## Editorial

# Good Friday: A Call to Humility in the Shadow of the Cross

Today marks another Good Friday, a solemn day within Holy Week that draws believers across the world into reflection. It commemorates the crucifixion of Jesus Christ, nailed to a cross at Calvary—a moment of profound religious magnitude that symbolizes the ultimate sacrifice made to wash away the sins of humanity.

For Christians, this sacred observance reflects the boundless love of God and serves as the precursor to the promise fulfilled on Easter. It represents not only suffering and sacrifice but also redemption and hope. The crucifixion stands as the fulfillment of prophecy found in the Old Testament, where the image of the sacrificial lamb foreshadowed the path that Christ would take so that humanity might have the promise of eternal life.

Yet beyond the theological significance lies a deeper moral lesson for mankind.

During this sacred season, many observe the principles of fasting and spiritual reflection. Fasting, in its truest sense, is not merely the absence of food but the presence of discipline, humility, and inner examination. It calls upon individuals to cleanse the spirit, to turn away from excess, and to focus on the values that nurture the soul—compassion, forgiveness and love.

In the Caribbean, one often hears the saying: ‘Oh, they crucified Christ, so who am I?’ The phrase carries a sobering reminder about the nature of human behavior. If the Son of God could endure betrayal, ridicule and suffering at the hands of those he came to save, then surely mankind must reflect on the ways we sometimes inflict harm, cruelty, or injustice upon one another.

The crucifixion forces us to confront the darker tendencies of humanity—the ease with which individuals judge, condemn and mistreat others. Too often, society becomes quick to tear down rather than uplift; quick to condemn rather than understand. The story of the cross reminds us that cruelty and indifference are not new afflictions of mankind but neither are they acceptable ones.

But the greater message of Good Friday must speak louder than the cruelty it exposes.

The life and sacrifice of Jesus Christ call humanity toward

# Brantley Says Destiny Project Developers Are Getting Frustrated

**Basseterre, St. Kitts (Thursday 2nd April 2026)**-Premier Mark Brantley has indicated that there is still no update from the federal government regarding the application review for the proposed Destiny Project, noting the developers “are growing very frustrated because they are anxious to proceed.”

Speaking during his monthly press conference held on Monday 30th March 2026, he explained that the Nevis Island Administration remains without a definitive response.

He was asked by a local reporter whether there was any advancement towards a decision on the application review

“The Destiny Project. I regret to inform that we still have not had any movement at the federal government level,” Brantley replied.

He explained that the most recent communication came through the Cabinet Secretary.

“About a week ago, we got a letter from the Cabinet Secretary to say that the project had been referred to some committee that they had put in place in St. Kitts. That is the extent of what we know. We have not yet from the federal government an answer whether positive or negative, and it appears now that this committee now would have to deliberate.”

The Premier indicated that the establishment of the committee came as a surprise and that he had not been consulted.

“I don’t know about this committee. That committee was certainly not discussed with me in terms of any consultations on it. I’m not aware of any Nevis involvement in that committee save and except I believe of the Nevis Historical and Conservation Society and the Nevis Hotel Association I gather, were asked to submit members to that committee but beyond that truly we are in a waiting pattern.”

According to Brantley, the federal government’s role should be limited.

“I’m not sure why the federal government clearly is only concerned with any constitutional aspects of this development. There is nothing else that the federal government has to contend with so I’m not quite sure what the committee is going to advise on or why this project has to go to a St. Kitts Committee. The project is not a St. Kitts Project but that is the option that the federal government in their wisdom has and we in Nevis continue to wait.”

The Premier said the delay is also affecting the developers and potential economic activity tied to the project.

“I can tell you that the developers are growing very frustrated because they are anxious to proceed; they want to proceed. They

have real estate options that they want to close on and pay people their money, they want to start the necessary work.”

He also pointed to the potential employment and business opportunities the project could generate.

“I can tell you that in my engagement with our young people, we have people with heavy equipment who are anxious to get going. They know that there is going to be years and years of work available. I have people calling even from St. Kitts, trying to position themselves to see how they could get in on a project of this magnitude so we continue to wait.”

# Tucker Clarke Primary School Celebrates Double Championship Year

**BASSETERRE, St. Kitts (Thursday 2nd April 2026)**- With an occasion to mark having won three (3) separate athletic championship titles this year, the Tucker Clarke Primary School-the Titans- celebrated their most recent win of capturing the RAMS Inter-Primary School Championship with a victory motorcade and jam session through the streets of Basseterre.

On the morning of Tuesday 31st March 2026, students, staff, parents and other supporters clad in the school's red colours took to the streets in celebration following their performance at the championship from a field of 18 other participating schools coupled with the Basseterre Zone Public Primary School Championships and the Champs of Champs achievements.

At the end of the two-day event held from Saturday 28th March to Sunday 29th March, team Titans secured an impressive medal tally.

The school copped 15 gold medals, 10 silver medals and 10 bronze medals following the final medal count after the competition.

Following in second place was Dr. William Connor Primary School, finishing with 11 gold, 17 silver and 8 bronze medals, while Sandy Point Primary School secured the third spot with 10 gold, 11 silver and 5 bronze medals.

Head Teacher of Tucker Clarke Primary Wrennelcia Gumbs, speaking with this media house during the victory event, applauded the role of athletic trainer Timothy Morton, whose involvement she credited as instrumental in the school's success.

When asked whether the school did anything different in preparing its athletes this year, Gumbs highlighted: "We got a trainer for the students...he assisted us and he did an excellent job and we are more than grateful for his support and his guidance throughout the sports term."


Reflecting on the school's recent achievements, she noted that the momentum has been building.

Of note in January, the Titans won the Bank of Nevis Limited Basseterre Zone Public Primary School Championships, outperforming three (3) others with 23 gold medals, 14 silver medals and 14 bronze medals.

The other schools were:

Dr. William Connor Primary-17 gold medals, 21 silver medals and 12 bronze medals

Halliday-Smith Primary- 2 gold medals, 5 silver medals and 8 bronze medals.

# Greaux Comments On Cannabis Charges

**BASSETERRE, St. Kitts (Thursday 2nd April 2026)** – The People's Action Movement (PAM) Candidate for St. Christopher Two Nubian Greaux has addressed his recent run-in with the law, claiming that the matter was politically motivated.

“I understand what is going on ...they have to try dey best and I have to try me best same way too so for me it was nothing about cannabis or the illegality of it; It was a political move...in understanding the political arena, I know they going try dey dirtiest tricks, so we just have to be prepared for it,” Greaux said while speaking on 'Hot Topics' aired live on Tuesday 31st March 2026 on FreedomFM.

Greaux also spoke about what he described as “the double standard that exists in this [cannabis] industry,” while referencing public statements made by Prime Minister and Minister of National Security Dr.Terrance Drew regarding the pace of reforms surrounding the cannabis sector.

“I heard the Prime Minister said about they taking their time because the industry can't be discriminalized fully because they have to set up which is a fair statement. They need to get test equipment because they have to make sure it's safe and that's also a true statement ...,” Greaux said.

However, he went on to question the government's seriousness about putting measures in place to secure the necessary testing equipment for the industry.

Meanwhile, speaking in the National Assembly that day ( 31st March), Attorney General Garth Wilkin outlined the regulatory framework currently being established for the medicinal cannabis sector.

“No selling of cannabis unless licensed to do so by the Medicinal Cannabis Authority. Now, the Medicinal Cannabis Authority is dealing with medicinal cannabis because research has shown that cannabis can be used for medicinal purposes for different types of ailments,” Wilkin stated.

He explained that the Authority is in the process of being established and must ensure that the proper systems are in place before the industry can function.

“The Medicinal Cannabis authority is open; it is now setting up. Setting up means it has to ensure that there are doctors that are trained to prescribe medicinal cannabis. Also, one of the key roles of the medicinal cannabis authority is to ensure that the substance cannot cause harm to the person,” Wilkin said.

He added that the process involves acquiring the necessary testing equipment and developing regulatory oversight mechanisms.

“So part of the facility and part of the reason why a medicinal cannabis authority takes a while to set up is because they have to have the testing equipment. They have to have the testing equipment. Doctors have to be trained. They then have to have the capability of regulating the places where the prescriptions are granted, where the cannabis is sold, and that is in progress,” Wilkin explained.

“So there should be no selling outside of that regime. And naturally, Madame Speaker, if you are buying a product that is regulated, you should be sure that you're getting something that will not cause you harm,” he added.

Wilkin further encouraged members of the public to educate themselves on the legislation governing the sector.

“We have frequently asked questions. We have the debate from the National Assembly. We have all of the legislation there. So I encourage all persons to go to the website which is CannabisClaritySKN.com to

find out what are the do's and don'ts with respect to cannabis,” he said.


Meanwhile, a press release issued by the Royal St Christopher and Nevis Police Force on Friday 27th March 2026 stated that Greaux had been charged for cannabis-related offences.

According to the release, Greaux of Shadwell Housing, St. Kitts, was charged with the offences of Possession of Cannabis and Cultivation of Cannabis with Intent to Supply. The charges stem from a search warrant executed at his residence by the Anti-Narcotics Unit of the Royal St. Christopher and Nevis Police Force and the Joint Security Operations Tactical Team (JSOTT) on March 26th, 2026, between 5 a.m.

# CARDTP Makes Regional Push with OECS to Tackle Cyber Threats

Cybersecurity is a critical sub-component of the World Bank-funded Caribbean Digital Transformation Project (CARDTP), reflecting the region's growing emphasis on strengthening digital resilience and safeguarding information systems. Serving as the technical lead institution for this sub-component, CARICOM Implementation Agency for Crime and Security (IMPACS) coordinated the development of the regional cybersecurity strategy, which was executed by the consulting firm NRD Cyber Security.

Digital and national security experts from Organisation of Eastern Caribbean States (OECS) member states Grenada, Dominica, Saint Lucia, and Saint Vincent and the Grenadines, participated in developing a comprehensive Regional Cybersecurity Roadmap to address the growing urgency of digital threats in the Eastern Caribbean.

Participants reviewed current national cybersecurity strategies across participating countries, while promoting structured cooperation in line with regional and international frameworks. The workshop aimed to enhance participants' skills in identifying and protecting Critical Information Infrastructure (CII), support the development and refinement of National Incident Management Plans through practical exercises, and strengthen cyber crisis preparedness through a simulated table-top exercise.

At the opening ceremony, Director General of the OECS, Dr. Didacus Jules, emphasised that protecting the regional digital space is no longer a solitary endeavour.

"For the OECS, the protection of our digital space must therefore be approached as a matter of collective regional responsibility. No single small state can effectively confront these challenges alone. Cyber threats do not respect national boundaries, and neither should our response. This is why the work being undertaken through this initiative is so important. The development of a Regional Cybersecurity Roadmap, accompanied by actionable national implementation plans, represents a critical step toward strengthening governance, coordination, and preparedness across our Member States."

Minister of Education, Vocational Training and Innovation, Digital Transformation, and Information in Saint Vincent and the Grenadines, Honourable Phillip Jackson, explained that through CARDTP, his ministry can materialise the country's cybersecurity agenda with the goal of "building a culture of cybersecurity awareness".

Minister Jackson said, "Technology alone cannot protect us; our people are our first line of defence. We recognise that

cybersecurity is not just a technical issue for IT specialists; it is a life skill for every citizen."

He outlined a two-tiered institutional approach to safeguarding national assets, highlighting the creation of dedicated response teams. Firstly, the Saint Vincent and the Grenadines Government Computer Security Incident Response Team, which will serve as the shield for our government's digital infrastructure, protecting the services our citizens rely on every day. Secondly, the National CSIRT will be the national hub for coordinating threat intelligence and incident response across all sectors. It will be the primary point of contact for regional and international partners, ensuring a coordinated cross-border response when a threat emerges.


Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of National Security, Disaster Management, and Immigration, Honourable St. Clair Leacock, further reinforced that digital resilience is now a fundamental pillar of state stability, equating the impact of cyber incidents with physical disasters.

"We view a National Cybersecurity Strategy and action plan as an integral component of our national security framework. The threats we face in cyberspace—from ransomware that can halt government operations to disinformation that can destabilise our society—have tangible, real-world consequences. They affect public order, citizen safety, and the integrity of our state institutions. It is therefore critical that our strategy and actions establish, among other elements, the protocols for a coordinated national response to a major cyber incident, allowing us to treat it with the same gravity as a physical disaster."

Ms. Marolla Haddad, Task Team Lead for CARDTP of the funding agency, said that the World Bank Group is proud to be working with the member states on this strengthening exercise.

She said, "Cybersecurity is not a technical agenda, purely. It is a development and security issue. It underpins economic stability...and the resilience of our societies. It is very critical that we are embarking on this journey, and what makes this effort particularly compelling and interesting for us is its regional character. In a world where cybersecurity threats do not respect borders...this OECS regional approach has the potential to become a model."

At the end of the session, participants identified key takeaways and outlined next steps for implementation at both national and regional levels. The workshop signified a milestone in the OECS's ongoing efforts to ensure that regional digital transformation is underpinned by robust security, sovereignty, and trust.

# Major Step Forward for Nevis Geothermal Project as NIA Moves to Finalize Drilling Contract

**NIA CHARLESTOWN, NEVIS (March 30, 2026)**- The Nevis Island Administration (NIA) is advancing decisively toward the next phase of its geothermal energy development, following high-level discussions with the firm Iceland Drilling Company Limited as efforts intensify to finalize a contract for exploratory drilling.

Premier of Nevis and Minister of Energy, the Honourable Mark Brantley, met on March 26 with Iceland Drilling's CEO Sveinn Hannesson and Legal Counsel Lyes Kennouche, alongside key government personnel namely NIA Cabinet Secretary Stedmon Tross; Permanent Secretary in the Premier's Ministry Wakely Daniel; Nevis Electricity Company (NEVLEC) Chief Financial Officer and Acting General Manager Roma Merchant; and Project Coordinator Naftalie Errar.

The visiting delegation also engaged directly with NEVLEC officials as the island's implementing agency, working through technical and contractual details to bring the drilling agreement to completion.

Providing an update during his monthly press conference on March 30, Premier Brantley revealed that Iceland Drilling has outlined an ambitious timeline for mobilization.

"Iceland Drilling set out a very aggressive timeline that they could mobilize and in fact hope to start drilling by August- this is their timeline. I'm optimistic that we can make it, bearing in mind that we're now in April. But they feel that the drill rig, which they say is enroute to Iceland for repairs and retrofitting, can then sail to Nevis to commence the drilling operations here, which will be a significant forward step in terms of our geothermal ambitions."

The geothermal project represents a transformative opportunity for Nevis and the wider Federation. Studies have indicated that the island possesses one of the most significant geothermal resources in the Caribbean, with potential output estimated in the hundreds of megawatts-and possibly as high as 900 megawatts-far exceeding local demand.

Initial development plans, however, are more targeted. The first phase is expected to involve drilling multiple wells to support the construction of a geothermal power plant capable of producing approximately 10 to 30 megawatts of electricity, sufficient

to fully power Nevis while supplying additional energy to St. Kitts.

Beyond this phase, the long-term vision positions Nevis as a renewable energy hub, with the capacity to export clean geothermal power to neighbouring islands across the Eastern Caribbean.

Premier Brantley underscored the urgency of the project against the backdrop of global energy instability, pointing to ongoing geopolitical tensions affecting major oil-producing regions.

He warned that rising oil prices will continue to push up electricity costs, and that higher fuel prices will inevitably affect everyday goods and services, including imported food and products, local fish and meat, bus fares, and more.

As Minister of Finance, he urged residents to remain aware of international developments, particularly tensions involving the United States and Iran.

"That is why I keep saying to our people, we must remain engaged. We must watch the news. We must pay attention... because the reality is that once the price of oil goes up, everything goes up with it. The world is fuelled by energy.

"And I said that at this point because it simply reinforces why we must proceed with our geothermal potential in as aggressive a manner as we can."

With contract negotiations nearing completion and a potential August start date for drilling, the NIA's geothermal initiative is poised to enter a critical implementation phase, one that could redefine the island's energy future, reduce electricity costs, and position Nevis as a leader in clean energy production in the region.

# Saint Kitts And Nevis Strengthens Tourism Ties In UK And Europe Through Strategic Engagement And Partnership

Basseterre, Saint Kitts, March 31, 2026 (SKNIS): Minister of Tourism, the Honourable Marsha T. Henderson, has highlighted the Federation's continued efforts to strengthen its tourism industry following a series of high-level engagements in the United Kingdom (UK) and Europe.

Speaking at the Prime Minister's Press Conference with Cabinet Ministers on March 30 at the National Emergency Management Agency (NEMA) Conference Room, Minister Henderson shared that the recent mission focused on deepening relationships, expanding market reach, and positioning Saint Kitts and Nevis for long-term growth within the global tourism industry.

The delegation, which included Deputy CEO of the St. Kitts Tourism Authority, Melnecia Marshall, and Chief Operations Officer of the St. Christopher Air and Sea Ports Authority (SCASPA), Calvin Duggins, engaged key partners across multiple destinations, beginning with a diaspora outreach in Birmingham. There, nationals of Saint Kitts and Nevis were updated on developments in the tourism sector and encouraged to play an active role as ambassadors for the destination.

The visit also saw the official United Kingdom launch of the "We Limin" campaign, building on its earlier rollouts in New York and Canada. The initiative continues to serve as a key platform for promoting the Federation's unique tourism product while encouraging investment and engagement from nationals abroad.

In Italy, the delegation met with executives from Costa Cruises to explore opportunities for expanding cruise business, including homeporting arrangements and destination marketing. Discussions also highlighted the strong performance of Saint Kitts' Port Zante, which is ranked among the top ports within the cruise line's network.

"So essentially, the discussions we had there were based on relationship building. We focused on securing, of course, our long-term relevance and positioning Saint Kitts and Nevis to capture greater value from the industry as it continues to evolve, not just as being a port of call, but of course, for home porting opportunities," said Minister Henderson.

Further engagements in Germany included meetings with AIDA Cruises, where similar strategic opportunities were explored to strengthen collaboration and expand the Federation's presence within the European cruise market.

In addition to stakeholder meetings, the delegation undertook an aggressive media campaign across the UK, completing more than ten interviews with major media outlets to increase destination visibility and promote upcoming events.

"We promoted the destination. We promoted the events, including the Nevis to Saint Kitts cross-channel swim, and some of the media houses from the UK and Europe are here on island. We had about three of them, and one of them participated in the swim," said the tourism minister. "So ultimately, the visit was to grow the long-term relationship with our partners and to make sure that we raise the visibility of the destination in the UK and Europe."

Minister Henderson noted that early results from the visit are already being realised, with international media representatives visiting the Federation and participating in local events such as the cross-channel swim, helping to generate authentic, on-the-ground coverage of Saint Kitts and Nevis.

She also commended the delegation for their dedication and commitment, emphasising that such missions require significant sacrifice but are essential to advancing the country's tourism agenda and creating opportunities for the people of Saint Kitts and Nevis.

# Saint Kitts and Nevis Leads with Compassion: US\$100,000 Contribution to CARICOM Humanitarian Effort for Cuba

**BASSETERRE, Saint Kitts and Nevis** — The Government of Saint Kitts and Nevis has fulfilled its commitment to regional solidarity by pledging and forwarding an initial US\$100,000 to support the collective US\$500,000 CARICOM humanitarian initiative for the Republic of Cuba—representing its first installment of regional assistance.

The contribution was formalized during the historic 50th Regular Meeting of the Conference of Heads of Government of the Caribbean Community, hosted in Saint Kitts and Nevis from February 24-27, 2026. It was at this gathering that Prime Minister and CARICOM Chairman, The Honourable Dr. Terrance M. powdered milk and baby formula; non-perishable food items such as beans, wheat flour, rice and canned goods; basic medical supplies; and critical infrastructure support including solar panels, batteries and water tanks.

The initiative has also

received the support of the Government of Mexico, which has identified suppliers in Mexico capable of delivering the requested items to the port of departure and will provide free shipment from Mexico to Cuba.

Prime Minister Drew said the Government of Saint Kitts and Nevis stands in solidarity with the people of Cuba at this difficult time.

"Cuba has never turned its back on the Caribbean. When our people needed doctors, Cuba sent them. When our students needed education, Cuba opened its classrooms. When disaster struck, Cuba was among the first to offer assistance. Today, we return that kindness not as charity, but as family. This is what CARICOM is about—standing together, sharing burdens, and ensuring that no member of our Caribbean family faces hardship alone. Saint Kitts and Nevis is proud to contribute, and we stand ready to offer whatever further assistance we can in the days ahead," said Prime Minister Drew.

The CARICOM humanitarian initiative reflects the very essence of the Community's founding principles: cooperation, collective action and care for one another. As member states come together to ease the hardships facing the Cuban people, the gesture also signals the region's commitment to dialogue, mutual respect, and the peaceful resolution of challenges.

Prime Minister Drew reaffirmed that Saint Kitts and Nevis remains committed to supporting Cuba and the wider CARICOM region in any future efforts to advance humanitarian cooperation and regional solidarity.



# Prime Minister Drew Positions Sovereign Wealth Fund as Legacy Initiative for Future Generations

**Basseterre, Saint Kitts, March 31, 2026 (PMO)** — Prime Minister Hon. Dr. Terrance Drew today, March 31st, presented the Saint Kitts and Nevis Sovereign Wealth and Resilience Fund Bill, 2026, in the National Assembly, describing the proposed legislation as a transformative step toward securing the nation’s long-term economic future and safeguarding prosperity for generations to come.

Leading debate on the Bill, Prime Minister Drew underscored its historic significance, noting that it goes beyond routine governance and speaks directly to the Federation’s vision for nationhood and sustainability. “This bill is about how we treat the blessings of today. It is about whether unusual revenues are consumed and forgotten or invested and preserved.”

The proposed Sovereign Wealth and Resilience Fund is designed as a statutory, professionally managed investment vehicle that will capture and invest a portion of the country’s extraordinary revenues, including inflows from the Citizenship by Investment (CBI) Program and anticipated earnings from the geothermal sector. The overarching goal is to convert these revenues into durable national wealth while strengthening the Federation’s resilience to external shocks.

Prime Minister Drew emphasized that the initiative is rooted in a philosophy of responsible governance and long-term planning.

“We choose stewardship,” he declared, framing the Bill as a conscious decision by the Government to prioritize prudent financial management over short-term consumption.

He further explained that the Fund will serve multiple national objectives, including intergenerational savings, disaster recovery financing, and fiscal stability, particularly in the face of global economic uncertainty and climate-related risks.

Drawing on both cultural and biblical references, the Prime Minister illustrated the importance of saving during periods of economic strength to prepare for future challenges. He pointed to the well-known story of Joseph in Egypt as a guiding principle for the legislation. “Madam Speaker, it is a biblical example of a sovereign wealth fund,” Dr. Drew said. “When things are good, don’t waste it. Save what you can, because hard days will surely come.”

The Prime Minister made clear that the establishment of the Fund represents a decisive shift in national policy, from the consumption of extraordinary revenues to disciplined saving and investment.

Central to the Bill are strong governance and accountability mechanisms. The Fund will be managed by an independent board operating under strict fiduciary duties, with clear safeguards against political interference. The legislation mandates transparency through regular public reporting, independent audits, and accessible information on the Fund’s performance.


In outlining how the Fund will operate, Dr. Drew explained that deposits will include defined portions of CBI revenues, Sustainable Island State contributions, geothermal profits, and other qualifying inflows. Investments will be made prudently, primarily in foreign assets, with strict limitations on withdrawals to ensure that the Fund is preserved for its intended purposes.

Importantly, withdrawals will only be permitted under clearly defined conditions, such as natural disasters, economic shocks, or carefully assessed national development priorities, thereby ensuring that the Fund is protected from misuse.

Prime Minister Drew also highlighted that the Bill aligns with international best practices, including guidance from the International Monetary Fund, and is structured to meet globally recognized standards for sovereign wealth funds.

The Saint Kitts and Nevis Sovereign Wealth and Resilience Fund Bill, 2026, now moves forward in the legislative process, marking a significant step in the Government’s efforts to build a more resilient, sustainable, and forward-looking nation.





# Consumers Urged To Reduce \$28M Arrears For Water Service As Government Expands Supply Infrastructure

Basseterre, Saint Kitts, March 31, 2026 (SKNIS): Consumers in Saint Kitts are urged to support the government’s major investment to enhance and expand the water infrastructure by reducing the massive \$28 million owed to the Water Services Department in arrears.

The startling figure was shared by the Honourable Konris Maynard, Minister with responsibility for water, while he addressed the National Assembly on Tuesday, March 31, 2026. He noted that the low cost billed to households for water supply is a key factor in some delayed payments.

“People say, ‘Oh water is cheap. That’s \$20, Oh I will pay it later,’” he said.

The total then accumulates for months, and some find it difficult to zero balance the arrears on what is the cheapest water rates in the region, according to Minister Maynard.

To help consumers with financial difficulties, the Water Services Department has created flexible payment plans. Persons are strongly encouraged to contact or visit the department to develop payment schedules, as accounts in arrears are subject to service interruption after 90 days. However, payments of any amount will keep accounts active while reducing the balance.

“That is empathetic,” said Minister Maynard. “It is not a case where people are going after you. If you have

challenges, please present yourselves, indicate your challenges, and the Water Services Department will develop a payment schedule for you.”

The government continues to move forward in its efforts to restore 24/7 water supply after years of neglect and poor planning by the previous administration. Since 2022, millions have been spent on the construction and commissioning of two desalination plants, establishing a new well in Cayon, constructing new water storage

facilities, and replacing underground pipes. Currently, exploratory drilling is taking place in Saddlers at a highly probable well site

# Oil prices jump and shares drop after Trump threatens more Iran strikes

Oil prices started climbing again after US President Donald Trump reiterated threats to hit Iran "extremely hard" in the coming weeks and failed to give concrete details on how the war will end.

Brent crude briefly surged past \$109 (£82) a barrel and stock markets in the US, Europe and Asia fell following Trump's address from the White House.

He said that the US would complete its strategic objectives for the war "very shortly" and spend the next two to three weeks bombing Iran "back to the Stone Ages".

Earlier on Wednesday, oil prices dipped below \$100 ahead of the speech on hopes Trump would say how the US would exit the conflict but his address repeated the same points he made previously.

The Iran war has severely disrupted global oil and gas supplies.

Oil shipments through the critical Strait of Hormuz waterway have mostly been halted after Iran threatened to attack tankers that try to cross in retaliation to US-Israeli strikes, which began on 28 February.

In his speech, Trump said the US did not need the Middle East's energy and urged other nations to step in to free up shipments from the Gulf that have been disrupted as a result of the war.

He said: "To those countries that can't get fuel, many of which refuse to get involved in the decapitation of Iran... build up some delayed courage, go to the Strait and just take it."

Oil prices, which had been fluctuating incrementally before, shot upwards moments after the televised speech.

Brent crude, the global benchmark, rose more than 8% on Thursday, before retreating a bit.

The US benchmark, West Texas Intermediate, which had been somewhat shielded from the price rises earlier in the conflict compared with Brent, also took off, briefly trading above \$110 a barrel in Thursday morning trade in New York before dropping back a bit.

The rise was a "clear market reality check following the earlier optimism for an imminent ceasefire" said Alberto Bellorin, founder and managing director at InterCapital Energy, an oil and gas consultancy.

Trump's speech lacked a "concrete timeline" for the reopening of the Strait of Hormuz, while a return to normal now looks "months away rather than weeks," he added.

In urging other nations to step in, Trump has removed hopes that disruptions to global energy supplies will be resolved swiftly, Bellorin said.

In his speech, Trump said oil and gas flows would return quickly when the war ended.

"When this conflict is over, the strait will open up naturally. It will just open up naturally," he said.

But Anne-Sophie Corbeau, former head of gas analysis at oil giant BP, suggested it could take some time for flows to return to normal.

The Gulf's energy infrastructure has been damaged following strikes by Iran, Israel and the US and Corbeau said repairing it could take between three and five years.

Corbeau, who is now at Center on Global Energy Policy at Colombia, told the BBC's Today programme that disruption to traffic through the Strait of Hormuz was likely to persist and that additional costs in the form of fees to use the strait could be "quite substantial".

She said currently she understood ships were subject to a charge in the region of \$2m for using the strait, which, if made permanent amounted to "the worst-case solution" for users of the waterway.

In the US, the Dow Jones Industrial Average, the S&P 500 and Nasdaq were all more than 1% lower in early morning trade.

In the UK, the FTSE 100 index fell in early afternoon trade but closed 0.69% higher. France's Cac index closed down 0.24%, and Germany's Dax closed down 0.79% - both regaining some earlier falls.

In Asia, major stock indexes fell after Trump's address, reversing earlier gains. Japan's Nikkei 225 closed down 2.4% and South Korea's Kospi ended 4.5% lower.

The region's stock markets have been volatile since the Iran war began.

Asia is particularly vulnerable to the impact of the conflict as it is heavily reliant on the Middle East for its energy supplies.

## Woods crash bodycam footage released by police

Police have released body camera footage showing Tiger Woods after he clipped a truck and rolled his car in Florida last month.

The 15-time major winner, 50, was arrested and charged with driving under the influence and submitted a written plea of not guilty via his lawyers on Tuesday.

He was also charged with property damage and refusal to submit to a lawful test.

Woods has been given permission by a judge to seek treatment overseas, and said he will be stepping away from professional golf to focus on his recovery and health.

Nobody was injured in the crash, but Woods had to crawl out of the passenger door to free himself. He passed a breathalyser test but refused a urinalysis test for other drugs, according to Martin County Sheriff John Budensiek.

In the arrest affidavit, an officer wrote Woods was "sweating profusely", his pupils were "extremely dilated" and his movements were "lethargic and slow".

In the video, Woods, who is wearing a blue polo shirt, shorts and dark sunglasses, is seen being handcuffed as officers question him.

He is told they suspect his "normal faculties are impaired" by an "unknown substance". Authorities then find two white pills, which were identified as hydrocodone - an opioid used to treat pain - in his pocket.

Woods, who remains still while officers search him, is asked does he have anything else on his person, to which he replies he does not.

On Wednesday, it was announced that Woods had turned down the role of United States Ryder Cup captain when the biennial tournament takes place in Ireland in 2027.



# Ancient golden helmet recovered more than a year after Dutch heist

A 2,500-year-old golden helmet considered one of Romania's greatest treasures has been recovered more than a year after it was stolen during a raid on a Dutch museum.

It and two golden bracelets dating back to about 450BC were unveiled as having been returned to the museum on Thursday, secured behind a glass case with two armed police guarding them. A third bracelet has not yet been found.

The theft of the Co?ofene?ti helmet and bracelets by an armed gang who broke into the Drents Museum in Assen caused outrage in Romania and raised questions about security for priceless artefacts on loan to other countries.

"It's a long-awaited result," Romanian prosecutor Daniela Buruian? told journalists.

"We are happy that we are now witnessing here the recovery of the Romanian artefacts," she added.

The treasures had been on loan from Romania's national history museum when they were stolen, as part of an exhibition called "Dacia - empire of gold and silver", telling the story of the civilisation and people who lived in present-day Romania before the Roman conquest in 106 AD.

Their theft prompted a spat between the two governments that led to the Dutch

government paying a reported €5.7m (£5m; \$6.5m) in insurance compensation. Romanian officials refused to discuss what would happen to that money now.

Robert van Langh, director of the Drents Museum in the northern Netherlands, said the helmet had been slightly dented but could be restored. The bracelets remained in perfect condition, he said.

Romanian prosecutor Rare?-Petru Stan spoke of the "major impact" that the theft had had in his home country, and praised his Dutch colleagues for their "hard work and keeping the faith".

"We are continuing the investigation to find the last bracelet," he added, "and we are grateful that we will be able to return this treasure to the Romanian people."

Dutch public prosecutor Corien Fahner revealed that the helmet and bracelets were handed over to authorities on Wednesday following negotiations involving lawyers for the three suspects.

Two men in their mid-30s and one aged 21 will face trial later this month and Fahner said the return of the treasures was part of a pre-trial agreement with the suspects' defence lawyers.

The men were arrested within days of the gang using explosives to break into the museum, but by then there was no trace of the priceless items.

Art experts have suggested that the helmet and bracelets were stolen to order by a criminal gang.

Several Dutch provincial museums have been targeted in recent years because of the difficulty in providing adequate security for priceless artefacts. The helmet and bracelets were in a glass case that provided little resistance to the armed group.

In 2024, two works by Andy Warhol were stolen from a gallery in the southern Netherlands, and six years ago a Frans Hals painting called Two Laughing Boys was stolen from a small museum in the central town of Leerdam.

The former head of the national history museum in Bucharest, Ernest Oberländer-Târnoveanu, faced considerable domestic criticism for loaning the gold objects abroad and lost his job within days of the theft.

He spoke of his relief that the helmet had been retrieved.

"This is a unique item in European and even global cultural heritage," he told RTL Nieuws. "The helmet is an important social and political symbol of Dacian civilisation."

# DR Congo declares national holiday after reaching World Cup for first time in 52 years

## There were celebrations in Kinshasa at the final whistle

Authorities in the Democratic Republic Congo have declared Wednesday a public holiday after the national football team qualified for their first World Cup in 52 years.

The Leopards reached the finals on Tuesday when Axel Tuanzebe's extra-time goal gave them a 1-0 win over Jamaica in the play-off.

DR Congo's ministry of labour and employment said that as a result of the "historic" victory, the nation could have the day off work to "celebrate in unity, fervour and national pride".

The central African nation has only played in the World Cup once before - in 1974 when the country was named Zaire.

Numerous employers honoured the holiday on Wednesday, with many banks and shops shut throughout the day in the capital, Kinshasa.

However some employers proceeded with the work day as normal as the announcement - made at approximately 08:00 local time (07:00 GMT) - came at such short notice.

Tuesday's match was an intense affair, with former Manchester United player Tuanzebe only breaking the deadlock in the 100th minute.

Elated football fans celebrated in Kinshasa after the team's victory was confirmed just before 01:00 local time on Wednesday morning.

One supporter told the BBC: "Whatever we may be feeling at the moment, amidst pain and war and occupation, this victory makes us proud... I feel so emotional and happy."

DR Congo has been battered by decades of conflict. The fighting escalated early last year when the M23 rebel group captured swathes of territory in the country's east.

Although neighbouring Rwanda is widely believed to be

supporting the M23 and the two countries' leaders have exchanged bitter insults in recent years, Rwanda's government has congratulated DR Congo on qualifying.

Deputy government spokesperson Jean Maurice Uwera said in a post on X: "Leopards stepping up for Africa! Congratulations DR Congo, go make the continent proud on the world stage."

In the Kinshasa neighbourhood of Kingabwa, some fans took to the streets chanting: "Christiano Ronaldo is next".

DR Congo's first match will be against Ronaldo's Portugal in the US city of Houston on 17 June.

They will also play Colombia and Uzbekistan in the group stages.

DR Congo are the 10th African nation to reach this year's expanded World Cup finals, jointly hosted by the US, Mexico and Canada.

Born in Bunia, a city hit by the ongoing conflict, Tuanzebe said Tuesday night's goal was "without a doubt the most important" of his career.

"I'm so grateful to have scored that goal for the team, for the nation. I realise the magnitude of what it represents and the joy it brings to people."
