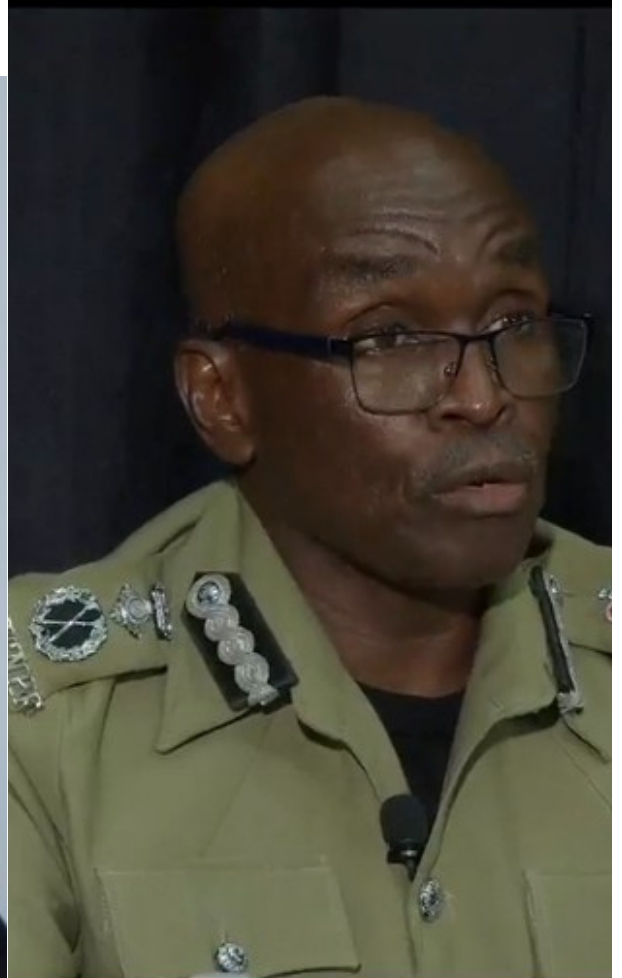

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Editorial

For Justice to Appear, Transparency Must Lead

There is a well-known phrase that says, 'Justice must not only be done but must appear to be done.' Such principle, rooted deeply in democratic ideals and the rule of law, must guide every response to national tragedy and trauma-particularly when it concerns the death of a child.

The decision by the Ministry of National Security to appoint internationally recognised forensic pathologist, Dr. Shanedelle Norford-Harry, to lead the autopsy of 15-year-old Janelika Romney, is not just a procedural move. It is a powerful and necessary signal. One that tells the people of St. Kitts and Nevis that the investigation into this heart-wrenching case is being handled with the highest degree of professionalism, independence, and care.

Dr. Norford-Harry brings with her not only an impeccable reputation but the kind of experience that inspires confidence. Triple-board certified in forensic, clinical, and anatomic pathology, with thousands of autopsies to her name and court-tested expertise in complex cases, she is a daughter of our soil whose credentials place her on the world stage. Her involvement represents more than external assistance-it is an affirmation that we value thorough, scientific, and impartial inquiry, especially in cases that have shaken public trust and emotions. For many, the circumstances surrounding Janelika's disappearance and subsequent death remain a source of pain, disbelief, and unanswered questions. In these moments, the public's confidence in the justice system can waver. That is why it is so crucial that every effort is made to keep the process beyond reproach. Transparency must not be a talking point-it must be the foundation of our national response. The government action rightly signals that no corners will be cut, no conclusions will be rushed, and no room will be left for speculation where facts can be found. It also reinforces the call made by Police Commissioner James Sutton that "no one will be covered" and that "whoever is found to have been legally responsible, whether directly or indirectly, for this child's death, will report to justice."

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Forensic science is only one component of the justice process, but it is a vital one. By investing in credible expertise and modern investigative protocols, we not only pursue the truth-we protect it. Let this be a turning point. A case so tragic should leave behind more than sorrow. It should lead to stronger systems, deeper accountability, and renewed national resolve to protect our children and preserve our justice institutions.

Overseas Expert To Conduct Teen's Autopsy

BASSETERRE, St.Kitts (Friday 11th July 2025) -The Ministry of National Security has publicly indicated that internationally recognised forensic pathologist Dr. Shanedelle Norford-Harry has been appointed to lead the autopsy in the case of 15-year-old Janelika Romney. The announcement came via a formal press release- issued by the Ministry of National Security, Citizenship and Immigration on Friday 11th July 2025-which outlined the government's ongoing efforts to strengthen national forensic capabilities while ensuring transparency and thoroughness in sensitive investigations.

As highlighted, Dr. Norford-Harry, a native of St. Kitts and Nevis, is triple-board certified by the American Board of Anatomic Pathology, Clinical Pathology, and Forensic Pathology. She holds a medical degree from Boston University and a Master's degree in Criminal Justice. With advanced certifications in medicolegal death investigation, forensic photography, and courtroom testimony, she has conducted thousands of autopsies and served as an associate medical examiner in several U.S. jurisdictions.

It was also express that Dr. Norford-Harry's deployment is part of what the Ministry described as "a wider thrust to modernise forensic protocols and uphold the integrity of justice in the Federation." She is expected to work closely with national security personnel and other relevant authorities.

The Ministry emphasized that while international expertise will be engaged as needed, the long-term goal is to build and rely on national forensic capacity. The collaboration with Dr. Norford-Harry was described as a strategic decision by both the Ministry of National Security and the Ministry of Health.

COP Sutton On Janelika's Case: 'Whoever is responsible will be brought to justice'

BASSETERRE, ST. KITTS (Wednesday 9th July 2025)-Police Commissioner James Sutton has made it clear that no individual will be shielded during the ongoing investigation into the death of 15-year-old Janelika Romney whose body was recently discovered in the White Gate area days more than one week after she was reported missing.

Speaking at a recent press conference, he stated: "Whoever is found to have been legally responsible, whether directly or indirectly, for this child's death, will be brought to justice."

He assured the public that the Force is leaving nothing to chance.

We are leaving nothing to chance and no stone unturned. We will continue to probe and seek out the truth and we remain committed to following the facts wherever they lead. We will not dismiss any detail. We will not cover for anyone," COP Sutton commented.

He reiterated the importance of community cooperation saying:

"The police need the public and the public needs the police. We have said it many times: One hand cannot clap. Only by working together can we create a nation where every child is protected, every family is respected and every person accounted for."

He also stated that the Force remains committed to thoroughly pursuing the facts and following all credible leads.

The Police Commissioner told the nation that something like this cannot happen again s he called on society to do better going forward with such a wake-up call.

"My fellow citizens, we are at a crossroads. The opportunity to do better has lapped us several times already. And sadly, we have begun to learn, but much too late and by the hard way. In this dark and painful moment, we are facing an unavoidable choice. Are we going to continue watching bad turn to worse while sitting on our hands? Or are we ready to rise to the moment and do the work to change our society for the better? This strategy must be our absolute final wake-up call. Something like this cannot happen again. Most importantly, we as a society cannot allow it to happen again."

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MULTI-AGENCY OPERATION TARGETS HUMAN SMUGGLING AND ORGANISED CRIME ACROSS FEDERATION

Royal St. Christopher and Nevis Police Force

On July 9th, 2025, a coordinated multi-agency search operation was conducted at various locations in St. Kitts and Nevis. The operation was executed by the Royal St. Christopher and Nevis Police Force (RSCNPF), the St. Kitts-Nevis Defence Force (SKNDF), the St. Kitts and Nevis Immigration Department, and the Joint Security Operations Tactical Team (JSOTT). It targeted individuals and groups suspected of involvement in human smuggling, organised crime, and immigration violations. The Regional Security Systems (RSS) and the United States Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) were also available and provided technical support to the operation. The operation resulted in the execution of eleven (11) search warrants; three (3) in Nevis and eight (8) in St. Kitts. A total of thirty (30) persons were detained, including twenty-six (26) adults who were arrested and four (4) juveniles who were placed in care and protective custody. Multiple electronic devices and other items of evidential value were also taken into Police custody. The operation stands as clear demonstration of law enforcement authorities' unyielding resolve to disrupt and dismantle criminal networks and enterprises operating across the Federation. It also underscores the value of coordinated intelligence, inter-agency cooperation, and swift tactical execution in safeguarding national security through coordinated intelligence gathering and decisive action. Updates will be appropriately provided as the investigations progress.

Basseterre, Saint Kitts, July 09, 2025 (SKNIS): Persons benefitting from the Government of Saint Kitts and Nevis' School-Based Assistance Programme and new enrollees will now enjoy a streamlined and efficient system that eliminates duplication and enhances confidentiality.

A new Expression of Interest portal, www.socialdevelopment.gov.kn by the ministry is now live as officials continue to modernise the way information is collected and use it to inform the decision-making process, reduce fraud, and expand services to children enrolled in public primary and secondary schools, as well as tertiary institutions.

The new system covers the School Uniform Assistance Programme, High School Book Loan Programme, CXC Fee Waiver Programme and the Early Childhood Subvention Programme. Azilla Clarke, Permanent Secretary in the Ministry of Social Development, explained how the system works utilising Microsoft Forms.

"Since we launched our national social protection strategy back in 2012, some of the commitment points have been to serve as the one-stop shop for all social protection programmes because we have heard the cry of the public that they have to indicate their personal information repeatedly to a number of persons, so by being the clearing house we capture and then we just [share the information]," Ms. Clarke stated. Officials will rely on information already in the database for beneficiaries of the Livelihood Improvement for

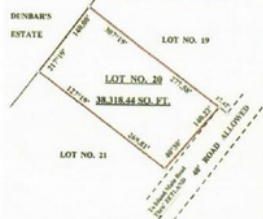

NIA CHARLESTOWN NEVIS (July 07, 2025) The Nevis Island Administration (NIA) has achieved another key milestone in its ongoing Water Enhancement Project with the successful discovery of water at the Braziers well site, marking a significant step forward in its mission to strengthen long-term water security on the island. Honourable Spencer Brand, Minister responsible for Water Services in the NIA, shared the encouraging news following the completion of drilling at the location on Saturday, July 06, by Water and Oil Well Services Company Limited. “I am delighted to report that we have completed the drilling exercise at the Braziers well site and we were able to access water. The geological data did indicate that we should be able to access water at 550 feet and that data has proven to be accurate. The drillers met their target depth of 550 feet and actually extended that depth to 575 feet.”

He stated that over the next few weeks, the team would begin pump testing at the Braziers well, a process expected to last approximately four days. This testing phase, he noted, would provide the necessary data to determine the optimal pumping rate for the site. The Minister stated, “I am even more delighted to know that we are able to continue this mission and this exercise of improving our water security for the island and the people of Nevis.”

Following the completion of testing at Braziers, the drilling team is expected to return to the Dasents well site, where a new well will be dug. A previous attempt at that location had to be abandoned after the drill bit became stuck and could not be retrieved. Minister Brand also noted that the first two wells at Maddens were successful and that the water passed potability tests and has already been connected to the island’s distribution system, contributing an additional 600,000 gallons of water per day. The NIA’s comprehensive strategy to enhance water infrastructure across Nevis includes drilling nine wells, increasing storage capacity, and upgrading the island’s distribution network. The Water Enhancement Project is a critical component of the NIA’s broader commitment to long-term water security. It represents a deliberate and sustained

Family Transformation (LIFT) Programme, Back-to-School Independence Initiative, and the Budget Boost Wallet. Persons applying for the School-Based Assistance Programmes will need to fill out the expression of interest application. Once completed and submitted, the social development staff will cross-reference the information and prefill the application form. “When you come in to meet with the social assistance officers stationed at community centres around the island you are simply confirming the information that we have for you, providing any that we do not have, and then your application is processed and within a 14-working day period you will get a response,” Ms. Clarke added.

The information collected will be confidentially shared with the Ministry of Education, which will subsequently reach out to persons who applied for benefits for their children for assessment and disbursement.

The permanent secretary shared that the data collected will help to provide useful information that will help to shape policy and programmes in the near future, while also allowing greater access where necessary to additional social services support including cash transfer or voucher programmes, as well as training in parenting, money management, counselling and the like. Persons are encouraged to register as soon as possible to meet the respective social programme deadlines.

From June 21–28, 2025, a total of 7,711 passengers arrived in Saint Kitts and Nevis via air and sea, marking a dramatic increase compared to 4,429 during the same period in 2023 – a difference of 3,718 passengers. The surge in visitors, drawn by one of the Caribbean’s premier entertainment events, was seamlessly accommodated thanks to the newly implemented eTA system.

“This record-breaking performance during the festival is a powerful demonstration of how innovation and strategic planning are improving our visitor experience while strengthening national security,” said Prime Minister and Immigration Minister, the Honourable Dr. Terrance Drew. “We are not only keeping pace with global standards - but we are also setting them.”

Notably, June 26, 2025 – the day before the main stage performances – saw 1,564 arrivals, the highest ever recorded for a single day ahead of the Music Festival.

In just its first month of operation, the eTA platform has processed over 21,000 applications, with 21,138 approvals and an average turnaround time of just over nine (9) hours. The system has streamlined immigration processing at ports of entry, reducing average wait times by 96 percent – from 50 seconds to just three (3) seconds – via the high-tech biocorridor.

The impact of the system extends beyond speed and security. More than 8,800 visitors listed “pleasure” as their reason for travel, confirming the Federation’s continued appeal as a leisure destination. In addition, \$107,525 in traveler fees was collected, contributing to national development.

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Microsoft to cut up to 9,000 more jobs as it invests in AI

Microsoft has confirmed that it will lay off as many as 9,000 workers, in the technology giant's latest wave of job cuts this year.

The company said several divisions would be affected without specifying which ones but reports suggest that its Xbox video gaming unit will be hit.

Microsoft has set out plans to invest heavily in artificial intelligence (AI), and is spending \$80bn (£68.6bn) in huge data centres to train AI models.

A spokesperson for the firm told the BBC: "We continue to implement organisational changes necessary to best position the company for success in a dynamic marketplace."

The cuts would equate to 4% of Microsoft's 228,000-strong global workforce.

Some video game projects have reportedly been affected by them.

According to an internal email seen by The Verge and gaming publication IGN, Microsoft has told gaming staff that the planned reboot of first-person shooter series Perfect Dark, along with another title, Everwild, will be cancelled.

The Initiative, a Microsoft-owned studio behind the Perfect Dark reboot, will also be shut down, the memo stated.

Job cuts have also affected staff across wider studios owned by Microsoft, including Forza Motorsport maker Turn 10 and Elder Scrolls Online developer ZeniMax Online Studios, according to employee posts on social media seen by the BBC.

Matt Firor, studio director of ZeniMax Online Studios, announced on Wednesday he would be leaving his position in July after more than 18 years at the studio.

"While I won't be working on the game anymore, I will be cheering you on and adding to the thousands of hours I've already spent in-game," said a post attributed to Mr Firor by ZeniMax on X.

Microsoft has initiated three other rounds of redundancies so far in 2025, including in May when it said it would cut 6,000 roles.

An official database maintained by Washington state shows that more than 800 of the positions eliminated will be concentrated in the city of Redmond as well as in Bellevue, another Microsoft hub in its home state.



In recent years, like many other big technology firms, Microsoft has refocused its business towards developing AI, including investing in data centres and chips.

Last year, the company hired British AI pioneer Mustafa Suleyman to lead its new Microsoft AI division.

A top Microsoft executive recently told the BBC that the next half century will "fundamentally be defined by artificial intelligence," changing the way we work and interact with one another.

Microsoft is also a major investor and shareholder in OpenAI, the company behind the popular chatbot ChatGPT, although the relationship has reportedly grown tense in recent months.

Bloomberg reported that Microsoft has struggled to sell its AI assistant, known as Copilot, to business customers because many office workers prefer ChatGPT.

The layoffs among rank and file workers at Microsoft come as major US tech companies court top AI talent.

Meta, which owns Facebook and Instagram, has been poaching talent from rivals to form a 'superintelligence' lab.

Chief executive Mark Zuckerberg has reportedly been personally involved in recruitment.

OpenAI boss Sam Altman said recently that members of his team had been getting offers of more than \$100m (£74.3m) as "signing bonuses" from Meta.

Last month, Amazon boss Andy Jassy said he expected AI would replace some of his firm's workers.
