sure that you do your part to ensure that there's integrity in the Electoral Office."

Dr. Drew continued: "Already, we are hearing and I have evidence that people are registering where they don't live .I came here to see how the line is being operated on and some of the things we see here, I'm really not too pleased about so I am saying that I will be here daily and I'm asking all fair-minded people to come to the Electoral Office and to make sure that the shenanigans that potentially can happen here; some of which are happening outside of here that it shouldn't continue. Finland Nato: Russia threatens to retaliate over membership move

Russia has said it will be forced to take “retaliatory steps” over its neighbour Finland’s move to join Nato.

A foreign ministry statement said the move would seriously damage bilateral relations, as well as security and stability in northern Europe.

Earlier, Finland’s president and PM called for the country to apply for Nato membership “without delay”.

It comes amid a surge in public support for Nato membership following Russia’s invasion of Ukraine.

Finland shares a 1,300-km (810-mile) border with Russia. Until now, it has stayed out of Nato to avoid antagonising its eastern neighbour.

Finland will formally announce its decision on Sunday after it has been considered by parliament and other senior political figures.

Sweden has said it will announce a similar decision on the same day.

Nato Secretary General Jens Stoltenberg has said he expects the process of giving Sweden and Finland membership to happen “quite quickly”.

Are Finland and Sweden going from neutral to Nato?

What is Nato and could Finland and Sweden join?

Is Nato’s Nordic expansion a threat or boost to Europe?

The Russian statement (in Russian) described Finland’s move as “a radical change in the country’s foreign policy”.

“Finland’s accession to Nato will cause serious damage to bilateral Russian-Finnish relations and the maintaining of stability and security in the Northern European region,” it said.

“Russia will be forced to take retaliatory steps, both of a military-technical and other nature, in order to neutralise the threats to its national security

that arise from this.”

However, Moscow has not specified what steps it plans to take.

“Everything will depend on how this expansion process plays out, the extent to which military infrastructure moves closer to our borders,” Kremlin spokesman Dmitry Peskov earlier told reporters.

Russian officials were responding to a joint statement by Finnish President Sauli Niinisto and Prime Minister Sanna Marin, which

said the two leaders expected a decision on Nato membership in the next few days.

“Nato membership would strengthen Finland’s security,” it said. “As a member of Nato, Finland would strengthen the entire defence alliance. Finland must apply for Nato membership without delay.”

Speaking to journalists later, Mr Niinisto responded to Russian concerns and blamed the move on Moscow’s invasion.

“Joining Nato would not be against anyone. You caused this. Look in the mirror,” he said.

An opinion poll last week put support in Finland for joining Nato at 76%, with 12% against, a big swing towards membership since before the invasion.

Finland and the USSR were on opposing sides in World War Two, with the Finns famously fending off a Soviet invasion in 1939-40.

But Finland lost 10% of its territory in the final peace agreement and remained non-aligned throughout the Cold War.

Its accession to Nato would more than double the length of Russia’s borders with the alliance. Sweden does not have a border with Russia.

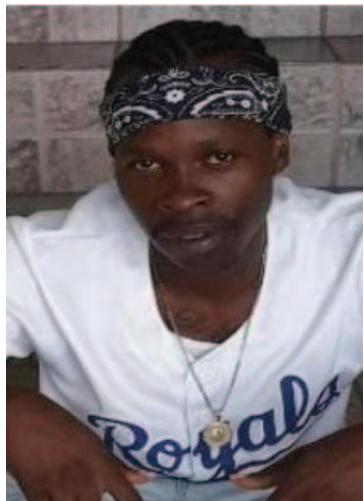
Young Man Charged With Murders Of Missing Men Including 2021 Case

BASSETERRE, St. Kitts (Thursday 12th May 2022)- Almost one month after a young man was charged the murder of a missing man on St.Kitts, police have charged him with the murder of a second man whose remains were identified through DNA testing after he was last seen over four months ago in November 2021.

29-year-old Trevern Edwards of Stapleton Village has been charged for the murders of 29-year-old Jesse Lee of Lime Kiln and 67-year-old Arthur Henry of Fountain Estate.

He was charged by police on Tuesday 10th May 2022 for Lee's murder and for Henry's murder on Thursday 13th April.

In a statement issued on Wednesday 11th May, police indicated that the identity of the human remains found in the Bayford's Mountain area on April 01 2022, has been determined, and that based on evidence taken from the scene, they (the police) narrowed their investigations to focus on a person of interest.

As reported, DNA samples from the remains and a close relative were sent abroad for testing. The results were recently received and proved to be a match.

Police determined that the remains are that of Jesse Lee who was last seen on November 18, 2021, and who was 29 years old at the time of the report.

In relation to Henry, police say the offence was committed on March 24. An autopsy performed on his body on Friday 8th April by Resident Pathologist Dr. Adrian Nunez concluded that death was as a result of severe brain injury due to a single gunshot wound to the head.

A police statement-dated 8th April- informed that the body of a man found that week was officially identified as that of Henry who was reported missing on March 24.

His body was identified by members of his family on April 08 which was found in the Fountain Estate Mountain area on April 05.

Edwards remains at Her Majesty's Prison where he was recently remanded for the offence of Assault with Intent to Rob which was committed on March 11, 2022.

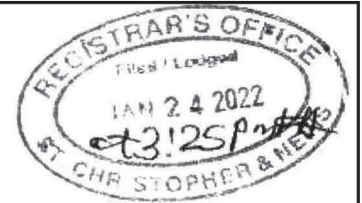



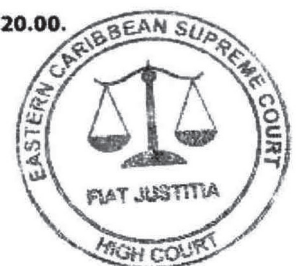

Premier Mark Brantley Calls Out PM Harris For Turning Back On Team Unity Helpers

BASSETERRE, St. Kitts (Wednesday 11th May 2022)- “Mr. Harris, I know you pay attention to these programmes. Let me say to you this: It is we in Team Unity who took you up, dusted you off and made something out of you when you had been discarded to the scrapheap of political history in this country.”

These were the sentiments of Premier Mark Brantley, Leader of the Concerned Citizens Movement (CCM), while speaking on his weekly ‘On The Mark’ VON radio programme aired on Wednesday 11th May 2022.

His comments followed the Prime Minister’s address to the nation the day before (Tuesday) which saw the announcement on the firing of six opposing cabinet colleagues including Brantley who was dismissed from his federal post, and is now a former Minister of Foreign Affairs.

“Don’t damn the bridge you walk over, don’t damn the bridge you walk over because often times you will come to regret it, and this is no threat nor promise but what I will say to you is that the people of number nine St. John’s and St. Paul’s have elected me from 2007 until now,” he said further.

Brantley went on to put it to PM Harris that he cannot fire him because he was not the one who hired him.

“For fifteen years I have been their representative and they keep electing me with larger numbers, and you know why? It’s because they know I represent them, that I serve them and that when I go out I go out to work for them not for me and they are the ones who hired me in June of 2020 as they

have hired me in 2015, 2010 and 2007. Therefore means with respect, you can’t fire me cause you never hired me, you can’t fire me cause you ever hired me and so as I’ve said to the many who have offered me jobs since yesterday...I have suggested to them that it’s ok because what happened yesterday is temporary, a mere blip because the saints will once more go marching in and when the saints go marching in, I can tell you there will be one who will not be in that number, and so we have here a situation of a great idea ‘Team Unity’; still a great idea, still in my view the best idea for this country but wrecked by the ambition and the lust for power, and the greed of one man could not see that there was strength in compromise, strength in team work, strength in working together.”

According to Brantley: “The stone that the builder refuse sometimes become chief corner stone, and I will remind Dr. Harris that he was fired by Denzil Douglas and he came back as prime minister. So, if our history holds true, those that were fired will come back and be in government, and that is why as far as I’m concerned, I have no tears to shed about what happened yesterday, what happened yesterday was farcical.”



Reflecting on PM Harris’ announcement, Brantley commented: “It was as if one was watching Tom and Jerry cartoon series. Timothy Harris has succeeded in making St. Kitts and Nevis a laughing stock of the region. I can’t begin to tell you all the calls I got from across the region people asking me if there is no room in the asylum in St. Kitts and Nevis because clearly the person they heard and what they’re hearing from him can’t make no sense...”

According to him: “If Timothy Harris had any desire to save Team Unity, he could have come to the table at any point in time and say ‘Gentlemen I understand your concerns. Gentlemen let me see to address these concerns...’

“Not once did he sit with his colleagues...and say ‘Look I realize there’s an issue; let us discuss’,” Brantley shared.

In his presentation, he questioned in part while speaking about PM Harris: “How could you be undermining your colleagues? How could anything good that happen in the government is you even when you nuh got nothing to do with it’s you. How could you be out there seeking to undermine, disrespect, disparage, and how could you have all these secrets? Peace Programme nobody know how it work, CBI Programme nobody know how it work...no details, and you’re sitting in a cabinet the highest decision-making body in the country...”

PM Harris Fires MONC Filers

BASSETERRE, St. Kitts (Wednesday 11th May 2022)- Prime Minister Dr. Timothy Harris of the People's Labour Party (PLP) has fired his PAM colleagues (excepting Eugene Hamilton-the new deputy Prime Minister) and CCM colleagues who a recently teamed up to file of a Motion of No Confidence against him.

Dismissed are Shawn Richards, Lindsay Grant, the Hon Jonel Powel of the People's Action Movement as well as Mark Brantley, Alexis Jeffers and Eric Evelyn of the Concerned Citizens Movement have been stripped of their appointments as Ministers of Government.

The news of the ministers being stripped of their portfolios was delivered to the nation via an address on Tuesday 10th May 2022.

In speaking about his estranged colleagues, he stated in part, "Unfortunately, over the past few months, the people of St. Kitts and Nevis have been subjected to increasingly strange and irrational

behavior by certain members of the People's Action Movement (PAM) and Concerned Citizens Movement (CCM)."

PM Harris informed that the day before, he asked the Governor-General, Sir Tapley Seaton to remove Shawn Richards from the Office of Deputy Prime Minister.

"In his stead, I have advised His Excellency to appoint the Hon Eugene Hamilton to the Office of Deputy Prime Minister. Hon Hamilton has been steadfast and responsible in discharging his duties as Minister of the portfolios assigned to him.

Additionally, he said he also advised the Governor General to revoke the appointment of Richards as a Minister of Government and to reassign his portfolios to the Hon Eugene Hamilton.

"Deputy Prime Minister Hamilton will now have conduct of the Departments and Subjects under the Ministry of Public Infrastructure, Posts and Urban Development that had been previously assigned to the Hon Richards."

PM Harris continued: "I am also to advise that I have asked His Excellency to revoke the appointments of the other Ministers who have thought fit to disrespect the sacred trust that the people of St. Kitts and Nevis placed in the Government following our very successful General Election Campaign in 2020. As a result, the following individuals, namely the Hon Mark Brantley, the Hon Lindsay Grant, the Hon Jonel Powell, the Hon Alexis Jeffers and the Hon Eric Evelyn have been stripped of their appointments as Ministers of Government."

The portfolios of those members of Parliament that have been removed have been reassigned.

Wendy Phipps will assume the additional responsibility for Tourism and Transport, including the Ports.

He said Attorney General Vincent Byron will assume the additional responsibility for Foreign Affairs and Aviation, Education, Youth and Sports while Akilah Byron-Nisbett, in addition to her responsibilities, will have added the portfolio for Culture.

As understood, the subjects of Agriculture, Fisheries and Marine Resources and Environment will be brought under the Ministry of Sustainable Development.

Ground Broken to Mark Construction Phase of USD59.9M UK/CDB Road Upgrade Project in Belize

Representatives of the Government of Belize, the Government of the United Kingdom (UK) and the Caribbean Development Bank (CDB) broke ground to officially mark the construction phase of the USD59.9 million (mn) Philip S. W. Goldson Highway and Remate Bypass Upgrading Project.

The Project involves major improvement of 125 km of the essential arterial route that links Belize City to the Mexican border. The work includes road realignment, culvert construction and replacement, and improvement of pavements and junctions. In addition, sidewalks, bus shelters and pedestrian crossings will be installed.

The upgraded roadway will enhance connectivity, accessibility, and the resilience of the road network in Belize, and some 55,000 daily road users will benefit from improved road safety and reduced travel times. The construction phase, which is expected to run until late 2023, will generate increased economic activity for the 45,000 residents of Corozal, Orange Walk and other northern communities.

The project will also support the development of livelihood opportunities for residents in the project footprint and will help to tackle the risks around gender-based violence and human trafficking through public education and communication.

At the ground-breaking ceremony, which was held on May 10 in Mameyal Curve, Belize, CDB's Vice President (Operations), Mr. Isaac Solomon said, "CDB's 2016-2020 Country Strategy for Belize identified this Project as an important intervention for modernising the road network, improving communication, safety, and resilience, and contributing to increased competitiveness and productivity. The implementation approach integrates the cross-cutting themes of gender equality, and environmental sustainability. The Project is also expected to contribute to Belize's achievement of its Sustainable Development Goals."

The British High Commissioner to Belize, Ms. Claire Evans, said: "It is great to see the Philip Goldson Highway and Remate Bypass Upgrading Project break ground, the second of the UK's grant funded critical highways to be upgraded. Working in partnership with Belize and CDB, these road improvements will deliver substantial social and economic benefits for the country."

The road upgrade project is being partially financed by a £16 mn (USD20.9 mn) grant from the Government of the United Kingdom, under the UK Caribbean Infrastructure Partnership Fund (UKCIF). The UKCIF, which provides £350 mn in grant financing for climate-resilient infrastructure projects in the Caribbean, is administered by the CDB. The Bank is providing USD34.4 mn in loans and grant funding for the project and the Government of Belize has allocated USD4.6 mn.

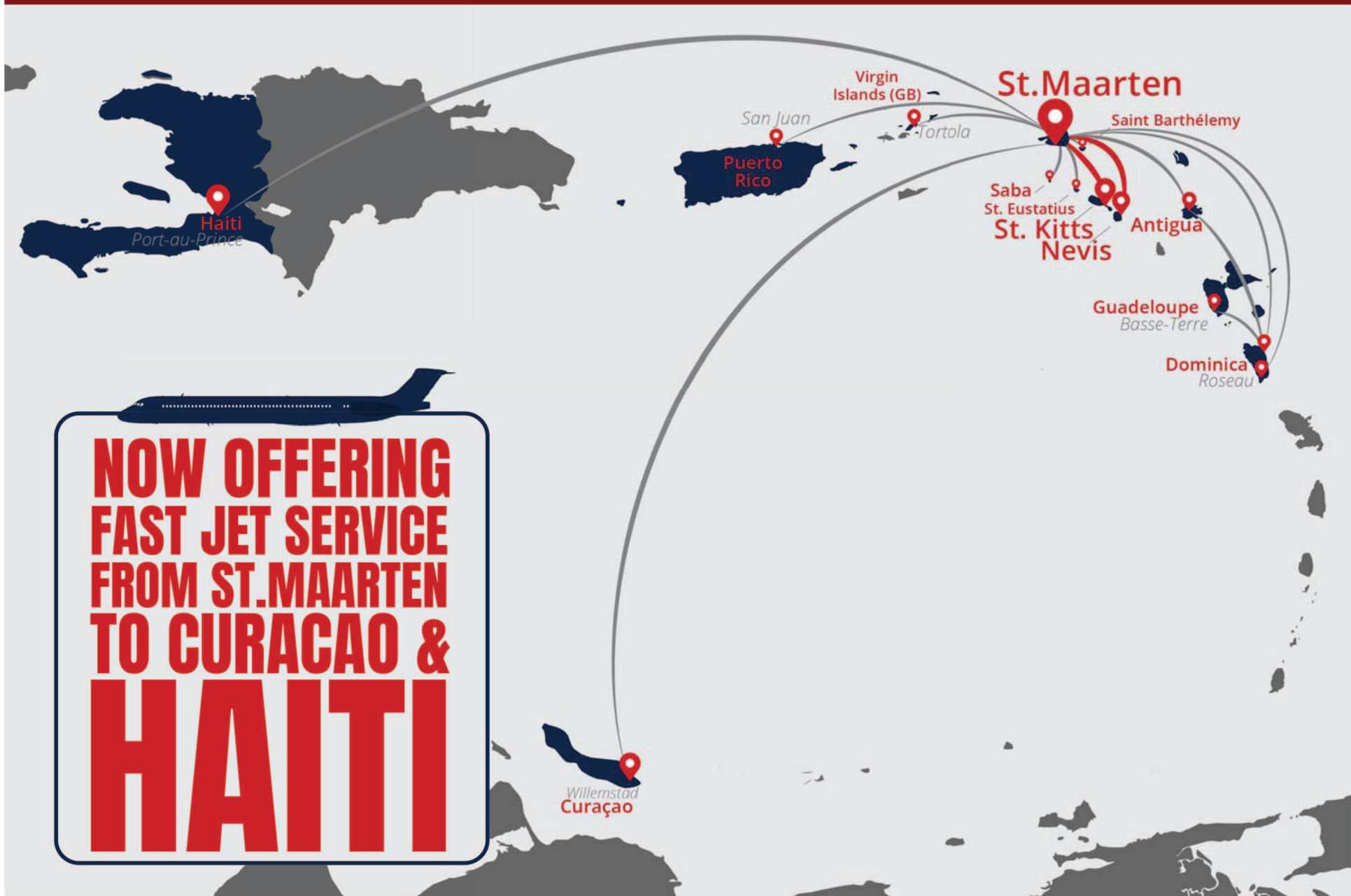



FARMERS RECEIVE ONE THOUSAND GALLON WATER TANKS TO BOOST WATER SECURITY

(Basseterre, St. Kitts, May 9, 2021): In keeping with its pledge to address the water supply challenges facing many farmers in St. Kitts, the Ministry of Agriculture, Fisheries and Marine Resources is distributing 100 water tanks measuring over the next few days.

While speaking on the distribution of tanks, Permanent Secretary in the Ministry of Agriculture, Fisheries and Marine Resources, Ron Dublin Collins said, "This effort forms part of the Ministry's Agriculture Support Project which aims to resolve the water concerns expressed by farmers all across the island".

He added, "We held several discussions with farmers, we have heard their cries and we intend to continue delivering to our farmers in every way possible to ensure that they can increase food production while also practicing sustainable methods of farming".

Russia Warns West Over Risk Of Conflict With NATO

LONDON, 12 May (Reuters) - One of President Vladimir Putin's closest allies warned the West on Thursday that the increasing military support given to Ukraine by The United States and its allies risked triggering a conflict between Russia and the NATO military alliance.

Former president Dmitry Medvedev, now deputy chairman of Russia's security council, said such a conflict with NATO always carried the risk of turning into a full blown nuclear war.

Russia's 24 February invasion of Ukraine has killed thousands of people, laid waste

to swathes of its former Soviet neighbour, and raised fears of the gravest confrontation between Russia and The United States since the 1962 Cuban Missile Crisis.

"NATO countries pumping weapons into Ukraine, training troops to use Western equipment, sending in mercenaries and the exercises of Alliance countries near our borders increase the likelihood

of a direct and open conflict between NATO and Russia,"

Medvedev said in a Telegram post.

"Such a conflict always has the risk of turning into a full-fledged nuclear war," Medvedev said. "This will be a disastrous scenario for everyone."

Russia and The United States are by far the world's biggest nuclear powers: Russia has some 6,257 nuclear warheads while NATO's three nuclear powers - The United States, The United Kingdom and France - have about 6,065 warheads combined, according to the Washington-based Arms Control Association.

Putin says the "special military operation" in Ukraine is necessary because The United States was using Ukraine to threaten Russia, and Moscow had to defend against the persecution of Russian-speaking people.

Putin, who says Ukraine and Russia are essentially one people, casts the war as an inevitable confrontation with The United States, which he accuses of threatening Russia by meddling in its backyard through NATO eastward enlargement.

Ukraine says it is fighting an imperial-style land grab and that Putin's claims of genocide are nonsense.

Kyiv says Putin's invasion has only strengthened the Ukrainian people's wish to turn westwards out of Russia's orbit.

WHO - COVID-19 Falling Everywhere Except In The Americas And Africa

GENEVA (AP) - The number of new coronavirus cases reported worldwide has continued to fall except in the Americas and Africa, The World Health Organization (WHO) said in its latest assessment of the pandemic.

The decline comes as Europe marked a COVID-19 death milestone: 2 million on the continent.

In its weekly pandemic report, released late Tuesday, the UN health agency said about 3.5 million new cases, and more than 25,000 deaths, were reported globally, which respectively represent decreases of 12% and 25%.

The downward trend in reported infections began in March, although many countries have dismantled their widespread testing and surveillance programmes, making an accurate count of cases extremely difficult.

The WHO said there were only two regions where reported COVID-19

infections increased: the Americas, by 14%, and Africa, by 12%. Cases remained stable in the Western Pacific, and fell everywhere else, the agency said.

WHO Director-General Tedros Adhanom Ghebreyesus warned during a press briefing this week that “the rising cases in more than 50 countries highlights the volatility of this virus.”

Tedros said COVID-19 variants, including mutated versions of the highly infectious omicron, are driving a resurgence of COVID-19 in several countries, including South Africa, which was the first to identify omicron in November.

He said relatively high rates of population immunity are preventing a spike in hospitalizations and deaths, but cautioned that “this is not guaranteed for places where vaccination levels are low.”

Only about 16% of people in poorer countries have been immunized against

COVID-19.

WHO’s report noted that some of the biggest jumps in COVID-19 cases were seen in China, which saw a 145% rise in the last week.

Earlier this week Chinese authorities doubled down on pandemic restrictions in Shanghai after a brief period of loosening up. The move frustrated residents who were hoping a more than monthlong lockdown was finally easing after complaints of food shortages and quarantines where some people were forced to surrender their house keys.

WHO’s Tedros said Tuesday he didn’t think China’s “zero-COVID” strategy was sustainable, “considering the behaviour of the virus now and what we anticipate in the future.”

On Thursday, North Korea announced its first coronavirus outbreak and imposed a nationwide lockdown. The size of the outbreak wasn’t immediately known, but it could have serious consequences because the country has a poor health care system and its 26 million people are believed to be mostly unvaccinated.

Taiwan’s Teachers Union Pushes Government To Proclaim Labour Day A National Holiday

Confusing holiday rules cause problems - especially for teachers.

TAIPEI (Taiwan News) - Taiwan’s National Federation of Teachers Unions (NFTU) on Thursday (12 May) called on the government to make Labour Day (1 May) a national holiday for all people in the country, including teachers.

Federation president Hou Chun-liang told a news conference on Thursday that this year’s Labour Day fell on a Sunday, and all workers who were covered by the Labour Standards Act had the following day (2 May) off as a deferred holiday, CNA reported.

However, as teachers are not covered by the labour law, they had to work on 2 May this year.

Hou pointed out that Labour Day is not a holiday for teachers, public servants, and physicians, and the exclusion of these professions from the holiday has caused many problems, he said.

Federation publicity director Lo Te-shui added that the confusing holiday rules have caused inconveniences for many people.

More than 10 million workers in the country have Labour Day off, while nearly a million other wage earners have to work, and this inconsistency has brought about annoyance and controversy.

At some schools, temporary workers and contracted workers covered by the Labour Standard Act enjoyed their Labour Day off, while public servants and teachers were made to work.

The NFTU said “Taiwan society has progressed to a point where the Labour Day holiday controversy should be resolved once and for all.”

“1 May is also known as International Workers’ Day, and Taiwan should proclaim it a national holiday day as other countries in the world have done in order to honour the value and sacredness of labour, ...” the federation added.

Insights From Zimbabwe On How To Link Formal And Informal Economies

The informal sector in Zimbabwe is massive. Finding ways to connect it to the formal sector is vital.

In 2003 Thabo Mbeki - then president of South Africa - described South Africa's economy as being like a two-storey house. The top floor was quite plush, with all the fittings packed neatly together. He referred to this as the modern, diversified economy within South Africa.

Below that level, however, was an informal economy where the poor were trapped in poverty, with little or no skills.

Mbeki's analogy went further: there was no interconnecting staircase between the two floors. In effect, South Africa had two economies and there was no bridge between them.

What Mbeki was describing is a common problem in developing countries, including South Africa's neighbour Zimbabwe.

My colleague Baldwin Guchu and I recently conducted research on an initiative in Zimbabwe that is trying to address the problem. In the paper we examined the role intermediaries are playing in connecting formal and informal economies in the country. South Africa can learn from this.

Since 1994 South Africa has built on the existing two-storey infrastructure without paying much attention to a stairway. At least, not one wide or sturdy enough to encourage upward movement.

This poses a serious developmental problem - one shared by many developing economies.

Academic research typically labels this as being a function of dualism and the lack of institutional connections between these dual economies: although institutions establish the "rules of the game" governing economic activity in each of these economies, the institutions do not bridge the two disparate economies and so they coexist but in isolation.

How often do we hear the refrain that big business does not do business with small business?

The result of this missing link is that the two economies struggle to engage with each other, leading to inefficiencies and substantial lost opportunities. Worse still, it entrenches social and economic divisions, and deepens inequality. We see this manifest in various ways in South Africa.

South Africa has deep and liquid financial markets, together with a highly

functioning and well-regulated banking industry, which means our top-floor financial system measures well against any of the leading economies around the world. Access to capital should therefore be widely available.

But it's not. Swathes of small businesses fail to meet the criteria set for top-floor financing. In developed economies, small businesses have a range of alternatives for financing from banks or other capital markets, including secured and unsecured options.

How can this be fixed? Claiming "it's the government's job" ignores other players who have the ability to play a more innovative intermediary role.

If South Africa's two-storey economy is pronounced, Zimbabwe's is severe. Its house is pyramid shaped. Yet there are attempts underway to connect the different levels. Our research looked at what these are.

The role of intermediaries

Zimbabwe has a reputation for weak and extractive political and economic institutions. The World Bank⁵ estimates that the informal economy makes up approximately 60% of the total economy; roughly 90% of those considered 'employed' work in the informal economy.

This is especially true in the agriculture space, where the combined legacy of colonialism and more recently, land grabs, has carved a chasm between large-scale commercial farmers and small-scale, often subsistence farmers.

These smaller agriculture producers cooperate in their villages through a system of mutual trust, but this way of doing things does not extend beyond the villages. Tight legal contracts are needed to sell to the bigger retail industry players. In addition, small-scale farmers need some level of financing to ensure access to machinery, and a sustainable supply of input commodities necessary to plant, harvest, and store their crops.

This is impossible without collateral to guarantee a loan, or without buying contracts from retailers. The result is that they are trapped in a vicious cycle - they can't borrow money to produce, nor are they able to produce to borrow money.

That's where an organisation like the private, for-profit entity Palladium can step in. Its approach is collaborative. In this case it backed a donor funded project, acting as a bridge between the formal and informal economies connecting small-scale farmers to formal markets. In other words, the staircase between the two floors.

Palladium functions as an intermediary in various ways. It facilitates contract farming by connecting input suppliers with small-scale farmers, who then agree to sell the produce back to them at a pre-agreed future price. This addresses input financing and provides a guaranteed market for the farmers' output. It also builds partnerships with the private sector to enable mobile buying systems. This frees farmers from having to find a market, and ensures them a fair price; furthermore, it relieves them of the problem of storage and packaging. As part of a consignment stock initiative, the intermediary also keeps an electronic transaction history farmers can use to access credit in the future by providing records and information that would otherwise be missing.

Solutions

All these interventions are better served by intermediaries rather than through bureaucratic government overreach. This is particularly true where government institutional capacity is weak and corruption is common. Governments with little or no entrepreneurial mindset fail at this because they don't see a gap they can fill in a sustainable way. What governments can do is enable policies that support these intermediaries to function effectively, and to recognise that the traditional boundaries between the public and private sectors are increasingly blurred and hybrid partnerships provide the potential for innovative solutions.

For its part big business needs to realise that maintaining the status quo of dual economies delegitimises markets and results in lost opportunities. The question for intermediaries is to imagine ways in which bridging support can extend beyond project initiatives.

These projects are time-bound, with limited budgets. If not implemented with longevity in mind, such interventions can create dependencies rather than solve them. That's why longer-term, more sustainable solutions must be imagined, to bring the formal and informal economies closer together. And also to ensure permanent integration.

Without this kind of lateral thinking countries like Zimbabwe and South Africa will continue to have two-storey houses with no stairway, leaving the majority of citizens stranded on the ground floor, looking upwards. Such structural inequality is unsustainable.

Brendon McCullum: England appoint former New Zealand captain as new men's Test coach

England have appointed former New Zealand captain Brendon McCullum as men's Test coach on a four-year deal.

McCullum, 40, will be in place for England's first Test against world champions New Zealand at Lord's on 2 June.

He succeeds Chris Silverwood, who left his position in February following the heavy Ashes defeat in Australia.

McCullum said he is aiming to "move the team forward into a more successful era" alongside new captain Ben Stokes.

He added: "In taking this role on, I am acutely aware of the significant challenges the team faces at present, and I strongly believe in my ability to help the team emerge as a stronger force once we've confronted them head-on."

England are winless in nine Tests and have only one won of their past 17 matches.

McCullum's appointment continues England's post-Ashes overhaul, with Rob Key having taken over as managing director last month, replacing Andrew Strauss, who had stepped in on an interim basis following the sacking of Ashley Giles in February.

Root stood down as captain following March's 1-0 series defeat in the West Indies and was replaced by Stokes.

The England and Wales Cricket Board (ECB) selection panel of Key, strategic adviser Strauss, chief executive Tom Harrison and performance director Mo Bobat said McCullum was the "outstanding candidate" for the role.

"I've enjoyed several robust conversations with Rob Key about the direction of travel for the team and have

found his enthusiasm contagious," added McCullum.

"I'm no stranger to bringing about change within a team environment, and I can't wait to get started.

"Ben Stokes is the perfect character to inspire change around him, and I look forward to working closely with him to build a successful unit around us."

McCullum, who retired from playing in 2019, has never coached in first-class cricket, but played 101 Tests for New Zealand from 2004 to 2016.

He is currently head coach of Indian Premier League franchise Kolkata Knight Riders and previously coached Trinbago Knight Riders to the 2020 Caribbean Premier League title.

Kolkata are likely to go out of the IPL next Wednesday after their two remaining group games and McCullum is set to arrive in the UK later this month.

The squad for the first Test against New Zealand is set to be chosen next week.

In looking for Silverwood's successor, Key split the England head coach position into Test and white-ball roles.

McCullum, a close friend of England limited-overs captain Eoin Morgan, was initially approached over the white-ball post but has secured the Test job ahead of former South Africa and India coach Gary Kirsten, who was thought to be favourite for the position.

"It has been a real privilege to get to know Brendon and understand his views and vision for the game," said Key.

"He has a recent history of changing cricket culture and environments for the better, and I believe he is the person to do that for England's red-ball cricket.

"I believe in Brendon and Ben Stokes - a formidable coach and captain partnership. Time for us all to buckle up and get ready for the ride."

After three Tests against New Zealand, England face India in the rescheduled fifth Test in July before three Tests against South Africa in August and September.

McCullum captained New Zealand in 31 Tests, 62 one-day internationals and 28 Twenty20 internationals, leading

Liverpool manager Jurgen Klopp has confirmed his side will be without midfielder Fabinho for Saturday's FA Cup final against Chelsea.

The Brazilian came off with a hamstring injury in Tuesday's win at Aston Villa.

Fabinho will also miss the final two league games of the season, but Klopp hopes he will be fit in time for the Champions League final on 28 May.

"We can cope," Klopp said, when asked how the 28-year-old's absence
