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Team SKN at ILO Conference Gets Publicity Featuring Millions Of Viewers Reach

BASSETERRE, St.Kitts (Thursday 15th June 2023)- The St.Kitts-Nevis delegation participating in the 111th International Labour Organization (ILO) Conference being held in Geneva, Switzerland- hosted at the United Nations Headquarters-has gotten media interaction via a social media platform that reaches millions of young viewers, generally ages 17 to 28.

Government Advisor Geneva Liaison Ruben Escalante-Hasbun during an interview informed that Global Citizen is an [Non-Governmental] organization “that was founded 20 years ago by three guys who were at the age 23 in Australia and the idea was how to leverage the voices of young people into forcing politicians and the private sector to create change And it’s been growing and right now we are I want to say one of the largest advocacy organizations globally.”

He spoke about the approach of having influential and well-known entertainers being messengers.

“We usually use what is called like a ‘Pop and Policy Approach’. So, you will always see very sound political analysis, but at the same time it will come together with like Beyonce or Rihanna or Lady Gaga or Metallica or any of the big names because that is basically how we get young people Involved, you know, I mean if you follow It’s not the same kind of attention that you will get if you read a tweet by the Secretary General of the UN than that coming from your favorite pop star. So, it’s not about the message only but also about the messenger.”

According to Escalante-Hasbun: “And one of the big things that we do is we try to make sure that young people in the global South get engaged. We are very very committed with a small island developing states we have been working a lot with members in the

Caribbean and also the Pacific Islands and we hope to continue to be able to do that. And here what we are doing is basically that is deconstructing all the technical difficulties of a UN [United Nations] summit and we are breaking it down to our public.”

The Global Citizen official highlighted the role of the focus of the organization at the ILO event.

“It’s been always part of the staple things that we do so it’s always about taking things that are really complicated like financial support for members for countries or climate financing or the reform of the International Monetary Fund,and one of the reasons why a lot of people don’t want to engage with that is because number one- it sounds boring and number two, even when they are interested, it’s way too technical and they just don’t get it. So, you need to be able to find a way that you explain that to young people in a way that they get the gist of it in one minute and that they understand that it’s about them, right? That is affects them, it affects the access they will have to opportunitieslike climate change in the Caribbean right like the hurricane season and everything. Everybody’s aware that it’s affecting them at the personal level but when you try to explain concepts such as loss and damage or what is going to happen at COP 28 or what is happening here that’s when you tend to lose people because everything gets drowned in terminology terms and procedure whereas you should be focusing on giving the people access and highlighting their results.”

Notably, the 2023 United Nations Climate Change Conference or Conference of the Parties of the UNFCCC, more commonly referred to as COP28. It is slated to held from November 30th until December 12th at the Expo City, Dubai.

Escalante-Hasbun went to say:”...that is what we are doing with social justice. Social justice is a very ethereal concept. It can be defined in many ways but at the end it comes down to I think access to opportunities equality to Access resources and the ability to express your own voice but at the end of the day what you need to make sure is once this summit ends that countries and the private sector and employers and also everybody involved are going to be doing something about it and you need to stop you need to establish metrics that you can measure this against. Some of the metrics are already included in the SDGs (Sustainable Development Goals) for 2030 , and some of them are not, and that is going to be a challenge. I know that ILO is trying to launch a coalition for social justice and that is basically the big call to action of this summit but it will be about not only who makes part of the coalition but also what are going to be the targets that are going to be working against that can be measurable and that can be understood by people in simple terms.”

Delegation Head for Team SKN Permanent Secretary in the Ministry of Employment and Labour Denise Daniel was put in the Global Citizen media spotlight quizzed on the topic on the importance of social justice.

The other representatives for the delegation are Workers Representative Precious Mills of the St.Kitts-Nevis Trades and Labour Union, Labour Officer Jeneve Mills as well as the Chamber of Industry and Commerce Executive Director Kevin Taylor.

Asked about the social media platforms used by the Global Citizens and its outreach, Ruben Escalante-Hasbun replied: “ So at the very beginning when the NGO was founded we will do only Twitter and we were really effective about Twitter we will Launch what we call Twitter storms.So, back in the day, we would target one politician like the Prime Minister of Norway and then she will receive like hundreds of thousands of tweets from our audience until she will react Now social media has changed a little bit. So, we are doing still Twitter but we kind of like follow the tendencies of young people. So, now it’s more about tick-tock. It’s more about Instagram but The difference is that Tik-Tok and Instagram are visually based so you need to make sure that the video is appealing enough that they are going to stay and watch it; otherwise people just keep swiping and you need to make sure that you grab people’s attention What is the engagement level So the engagement is it depends on the issue it depends on whether we have something that is geolocated or if it’s global but if you add up all our following across social media, it adds up to 11 million people Now we would love for it to be like truly global, but we are still trying to get People to sign up to our app in Southeast

Basseterre, Saint Kitts and Nevis, June 14, 2023 (Press Secretary, PMO) - Prime Minister the Honourable Dr. Terrance Drew will assume

chairmanship of the Organisation of Eastern Caribbean States (OECS) when the OECS Authority holds its 73rd meeting in Saint Kitts and Nevis.

The incoming chairman will be among speakers at the opening ceremony on Sunday 18th June 2023 which begins at 5:00 pm at the Eastern Caribbean Central Bank Auditorium.

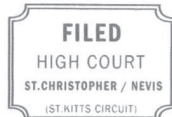

Basseterre, Saint Kitts and Nevis, June 14, 2023 (Press Secretary, PMO) - Saint Kitts and Nevis has taken a decision to join with fellow Caribbean countries to observe July 4 as a national holiday, to commemorate the Fiftieth (50th) Anniversary of the establishment of the Caribbean Community (CARICOM).

One of the decisions emanating from the Forty-Fourth (44th) Regular Meeting of the CARICOM Heads of Government in The Bahamas in February of this year, was the declaration of July 4, 2023, a National Holiday in all member states.

The Community will celebrate its golden jubilee under the theme ‘50 Years Strong: A Solid Foundation to Build on’.

An official message from the Prime Minister, Hon. Dr. Terrance Drew will be broadcast on CARICOM Day, July 4, 2023, via traditional and social media platforms to shed light on the myriad of accomplishments of our flagship regional integration organization.

All citizens and residents of the Federation of Saint Kitts and Nevis are invited to reflect on the legacy of CARICOM and its contribution to national and regional development.

CARICOM came into existence with the signing of the Treaty of Chaguaramas on 4 July 1973. The Founding Fathers who signed the Treaty on that date were: Prime Ministers Errol Barrow of Barbados, Forbes Burnham of Guyana, Michael Manley of Jamaica, and Eric Williams of Trinidad and Tobago.

The 50th anniversary celebrations will be held in Trinidad and Tobago, the birthplace of CARICOM, on July 3rd and 4th, where the 45th Meeting of the Conference of Heads of Government will be held. Other commemorative activities include digital exhibitions, cultural performances, and 5K and 10K road races.

Statement Of Update Re: Haitian Detainees

On February 2nd, 2023, fifteen (15) Haiti nationals arrived in the Federation of St. Kitts and Nevis after their boat malfunctioned in the area of Gallows Bay, Nevis. Since then, the Government of St. Kitts and Nevis has kept their basic needs satisfied and provided them with healthcare. Having entered the country illegally at that time, they were routinely detained in a government facility.

For humanitarian reasons, the Government of St. Kitts and Nevis has taken the decision to release the Haitians from detention and into the care of the local Haitian community as of June 10th, 2023. The Haitian community in the Federation had previously indicated as a collective that it is both ready and willing to fully accommodate its fellow countrymen and women.

In order to strengthen the regional thrust against human trafficking and illegal migration, the Government of St. Kitts and Nevis will shortly revise and enhance the nation’s laws on same, as well as the procedures through which asylum is sought. It is imperative that our nation’s legislation and laws are of a calibre that prohibits the inadvertent establishment or sustenance of a haven-like environment for human traffickers and illegal migrants.

Statement Of Update Re:Cameroonian Detainees

The Ministry of National Security wishes to provide the Federation of St. Kitts and Nevis with an update on the status of the fourteen (14) Cameroon nationals who were rescued at sea on March 28th, 2023.

On June 8th, 2023, the United Nations High Commission for Refugees (UNHCR) granted the Cameroon nationals “Asylum Seeker Status.” According to UNHCR’s definition, an asylum seeker is “someone whose request for sanctuary is yet to be processed.” Therefore, in addition to being protected against forced repatriation to their home country, the Cameroon nationals are entitled to continued humanitarian care while their asylum requests to UNHCR are being processed.

The Government of St. Kitts and Nevis will continue to collaborate closely with UNHCR and provide the Cameroon nationals with the necessary basic humanitarian services.

The official Asylum Seeker Certificates were hand-delivered to the Cameroon nationals at noon on June 10th, 2023, and the extended humanitarian provisions the Government has agreed to provide were also clearly communicated to them.

One such consideration is the Government’s decision to release them from detention and relocate them to an apartment complex with a view to increasing their comfort and autonomy. This arrangement will remain in place for ninety (90) days while their asylum applications are in progress.

In response, the Cameroon nationals communicated the following three (3) demands and stated that their hunger strike which they started the afternoon of June 9th, 2023, will continue until they have been met:

1. They wish to be issued with a United Nations identification card.
2. They wish to speak with the United States (US) Embassy or the US Congress.
3. They wish to be sent to their Cameroonian friends and family in Texas, US, as they claim they are specially protected under US law.

It was explained to the Cameroon nationals that these demands fall outside of the remit and authority of the Government of St. Kitts and Nevis, save and except the granting of access to communicate with the US Embassy. In this regard, they have been provided with the requisite email addresses, telephone numbers, and the physical address of the United States Embassy in Barbados.

In short order, the Government of St. Kitts and Nevis will be reviewing our nation’s asylum legislation and procedures as we cannot and will not tolerate illegal migration going forward. As a sovereign nation, the Government of St.Kitts and Nevis is adamant that the country will not become a safe haven for human traffickers and persons who use illegal means to enter our borders.

Mr. Liburd, Chief Credit Officer of The Bank of Nevis Limited, was elected Chairperson of the Board of Directors for the Nevis Division in April 2023. Speaking with the Department of Information, he outlined some the benefits of being a member of the CIC.

"We are not discriminating, so once you are a registered business we are here for you-tourism related, manufacturing, whatever type of business, we want to help you to position your business. Growth is essential for any business and the Chamber is quite willing to assist," he stated.

UNFCCC Executive Secretary Simon Stiell to Deliver William Demas Lecture at CDB's 53rd Annual Meeting

Climate Finance, a necessity for Caribbean countries faced with multiple threats from Climate Change, is the focus of the 2023 William G. Demas Memorial Lecture to be delivered by the Executive Secretary of the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change, (UNFCCC) Mr. Simon Stiell at the Caribbean Development Bank's (CDB) 53rd Annual Meeting. 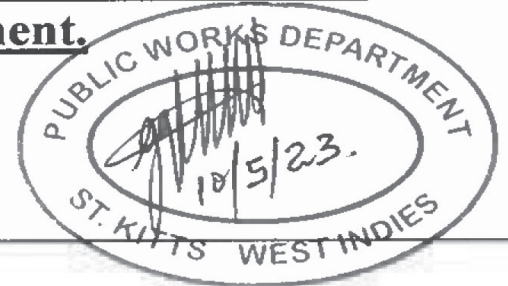

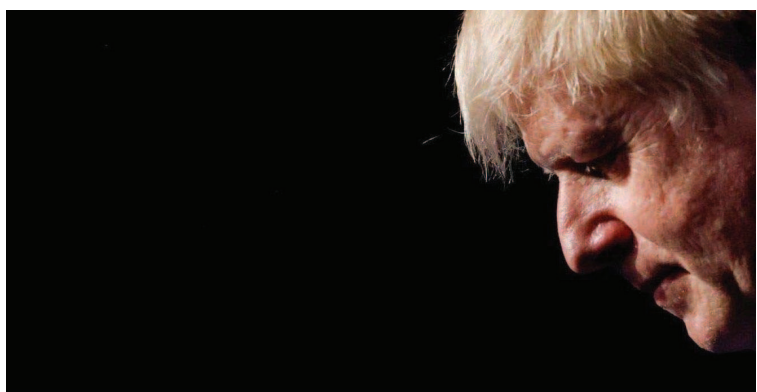

Blimey. This is a report - in breadth and depth - that demolishes Boris Johnson's character and conduct.

Let's be blunt: it says he lied.

The spine of the biography of Boris Johnson has his relationship with the truth running straight down it.

Sacked from The Times for making up a quote, when he was a young reporter. Sacked from the Conservative front bench for lying about an affair.

Just 40 weeks ago, Mr Johnson was prime minister, the figurehead of a government with a big majority.

Many are not widely known names.

I don't say that to deprecate or belittle them for a second, but to emphasise the power of Parliament.

A power Boris Johnson is feeling today like never before.

The crux of Mr Johnson's defence is this was cock up, not conspiracy.

That however forensic and conscientious this committee, how could it crawl into the mind of Mr Johnson to understand

the centre of an inquiry of such gravity.

It tried to do the former and claims to have managed to have done the latter.

"The committee now says that I deliberately misled the House, and at the moment I spoke I was consciously concealing from the House my knowledge of illicit events. This is rubbish. It is a lie," he claims.

Meta scientist Yann LeCun says AI won't destroy jobs forever

One of the three “godfathers of AI” has said it won’t take over the world or permanently destroy jobs.

Prof Yann LeCun said some experts’ fears of AI posing a threat to humanity were “preposterously ridiculous”.

Computers would become more intelligent than humans but that was many years away and “if you realise it’s not safe you just don’t built it,” he said.

A UK government advisor recently told the BBC that some powerful artificial intelligence might need to be banned.

In 2018 Prof LeCun won the Turing Award with Geoffrey Hinton and Yoshua Bengio for their breakthroughs in AI and all three became known as “the godfathers of AI”.

Prof LeCun now works as the chief AI scientist at Meta, the

parent company of Facebook, Instagram and WhatsApp. He disagrees with his fellow godfathers that AI is a risk to the human race.

“Will AI take over the world? No, this is a projection of human nature on machines” he said. It would be a huge mistake to keep AI research “under lock and key”, he added.

What is AI and what risks does it pose?

Warning using AI for loans and mortgages is big risk

People who worried that AI might pose a risk to humans did so because they couldn’t imagine how it could be made safe, Prof LeCun argued.

“It’s as if you asked in 1930 to someone how are you going to make a turbo-jet safe? Turbo-jets were not invented yet in 1930, same as human level AI has not been invented yet.”

“Turbo jets were eventually made incredibly reliable and safe,” and the same would happen with AI he said.

Meta has a large AI research programme and producing intelligent systems as capable as humans is one of its goals. As well as research, the company uses AI to help identify harmful social media posts.

Prof LeCun spoke at an event for invited press, about his own work in so-called Objective Driven AI which aims to produce safe systems that can remember, reason, plan and have common sense - features popular chatbots like ChatGPT lack.

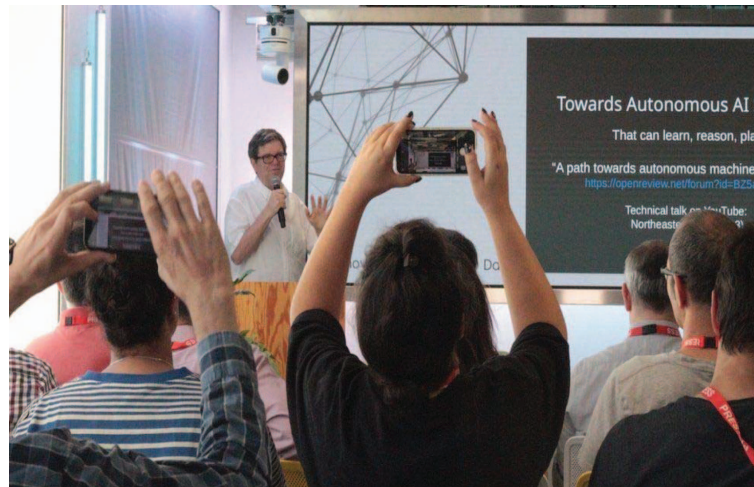

He said there was “no question” that AI would surpass human intelligence. But researchers were still missing essential concepts to reach that level, which would take years if not decades to arrive.

When people raise concerns about the human-level or above machines that might exist in the future, they are referring to artificial

general intelligence (AGI). These are systems, that like humans, can solve a wide range of problems.

There was a fear that when AGI existed scientists “get to turn on a super-intelligent system that is going to take over the world within minutes”, he said. “That’s you know just preposterously ridiculous.”

In response to a question from BBC news Prof LeCun said there would be progressive advances - perhaps you might get an AI as powerful as the brain of a rat. That wasn’t going take over the world, and he argued “it’s still going to run on a data centre somewhere with an off switch”. He added: “And if you realise it’s not safe you just don’t built it”.

Impact on jobs

It has been argued that AI has the potential to replace many jobs, and some companies have paused recruiting for certain roles as a result.

Prof LeCun told the BBC: “This is not going to put a lot of people out of work permanently”. But work would change because we have “no idea” what the most prominent jobs will be 20 years from now, he said.

Intelligent computers would create “a new renaissance for humanity” the way the internet or the printing-press did, he said.

Prof LeCun was speaking Tuesday ahead of a vote on Europe’s AI Act which is designed to regulate artificial intelligence.

He said from his conversations with AI start-ups in Europe “they don’t like it at all, they think it’s too broad, maybe too restrictive”. But he said he wasn’t an expert on the legislation,

Prof LeCun said he was not against regulation - but in his view each application would need its own rules, for example different rules would govern AI systems in cars and those scanning medical images.

Flight turbulence increasing as planet heats up - study

Flight turbulence has increased as climate change has warmed

the planet, researchers say.

Scientists at Reading University in the UK studied clear-air turbulence, which is harder for pilots to avoid.

They found that severe turbulence had increased 55% between 1979 and 2020 on a typically busy North Atlantic route.

They put the increase down to changes in wind speed at high altitudes due to warmer air from carbon emissions.

“Following a decade of research showing that climate change will increase clear-air turbulence in the future, we now have evidence suggesting that the increase has already begun,” said Prof Paul

Williams, an atmospheric scientist at the University of Reading who co-authored the study.

“We should be investing in improved turbulence forecasting and detection systems, to prevent the rougher air from translating into bumpier flights in the coming decades.”

Flight routes in the USA and North Atlantic saw the largest increases. Europe, the Middle East, and the South Atlantic also saw significant increases in turbulence.

Prof Williams said the increased turbulence was due to greater wind shear - or differences in wind speed - in the jet stream, a strong wind system blowing from west to east, about five to seven miles above the Earth’s surface. It exists largely due to a difference in temperature between the world’s equator and poles.

US doctors forced to ration as cancer drug shortages hit nationwide

Toni Dezomits, a 55-year-old retired law enforcement officer, is fighting a recurrence of her stage 4 ovarian cancer. She had already undergone several rounds of chemotherapy when her doctor told her she had some more bad news.

Just a day before her third round of treatment last month, Ms Dezomits was told there was a nationwide shortage of the generic chemotherapy drug, carboplatin - one of three medications she was meant to receive.

Forced to choose between going without the medication or swapping it for another with stronger side effects, the North Carolina native is finishing her final three chemotherapy sessions with only two of the recommended drugs.

"You have these two sub-optimal choices," she said. "I'm worried, because I know the drug I'm not getting is the one my cancer responded to very well [the first time]."

Experts say the US is currently suffering one of the most severe shortages of chemotherapy drugs it's seen for three decades.

Ms Dezomits is one of as many as 100,000 patients who may have been affected over the past several months, according to Dr Julie Gralow, the chief medical officer at the American Society of Clinical Oncology.

As of this week, the US Food and Drug Administration (FDA) said over 130 drugs were in short supply, 14 of which are cancer treatments.

Experts say a myriad of factors have contributed to the shortages, which this time have heavily affected two front-line therapies - carboplatin and cisplatin - used to treat a host of cancers, including head and neck, gynaecologic and gastrointestinal cancers.

The most recent shortage came after a plant in India - which supplied cisplatin materials for all US manufacturers - shut down

due to quality concerns. This drove up demand for a substitute drug, carboplatin, said Dr Gralow.

As a result, some providers have been forced to extend the time period between patients' chemotherapy sessions, while some patients have had to drive several hours to get treatment at different cancer centres.

When her local oncologist could not provide her carboplatin, Ms Dezomits tried a larger cancer centre in Texas where she had been before. But they told her they could not give her the drug because they were prioritising giving it to patients with better odds of being cured.

"It's like triage on the battlefield," said Ms Dezomits, who was a soldier in the Persian Gulf war. "This country should be a little better than that. We should be able to get life-saving drugs that cost about \$9 or \$10 a dose."

The low cost of generic front-line cancer drugs has actually played a role in recurrent chemotherapy drug shortages, experts say. While the medications are cheap to manufacture, pharmaceutical companies are not incentivised to do so because they don't bring in large profits, said Dr Karen Knudsen, CEO of the American Cancer Society.

The drug shortage issue has also worsened as US life expectancy has increased, meaning more people are becoming ill with cancer.

To help ease the supply chain crunches, the FDA began working with a Chinese manufacturer this week to import one of the chemotherapy drugs.

The move will likely help solve some short-term supply constraints in the coming months, but it will do little to address a more cyclical problem of chemotherapy drug shortages, said Dr Knudsen.

"An emergency solution is being put into place, but we are at a moment in time where there needs to be a more durable solution," she said.

Medical experts said the US government should work with the private sector to come up with more long-term solutions.

The US government could use its drug purchasing dollars to create national strategic reserves of the critical medicines and incentivise more higher-quality pharmaceutical companies to manufacture them, said Dr Gralow.

Patient Ms Dezomits fears that without more action, people across the US may continue to be put in challenging situations to find the cancer care they need.

"It's already stressful enough to deal with cancer and your own mortality," she said. "This is just another obstacle in front of patients that now they've got to think about."

invisible and hard to detect.

Turbulent flights are not only

uncomfortable, but can also cause injuries for those on the flight. Severe turbulence is very rare, but clear-air turbulence can come out of the blue, when

passengers are not belted in.

"Nobody should stop flying because they're afraid of turbulence, but it is sensible to keep your seat belt fastened all

the time, unless you're moving around, which is what the pilots do," said Prof Williams. "That is almost a guarantee that you will be safe even in the worst turbulence."

There are also financial consequences. The aviation

industry loses between \$150m (£120m) and \$500m (£400m) in the US alone annually due to effects of turbulence, including wear-and-tear on aircraft, said the researchers. It also has an environmental cost, as pilots burn up fuel avoiding it.

The study was published in the journal, Geophysical Research Letters.

near its parliament, citing a spying risk.

Prime Minister Anthony Albanese said intelligence agencies had given "very clear security advice" on the move.

Laws specifically drafted to halt construction were rapidly passed on Thursday after legal attempts to block the Canberra development failed.

The Kremlin said it was "yet another unfriendly action" which Russia would "take into account" in the future.

Australia was following the "Russophobic hysteria that is now going on in the countries of the collective West", said spokesman Dmitry Peskov.

A Russian diplomat earlier told AFP that the embassy was seeking legal advice.

The new legislation acknowledges that Russia may

be eligible for financial compensation.

The current embassy will not be affected by the new laws, which have bipartisan support.

Moscow currently holds the lease for a patch of land, acquired in 2008, some 400 metres (0.25 miles) from Canberra's Parliament House.

It has been laying the foundations for a new embassy building, but construction has proceeded slowly.

As relations between Australia and Russia soured in the wake of the invasion of Ukraine, the former moved to rescind permission for the new building.

A previous attempt to cancel the lease was thrown out by the federal court last month, prompting the new legislation.

The laws took less than five minutes to be introduced, and passed through the House of Representatives.

"We don't expect Russia is in a position to talk about international law, given their rejection of it so consistently and so brazenly with their invasion of Ukraine," said Mr Albanese, who condemned Russia's "illegal and immoral" invasion of Ukraine.

Former UK diplomat Alex Bristow of the Australian Strategic Policy Institute, told AFP that Russia has some of the "largest, most capable, most aggressive, and least constrained intelligence services" in the world.

"Given the proximity, it could be a form of electronic surveillance operating out of the embassy," he added.

Nottingham Open 2023: Andy Murray, Katie Boulter, Harriet Dart & Jodie Burrage all reach quarter-finals

Andy Murray reached the Nottingham Open quarter-finals with a 6-3 7-5 victory over France’s Hugo Grenier to cap a record-breaking day for British tennis.
Murray’s win came after Katie Boulter, Harriet Dart and Jodie Burrage joined Heather Watson in the women’s last eight - the first time four British women have reached the quarter-finals of the same WTA Tour event.
Burrage’s 7-5 6-3 victory over world number 21 and Australian Open semi-finalist Magda Linette was arguably the standout result.
“When we are all doing well it really pushes everyone on,” said world number 131 Burrage. “It is a bit daunting going on after the other two [Boulter and Dart] won, it was a little bit of pressure.
“But in the same breath it did help as well, but when you’re out on court you’re just wanting to win.”
In her first WTA quarter-final, the 24-year-old will face Poland’s Magdalena Frech in the opening match

on Centre Court at 11:00 BST on Friday.
Boulter and Dart will play each other in an all-British quarter-final in the following match, ensuring there will be at least one home player in the semi-finals on Saturday.
Watson, who booked her quarter-final spot on Wednesday, takes on Switzerland’s Viktorija Golubic in the third match on Centre.
‘Good friends’ Boulter and Dart set for all-British quarter-final
New British number one Boulter came through a tricky encounter with Ukrainian lucky loser Daria Snigur in straight sets to reach her third quarter-final at the Nottingham tournament.
Boulter, ranked 126 in the world after reaching the semi-finals of the Surbiton Trophy last week, beat 21-year-old Snigur 7-5 6-3.
Boulter squandered seven break points in the first set but was persistent and went on to capitalise on Snigur’s hampered movement, due to a knee injury she received treatment for midway through the second set.
“It was an absolute battle, I’m really proud of myself,” said Boulter.
“I put my heart on the line and played as well as I could. A couple of those games were ridiculous. It was so tough.”
Dart secured a 6-0 7-5 win over Ukrainian fifth seed Anhelina Kalinina to ensure her spot in the last eight.
The 26-year-old dominated the first set and did not drop a single game as Kalinina, number 25 in the world, struggled to get going.
But after Dart received treatment to what seemed like a lower-back strain, she was made to work for the second, going a break down but battling back to secure a late break of her own and progress.
“I hope to play more sets like that [first set],” said Dart. “I knew I had to come out firing - I’m just really pleased to be able to come through in two sets.
“We’re [she and Boulter] good friends but let the better player win tomorrow!”
Murray praises ‘brilliant’ British results
Murray, having claimed his first title on home soil since Wimbledon in 2016 with his win at Surbiton last week, secured an early break to take control of the

first set against Grenier.
The Frenchman came out firing in the second but the Scot rallied with a hold to love to draw level at 5-5 before following up with a break and then serving out the match to secure a straight-set win.
He is ranked 44th in the world and trying to secure a top-32 seeding for Wimbledon, which begins on 3 July.
“It’s been a lot of matches for me,” said Murray. “I’m an old boy now so it takes me a bit longer to recover but I’m feeling good.”
Murray joins fellow Briton George Loffhagen in Friday’s quarter-finals and said it was exciting to see so many home players having success at the tournament.
“It’s brilliant, especially for the women, they’ve done well this week. A lot of them have had injury problems but they’ve all started the grass-court season well. Let’s keep it going into the weekend.”
Anther Briton, Ryan Peniston, ranked 201 in the world, lost 6-4 6-2 to Switzerland’s number eight seed Dominic Stricker - who Murray will now face not before 16:00 BST on Friday.
Doubles success for Brits
In the men’s doubles, British duo Liam Broady and Jonny O’Mara secured a comfortable 6-1 6-4 win over India’s Yuki Bhambri and Saketh Myneni to reach the semi-finals.
Joining them in the last four are fellow Britons Jacob Fearnley and Johannus Monday, who beat Anirudh Chandrasekar and Vijay Sundar Prashanth 7-6 (7-4) 6-3, and the British pairs could meet in the title match should they both win their semi-finals.
In the women’s doubles, British pair Watson and Dart beat Spain’s Cristina Bucsa and Japan’s Makoto Ninomiya 6-4 7-6 (9-7) as they prepare for their respective quarter-finals on Friday.
Meanwhile in the Libema Open in the Netherlands, Britain’s Neal Skupski and Dutch team-mate Wesley Koolhof moved into the quarter-finals of the men’s doubles.
The top-seeded pairing, who lost in the US Open final last year, overcame American duo Nathaniel Lammons and Jackson Withrow in a final-set tie break 7-6 (7-4) 6-7 (5-7) 10-3.

The match against Curacao will be at 9pm at the DRV PNK Stadium in Fort Lauderdale.
