Editorial

SKNLP Conference Speaker Applauds Contribution of Women To Labour Movements

BASSETERRE, St. Kitts (Tuesday 19th May 2026) - "Women are not decorations, they are the foundation of the labour movements!"

So declared Lisa Jawahir, newly-elected Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries, Food Security and Sustainable Development in the Saint Lucia Labour Party administration and Parliamentary Representative for South East, St. Lucia, while delivering the feature address at the 94th Annual Conference of the St. Kitts-Nevis Labour Party (SKNLP) as she applauded the contribution of women to the Labour movement.

The conference was held on Sunday 17th May 2026 at the party's new headquarters at Manhattan Gardens in the Lime Kiln Commercial Development in Basseterre for the second consecutive year, under the theme 'Labour Strong-United In Purpose, Committed to progress.'

Jawahir reflected on her "four months in as new minister" in government and highlighted the importance of togetherness within labour movements.

"I want to tell you something tonight. Labour is better in office than out of office! And if we truly love this party and we truly love this movement, we cannot spend more time fighting comrades than fighting for the people," she said.

Jawahir told delegates that labour movements were established through sacrifice and struggle on behalf of ordinary people.

"We cannot forget why Labour movements were started in the first place; for the people, fighting for the people and not amongst ourselves because you know very well that the party was not built in comfort."

"It was built through sacrifice; it was built through struggle by ordinary people who believed that they deserve dignity and representation."

Referencing the long history of the SKNLP, Jawahir added, "And 94 years St. Kitts-Nevis Labour Party is standing firm and strong through storms, through hardships, victories and defeats, your party is still standing strong."

"That is why the movement must be protected because if Labour loses, it is always the poor and vulnerable who will feel it first."

Speaking directly to younger parliamentarians, Jawahir encouraged them to seek guidance from senior members and longstanding supporters of the movement.

"And as a new minister, I want to share some words with my young parliamentarians, those here and those listening. It is wise to seek counsel from the elders."

"Listen to the people who carried the party when it was not fashionable. Listen to the women who cooked and marched and mobilized [and] sacrificed, listen to your branch members who stood loyal through difficult years, and listen to understand the soul of this movement."

Jawahir also singled out the contributions of women within labour movements across the region.

"Women of Labour ... Never forget them you know, they stood on the blocks, they're organizing the community meetings, they are mobilizing. Women are not decorations, they are the foundation of the labour movements," she expressed.

The St. Lucia minister also shared lessons from her recent election campaign, emphasizing grassroots engagement over social media campaigning.

"I am learning very quickly; elections are not won in ministries; they are not won behind desks, they are won among the people."

"They are not won in ministries, they are not won behind the desk, they are won in the people, in the presence of the people."

"Many of you told me that you followed my campaign on social media but I didn't win the campaign on social media."

"I won the campaign by knocking on doors... I won the campaign by

Band Manager Shares Plans Kollision Band Had to Address Bullying and Violence in Schools During Funeral Tribute

BASSETERRE, St. Kitts (Thursday 21st May 2026) - "Sometime later this year, we wanted to go to the schools and talk about bullying and violence and look and behold he die by violence."

So said Kollision Band Manager Shervin White during the "Sing In Paradise" funeral service for 39-year-old lead singer Jermaine 'Chubby' Clarke held on Wednesday 20th May 2026 at the Warner Park Cricket Stadium.

He gave the assurance that the band would continue, saying: "I can assure everyone today, this is not the end of Kollision Band. His legacy would go on. We will continue his legacy."

During his tribute, White spoke about Clarke's involvement with the band, his interaction with young supporters and the group's plans for outreach in schools.

"He loved the band. I encouraged Chubby to leave the Breweries and pursue music. I said Chubby, you have done fifteen years; there's only so much you can go, take the payout and do music. That's why Chubby was so passionate about Kollision Band," White said.

"I mean he can be harsh sometimes; we fall out couple times; his mouth is something else but he ain't mean nothing."

White also recounted conversations Clarke had regarding the band's younger supporters.

"I mean sometimes I do get frustrated when people say 'The Children Band' he say 'Shervin don't worry, don't worry when the parents go wid de other band, I will take care the children dem for dem.'"

According to him, the band had been visiting schools and intended to continue outreach efforts later this year.

"He have grown to love his fans that we embarked on a tour to visit all the

Reflecting on the band's achievements, White recalled discussions with Clarke about stepping away from management after helping the band secure Sugar Mas road march competition success in 2024.

"This year, I told him now Chubby 'I brought you all a road march; it's time for me to move on cause it was not my intention to continue long.' He said man give me one more year. I went into 2025, I gave it my shot and then we tie for road march."

"Don't mind him, we concede to the band that won but Chubby say that we win de road march; first runner-up, first runner up," he added.

White also recounted a surprise birthday celebration Clarke helped organize for him earlier this year.

"Later this year, it was my birthday on March 31st. Chubby went behind my back with my mom and planna surprise birthday party. I never know nothing about it, he talk to me every day and now I learn, he was an active member in the chat."

"On that night he gave me the 'Keys of The City'; he handed it over to me. I was wondering what the meaning of that was, and he said Shervin you are my national hero."





"I start to cry because I saw him because knowing that we talk all de time and he ain't tell me nothing; they kept it very silent, and just imagine, just four days later, I will have plan his funeral."

White said organizing the funeral and supporting members of the band in the weeks following Clarke's death had been difficult.

"I wasn't ready for this; it was very challenging. It has been a tough six weeks for me until the funeral. I hardly slept; I had to keep the guys together. The pressure was on."



Saint Kitts And Nevis To Receive Three CARICOM Nationals Transferred From The United States

Basseterre, Saint Kitts, May 19, 2026 (SKNIS): The Government of Saint Kitts and Nevis wishes to inform the general public that three (3) individuals who are nationals of Member States of the Caribbean Community (CARICOM)—Jamaica and Belize—are scheduled to arrive in the Federation on May 19, 2026 following their transfer from the United States of America (USA).

The transfer is being conducted pursuant to the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between the Government of Saint Kitts and Nevis and the Government of the USA concerning the transfer of certain third-country nationals who are citizens of CARICOM Member States.

In accordance with the arrangements outlined in the MOU, at no cost to the Government of Saint Kitts and Nevis, the individuals will be processed through the established immigration and security procedures of Saint Kitts and Nevis and will be granted the immigration status and legal accommodation ordinarily applicable to CARICOM nationals within the Federation.

The Government wishes to assure the public that all relevant national security, immigration, and law enforcement agencies have been fully engaged in the process. The USA Government has also provided the relevant biographical, medical, and criminal background information available in relation to the individuals prior to their transfer.

It is often said that water is life. In the face of growing global climate challenges and increasing threats associated with climate change, safeguarding water resources has become more critical than ever. The Organisation of Eastern Caribbean States (OECS) has been advancing efforts to protect vital ecosystems and water resources through the Integrated Landscape Management (ILM) Project, a five-year initiative funded by the European Union.

On Wednesday, May 13, 2026, the OECS Commission, in collaboration with the European Union (EU) and the Government of Saint Kitts and Nevis, officially handed over the Royal Basseterre Valley National Park Arboretum during a ceremony held under the OECS ILM Project.

Implemented through European Union grant funding, the initiative focused on enhancing sustainable land management through the construction of perimeter fencing and the establishment and afforestation of an arboretum within the Royal Basseterre Valley National Park. The protected site is located within a critical aquifer area that supplies fresh water to approximately 40 percent of the population of St. Kitts. The project also seeks to enhance the ecological, recreational,

educational, and cultural value of the area through the strategic planting of fruit and ornamental trees.

The ceremony brought together government officials, OECS representatives, an EU representative, students, community members, development partners, and environmental stakeholders to celebrate the completion of the project and reaffirm a shared commitment to environmental stewardship and sustainable development.

Delivering remarks at the ceremony, Senator and Minister of Sustainable Development, Environment and Climate Action and Constituency Empowerment in St. Kitts and Nevis, the Honourable Joyelle Clarke emphasised the importance of the initiative to the Federation's long-term sustainability goals, which takes a holistic approach to include the concepts of health

and wellness, and the protection of the country's water resources.

"This arboretum is a testament to the possibility that exists through partnership and our regional systems," Minister Clarke stated. "We are able to benefit from an initiative that actively takes into consideration our local realities and caters to the unique needs of this protected space, all while strengthening our environmental resilience."

Director of the Department of Environment, Derionne Edmeade, described the project as an important investment in environmental resilience and public wellbeing and symbolised the Federation's shared commitment to environmental stewardship, biodiversity conservation, climate resilience, and sustainable development for present and future generations.

Speaking on behalf of the OECS Commission, Mrs Delamine Andrew-Williams stated: "The Royal Basseterre



Valley National Park Arboretum stands as a practical example of this vision in action, where environmental stewardship, community benefit, and national development come together harmoniously." She added, "The successful establishment of the arboretum, including its fencing and afforestation, is a testament to sustained collaboration and technical excellence."

Mr Quentin Peignaux of the European Union also addressed the gathering and reaffirmed the EU's commitment to biodiversity conservation, soil and water protection, and sustainable development throughout the Caribbean region.

"It is very important for the European Union to participate in initiatives such as the ILM Programme because water resources and soil conservation are inseparable and are both essential to protecting the natural resources that sustain our living environment," Mr Peignaux stated.

He also highlighted the European Union's ongoing support for biodiversity conservation, protected area management, blue carbon initiatives, and nature-based solutions across the OECS region.

The official handover ceremony concluded with the unveiling of a commemorative plaque, followed by a symbolic tree-planting exercise, recognising the national day tree planting activities, involving government officials, OECS representatives, students, the Environment Ministry staff, community members, and development partners, reinforcing the shared commitment to environmental protection and sustainable landscape management in Saint Kitts and Nevis.





Social security reform

Saint Kitts and Nevis steps up on social security: Tripartite national dialogue on reform gains momentum

A landmark stakeholder conference hosted by the St. Christopher and Nevis Social Security Board signals a turning point for the Federation's pension system.

FRIGATE BAY, Saint Kitts and Nevis (ILO News) - Saint Kitts and Nevis is moving decisively to address the future of its social security system, following a high-level Stakeholder Reform Conference convened by the St. Christopher and Nevis Social Security Board on 21 April 2026, under the theme "Refining Today for a Sustainable Tomorrow."

The conference brought together government, employers, workers and regional and international experts in what participants described as a critical step towards long-awaited reform. Discussions were grounded in a shared recognition: the system faces mounting financial and demographic pressures that can no longer be deferred.

From analysis to action

Over the past two decades, pension expenditure has risen sharply, while the ratio of contributors to pensioners has declined. At the same time, key parameters, including contribution rates and benefit rules, have remained largely unchanged. Actuarial projections presented at the conference pointed to a clear conclusion: without reform, reserves are expected to decline significantly in the coming years.

"There is a path towards sustainability, but it requires timely, balanced decisions," said Derek Osborne Senior Actuary, highlighting the need to align benefits, contributions and demographic realities.

Key reform options discussed include gradual increases in contribution rates, adjustments to the pensionable age, and changes to benefit formulas - practical measures aimed at balancing adequacy with long-term sustainability. The proposals were framed around three pillars: benefit adequacy, contribution affordability, and financial sustainability - underpinned, by honest and responsible governance.

Leadership, dialogue and shared responsibility

Prime Minister Dr. Terrance Drew set the tone with a candid call for action, acknowledging that reform has been delayed for too long and emphasizing the need for leadership and responsibility. In his words, "the time has come for leadership, courage, and responsibility. We cannot continue to defer decisions that impact the future security of our people."

At the same time, the conference underscored that reform must be inclusive. Workers and employers were represented by Precious Mills, General Secretary of the St. Kitts-Nevis Trades and Labour Union, and Trevor Blake, immediate Past President of the Saint Kitts and Nevis Chamber

of Industry and Commerce. They addressed the meeting alongside technical experts and regional social security leaders, bringing to bear the concerns and perspectives of their respective constituencies on the issue at hand.

The International Labour Organization (ILO) participated in the day-long discussions, avowing its commitment to providing technical support and advocacy for the reform process. ILO Caribbean Director Dr. Joni Musabayana emphasized that sustainable reform depends on both evidence and trust. He commended the tripartite approach of bringing together all social partners as one that fundamentally ensures that reforms are both fair and durable.

"Social security is not just a benefit, it is a right. Sustainable systems must be built through inclusive, evidence-based dialogue between government, employers and workers." Joni Musabayana, Director ILO Decent Work Team and Office for the Caribbean.

For Saint Kitts and Nevis, Social Security reform, once seen as politically difficult, is now firmly on the national agenda, supported by data, dialogue and a growing sense of urgency. The path forward will require continued engagement, careful sequencing of reforms and sustained communication with the public. As Chairperson Janet Harris noted in closing, the conference laid "a strong foundation for shaping a more resilient and inclusive Social Security system" for current and future generations.

Social security, at its core, is one of the most powerful tools a society has for reducing poverty, sustaining livelihoods, and sharing prosperity across generations. The ILO Caribbean Office stands ready to walk this path with Saint Kitts and Nevis, through technical support, actuarial guidance, and a continued commitment to facilitating inclusive social dialogue that makes reform not just sound on paper, but sustainable in practice.

NIA Empowers Dozens of Women with Tools for Wealth and Home Ownership

NIA CHARLESTOWN, NEVIS (May 18, 2026)- In a bold step toward empowering women to build wealth and secure their futures, the Nevis Island Administration's Department of Gender Affairs recently hosted its first annual Women's Asset Building Seminar under the theme "Own Your Future: Women, Wealth and Home Ownership."

The event brought together approximately 50 women for an evening of practical learning, expert guidance, and meaningful engagement focused on financial empowerment and long-term asset building.

Minister of Gender Affairs, the Honourable Senator Jahnel Nisbett, expressed her satisfaction with both the turnout and the level of participation, noting that the workshop was well attended, with participants actively engaging in highly interactive sessions designed to equip them with real-world knowledge and tools.

"Over-all the event was a tremendous success. What made it particularly impactful was that it was not simply another talk shop. The participants received practical, realistic information on topics such as credit, legal protection in home ownership as well as retirement planning.

"Often women focus primarily on taking care of children, spouses, parents, and neglect focusing on their wellbeing, and this workshop was targeted specifically towards that group so that they could realize it's never too late to achieve those personal and financial goals. And I'm grateful that we were able to provide a lot of the tools to make that possible."

The seminar featured a panel of knowledgeable facilitators who delivered presentations across key areas of financial and personal development. Mr. Orvis Tyson, Senior Adviser at Sagicor, presented on insurance protection and investments; Ms. Tesia Burton, Branch Manager at Republic Bank, addressed savings, loans, and credit awareness; Mrs. Karen Claxton-Amory, Inspector at Social Security, spoke on maximizing retirement income; and attorney Ms. Althea Campbell provided guidance on legal protections and safeguarding assets.

Minister Nisbett highlighted the dynamic dialogue throughout the evening, noting that participants openly shared their experiences and asked insightful questions to better understand the various subject areas.

"We were very encouraged by the interest and most of the participants would have expressed a desire for follow-up sessions, while all of the facilitators made themselves available by providing contact information for future personal follow-ups to tailor the advice to their specific situations."

The seminar was chaired by Mrs. Deslyn Johnson of the Department of Gender Affairs. Following the presentations, participants had the opportunity

to engage directly with representatives from a legal aid clinic, the Department of Physical Planning, the Nevis Housing and Land Development Corporation (NHLDC), Structural Engineering and Architectural

Consultants, and the Ministry of Finance.

Minister Nisbett extended her gratitude to the facilitators, participants, and the staff members whose efforts were instrumental in conceptualizing and executing the successful event.

Decent work

ILO renews engagement with Saint Kitts and Nevis on decent work priorities

A four-day ILO mission to Basseterre sets the stage for renewed cooperation on the country’s wide-ranging decent work agenda including social security reform, tripartite dialogue, and skills development.

BASSETERRE, Saint Kitts and Nevis (ILO News) – The International Labour Organization (ILO) joined national stakeholders in Basseterre from 21 to 24 April 2026, in a series of engagements that reaffirmed the ILO’s technical support for national priorities for advancing decent work in the country. The twin-island

federation became an ILO Member State in 1996 and has since ratified ten ILO Conventions, including all eight fundamental Conventions - a foundation on which both sides agreed there is more to build.

On 21 April, at the invitation of the St. Christopher and Nevis Social Security Board, Joni Musabayana, Director of the ILO Decent Work Team and Office for the Caribbean, and Kagisanyo Kelobang, ILO Social Protection Analyst participated in a national stakeholder conference on social security reform. The ILO officials contributed to high-level panel discussions on regional and global good practices and lessons for strengthening social security; and that examined the practical implications of reform for national stakeholders.

In the following days, the ILO team benefitted from a series of engagements with key government officials, employers’ and workers’ organisations. Minister of Labour, Marsha Tamika Henderson, in the meeting with the ILO Director and team, tabled as immediate priorities action to modernize the Labour Code and revitalize the National Tripartite Committee (NTC) - the principal forum for consultation between government, workers, and employers. The Ministry also expressed interest in the ratification of several ILO Conventions.

The issues of effective tripartite dialogue and legislative reform, also emerged as common priorities across separate discussions with representatives of the St. Kitts and Nevis Trades and Labour Union and with the St. Kitts and Nevis Chamber of Industry and Commerce. Talks with the TVET Council brought a further challenge into focus: a widening gap between technical and vocational training and the skills the labour market actually needs. Officials also raised the need for stronger policy frameworks to manage labour migration - a shared concern across the Caribbean region.

The mission reaffirmed the ILO’s role as a partner and opened fresh spaces for ILO’s technical support and advisory to Saint Kitts and Nevis across social protection, labour market governance, and workforce development. It also marked an important step in renewing cooperation with the full range of national constituents- government, employers’ and workers’ organizations, around a shared agenda for decent work.

Band Manager Shares Plans Kollision Band Had to Address Bullying and Violence in Schools During Funeral Tribute

He also recalled receiving the call informing him that Clarke had been shot.

"I just left the night he was killed on the bypass road, they called me and told me Chubby was shot. I couldn't believe it."

"When I went to the hospital and saw him there, I said lord why. He had so many plans; he started writing his songs already for this year."

White described Clarke as a talented songwriter and recording artist.

"And a next thing when we went to studio, this guy was so talented, he would go in with a half a song and come out wid a whole song."

Deputy Prime Minister Dr. Geoffrey Hanley read a tribute on behalf of Prime Minister Terrance Drew, who sent regrets that he could not attend the service.

"The vibrant and charismatic Jermaine 'Chubby' Clarke left a mark on so many people across St.Kitts and Nevis, the region and the world," the tribute stated.

"Chubby was gifted. There is no other way to put it. He possessed a talent that could command a stage, move a crowd and bring people together through the universal language of music."

The tribute also referenced Clarke's role in the development of Kollision Band.

"He showed remarkable tenacity in helping to grow Kollision Band from a young and emerging group into a household name that captured the hearts of many."

"He remained committed to the craft, committed to the vision and committed to pushing forward."

Minister of Creative Economy with responsibility for National Carnival (Sugar Mas), Samal Duggins, also delivered remarks during the service.

"In giving tribute to someone I considered an icon gone too soon but today as

we mourn the loss of Jermaine 'Chubby' Clarke, we are here also to celebrate a life that shook the culture of St.Kitts and Nevis, shook the culture of our very nation," Duggins said.

"Chubby was not just a band leader; Chubby was a visionary, he was a creative force, a young man who believed deeply in his dream, even when others could not understand or see that vision that he had."

"He believed in Kollision Band, he believed in the culture-our culture-the culture of 'Wilders', and he believed in the power of young people expressing themselves in a way they see fit."

Duggins said the band persisted despite criticism and setbacks.

"Even when doors were closed in front of them, Chubby and the band pushed even harder. When people doubted them for years, the band came back year after year after year."

"They remained focused and through pure determination, passion and a relentless belief, he transformed Kollision Band into one of the most powerful cultural movement this Federation has seen to date."

The minister also referenced the band's 2024 Road March victory and the support it received from young followers.

"We witnessed that greatness live and in living colour when Kollision Band captured the 2024 Road March title."

"We witnessed it in the energy we see from the Teflon Dons, the crowds of young people that followed religiously behind Kollision Band, and we witnessed it every time the band touched the stage and made an entire generation feel seen, and made them feel proud, and made them feel connected."

"What Chubby built was just bigger than music. Chubby built an identity. He built a sense of belonging and he built a source of inspiration for our young people."

Police say Clarke was gunned down while seated in his vehicle in Keys Village on Sunday-5th April 2026 (Easter Sunday). Credible reports indicate it happened during the wee morning hours shortly after performing at an event.

RSCNPF & SKNDF Apprehend Jamaican Fugitives In Joint Operations

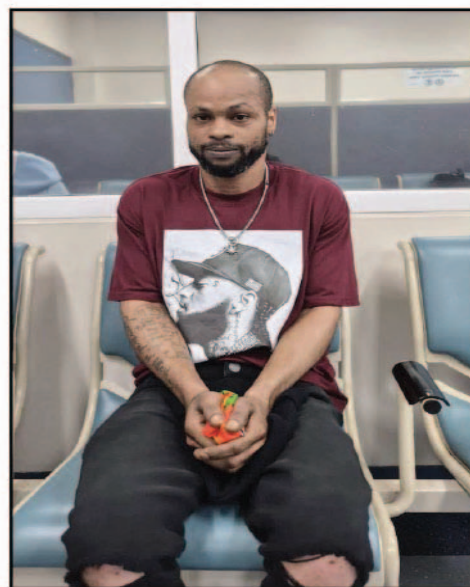

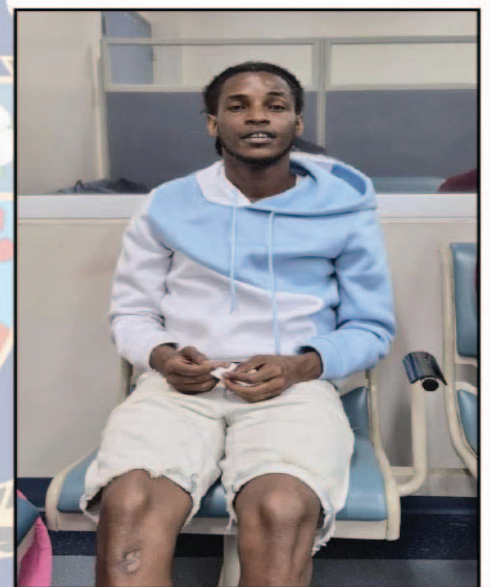

MFCR Old Road United Jets Crowned 2025/2026 National Bank Group/SKNFA Premier League Champions

Basseterre, St. Kitts — MFCR Old Road United Jets have etched their names into the history books after capturing the 2025/2026 National Bank Group/SKNFA Premier League title and completing the season unbeaten, becoming the first club in the Premier League era to achieve the feat in St. Kitts and Nevis football.

Old Road sealed the championship on Sunday, May 17, at the National Bank Group Technical Center with a commanding 4-2 victory over Development Bank St. Peters FC.

The club's talisman and league MVP delivered another standout performance in the season's biggest match, scoring a hat-trick in the 24th, 41st, and 61st minutes. The forward also finished the season as the league's top goal scorer and Final Four Playoffs MVP. Jardel Isaac added Old Road's go-ahead goal in the 29th minute after Aiden Nurse equalized for St. Peters three

minutes following Old Road's opener. Lyjani Isaac scored a consolation goal for St. Peters deep into stoppage time.

Following the final whistle, players, fans, club officials, and supporters celebrated jubilantly as the team lifted the championship trophy, marking the culmination of a historic campaign.

Reflecting on the season, Tiquanny Williams described the achievement as a special moment for the entire club.

"To be honest, I wouldn't say I expected the season to be like this. But the golden boot (award), I knew that was mine. But as I said, it was a great season, undefeated, history. So, of course, I wouldn't say I expected it. I just want to party with my teammates. Big moment for everybody," he said.

Head Coach Alexis Morris also reflected on the club's remarkable transformation from battling relegation in previous years to becoming unbeaten champions.

"I remember coaching against this team...it's always on the back end of things, 6-7-8-nil. And

when I finished (coaching Conaree) and I decided to take a break from football, some young men from Old Road contacted me and said, coach man, you can't end like this. You have more to offer. Can you give us some time?" he reminisced. "I had to think long and hard about it. And then, of course, I answered the clarion call and ended up with OR. And like I did with Conaree, I just needed at least four years with these guys."

Morris, who guided Conaree to their only league title 13 years ago,

compared that success to the work accomplished at Old Road, leading the club to its first Premier League championship.

"As long as this team stays together, there will be more victories and more history to be made," he added. "We're going to get bigger."

The championship triumph caps off a remarkable season for Old Road, who not only secured their first Premier League crown but also lifted their second FA Cup title, completing an extraordinary domestic campaign.

The conclusion of the 2025/2026 Premier League season also marks the end of the domestic football calendar in St. Kitts and Nevis for this season as clubs now begin preparations for the upcoming season.

SKNOC Strengthens Athletes' Welfare Through Safeguarding Education and Leadership

Basseterre, St. Kitts. May 20, 2026. The St. Kitts and Nevis Olympic Committee (SKNOC) has strengthened its commitment to athlete welfare and safe sporting environments with the successful completion of an intensive international Safeguarding in Sport certification programme by four local sport administrators.

Brenda Allen, Diane Browne, Sharon St. Luce and Damian Bacchus recently completed the eight-month course commissioned by the International Olympic Committee (IOC), officially earning certification as Safeguarding Officers.

Safeguarding in sport focuses on creating safe, inclusive and respectful sporting environments by protecting athletes and participants from abuse, harassment, discrimination, neglect and other forms of harm. Safeguarding Officers play a critical role in promoting athlete welfare, implementing protective policies, responding to concerns and helping sporting organisations maintain international best practices.

The four participants recently received confirmation (May 15) of their successful completion after months of assignments, assessments and continuous evaluations throughout the programme.

Each newly certified Safeguarding Officer expressed delight at completing the rigorous process and highlighted the value of the experience.



Brenda Allen described the programme as both enlightening and empowering.

"Safeguarding is not just about policies and procedures; it is about protecting people and ensuring that athletes can thrive in healthy environments. This course opened my eyes to the many ways we can better support and protect athletes, especially young athletes," Allen said.



Diane Browne noted that the course reinforced the importance of accountability and education in sport.

"The certification process challenged us to think critically about athlete welfare and organisational responsibility. I am grateful for the opportunity to contribute to building safer sporting spaces in St. Kitts and Nevis," Browne stated.
