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Glen ‘Ghost’ Phillip Passes Away Days After Birthday;

Shawn Richards Remembers Celebration Outings

BASSETERRE, St. Kitts (Thursday 1st August 2024)- News of the death of well-known public figure 57-year-old Glen ‘Ghost’ Phillip, days after his birthday, has sent shockwaves throughout the Federation.

On Thursday 1st August 2024, many people from all walks of life who knew the former business professional, national basketball athlete, community activist and also past government minister and former Parliamentary Representative for Constituency Four under the Douglas-led St.Kitts-Nevis Labour Party administration-SKNLP) took to social media to express sadness and shock.

In tribute, the House of National Assembly adjourned its scheduled sitting that day which saw ministers of the present SKNLP administration led by Prime Minister Dr. Terrance Drew, sharing tributes before the adjournment of parliament.

Phillip recently celebrated his birthday on Saturday 20th July. Immediate past leader of the People’s Action Movement (PAM) and former Deputy Prime Minister of the Team Unity administration Shawn Richards, via his Facebook account also paid respect to his friend and shared details of what Phillip’s last birthday celebration looked like.

“Two Fridays ago, I received a phone call from my late friend, Glen Ghost Phillip, just after midday. We joked about my unavailability to meet with him due to my location in Nevis. We also talked about his upcoming birthday, the following day, July 20th. He told me about his plans for an early evening celebration before having a quieter birthday at home. Upon returning to St. Kitts, I agreed to meet him later that evening. When I got back, we celebrated with a small group of friends, and as the clock struck midnight, we raised our glasses for a heartfelt toast on his

birthday. We sincerely wished him happiness, a long life, good health, and many other positive blessings,” he shared.

Richards added: “I took the opportunity to once more extend birthday wishes with a phone call later in the day and inquired about his decision to stay in and consume nothing more than water. To my mild surprise, he said he was succumbing to the persuasions of friends and coming out, leading us to meet again that day. Imagine my further surprise when, the following

Sunday, our paths crossed once more for quite a few hours as he humorously accounted for an early morning shopping errand that had extended beyond his initial intent. He joked that the chicken that he had bought to cook had perhaps already thawed out.”

He went on to say: “Less than a week ago, our most recent interaction was accompanied by an invitation to meet. We traversed from McKnight to the strip, then to Newtown while engaging in a seamless discussion. We touched on various subjects during our outings, including his son’s post-graduation employment, his daughter’s progress, his intended participation in a family reunion in Antigua this week, national affairs, sports, and even my retirement as the leader of PAM, all the while not allowing our differing political affiliations to overshadow our camaraderie. His capacity as an advisor in the Ministry of Sports began under my tenure as the minister. I held his insight and experience in high regard.”

Richards expressed that he is saddened and shocked. “The news of Glen Ghost Phillip’s passing this morning has profoundly saddened and shocked me. His vitality and spirit, evident in our recent interactions, are poignant reminders of his departure. I am grateful for his enduring friendship, invaluable guidance, and unwavering commitment to the well-being of our nation and its people. My heartfelt condolences go out to his entire family, especially his children and their mother. Rest in peace, my dear friend. You will be sorely missed.”

Cricket West Indies Announces Return of Deandra Dottin to International Cricket

St. John's, Antigua - Cricket West Indies (CWI) is delighted to announce that Deandra Dottin has decided to come out of retirement and will be available for selection to represent the West Indies Women's international cricket team once again.

In a heartfelt letter to CWI, Dottin expressed her enthusiasm to return to the game, stating: "Representing West Indies in international cricket has always been a matter of great pride and passion for me. After a period of reflection and thoughtful dialogue with various parties within Cricket West Indies, including Cricket West Indies President, Dr.

Kishore Shallow, I am pleased to inform you that I am eager to return to the game that I love, and contribute my utmost to the West Indies women's team across all formats, with immediate effect."

She continued, "I am confident that my experience, maturity, and skills will add value to the team as it has done in the past, and I am prepared to furnish my best efforts in every match and training session to ensure the team's winning trajectory in international cricket. Moreover, I am enthusiastic about

mentoring younger players and contributing to the overall development of women's cricket in our region."

CWI Director of Cricket, Miles Bascombe, welcomed Dottin's return, acknowledging her talent and potential impact on the team: "Deandra is a player of immense ability and experience. We are pleased with her decision to return to international cricket and be eligible for selection. There is no doubt that she could add significant value to the West Indies Women's teams."

Deandra Dottin, who will lead the Trinbago Knight Riders women's team for the third consecutive year in the upcoming WCPL tournament, last played for West Indies in 2022. She has 270 international matches across ODI and T20I. In 2010, she scored the first Women's T20I century. Last month, MCC awarded Dottin with Honorary Life Membership of the club.

West Indies Women will have a camp in August 2024. The players will also be engaged in the CPL next month. The next international assignment will be the T20 World Cup in Bangladesh from October 2 - 19, 2024.

United States Provides Additional \$2 Million to Support Hurricane Beryl Recovery in Eastern Caribbean

Bridgetown, Barbados | July 30, 2024 - The U.S. Government through the U.S. Agency for International Development (USAID) has announced an additional \$2 million in funding to support recovery efforts in the Eastern Caribbean following the devastation caused by Hurricane Beryl. The hurricane caused significant damage across Barbados, Grenada, Saint Lucia, and Saint Vincent and the Grenadines. The USAID assistance will focus on supporting regional economic resilience and revitalization/recovery, particularly in the fisheries, agriculture, and informal business sectors, and Micro-, Small, and Medium Enterprises (MSMEs) in Barbados, Grenada, Saint Lucia, and Saint Vincent and the Grenadines. The announcement was made at the CARICOM Heads of Government meeting in St. George's, Grenada.

"In a disaster like Hurricane Beryl, small businesses, including fisherfolk and farmers, are often the hardest hit. As a former small business owner, I am a strong advocate for United States leadership in supporting the recovery of fisheries, agriculture, and small and medium-size businesses. I am proud we are helping our friends, neighbors and partners get back on their feet and building a more resilient future," said Ambassador Roger Nyhus.

Over the past two years, the U.S. Government, through USAID, has invested more than \$29 million in the Eastern and Southern Caribbean to help countries and populations withstand external shocks - manmade and natural - that impede economic development and limit the region's safety, security, and prosperity. USAID has already pledged over \$4.5 million to the region for immediate recovery efforts related to Hurricane Beryl.

**JOIN THE ST. KITTS-NEVIS
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BVI Pledge Over One Million EC Dollars to Hurricane Recovery Efforts in Grenada and St. Vincent and the Grenadines

The Premier of the British Virgin Islands (BVI), Dr. Natalio Wheatley, announced that his government would be donating almost half a million US dollars (1,068,000 XCD) to the Hurricane Beryl recovery efforts in St. Vincent and the Grenadines and Grenada. Each country will receive a total of \$200,000 US dollars.

The Premier made this announcement during the opening of the Organisation of Eastern Caribbean States (OECS) Environmental Sustainability Exhibition at the H. Lavity Stoult Community College on July 24, 2024. The OECS hosted the 11th Council of Ministers on Environmental Sustainability (COM: ES 11) in the British Virgin Islands on July 24 - 25, with Dr. Wheatley serving as the Chair. In his remarks to the meeting’s participants, he mentioned that “this very meeting, originally slated for July 3 and 4, had to be postponed on account of three OECS member states being affected by unprecedented, record-breaking Hurricane Beryl.”

He further reminded attendees that “Hurricane Beryl left a trail of devastation in its wake in Grenada’s Carriacou, where approximately 60% of homes were damaged or destroyed, and critical infrastructure such as roads and power lines were severely impacted. St. Vincent and the Grenadines’ Union Island faced similar devastation, with an estimated 70% of buildings sustaining damage and essential services disrupted for weeks. The storm’s ferocity and the unprecedented damage it caused in these islands are stark indicators of the increasing severity of climate-related disasters. As Premier of the Virgin Islands, I offer my deepest empathy for the leaders and people of all Caribbean countries affected in some way by Hurricane Beryl.”

The issue of climate change has been central to the discussions of the Council of Ministers on

Environmental Sustainability with its regional and international partners, given that OECS member states are on the front lines of the climate change battle and facing such devastating impacts.

Dr. Wheatley sympathised with his fellow ministers and pledged solidarity with them in this existential battle. He stated: “Having experienced catastrophic damage from category 5 hurricanes Irma and Maria in 2017 and still actively recovering, the Virgin Islands is all too familiar with the realities on the ground right now in these countries and the long road to recovery ahead. The Virgin Islands stands in solidarity with you, and rest assured that just as the OECS Member countries were there to support the Virgin Islands in the wake of hurricanes Irma and Maria, we are here to support St. Vincent and the Grenadines and Grenada.”

The two-day OECS Council of Ministers gave special focus to the support of impacted member states, increased recognition of OECS vulnerabilities, and the urgency for resilient prosperity, in line with the SIDS4 outcome, “Antigua and Barbuda Agenda for SIDS (ABAS).”

The meeting focused on a range of critical issues, including housing, renewable energy, and capacity building.

Dion Dolphin gave Security Forces an early lead in the 3rd minute of the match, but Ronald Williams ensured Molineux were not going down without a fight with a 88th minute goal. Still, the result was enough to give Security Forces the Division 1 title, with 42 points at the top of the table. Coach of Security Forces Iroy Jeffers lauded

his players for the accomplishment. He recalled taking over the team halfway into the season with an unbeaten record, and his experience in guiding them to the title.

"It was a difficult decision to make but after talking to my daughter, she gave me the go ahead to challenge myself. I went (to training) for the first time and saw the players. They are respectful, loving willing to learn, which is the most important thing and everything (took off)," Jeffers said.

Despite winning the title and earning a place in the National Bank Group of Companies Premier League for next season, Jeffers said it will not be easy and they will have to work exceptionally hard. "In the premier level, its better players, better coaches, better referees. You have to be hungry and learn as quickly as possible," Jeffers surmised.

Meanwhile, Keith King, the goalkeeping coach for the team, spoke about the work and effort in improving the Security Forces defense ahead of the season. Security Forces conceded only 15 goals all season, less than all the teams in Division

1. "One thing we tried to focus on is improving defensively. People say goals win championships and if you don't give up goals, you technically can't lose. We try to install in the players how important it is to keep the ball out of the back of the net, how important it is to work with each other as a defensive unit and make sure the opponent has a hard task getting past the defensive line," King disclosed. Security Forces still has one more match to go before ending the season, which will be played this Tuesday at the Technical Center.

UFC's £262m settlement for former fighters rejected

The UFC has criticised a judge who rejected a financial settlement it had reached with former fighters.

In March the UFC's parent company the TKO Group agreed a £262m (\$335m) settlement in two lawsuits that represented about 1,200 former UFC athletes.

The group of former fighters claimed the UFC's contracts suppressed athletes' abilities to negotiate other promotional options.

However, earlier this week in Nevada Judge Richard Boulware refused to accept the settlement and set a tentative trial date for October.

"We obviously disagree with this ruling," the UFC said.

"As we have said throughout this process, we believe strongly in the merits of our cases and are evaluating all our options, including, without limitation, an appeal, and have initiated discussions with plaintiffs' counsel who have expressed a willingness to engage in separate settlement discussions for the Le and Johnson cases."

There are two separate lawsuits, one filed by fighters Cung

Le and Nate Quarry in 2014 representing fighters from 2010 to 2017, and a second filed by fighters such as Kajan Johnson that represents fighters from 2017 to the present.

The UFC had reached a joint settlement for both cases. The first lawsuit could begin on 28 October.

Plaintiffs in both cases say are they open to "re-engaging" with the UFC over a new settlement or moving forward with the trial.

The judge had previously said he felt the settlement number was too low.

The UFC merged with World Wrestling Entertainment (WWE) in 2023 to form the TKO Group.

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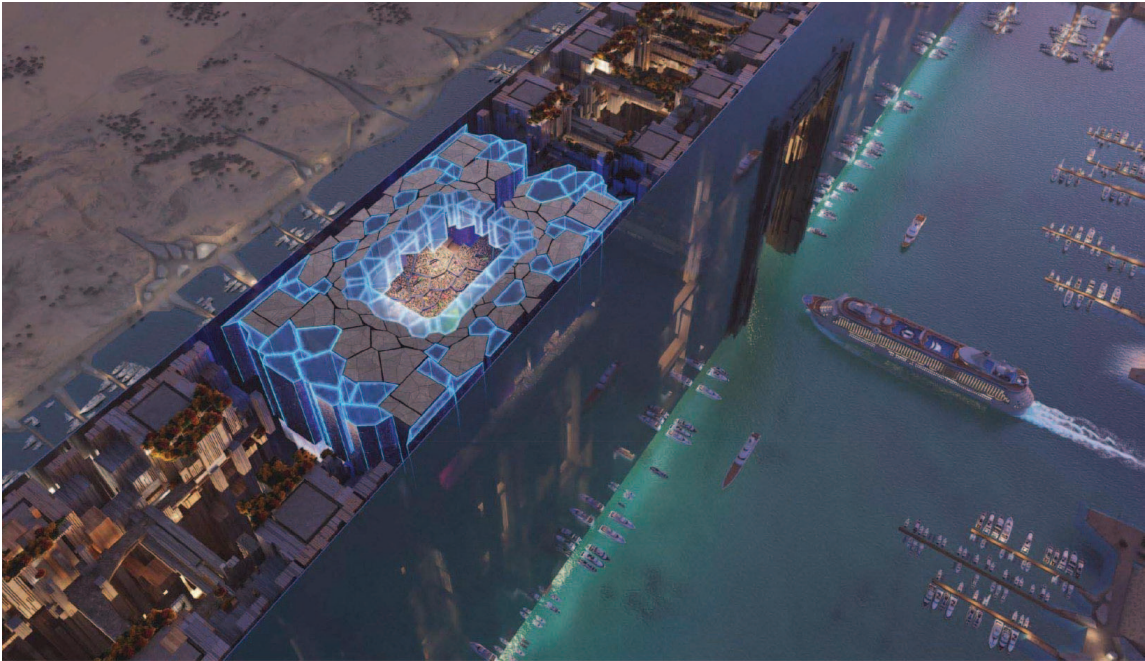
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Saudi 2034 plans include stadium 350m above ground

Saudi Arabia has submitted plans to build 11 stadiums - including one set 350 metres above ground level - as part of the country’s bid to host the 2034 World Cup.

The proposed stadium in Neom, an as-yet-unbuilt city in the north-west of the country, will only be accessible via high-speed lifts and driverless vehicles.

The arena, which is part of the country’s ‘The Line’ project to diversify the kingdom’s economy away from oil, is set to host a quarter-final fixture.

Saudi Arabia’s bid is uncontested and the country had until October’s deadline to submit its plans.

Of the 11 new stadiums, eight will be in the capital Riyadh - including the 92,760 King Salman International Stadium, which will host the opening game and the final.

The cities of Jeddah, Al Khobar and Abha will also host matches.

The 2034 World Cup will be the first time the expanded tournament is held in just one country as a 48-team event.

The hosts are set to be confirmed by the Fifa congress on 11 December.

How much development needs to be done?

An entire new city will need to be built in Neom’s case.

Its flagship project, The Line, has been pitched as a car-free city, just 200m (656ft) wide and 170km (106 miles) long - though only 2.4km of the project is reportedly expected to be completed by 2030., external

The Line will be taller than the Empire State Building and about as long as the distance between Bristol and London.

The bid document claims the new Neom stadium will be “run entirely on renewable energy”, mainly from wind and solar sources.

There are plans to build a new international airport in Neom, which the bid document states will have 12 million domestic and international visitors annually by 2034.

The airports in all the other host cities are also set to be expanded, with Riyadh expected to have 100m passengers per year by 2034 - an increase of 170% on 2023 - while Abha airport will be upgraded to increase its passenger capacity from 1.5m to 8m in time for the tournament.

Saudi Arabia is also planning to extend train lines and bus routes, with the document stating “navigation around the country will be quick and efficient”.

Qatar reportedly spent \$220bn (£172bn) to host the 2022 World Cup.

The Saudi bid document does not state an overall cost of hosting, but the plans outlined will probably require hundreds of billions of dollars.

When could it take place?

As was the case with the 2022 World Cup in Qatar, a winter tournament may be necessary for temperatures to be cool enough.

Temperatures in Saudi Arabia are at their mildest between October and April.

During those months, average daily temperatures in host cities range between 15 and 30 degrees Celsius.

Between May and September, average daily temperatures range between 17 and 38C.

Sportswashing concerns

Saudi Arabia is thought to have invested more than £5bn in sport since 2021, when the country’s Crown Prince made it a key part of his strategy to diversify the economy.

It has hosted several major sporting events, including in football, Formula 1, golf and boxing, while the country’s Public Investment Fund has launched the breakaway LIV Golf series, taken control of four Saudi Pro League clubs and purchased Newcastle United.

However, the Gulf kingdom has been accused of using its investment in sport and the hosting of high-profile events to improve its international reputation - a process known as ‘sportswashing’.

It has been criticised for its human rights violations and has faced accusations over the 2018 murder of journalist Jamal Khashoggi, women’s rights abuses, the criminalisation of homosexuality, the restriction of free speech and the war in Yemen.

The Saudi government says the investment in sport is boosting the economy, opening it up to tourism and inspiring people to be more active.

According to Fifa guidelines, countries bidding to host the event must commit to respect human rights.

Speaking to BBC Sport in December, Saudi Arabia’s sports minister Prince Abdulaziz bin Turki Al Faisal said claims of sportswashing against the country are “very shallow”.

“Any country has room for improvement, no-one’s perfect. We acknowledge that and these events help us reform to a better future for everyone,” he said.
