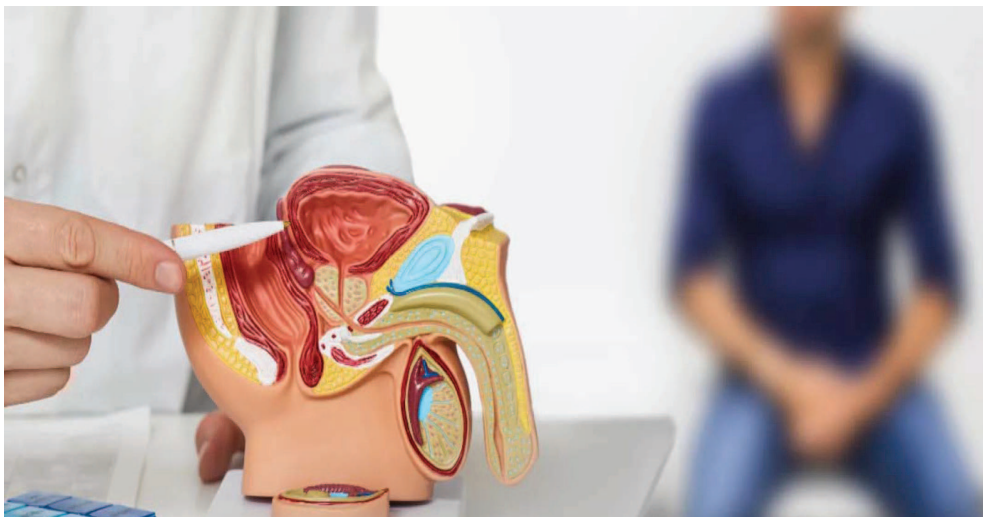

Editorial

Shower Black History Month With Love

February arrives each year dressed in red and white. Storefronts blossom with hearts, roses and glittering declarations of affection. Dinner reservations are made weeks in advance. Social media timelines overflow with curated expressions of devotion. And in the midst of all that celebration, another observance quietly shares the same calendar space-Black History Month.

PM Drew Pledges Monetary Support Toward First Prostate Health Foundation

BASSETERRE, St. Kitts (Wednesday 18th February 2026)-Declaring that “we cannot leave our men behind,” Prime Minister and Minister of Health and Finance, Dr. Terrance Drew, has highlighted his push for setting up the first prostate cancer health foundation aimed at providing support to men diagnosed with the condition in St. Kitts and Nevis.

Dr. Drew made the disclosure while speaking at The Roundtable media session on Tuesday 17th February 2026 outlining what he described as a necessary step to ensure that men are not left out of national health support initiatives.

“I have asked Advisor Austin Edinborough, who is a prostate cancer survivor- he has spoken of this publicly - and I have said to him, I asked his permission to say this publicly, and he said that I of course can talk about it. I’ve asked him to help initiate a prostate health foundation here in St. Kitts and Nevis,” he expressed.

He further pledged personal financial support toward the effort.

“I will be the first donor and I have pledged \$5,000 of my own money to that foundation that I hope will be formed soon so that our men can get support,” he announced.

During his remarks, the Prime Minister first highlighted the charitable impact of the annual Prime Minister’s Gala.

“... the Prime Minister’s Gala which was held this year - the proceeds from that gala-for the first time, well the second time last year, dedicated it to the Children’s Medical Fund, and this year it was dedicated to the Breast Cancer Foundations,” Dr. Drew said.

He announced that both breast cancer foundations received financial contributions from the event.

“Today I presented both breast cancer foundations with a cheque each of \$15,000- so that’s \$30,000 directly from the Prime Minister’s Gala for the betterment of our women, or men-men can get breast cancer as well - for those who may need some support,” he stated, while thanking the organisations for “the tremendous work they have been doing here in St. Kitts and Nevis.”

However, Dr. Drew said the moment also highlighted a gap in support services.

“I’ve also mentioned that it’s time to get a men’s prostate health program going. It is about time,” he said. “What we could have done as well is dedicate some of this money to prostate health which would go directly to men.”

The Prime Minister noted that while support structures exist for pregnant women, children and women battling breast cancer, “at no point men are being mentioned.”

“We cannot leave our men behind. We have families in St.Kitts and Nevis. Families are made up of children, men, women and others. And therefore, we want to make sure that our men are not left behind,” he stressed.

Drawing from his experience as a medical doctor, Dr. Drew shared a deeply personal account that underscored the urgency of the initiative.

“I remember I’ve seen a lot of men in my office with prostate cancer, and I can never forget- Austin himself was one of my patients as well and we were able to cure him,” he said.

He also recounted a case that left a lasting impact.

“I remember there was a gentleman who came to see me, my patient, and I diagnosed him with prostate cancer. And I told him the cost. And he shook my hand-I will never forget it- and he said, ‘Dr. Drew, thank you for your service but I can’t afford it. I am not going to leave my family in debt, and I’m going home to die.’ He was dead one month later. He had nowhere to turn, nowhere to go.”

The Prime Minister contrasted that experience with the support networks available to women.

“I normally see when women come down with breast cancer, these foundations are a source of help and support. So we need that for men,” he said.

Dr. Drew expressed hope that the proposed foundation would be established within the first quarter of the year.

“I’ve said to Advisor Edinborough to get it started as soon as possible because I’m very sure there are men out there who need help right now with dealing with prostate health. So I hope that will be formed within the first quarter so that men can start getting some help that they would need in order to deal with their health situations.”

Official Commissioning Ceremony of the Basseterre Desalination Plant

Basseterre, Saint Kitts — The Ministry of Public Infrastructure, Energy and Utilities is pleased to announce the official commissioning ceremony of the Basseterre Desalination Plant, a landmark infrastructure project designed to significantly strengthen water security for Basseterre and surrounding communities.

The commissioning ceremony will be held on Tuesday, 24 February 2026, at 9:00 am, at the C.A. Paul Southwell Industrial Park, marking the transition of the facility from construction and testing to full operational status.

The plant is designed to produce up to two million gallons of potable water per day, utilising reverse osmosis technology to provide a reliable and climate-resilient water supply.

Minister of Public Infrastructure, Energy, Utilities and Domestic Transport, Hon. Konris Maynard, described the commissioning as a major achievement for the Federation.

“The plant represents a critical investment in our national infrastructure and is a tangible demonstration of the Government’s decisive action to address long-standing water challenges in the capital,” Minister Maynard said.

“Its commissioning signals the completion of a key phase in an ambitious undertaking involving multiple stakeholders and partners, aimed at restoring potable water service in Basseterre to 24 hours a day, seven days a week.

“This is a celebratory moment for the Water Services Department, the Ministry of Public Infrastructure, the Government of St. Kitts and Nevis, our partners, and every citizen of the Federation.”

The Minister further underscored the strategic importance of the facility in the context of climate resilience and growing demand.

“As climate variability continues to impact traditional water sources, desalination offers a dependable alternative. This plant strengthens our capacity to meet current demand while positioning Basseterre for future growth.”

The project was implemented under the direction of the Ministry of Public Infrastructure in collaboration with the Water Services Department and key technical partners, including Royal Utilities Ltd., with funding provided by the Republic of China (Taiwan).

Comprehensive testing has been completed to ensure that the facility meets all required operational and water quality standards ahead of commissioning.

The Basseterre Desalination Plant forms part of the Government’s broader Sustainable Island State Agenda, which seeks to enhance infrastructure resilience, safeguard public health, and ensure equitable access to essential services.

Once fully operational, the facility is expected to significantly reduce water interruptions and expand 24-hour potable water service to households and businesses within the Basseterre area.

The Ministry of Public Infrastructure, Energy and Utilities is responsible for the planning, development and maintenance of the Federation’s physical infrastructure, including roads, public buildings, water services and energy systems. 'I Am Not Going to Be Forced' - PAM Leader Addresses Unity Letter

BASSETERRE, St. Kitts (February 10, 2026) -Leader of the People's Action Movement (PAM), Natasha Grey-Brookes, has pointed out that her party will not be pressured into any political alliance, saying "I am not going to be forced into getting into any alignment."

Grey-Brookes was responding to a question from a supporter during a PAM press conference held Thursday 12th February 2026 regarding a letter reportedly sent to PAM proposing a unity arrangement among opposition parties.

Detailing how the letter reached her, Grey-Brookes explained that it was delivered to her office the previous Friday.

"Last week Friday, I was at my office. I got a message from one of my staff members to tell me that a gentleman was outside to me. I sent a message to indicate that I was trying to meet a court deadline and so leave a message. What was left was an envelope marked confidential," she said.

She added that she handled the envelope cautiously.

"I took the envelope. I put it in my drawer. I locked it away since it said confidential."

Grey-Brookes said she then shifted her attention to constituency matters.

"And after that because I am working in the best interest of the people I went to make sure that I go to my constituency office in the evening to do all my objections to make sure that no wrong names are on the voters list. So I didn't remember the envelope."

The PAM leader said she only became aware of the letter's contents after it began circulating publicly addressed to her as well as two (2) other opposition leaders namely Leader Janice Daniel Hodge of the Nevis Reformation Party (NRP) and Timothy Harris of the People's Labour Party (PLP).

"Saturday I had a wonderful breakfast with my team and we planned for today. By the time I got home, my good friend sent

me a message with the letter that is circulating from Lionel Sydney Osborne addressed to Natasha Grey-Brookes, Janice Daniel Hodge and Timothy Harris."

She continued: "And I'm not sure if you saw the letter but basically the letter was suggesting that there should be a unity arrangement between amongst the three parties and it also had the results from the last election."

According to Grey-Brookes, she did not open the envelope immediately.

"The first time I opened the envelope was Monday morning. By then I would have already seen the memo circulating in social media. So I began to wonder if it was really confidential because persons in the media saw it before I actually saw it. So I locked it

away thinking it was confidential but then I saw it on social media."

She confirmed that she has not formally responded to the correspondence.

"I have not responded to the letter. The party issued a statement. I'm not sure if you saw that the party issued a statement indicating that we are focused on ensuring that we build our party and work in the best interest of the people."

Grey-Brookes stressed that PAM's immediate priority is strengthening its own organisation rather than negotiating alliances.

"At this point, we are not focused on any alignment. If there is any alignment with any political party in St. Kitts and Nevis, it will be on PAM's terms and it will be when PAM is ready and it will be what the people want," she stated.

Reaffirming her position, she added: "So, I am not going to be forced into getting into any alignment. My first and foremost priority is the people and I'm using the political party of PAM to make sure that we work on the best interest of the people."

According to the PAM Leader: "I'm not worried about any alignment. I'm worried about making sure that we work for the people and build a team that is ready for the people."

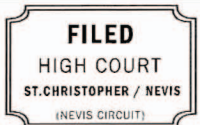

Government Advances Water Security as Trinidad and Tobago Firm Begins Local Drilling Program

Basseterre, Saint Kitts, February 18, 2026 (PMO): The Government of Saint Kitts and Nevis continues to accelerate its national water security strategy, with a Trinidad and Tobago-based company currently on island conducting exploratory drilling at multiple sites.

Prime Minister, Hon Dr. Terrance Drew confirmed during yesterday's, February 17th, Round Table that the drilling exercise forms part of a broader, multi-layered approach to guarantee 24/7 potable water access across the Federation.

"We have contracted a company from Trinidad and Tobago who is now presently drilling, right now they are in Saddlers," the Prime Minister said, noting that approximately ten sites have been identified for assessment.

The drilling initiative complements the Government's major investment in the newly completed publicly owned desalination plant, which is currently producing two million gallons of potable water per day and is scheduled for official commissioning on February 24.

The Prime Minister stressed that his

administration does not intend to return to a time when communities face inconsistent water supply.

"We do not intend to ever go back to a place where people cannot have 24/7 water," he affirmed.

The \$60 million desalination investment, according to Prime Minister Drew, along with new well development and infrastructure upgrades, forms a core component of the Sustainable Island State Agenda, particularly under its water security pillar.

Prime Minister Drew also encouraged citizens to support national efforts by remaining compliant with water bill payments, explaining that revenues collected are reinvested directly into improving and maintaining the water system.

"We subsidize water heavily. When you pay your water bill, the Government does not make a profit. The Government uses that money to reinvest in you."

The Government remains committed to long-term infrastructure resilience and sustainable resource management for present and future generations.

Andrew arrested on suspicion of misconduct in public office

Andrew Mountbatten-Windsor has been arrested on suspicion of misconduct in public office.

Thames Valley Police confirmed it had arrested a man in his 60s in Norfolk on Thursday and was carrying out searches at addresses in Berkshire and Norfolk. He remains in custody, it said.

King Charles III said the "law must take its course" in response to Andrew's arrest and that the police had his "full and wholehearted support and co-operation".

Police had previously said they were considering investigating the former prince over allegations relating to his association with the late sex offender Jeffrey Epstein.

They were reviewing allegations Andrew shared confidential material with the disgraced financier, after communications between the two were among files released by the US government.

This is the first time Andrew has been arrested. He has consistently and strenuously denied any wrongdoing.

Thames Valley Police said that, following a "thorough assessment", a formal investigation had now been opened.

It also said earlier in February that it was assessing a separate allegation that a second woman was sent to the UK by Epstein for a sexual encounter with Andrew in 2010. The woman, who is not British, was in her 20s at the time.

The arrest, which took place at Sandringham at 08:00 on Thursday, is not in relation to any allegations of sexual offences.

The BBC understands that Royal Lodge - Andrew's former home in Windsor Great Park - is being searched by police. A number of uniformed officers have been seen beyond the gates.

Thames Valley Police said it was not naming the arrested man "as per national guidance", and warned that as the case was now active, care must be taken to avoid being in contempt of court.

Assistant Chief Constable Oliver Wright said: "We understand the significant public interest in this case, and we will

provide updates at the appropriate time."

Norfolk Constabulary told the BBC it was "supporting a Thames Valley Police investigation into misconduct in a public office".

The former Duke of York served as the UK's trade envoy between 2001 and 2011, travelling globally and enjoying privileged access to senior government and business contacts around the world.

In 2010, Andrew appears to have forwarded government reports from visits to Vietnam, Singapore and China to Epstein, files relating to the late financier recently released by the US Department of Justice appear to show.

The documents also appear to show Andrew forwarded information on investment opportunities in gold and uranium in Afghanistan to Epstein.

Under official guidance, trade envoys have a duty of confidentiality over sensitive, commercial, or political information about their official visits.

King Charles said he learned of the news his brother's arrest with the "deepest concern".

"What now follows is the full, fair and proper process by which this issue is investigated in the appropriate manner and by the appropriate authorities," he said in a statement.

"Let me state clearly: the law must take its course.

"As this process continues, it would not be right for me to comment further on this matter. Meanwhile, my family and I will continue in our duty and service to you all."

It is understood neither the King nor Buckingham Palace were given advance warning of Andrew's arrest, which occurred on his 66th birthday.

Andrew has always denied any wrongdoing over his association with Epstein. He has not responded to the BBC's requests for comment on the specific allegations in relation to the release of millions of Epstein files in January.

The former prince previously faced allegations from another woman, Virginia Giuffre, which were settled out of court.

She alleged she was made to have sex with Andrew on a number of occasions, including on Epstein's private island Little St James in the early 2000s.

The settlement reached between the two made no admission of wrongdoing on Andrew's part.

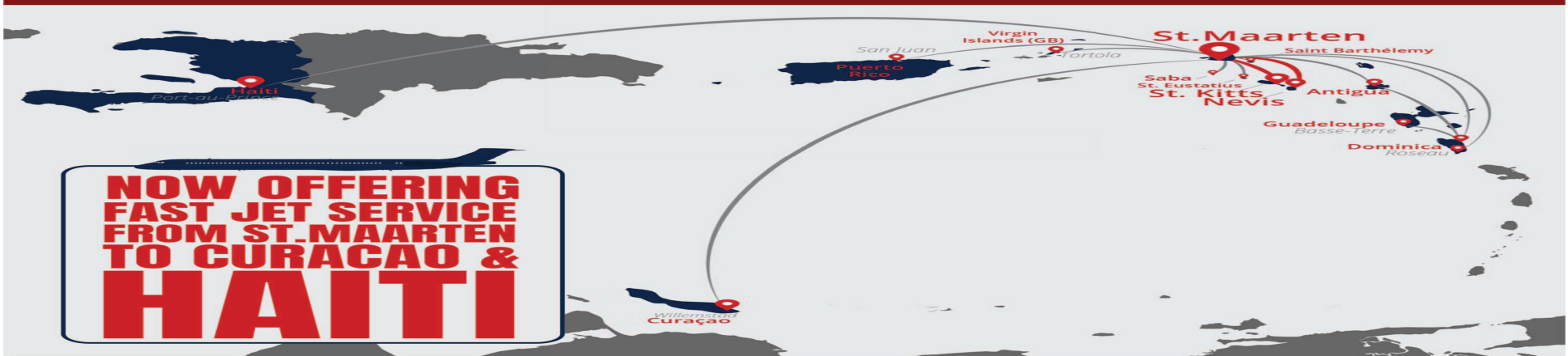
Andrew stepped back from royal duties in 2019 as he said the allegations had become a "disruption" for the royal family.

He subsequently lost his military titles and royal patronages as Giuffre brought a civil action against him in the US in 2022.

Andrew was stripped of his princely title in October 2025, the same month Giuffre's posthumous memoir was published and as fresh details about his association with Epstein came to light.

Family Members Express Gratitude as Newtown Institutions Renamed in Honour of Well-known Community Pillars

BASSETTERRE, St. Kitts (Wednesday 18th February 2026)-Emotional tributes and heartfelt gratitude have marked the recent official renaming ceremony of the Newtown Health Centre and the Newtown Community Centre by loved ones of the honourees.

The ceremony, held at the Newtown Paddock, on Tuesday 17th February 2026 saw the Health Centre renamed in honour of the Nurse Millicent West (Millicent West Health Centre) while the Community Centre now bears the name of a well-rounded community activist Mr. Kennedy Earle Clarke (K. Earle Clarke Community Center).

Additionally, two halls within the newly named community centre are dedicated to two other late community figures- Mr.Lloyd Lazar and Teacher Myrtle Neal.

The event was hosted by the Ministry of Social Development & Gender Affairs in collaboration with the Ministry of Health.

Earla Clarke-Allen, the eldest daughter of Mr. Kennedy Earle Clarke, reflected on her father's legacy.

"As daddy's eldest daughter, that today my heart is full. My heart is very full," she said.

Describing her father as a proud son of Newtown, she added, "Naming this community center after my dad is more than a tribute. It is a reflection of the life that he lived every single day."

Clarke-Allen painted a picture of a man devoted to people, particularly the vulnerable.

"He believed in community, he believed in people and especially if you were an underdog, if you were overlooked or if you were struggling or if you simply needed somebody in your corner he was there and he didn't just speak about helping others he lived it."

She recalled his generosity with a touch of humour and honesty.

"He would give his last dollar and truth be told he would give my last dollar just to make sure that somebody else was okay and that was his heart."

In closing, she expressed appreciation to those who made the renaming possible.

"I want to say thank you, thank you, thank you Dr. [Geoffrey] Hanley (Deputy Prime Minister and Parliamentary representative For St.Christopher One) and to all those who have made this possible... May this Center stand as a reminder of who he was - a champion for the underdog, a helper to those in need and a true man of Newtown. Thank you for honoring his legacy."

For Lilleth Hallpike Hughes, granddaughter of Nurse Millicent West, the day marked the fulfilment of a long-held vision.

"This endeavor has been very personal to me. It has been 10 years since the idea came to me, and I was also approached by many present and former Newtowners and other citizens of our Federation through personal contact and social media to pursue this recognition."

She shared further: "My grandmother, Nurse West, raised my cousin Dennis Delaney Richards; he referred to her as his first love, and myself. And today we feel a sense of joy that this recognition has come to fruition."

Hallpike Hughes recounted a formative childhood memory during Hurricane Donna.

"She went to the clothes bag and was taking out clothes... And I said, 'Mother, what are you doing?' 'I'm sending clothes to Anguilla.'"

That moment, she said, remained etched in her memory. "Whenever there's a hurricane, I think of her because she cared for so many here and abroad. It didn't matter what she could do. She always was willing to help."

She also shared testimonies from community members, including one who said, "Nurse West delivered all the Barker children. And she was always there."

The granddaughter expressed gratitude to those who supported the petition and submitted testimonials.

"I hereby thank the attendees who have come to share in this momentous occasion... It would take us weeks to go through them and sign the petition," she said, noting that some supporters had since passed on, saying "They're looking down on us from heaven today."

Nurse Millicent passed away on 27th November 1983 and Earle Clarke on 25th May 2023.

'Cricketers need to understand right times to drink'

Cricket does not have an alcohol problem but players "need to understand the time to have a drink and the time not to", says former England captain Alec Stewart.

Discussion around drinking dominated this winter's Ashes series in Australia with the behaviour of England's players heavily scrutinised during their 4-1 defeat in the Tests.

The England and Wales Cricket Board investigated reports

of players drinking excessively during a mid-series trip to Noosa, while white-ball captain Harry Brook was punched by a nightclub bouncer the night before a one-day match in New Zealand in November.

"Alcohol will not improve anyone's performance so this is why the education is so important," said Stewart, currently director of cricket at Surrey.

"People aren't going to just live like monks and be completely teetotal, but people need to understand the time to have a drink and the time not to.

"The higher level you are, the more scrutiny you're under and therefore the sacrifices are greater and therefore be very selective in what you put into your body, whether that is food, whether that is drink or whatever."

Stewart was speaking after being announced as the new president of the Cricketers' Trust charity, which provides

support to current and former players and their families around their health and wellbeing.

He was also suggested as a potential candidate to replace England's managing director Rob Key, though Key is expected to be given the chance to improve England's fortunes.

Selector Luke Wright left his position after the Ashes and is yet to be replaced.

The charity has released a new report to outline its work, including providing mental health support to 239 current and former professional cricketers over the past five years. There has been a 33% increase in therapy sessions from 667 in 2024 to 889 in 2025.

The report references eight cases of players going into "residential rehabilitation" - receiving treatment in specialist facilities at which they can stay for a period of time supported financially by the trust - for various issues including to alcohol, anxiety, gambling and substance abuse.

Speaking about the high-profile discussion around alcohol this winter, former batter Ian Thomas who now works at the Professional Cricketers' Association and is a Cricketers' Trust trustee said: "We've continued to work hard on the education front.

"It's something that's in everyday life in society, but there is a responsibility for athletes and cricketers to make the right choices at the right times and that's what our education was about.

"We're still going to have people make the wrong choices and we're still going to have human error.

"The biggest part for us if that does happen is that we're able to pick them up."

The report says more than half of the issues affecting players relate to low mood, anxiety and emotional support.

"We've got to make sure the support mechanisms are in place and that individuals are not afraid to actually put a hand up and say I'm struggling," Stewart said.

"It's always been there. It always will be there because it's such a result-based business. This is where you've got to get the balance."

Zimbabwe stun Sri Lanka to finish top of Group B

Zimbabwe won by six wickets

Zimbabwe finished top of Group B at the T20 World Cup after stunning England's next opponents Sri Lanka in a six-wicket victory in Colombo.

Both sides were already guaranteed their place in the Super 8s but Zimbabwe, who did not qualify for the last T20 World Cup in 2024, progress unbeaten after completing a fine chase of 179 with three balls to spare.

Opener Brian Bennett, who is yet to be dismissed in the tournament, followed his score of 64 not out in the famous win over Australia last week with an unbeaten 63 to steer home the chase.

He shared an opening stand of 69 with Tadiwanashe Marumani and, after Marumani fell for 34 and Ryan Burl 23, played the anchor role as captain Sikander Raza struck 45 from just 26 balls.

Raza and Tashinga Musekiwa fell in the penultimate over but, with eight runs needed from the last, Tony Munyonga emerged and hit a six before Bennett drove the winning runs through the covers.

Co-hosts Sri Lanka, who play England in both sides' Super 8s opener in Pallekele on Sunday, dropped catches and leaked boundaries with misfields.

They were without injured bowler Matheesha Pathirana and fellow seamer Dushmantha Chameera, who was resting.

Pathum Nissanka, who also scored a fine century in Sri Lanka's win over Australia, continued his form with 62 from 44 balls in his side's 178-7.

Zimbabwe progress into a Super 8s group with co-hosts India, South Africa and West Indies.

Their first match is on Monday in Mumbai against the Windies, who beat Italy earlier on Thursday to continue their unbeaten record.

Joseph stars as West Indies extend winning run

West Indies won by 42 runs

West Indies' Shamar Joseph became the first player to take four catches and four wickets in a single T20 international as his side beat Italy by 42 runs.

Having already secured Super 8s qualification, the two-time champions completed a perfect group-stage record of four wins from four at Kolkata's Eden Gardens.

Italy won the toss and chose to bowl, making a positive start by dismissing opener Brandon King and the big-hitting Shimron Hetmyer cheaply inside the first five overs.

Windies captain Shai Hope helped lead his side to a competitive total, compiling a second successive fifty before he was bowled by Crishan Kalugamage for 75 off 46 balls, including six fours and four sixes.

Roston Chase and Sherfane Rutherford both added 24 as West Indies posted 165-6. Kalugamage was the best of Italy's bowlers, finishing with 2-25 off his four overs.

Italy struggled to make any sort of a dent in their run chase, slipping to 37-3 after the powerplay.

Jon-Jon Smuts (24) and Ben Manenti (26) were the only batters to pass 20 for the Italians, who beat Nepal to claim their first-ever T20 World Cup win earlier in the tournament.

Joseph (4-30) and Matthew Forde (3-19) were the pick of the West Indies' bowlers as Italy were dismissed for 123 in 18 overs. Hope side's progress to the Super 8s having bowled out three of their four group-stage opponents.

Afghanistan thrash Canada to end on a high

Afghanistan won by 82 runs

Ibrahim Zadran hit a brilliant unbeaten 95 and Mohammad Nabi took four wickets as Afghanistan claimed a dominant 82-run victory over Canada in Chennai.

Both sides were playing out their final group-stage fixture for pride after their elimination from the tournament - but Rashid Khan's side looked particularly keen to set things straight after narrowly missing the Super 8s.

Ibrahim led the charge for Afghanistan once again, hitting seven fours and five sixes off 56 deliveries to post back-to-back half centuries at the tournament and record his highest score for the country.

The 24-year-old's solid innings was backed up by Rahmanullah Gurbaz (30) and Sediq Atal (44), before both were bowled by Canada seamer Jaskarandeep Buttar (3-52).

Canada were set a target of 201 and their collapse started in the six-over powerplay, falling to 34-3 with Afghanistan removing Dilpreet Bajwa, Navneet Dhaliwal and Yuvraj Samra.

It was a disappointing farewell for Canada's highest T20 international run-scorer Dhaliwal, who was dismissed for a duck by Azmatullah Omarzai after receiving a guard of honour prior to the match.

But it was Afghanistan's veteran spinner Nabi who dealt the final blows for Canada, claiming 4-7 from his four overs.
