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Editorial

Where is Janelika Romney?

The question that hangs heavy in the air across St. Kitts and Nevis is one that no family, no community, and certainly no nation should ever have to ask- Where is Janelika Romney?

It has now been several days since the 15-year-old went missing, and the longer the silence, the more the anxiety grows. The nation is holding its breath, hoping and praying for the safe return of this child. Communities across the island are in suspense, straining for any sign-any whisper-that she might be okay. But amid the confusion, frustration, and unanswered questions, a family's pain deepens with every passing hour.

Janelika is not just a name in the news or a trending topic online. She is a daughter, a student, a friend. She is a life full of dreams, laughter, and potential. And she is now the center of what can only be described as a national crisis of conscience. Because how did we get to a place where a teenager could vanish and not a single trace-no clothing, no belongings, no reliable footage-can yet confirm her whereabouts?

A recent search party, led by concerned citizens and supported by the police, turned up nothing conclusive. Not even a single item linked to Janelika. Yet the police have stated that they possess "credible information" suggesting she is still alive. This announcement, rather than easing fears, has raised eyebrows. Many have taken to social media to question the transparency and timing of such a revelation, while others are clinging to that one line of hope-that Janelika is out there, somewhere, and can be found.

As this case unfolds, social media has turned into both a place of solidarity and a battlefield of judgment. Most painfully, Janelika's mother has had to address a wave of criticism and harsh comments from those choosing to speculate and cast blame rather than uplift and support. In a raw, emotional live video, she defended herself against the negativity, reminding us that at the center of this tragedy is not public opinion, but a child still unaccounted for.

This is not the time for cruelty. This is not the time for speculation or character assassination. This is the time for unity. The time for truth. The time to amplify the question that matters most: Where is Janelika Romney?

Authorities must be relentless, families must be supported, and communities must remain vigilant.

Assistant Top Cop Highlights Safety Measures Music Festival

BASSETERRE, St. Kitts (Thursday 26th June 2025)-As anticipation builds for the annual St. Kitts Music Festival, Assistant Commissioner of Police (ACP) Adolph Adams laid out key safety protocols to ensure the well-being of all patrons.

Speaking at the Music Festival's daily press conference held on Thursday, June 26, 2025, at the St. Kitts Marriott Resort, ACP Adams urged the public to remain vigilant and cooperate with law enforcement and event security teams.

"As you leave your house, the safety and comfort of your house, and you come to the festival venue, our job is to ensure that you remain safe in our surroundings," ACP Adams stated. "Our team comprises law enforcement, private security, medical, and also fire services. As I said earlier, our job is to ensure that patrons who attend the venue remain safe and also to ensure that your premises remain safe as well..."

While emphasizing the festive nature of the event, ACP Adams reminded patrons to remain alert. "As you party the event at the venue, I would want to encourage persons who come to the venue, even though it's a festive area, we still want you to be aware of your surroundings," he said. "We want you to be alert and make our job easy and to ensure that you as well remain safe. If you see anything suspicious or you hear anything suspicious, the first order of business would be to report it."

ACP Adams encouraged festival-goers to use the buddy system, especially for those unfamiliar with the island. "You have a job to play and safety and security team, we also have a job to play. I would want to encourage you as well to adopt a buddy system. I don't want you to- a lot of persons are here on the island for the first time, and you may not know your surroundings, and I would encourage you to establish a buddy system. Stay close to your friends and your loved ones," he advised.

Given the large crowd expected, patrons were urged to have pre-arranged meeting points. "If you get lost for some reason, because thousands of people would be at the venue, establish a point where you can meet that people don't have to be up and down looking for you. You've got to establish a point where you can rendezvous and meet and get back together." He also highlighted the importance of familiarizing oneself with the venue layout. "When you get at the venue, it is very important to know the exits, which will be highlighted. It is very important as well to know the medical station because we are going to be consuming a lot of alcohol. A lot of heat is going to be in the area and people got to understand that emergencies will happen so know your medical emergency stations."

Cash Reward Part of Investigation in Tracking Down Missing Teen

BASSETERRE, ST. KITTS (21 June 2025)-The Royal St. Christopher and Nevis Police Force (RSCNPF) has announced a cash reward of EC \$7,000 for credible information that leads to the location of missing 15-year-old Janelika Romney who was last seen over five (5) days ago. Romney, a resident of New Guinea and a student of Verchids High School, was last seen on Monday 16th June 2025, around 3:40 PM, wearing her Verchids High School uniform. She is described as brown-skinned, approximately 5 feet tall with a slim build, brown eyes, and black locs.

In a public statement issued on Saturday 21st June, the RSCNPF revealed that they are actively investigating the case and believe that Janelika is alive.

"We have credible reason to believe that Janelika is alive and has been in contact with several individuals, including persons well known to her," the statement read. "However, many of those spoken to during the course of this investigation have been misleading or far less than forthcoming. This insensitive lack of cooperation has delayed progress and continues to hinder our efforts to ensure Janelika's safety and well-being."

Police are appealing to the public for any information that may assist in confirming her location or movements since June 16th.

"Should you have any information that can assist us in finding Janelika, we urge you to contact the nearest Police station soonest. All tips will be handled with strict confidentiality." The police also issued a warning: "If you are harbouring her or know someone who is, understand this: your silence is not protection; it is obstruction of justice and an iron-clad guarantee that you will be prosecuted to the

fullest extent permitted by law when we catch you - and we will."

Meanwhile, Prime Minister and Minister of National Security, Hon. Dr. Terrance Drew, expressed concern over the situation in a statement posted to social media. "I have been in constant communication with the Commissioner about the whereabouts of Janelika Romney. No stone will be left unturned in finding her whereabouts!"

He encouraged: "I urge everyone, especially those in and around New Guinea, to remain alert and report any information to the nearest police station. Your assistance could make all the difference. The police continue to work very closely with Janelika's family and the community."

Let us act with urgency and compassion. We are all praying for Janelika's safe return."

Parliamentary Representative for Constituency #4 Samal Duggins, in a statement issued on 19th June said in part: "I am deeply troubled by the news of 15-year-old Janelika Romney's disappearance... As a father, a leader, and a member of this community, I share in the concern and distress that this news brings. I urge everyone especially those in and around New Guinea to remain vigilant and do everything possible to assist the police in locating Janelika."

If you have seen anything or know something that could help, I strongly encourage you to speak up. No detail is too small. Please contact the nearest police station. Your information will be treated with the utmost confidentiality. To Janelika's family: my thoughts are with you during this agonizing time. I am committed to doing all I can to support efforts to bring her home safely. Let us come together as a community and help find Janelika."

A search party dubbed 'HELP US FIND JANELIKA ROMNEY' was held on Saturday 21st June at 6:00AM with the New Guinea Boat Yard being the starting point.

ACP Adams stressed, "Stay hydrated. Don't just drink alcohol like some people, drink water as well. That would make the job of the security [and] medical personnel a bit easier."

Addressing behavior at the festival, Adams noted, "There will be zero tolerance to harassment, discrimination and aggressive behaviour. This is not J'ouvert morning. This is Music Festival. And I mean be respectful to people as well as we try to ensure that you remain safe and secure."

He confirmed that standard security checks would be in effect. "There would be screening upon entrance to the venue. This is not to harass anyone. Ladies, your bags would be checked as usual. This is protocol that must be adhered to upon entry."

He urged patrons to ensure their phones are charged: "I would like to also encourage each and every one to ensure that your phone is fully charged when you're coming to the venue... If there are emergencies, you need to contact people..."

On transportation, Adams noted: "Transportation would be at Port Zante for the general admission and we want to ensure

that as you journey through Basseterre to the venue that you are safe. So measures will be in place to ensure that as you make your way to the festival venue that you are safe."

ACP Adams ended his address with a final word of caution: "Drink responsibly. I know there will be a lot of alcohol on the venue, especially in those VIPs, and I know what can happen after people get drunk and we are traveling home. I also want to encourage you to establish a designated driver. We want to ensure that you come to our venue safe and you reach to your final destination safe."

Prime Minister Drew Clarifies: No Formal U.S. Travel Ban on Saint Kitts and Nevis; Government Proactively Engaged in Diplomatic Channels

Basseterre, Saint Kitts, June 23, 2025 (PMO) —Prime Minister of Saint Kitts and Nevis, Honourable Dr. Terrance M. Drew, has reaffirmed that the Government has not received any formal communication from the United States of America regarding reports of an impending travel restriction or ban on citizens of Saint Kitts and Nevis.

Addressing the matter during an interview on The Edge on ZIZ Radio, Prime Minister Drew assured the public that, despite reports being circulated, his administration has not been officially notified of any such decision by the U.S. government.

“This administration has received no official notice of any travel ban or restriction on our citizens. From the moment we saw the reports, we moved immediately through all appropriate diplomatic channels. I put out communication to inform our people that we had not been formally informed about such a list, and therefore, as we get information, we would inform our people and keep them updated,” Dr. Drew stated.

Prime Minister Drew went further to explain the steps undertaken by the Government to seek clarification.

“Immediately, Foreign Affairs got activated. I got in touch with the Embassy of the United States of America in Barbados to get clarification. At that time, the embassy indicated that they had not received any formal communication about this so-called list. In addition to that, our Ambassador to the United States and OAS, Her Excellency Jacinth Henry-Martin, she and I spoke on the matter, and a meeting was held with the State Department to seek clarification as to what this is about.”

He confirmed that the U.S. State Department is currently awaiting an update from the Embassy in Barbados regarding the matter and reiterated that no formal position has been conveyed to the Government of Saint Kitts and Nevis to date. “Has it been circulating? Yes. Has it been concerning? Yes. But we have been working the diplomatic channels from day one to deal with this matter, and to deal with it even proactively.”



The Prime Minister also reaffirmed the strong relationship between the Federation and the United States. “We have an excellent relationship with the United States of America, a relationship that spans decades... Many of our citizens would have had tremendous positive impact on the development of the United States of America.”

Prime Minister Drew emphasized his administration’s ongoing commitment to provide timely and factual information to citizens, noting that “as far as I can report now, everything is normal. Our people can travel to the United States. They can apply for a visa to the United States of America. Everything remains totally normal.”

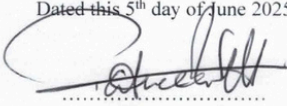

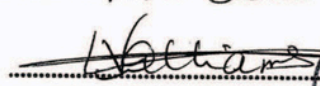

Womb lining test offers miscarriage hope to women

UK scientists say they have developed a test which can help identify women with an abnormal womb lining that increases their risk of miscarriage.

They say their work could pave the way for new treatments for those going through repeated pregnancy loss.

In some women with a history of miscarriage, the womb lining doesn't react the way it should - transforming into a supportive place for the embryo to implant, the University of Warwick team discovered.

Charities say the findings could help provide an explanation, in some cases, for the trauma and devastation of recurrent miscarriage.

Around one in six of all pregnancies are lost, most before twelve weeks, and each miscarriage increases the risk of another one happening.

To date, most research in this area has focused on the quality of the embryo, with much less known about the role of the womb lining.

Dr Jo Muter, study author and researcher at Warwick Medical School, said: "Many women are told they've just had 'bad luck', but our findings show that the womb itself may be setting the stage for pregnancy loss, even before conception takes place."

The job of the womb lining is to receive the embryo and help it develop during pregnancy, thanks to a reaction which converts cells into a different, supportive state. But when that reaction is messed up and doesn't fully happen, the risk of bleeding and early pregnancy loss rises.

Once a woman has had one faulty reaction, she is more likely to have another, the researchers say.

'They've developed a new test which can measure signs of a healthy or defective reaction in the womb lining, which is being piloted to help more than 1,000 patients at Tommy's National Centre for Miscarriage Research at University Hospital Coventry & Warwickshire (UHCW).

A tiny miracle'

Charlie Beattie, 37, had countless early miscarriages over the course of four years, to the point where "a positive pregnancy test wasn't exciting any more", she says.

She and her husband Sam, from Leamington Spa, felt devastated and resigned to considering other options for having a family.

Then they found out about a trial taking place at the miscarriage research centre.

Charlie had a sample of her womb taken, and the new test showed it was not "hospitable for babies", she says. After taking the drug sitagliptin for three months, she had a pregnancy which finally stuck - and nine-week-old June is the joyful result.

"She's a tiny miracle. It doesn't feel real," says Charlie. She admits being anxious all the way through her pregnancy until June was safely in her arms.

Even the pregnancy scans were a new experience.

"We'd never seen anything on a scan before that moved," she says. "When they said 'I can see it, it's in the right place', we both burst into tears."

Anyone can refer themselves to the clinic, but it has a long waiting list and funding issues mean patients must contribute to the cost of the test.

Dr Jyotsna Vohra, director of research at Tommy's, said care and treatment for those who experience pregnancy or baby loss varied unacceptably across the UK.

"There should be no barriers to accessing any test or treatment that has been proven to make a difference.

"We hope NHS decision-makers will look carefully at the results of the Coventry pilot project and consider rolling this test out nationwide, so that everyone who might benefit has that opportunity."

Dr Muter says the next step is to use the test to assess potential drug treatments. Sitagliptin, usually used to treat diabetes, is one option for womb lining issues but doesn't work for everyone. More research is needed to find out if there are other existing drugs which could be used as treatments, she added.

With 80% of drugs not tested on pregnant women, it's unclear which ones might be effective.



Why your old mobile phone may be polluting Thailand

At an industrial site in eastern Thailand, Thitipas Choddaechachainun sifts through mounds of scrap metal, circuit boards and old computer keyboards in a cavernous warehouse beside a busy highway. Like forensic scientists, she and her team of inspectors from Thailand's industry ministry take samples of the waste and carefully bag it up to be taken away for analysis. "A lot of this is clearly electronic waste and the company that owns this site doesn't have a licence to process it," she concludes. "This is a growing problem in Thailand."

Ms Choddaechachainun is the head of a ministry task force trying to get to grips with Thailand's e-waste problem. Each week, she and her team head out to raid these unlicensed plants, which have popped up in recent years, mostly in rural areas, out of sight of the authorities. But despite their efforts, the problem keeps growing. In the past, China was a major recipient of electronic waste. Tonnes of it were shipped across the world, mostly from Western countries, to be dumped there and recycled cheaply.

But in 2018, Beijing banned imports. That forced shippers to look elsewhere and many of them alighted on Thailand and other countries in south-east Asia. Thailand introduced its own import ban in 2020 but it has not solved the problem. The amount of electronic waste flooding into the country has increased twentyfold in the past decade, from around 3,000 tonnes a year before the Chinese ban to 60,000 now, according to environmental group Earth Thailand. Jamaica launches first-ever

Health Labour Market Analysis

The launch took place during an inaugural meeting of the Technical Working Group (TWG) for the HLMA, which is being carried out with support and collaboration from the Planning Institute of Jamaica (PIOJ) and the different levels of the Pan American Health Organization/World Health Organization (PAHO/WHO).

This is the first HLMA of its kind in the Caribbean and Latin America. The initiative aims to provide a comprehensive picture of Jamaica's health labour market, examining supply and demand, workforce distribution, and the key factors that influence performance and retention. It will explore how health professionals enter and leave the system, where they are deployed, how they are compensated, and the reasons they choose to stay in the country or migrate.

The HLMA will also consider strategies to attract and retain health professionals, ensure sufficient training capacity, and support returning healthcare workers who wish to re-enter the local system.

The Jamaica HLMA is a follow-up to the series of trainings, both virtual and in-person, including a 2024 face-to-face training for the Caribbean subregion, which took place in Trinidad and Tobago. Like other small island developing states, Jamaica faces significant health workforce challenges. These include the migration of skilled personnel, particularly nurses, midwives, and specialists, as well as migration within the country, which draws professionals toward urban centres, leaving rural clinics and hospitals understaffed.

These trends have increased pressure on the country's health system and threaten progress towards universal health, the Sustainable Development Goals, and the national objectives outlined in the Vision for Health 2030 Strategy.

Speaking at the launch, Ian Stein, PAHO/WHO representative for Jamaica, said the HLMA will provide Jamaica with the data needed to improve workforce planning.

"This analysis provides Jamaica with essential data to better understand its health workforce landscape. With these insights, the country is now better positioned to plan strategically, fill critical gaps, and make informed investments in workforce development that will strengthen the health system for years to come," Stein said.

Stein also commended the ministry's decision to undertake the analysis, describing it as a strong signal of commitment to long-term health system strengthening and a critical step towards aligning health worker competencies with population needs, improving retention, and ensuring a more equitable distribution of staff.

This first face-to-face meeting with the members of the TWG for the HLMA included a sensitisation on what the HLMA means for the Jamaican context, and a review of the terms of reference for the TWG, the policy questions guiding the HLMA, and guidance for related support.

During the meeting, PAHO/WHO reaffirmed its commitment to supporting the MOHW, the PIOJ, and other partners in using the HLMA findings to bring about meaningful improvements in healthcare delivery across the island.

The work ahead of the Core Working Group and TWG should result in the alignment of training programmes with required competencies, expanded capacity to produce the requisite number of healthcare workers, identification of key strategies to attract and retain workers, and support for the reintegration of those returning to Jamaica.

Inevitably, the analysis will yield valuable insights and practical recommendations to support more effective workforce planning and implementation, improved education, and investment, with the ultimate goal of improving the quality of care in Jamaica.

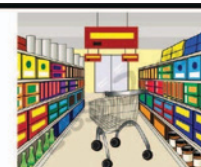

Much of it comes from the US and the European Union, where consumers update their mobile phones and computers relatively frequently, and where per-capita use of electrical goods like fridges and washing machines is high.

Even though most Western countries have laws in place to prevent the dumping of e-waste in other countries, there are ways round them. Some waste, for example, is deliberately mislabelled as "second-hand electronic goods for re-sale", only to be smashed up, recycled and smelted once it reaches its destination.

That smelting is a dirty business, releasing mercury, lead and toxic fumes into the environment. But it is also lucrative, producing millions of dollars worth of copper, gold and other valuable metals and minerals.

"Thailand is not getting anything from these businesses," Thai industry minister Akanat Promphan tells the BBC in Bangkok.

"There's no value to the economy, it destroys the environment, it poses threats and endangers the livelihood of the people. That's why I've formed a special task force to engage in a full-on crackdown on these businesses."

He says the unlicensed recycling plants, many of which are Chinese-owned, have created "a sort of a garbage site - an international garbage processing facility - in Thailand".

Once the e-waste arrives in Thailand and reaches the sites, it is fed into giant crushing machines which reduce it to a kind of gravel. It is then smelted to retrieve the valuable metal.

Promphan says most of that metal is then exported to China.

The environmental impact of this business can be devastating.

On his small plot of land in eastern Thailand, 57-year-old Seng Wongsena tells the BBC that polluted water running from a nearby smelter has blighted his cassava harvest. "The plants don't flower like they used to," he says, complaining that the smell from the smelter is so bad that it keeps him awake at night.

Local environmentalists say the plant is operating illegally and have urged the local authorities to shut it down.

International environmentalists are campaigning on these issues too.

"Thailand has really borne the brunt of so much," says Jim Puckett, executive director of the Basel Action Network, an NGO that campaigns against the shipment of toxic waste. "If you import this very dirty material for recycling you were going to contaminate your soil, your people."

Thailand's fight against e-waste is part of a much larger global problem.

According to the United Nations, the world produces over 60 million tonnes of electrical and electronic waste each year – twice as much as 15 years ago. That figure is projected to grow by more than 30% by the end of the decade.

Less than a quarter of it is collected and recycled responsibly, the UN says. And the rate of recycling is failing to keep up with the rate at which we are generating it.

Some countries have introduced laws to make the manufacturers of electronic goods – the likes of Apple, Samsung, Dell and Hewlett Packard – more responsible for taking back gadgets once they have reached the end of their life and disposing of them responsibly.

Thailand is planning to follow suit with a law of its own.

"I'm hoping for the enactment of this new legislation as soon as possible, maybe towards the end of this year, maybe at the beginning of next year," Promphan says.

"I'm fully committed to take full actions against this illegal business and drive them out completely."
