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Duggins On Small Business Growth Talks Removing Pain Points

BASSETTERRE, St.Kitts (Thursday 31st August 2023)- "The goal is to identify pain points and unnecessary rules that can be eliminated to save small enterprises valuable time and money. I will work with other ministries and agencies to streamline procedures for registering new businesses, applying for licenses..."

So said Minister of Entrepreneurship Samal Duggins during the official launch of the Ministry of Small Business and Entrepreneurship held on Tuesday 29th August 2023, at the Royal St.Kitts Hotel under the theme **'Building Businesses, Fuelling Innovation.'**

He was at the time talking about an aspect of three pillars identified as part of the vision for the new ministry.

He pointed out that when the government sought to create the Ministry upon taking office last August, "we came in with a vision. We recognize the need for entrepreneurial support."

Duggins said the launch of the ministry is a few steps closer to that vision. He also mentioned that his vision is to nurture the entrepreneurial ecosystem so that it continues to grow and thrive.

Praising the significance of small business, he remarked: "Small businesses are indeed the back bone of St.Kitts and Nevis' economy, providing jobs, innovation and opportunities for our citizens. It is a responsibility I take care very seriously being your minister. We know small business enterprises make up over 90 per cent of all businesses in our federation. Entrepreneurship is engrained in our national spirit and identity from the small shops in Basseterre to cottage industries in villages across the islands. Small villages are woven into the fabric of our communities."

The he talked about aiming to create policies and programmes that provide better support for small businesses at every stage of development from start-ups to established companies looking to expand.

On the topic of access to capital, which he said is a key pillar of his vision for the small business sector ,Duggins pointed out: "Improving access to capital access to affordable financing remain one of the biggest obstacles for small businesses and start-ups in St.Kitts and Nevis. We need to expand opportunities for small enterprises to secure the capital they need and get off the ground and expand."

He continued: "Strengthening loan guarantee programmes that provide critical backing for small businesses trying to obtain loans from commercial banks. By sharing the risk, we help more entrepreneurs qualify for credit even if they lack traditional collateral. With improved access to capital, we can unlock the potential of small businesses to drive innovations, create jobs and diversify our economy."

"By cutting red tape- small businesses often struggle with bureaucratic 'red tape' and burdensome regulations was identified as a pillar two. As Minister, I will spearhead efforts to review and reform policies to create a more business friendly legal and regulatory environment," was what he commented on for Pillar 2.

He said also that the government will conduct comprehensive assessment of

existing regulations affecting small business.

"The goal is to identify pain points and unnecessary rules that can be eliminated to save small enterprises valuable time and money. I will work with other ministries and agencies to streamline procedures for registering new businesses, applying for licenses, paying taxes and meeting other compliance obligations, digitalization of services will help to simplify and speed up interactions with government for you-our entrepreneurs."

Duggins added: "My aim is to reduce the hassle factor of small businesses interacting with the government while balancing important regulatory aims like consumer protection. By cutting red tape, we allow small enterprises to focus resources on productive business activities instead."

On Pillar 3, he touched on expanding training and monitoring.

He pointed out that beyond access to capital and a supportive regulatory climate, small business owners also need targeted assistance to strengthen their managerial, financial and technical skills. As minister, I would expand the training programmes offering and focusing on areas like business plan development, financial management, digital marketing, e-commerce and export readiness. Additionally, we would launch new small business mentorship initiatives that would match entrepreneurs with experienced advisors and industry veterans who can provide tailored guideline and support because by learning from others' successes and failures, small business owners can boost their own chances of thriving."

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Patriots Skipper Blames Not Sticking To Plan, Poor Bowling During Matches Held In SKN

BASSETERRE, St.Kitts (Thursday 31st August 2023)- “Nothing is guaranteed. We come here, we tried to win and it didn’t happen but nothing is guaranteed. We are humans, we gonna have to keep trying. The true fans always gonna remain true and keep supporting but nothing is guaranteed. The most we can do is just stay positive and come back strong.”

This was what St.Kitts and Nevis Patriots Skipper Sherfane Rutherford had to say when quizzed by local reporters on what he would say to fans about the experience in St.Kitts.

He remarks followed a losing streak closed off at the Republic Bank Caribbean Premier League (CPL) for the 12th match of the tournament for games played at the Warner Park Cricket Stadium on Sunday 27th August 2023 which

saw the Trinbago Knight Riders winning against the Patriots by 6 wickets (with 17 balls remaining).

Commenting on the team’s performance following that game, he said: “I think we didn’t bowl well again but having said that it’s cricket so nothing is guaranteed so I just think that we need to take the positive route and come back strong.”

Questioned about the turnaround, Rutherford stated:

“...It’s just about confidence and backing yourself and just stick to your length as long as possible. I didn’t think we stick to our length ...I didn’t think we stick to our plan for as long as possible, and coming against a team like Trinidad, you know you have to stick to your plan because they gonna come hard. It didn’t went [go] for us.”

Results for other matches played in the Fderation featuring the Patriots, For the 10th Match on Saturday 26th August 26, 2023, Barbados Royals won by 6 wickets (with 9 balls remaining), for the 8th Match played on Thursday 24th August, Guyana Amazon Warriors won by 65 runs and for the 7th Match-which was the first game featuring the

Patriots in St.Kitts-Nevis during the tournament, The Jamaica Tallawahs won by 8 wickets (with 21 balls remaining).

MOFA short urges UN to give Taiwan a voice

The Ministry of Foreign Affairs' short film "To Equality" highlights Taiwan's achievements toward the United Nations' Sustainable Development Goals while advocating for the country's right to a voice in the global body's general assembly and on the broader international stage. (MOFA)

A short film encouraging the United Nations to give Taiwan a voice at the upcoming General Assembly and other activities, mechanisms and meetings of the international body was released Aug. 28 by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs.

"To Equality" showcases Taiwan's implementation of the U.N. Sustainable Development Goals, including zero hunger, good health and well-being, quality education, gender equality, and partnerships for the goals.

The film tells five stories, beginning with the schools established in rural areas of eastern Taiwan's Hualien County for children of the Indigenous Amis people. The topic shifts to the country's first-place position in rankings of gender equality in Asia for five consecutive years, then moves to focus on use of telemedicine to connect isolated communities with the best doctors around the country.

The final two segments of the short film cover the use of blockchain technology by farmers in the eastern county of Taitung to ensure food security and missions from Taipei City-based International Cooperation and Development Fund (TaiwanICDF) to allies and developing countries around the world to help enhance agriculture and public health.

The MOFA said that the short film is aligned with the theme of the 78th General Assembly, "Rebuilding trust and reigniting global solidarity: Accelerating action on the 2030 Agenda and its

Sustainable Development Goals towards peace, prosperity, progress and sustainability for all," adding that the 78th UNGA opens Sept. 5 in New York, with the general debate scheduled for Sept. 19-23 and Sept. 26.

According to the ministry, the film is available in Chinese and English on the ministry's official Facebook page and Twitter account, as well as its Trending Taiwan YouTube channel, Facebook and Twitter. Videos subtitled in Arabic, French, German, Indonesian, Japanese, Portuguese, Spanish, Thai, Ukrainian and Vietnamese will be released in the following days.

In a tweet on its official Twitter account, the MOFA said, "Because we intimately understand the pain of exclusion, #Taiwan is all the more committed to advancing equality both at home & abroad. That's why we walk hand in hand with the world on the path toward equity & sustainability. Support our @UN inclusion, endorse #Taiwan4SDGs!" (YCH-E)

MOFA glad of UK parliamentary report's China concern

The Ministry of Foreign Affairs appreciates the recognition of Taiwan as a country by the British Parliament's House of Commons Foreign Affairs Committee in a report on the United Kingdom's Indo-Pacific policy released Aug. 30. (MOFA)

The Ministry of Foreign Affairs sincerely welcomed the show of support from the House of Commons Foreign Affairs Committee for Taiwan's sovereignty in a policy review report published by the British parliamentary body Aug. 30.

In the document, which evaluates and makes suggestions regarding the United Kingdom's foreign policy in the Indo-Pacific, the committee calls for the government to contribute to the defense of the right of Taiwan's people to self-determination. It is in this context that the Foreign Affairs Committee acknowledges Taiwan as a de facto independent country, citing factors such as its government, clearly defined territory and permanent population.

The committee also urges the British government to increase high-level official visits between the U.K. and Taiwan and to use its position as a new member in the Comprehensive and Progressive Agreement for Trans-Pacific Partnership to campaign for Taiwan's admission.

The MOFA described the U.K. as a like-minded partner and said that Taiwan has been deepening collaboration with the country in education, economy and trade, offshore wind power, technology, and the semiconductor industry. Taiwan's government will continue to promote cooperation and exchange with the U.K. in a variety of fields with the aim of creating prosperity and welfare for the people of both nations, the ministry added. The reinstated licenses signify the culmination of a process aimed at acknowledging their valuable contributions to the nation's healthcare system.

In 2013, several nurses from Saint Kitts and Nevis pursued training opportunities in Cuba to further their medical education and skills, gaining General Nursing Certificates, and Associate Degrees in Nursing, but were not recognized by the St. Christopher and Nevis Nurses and Midwives Council upon returning to the Federation. However, only those who completed the Bachelor of Science Degrees in Nursing were licensed with the St. Christopher and Nevis Nurses and Midwives Council in 2013, but their licensures were rescinded in 2015.

In a special ceremony held on Tuesday, August 29, 2023, at the JNF General Hospital Conference Room, the Honourable Prime Minister and Minister of Health, Dr. Terrance Drew, formally recognized the nurses' achievements and reinstatement status as Licensed Registered Nurses. Prime Minister Drew highlighted the significance of this occasion in a heartfelt address

to the nurses:

"There need to be some reparations, and I will see how much compensation we can give for what you suffered...The Nursing Council, now, has revisited your situation and they have taken, in my estimation, the correct action, and today what has been delayed for almost a decade, you are now being accepted fully as nurses in the industry. I have worked with you. I have seen how you work. In my estimation, there is no deficiency. You are as qualified as any other nurse to work."

He continued, "I want to encourage you to continue to be the professionals that you are—I want you to take to heart the new thrust that the Nursing Council has taken in terms of really bringing you fully into the profession. I know you follow the codes of Nightingale who set the trail for what the nursing profession is all about. I encourage you to stay close to the ethos of the basis from which the profession was formed."

Prime Minister Drew further expressed his gratitude to the four nurses for their remarkable service, commitment, and indomitable spirit.

Beekeepers to the rescue after 5 million bees fall off truck in Canada

Beekeeper Michael Barber woke up on Wednesday morning to several calls from police looking for help after five million bees fell off a truck in Canada.

The hives were being transported when the straps holding them in place came loose, allowing them to slip free.

Mr Barber said he arrived to "a pretty crazy cloud of bees" who were "very angry, confused and homeless".

Drivers were told to keep their windows up and pedestrians to stay away.

The scene in Burlington, Ontario was unlike anything Mr Barber has experienced in his 11-year career.

"It was something else," he told the BBC. "I hope to never experience it again."

Mr Barber, who owns Tri-City Bee Rescue in nearby Guelph, said he first received the calls from local police at around 07:00 local time (12:00 GMT), informing him that there was an accident that resulted in bee hives being spread all over the road.

At the same time police put out a public call on social media urging people to stay away from the area, which is about an hour south of Toronto.

The bees were in their hives packed up on the back of a truck and being transported to their wintering location when the accident happened.

As soon as Mr Barber heard from police, he put out a call to other beekeepers for additional help. About a dozen beekeepers eventually helped corral the insects.

Mr Barber said the bees and their hives were scattered over a 400-meter (1,300-foot) radius. On nearby cars and mail posts some of the younger bees were clustering, which he

said they do when they are seeking safety.

"There were probably a thousand bees on the front of my truck," he said.

Other bees, ones that were

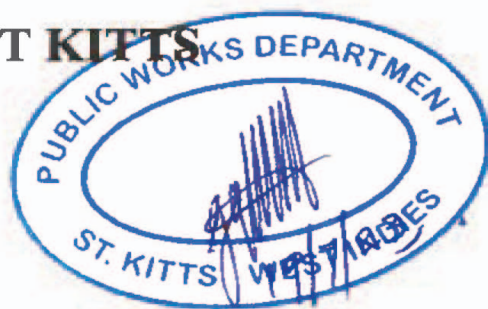

Burger King faces legal claim over size of Whopper

Burger King must face a lawsuit that alleges it makes its Whopper burger appear larger on its menus than it is in reality, a US judge has ruled.

The lawsuit accuses the fast food giant of misleading customers by showing the burger with a meatier patty and ingredients that "overflow over the bun".

"The plaintiffs' claims are false," Burger King told the BBC.

Rivals McDonald's and

Wendy's are facing a similar lawsuit in the US.

The class action lawsuit against Burger King alleged that the Whopper was made to look 35% larger, with more than double the amount of meat compared to what was actually served to customers.

Burger King had earlier argued that it was not required to deliver burgers that look "exactly like the picture".

In the ruling, US District Judge Roy Altman said it should be left to jurors to "tell us what reasonable people think".

However, he dismissed claims that Burger King misled customers with its television and online advertisements.

"The flame-grilled beef patties portrayed in our advertising are the same patties used in the millions of Whopper sandwiches we serve to guests nationwide," a Burger King spokesperson said in a statement after the ruling.

Lawyer Anthony Russo, who represents the plaintiffs, did not immediately respond to a BBC request for comment.

The Burger King website describes the Whopper as "the burger to rule them all", that contains a "real meaty" beef patty, and other ingredients.

Other fast food chains have recently faced legal challenges over claims of false advertising.

Earlier this year, Taco Bell was sued in the US for selling pizzas and wraps that allegedly contained half the filling that was advertised.

Last year, a man in New York proposed a class-action lawsuit against McDonald's and Wendy's, in which he accused the two companies of unfair and deceptive trade practices.

The lawsuit alleged that McDonald's and Wendy's burgers in marketing materials were at least 15% larger than they were in real life.

In the UK, the Advertising Standards Authority (ASA)

Live worm found in Australian woman's brain in world first

In a world first, scientists say an 8cm (3in) worm has been found alive in the brain of an Australian woman.

The “string-like structure” was pulled from the patient’s damaged frontal lobe during surgery in Canberra last year.

“It was definitely not what we were expecting. Everyone was shocked,” said operating surgeon Dr Hari Priya Bandi.

The woman, 64, had for months suffered symptoms like stomach pain, a cough and night sweats, which evolved into forgetfulness and depression.

She was admitted to hospital in late January 2021, and a scan later revealed “an atypical lesion within the right frontal lobe of the brain”.

But the cause of her condition was only revealed by Dr Bandi’s knife during a biopsy in June 2022.

The red parasite could have been alive in her brain for up to two months, doctors said.

The woman, who lived near a lake area in south-eastern New South Wales state, is recovering well.

Her case is believed to be the first instance of a larvae invasion and development in the human brain, researchers said in the Emerging Infectious Diseases journal which reported the case.

‘I pulled it out... and it was happily moving’

The neurosurgeon who found the worm said she had only begun to touch the brain part that had shown up strangely in the scans when she felt it.

“I thought, gosh, that feels funny, you couldn’t see anything more abnormal,” said Dr Bandi.

“And then I was able to really feel something, and I took my tweezers and I pulled it out and I thought, ‘Gosh! What is that? It’s moving!’”

“Everyone was shocked. And the worm that we found was happily moving, quite vigorously, outside the brain,” she said.

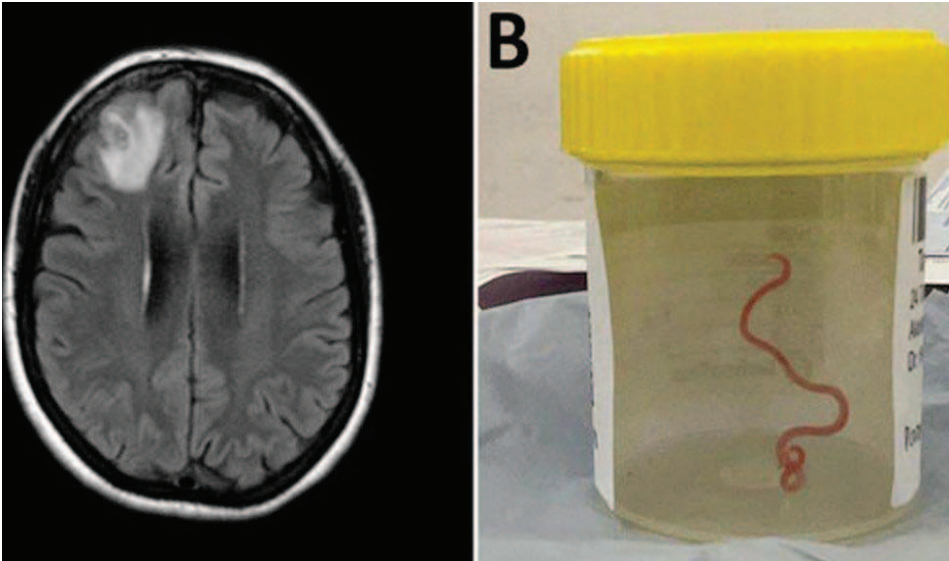

She then consulted her colleague Sanjaya Senanayake, an infectious diseases

expert, on what they should do.

“Everyone [in] that operating theatre got the shock of their life when [the surgeon] took some forceps to pick up an abnormality and the abnormality turned out to be a wriggling, live 8cm light red worm,” said Dr Senanayake.

“Even if you take away the yuck factor, this is a new infection never documented before in a human being.”

Researchers warn the case highlights the increased danger of diseases and infections being passed from animals to people.

The Ophidascaris robertsi roundworm is common in carpet pythons - non-venomous snakes found across much of Australia.

Scientists say the woman most likely caught the roundworm after collecting a type of native grass, Warrigal greens, beside a lake near where she lived. The area is also inhabited by carpet pythons.

Writing in the journal, Australian parasitology expert Mehrab Hossain said she suspected the woman became an “accidental host” after using the foraged plants - contaminated by python faeces and parasite eggs - for cooking.

“The invasion of the brain by Ophidascaris larvae had not been reported previously,” writes Dr Hossain.

“The growth of the third-stage larva in the human host is notable, given that previous experimental studies have not demonstrated larval development in domesticated animals, such as sheep, dogs, and

cats.”

Dr Senanayake - who is also an associate professor of medicine at the Australian National University (ANU) - told the BBC the case is a warning.

The ANU team reports that 30 new types of infections have appeared in the last 30 years. Three-quarters are zoonotic - infectious diseases that have jumped from animals to humans.

“It just shows as a human population burgeons, we move closer and encroach on animal habitats. This is an issue we see again and again, whether it’s Nipah virus that’s gone from wild bats to domestic pigs and then into people, whether it’s a coronavirus like Sars or Mers that has jumped from bats into possibly a secondary animal and then into humans.”

“Even though Covid is now slowly petering away, it is really important for epidemiologists and governments to make sure they’ve got good infectious diseases surveillance around.”

angrier and older, were buzzing around.

After a few hours, most of the bees were able to find their hives, Mr Barber said, but a few hundred bees did not survive the accident.

Some beekeepers were also stung.

The driver of the truck was stung more than 100 times, Mr Barber said, as he wasn’t wearing a full beekeeper suit. Paramedics were nearby and he was not seriously injured.

“There were a lot of flying bees that made even beekeepers in full suits nervous,” he said.

He said he was grateful for the many local beekeepers that worked to keep the insects and the public safe, and added that the incident is a good reminder to always securely strap your bees.

“Lesson learned. Everybody survived and a few bees were hurt,” he said. “Hopefully the hives will survive the winter.”

Britain recorded a haul of two golds, three silver and five bronze medals after nine days of competition.

Britain won 10 medals in Stuttgart in 1993 when Linford Christie, Colin Jackson and Sally Gunnell took golds.

Johnson Withe Bat, Thorne with Ball Deliver Superb Win in 2nd Youth ODI

A brilliant batting display, followed by disciplined bowling led West Indies Rising Stars Men’s Under 19 to a superb victory over Sri Lanka Under 19 in the second Youth One-Day International on Wednesday at the International Cricket Stadium in Dambulla.

Jordan Johnson made a match-winning century after West Indies were asked to bat first. They scored 320-8 off their 50 overs. Isai Thorne then produced a quick spell of fast bowling which wreck the Sri Lanka batting. The home side were bowled out for 125 in the 31st over as West Indies won by a whopping 195 runs. The series is now levelled 1-1 with the third and final match to be played on Friday.

The left-handed Johnson played with great aplomb as he recorded his maiden century in his seventh Youth ODI. He made 105 off just 79 balls with 12 fours and three sixes. He brought up his century when he got a single into the leg side which was met with rapturous applauds by teammates and spectators. He celebrated by taking a “bow” and raising his bat aloft.

He shared a crucial third-wicket stand of 160 with Joshua Dorne, who made 56 off 73 balls with six boundaries. When they both fell, Tarrique Edward maintained the momentum with an explosive 53 not out which came off just 36 balls as he smashed two boundaries and three towering sixes.

In the second half of the match Thorne took centre stage as he grabbed three wickets in the space of 12 balls to leave the Sri Lanka innings in tatters at 40-6 in the 14th over. He ended with impressive figures of 7-3-18-3. He was well supported by new ball bowlers Deshawn Edwards (3-30) and Nathan Edward (2-17). It was also a good day in the field as wicket-keeper Divonie Joseph held three catches on debut - including two in one over off the rampaging Thorne.

Keely Hodgkinson took 800m silver behind Kenya’s Mary Moraa.

Bronze - 5:

Zharnel Hughes won 100m bronze to claim Britain’s first medal in the event since Darren Campbell in 2003.

Ben Pattison secured a surprise 800m bronze. to earn his first global medal. The **women’s 4x100m relay team** of Asha Philip, Imani-Lara Lansiquot, Bianca Williams and Daryll Neita also won bronze.
